The Game

The Tribe will play its first conference road game of the season when it squares off against No. 18/23 Elon on Saturday at 2 p.m. W&M is coming off a narrow 21-18 setback against Stony Brook in its CAA opener last weekend, as it nearly erased a 21-point second-half deficit. One of the country's top teams defensively, W&M currently ranks third nationally in sacks (4.0) and 15th in scoring defense. After dropping its season opener at Toledo, Elon has responded with four consecutive victories, which includes narrow league wins against nationally ranked foes in Richmond (36-33) and Albany (6-0).

The Series

Saturday's game will mark just the fourth meeting between W&M and Elon. W&M claimed the first two matchups before suffering a setback versus the Phoenix in Williamsburg last fall. The Tribe won the lone matchup at Elon, 34-13, in 2015.

The Coaches

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M '70) owns a career record of 245-182-2 and is in his 38th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 245 wins rank second nationally among all active Division-I coaches, while his 109 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- Elon: Curt Cignetti (West Virginia '82) is in his first season at Elon and owns a 4-1 record with the Phoenix.

The Program

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 573-558-41 in 124 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won five conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs 10 times and posted 24 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice - 2004, 2009.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 45 All-Americans (125 total honors), while 38 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.

• W&M scored on its first offensive play of the second half - a career-long 77-yard touchdown catch by WR DeVonte Dedmon - which narrowed the margin to 17-10

• PK Nick Dorka connected on his only field goal attempt (43 yards)

• The loss snapped W&M's seven-game home winning streak

• It was W&M's first loss to Elon, as the Tribe won the previous two meetings

No. 8 Tribe Falls to Elon in CAA Opener, 27-10

Williamsburg, Va. - The eighth-ranked Tribe fell to Elon, 27-10, in both teams' conference opener at Zable Stadium on Sept. 24, 2016.

Although W&M (2-2, 0-1) outgained the Phoenix (2-2, 1-0) by nearly 100 yards - 335-236 - it was unable to overcome an early 17-0 deficit.

Elon capitalized on a pair of special teams miscues by the Tribe en route to building the early lead, as all three of its first half scoring drives combined to cover just 46 yards.

In addition to holding Elon to just 236 total yards, W&M's defense limited EU to just 96 passing yards and 5 of 15 on third down. However, the Phoenix scored on all four trips into the red zone, while the Tribe failed to come up with any points on its lone trip inside Elon's 20-yard line and committed three turnovers.

Junior wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon led the Tribe offensively with four catches for 93 yards, which was highlighted by a 77-yard touchdown reception early in the third quarter.

Two of Elon's first three scoring drives combined to cover a total of just 10 yards and came following Tribe miscues on punts. A 35-yard field goal by John Gallagher with 12:44 showing in the first quarter was set up by a blocked punt, while Cole Taylor hauled in a 5-yard touchdown pass from Daniel Thompson midway through the second quarter that came after a botched snap gave Elon starting field position at W&M's 6-yard line.

The Phoenix's other early score came on a 21-yard touchdown run by Malcolm Summers early in the second quarter, which capped off a short three-play, 36-yard drive.

A 43-yard field goal by junior Nick Dorka with 0:15 remaining in the second quarter was W&M's lone score in the first half.

Despite trailing 17-3 at the break, W&M's defense held Elon to just two first downs and 73 total yards during the opening 30 minutes. Additionally, it dominated the time of possession (21:06-8:54).

Things looked good for the Tribe early the third quarter, as senior quarterback Steve Cluley connected with Dedmon on a 77-yard touchdown strike on W&M's first offensive play of the half to narrow the margin to 17-10.

However, the big play was the Tribe's lone score of the second half as Elon pulled away for the conference-opening victory.

Senior linebacker Stephen Lubnow and redshirt freshman linebacker Nate Atkins led the Tribe defensively with seven tackles apiece, while senior cornerback Trey Reed recorded an interception and a TFL.

Summers led the Elon with 120 rushing yards on 26 carries with two touchdowns.

The loss snapped W&M's seven-game home winning streak dating back to last season and was the Tribe's first setback versus Elon in the teams' three meetings.

Series History

The Tribe won the lone matchup at Elon, 34-13, in 2015.

Capitalizing on Turnovers

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M has generated 85 turnovers and turned them into 289 points.

W&M has generated three turnovers this season. Safety Corey Parker turned one of those into points when he returned a fumble 19 yards for a touchdown in the win against Bucknell.

W&M owns an impressive average margin of victory during the past four seasons, while all but four of the Tribe's last 23 victories during that span have come by double-digit margins.

True Freshmen

Three true freshmen have earned playing time this season - defensive tackle Will Kiely, running back Nate Evans and punter Will Michael.

During the last four years, 11 true freshmen have played for the Tribe (2017 - 3; 2016 - 4; 2014 - 4).

First Starts

Ten Tribe players have made their first career starts this season. Six of those came at Virginia - quarterback Tommy McKee, running back Noah Giles, tight end Tyler Klaus, center Brooks Norris, right tackle Garrett Best and linebacker Arman Jones. Two others came at Norfolk State - fullback Tyler Crist and left tackle Mark Williamson - while two others came vs. Stony Brook - wide receiver Anthony Mague and right guard Graydon Campbell.

Historical Success in Close Games

Since taking over the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmye Laycock's squads have played in 69 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced success in those contests, totaling an impressive 37-30-2 record.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.

One Tribe, One Family

The W&M athletic department's unofficial slogan - "One Tribe, One Family" - is especially true for the Tribe football team, as the roster features a pair of brother tandems - Josh/Justin Dulaney and Collin/Corey Parker.

Success at Home

Dating back to the start of the 2015 season, W&M has won 10 of its last 13 home games at Zable Stadium.

Additionally, W&M has posted an 19-6 record at home since the start of the 2013 season, which represents a 76.0 winning percentage.

W&M's recent undefeated regular-season home records came in 2015, 2010, 2009 & 2004.



With 245 career victories, head coach Jimmye Laycock ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 247.

W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during six of the last seven seasons - Jonathan Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013), John Carpenter (2014) and DeVonte Dedmon (2015).

National Preseason Honor

Having established himself as one of the nation's elite offensive linemen throughout his career, W&M senior left tackle Chris Durant was selected to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Third Team this summer.

A two-time All-CAA honoree and four-year starter at left tackle, Durant also earned 2017 preseason All-CAA distinction.

Durant's standout play has helped W&M produce a 1,000-yard rusher during each of the last three seasons. Additionally, the Tribe allowed the league's fewest sacks per game (1.08) and led the nation in fewest tackles for a loss allowed per game (3.46) in 2015.

Preseason All-CAA

In addition to Durant's selection on the preseason All-CAA team, senior wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon also garnered the distinction.

One of the nation's most electric playmakers as both a wide receiver and a return specialist, Dedmon entered his senior season as an All-America candidate at both positions. A two-time All-CAA selection at wideout and former CAA Special Teams Player of the Year (2015), Dedmon ranked among the league's top 10 in five statistical categories last fall despite being limited for much of the season by injury.

Preseason CAA Rankings

The Tribe was selected to finish seventh the CAA preseason poll, which was voted on by the league's coaches and sports information directors.

Bouncing Back

Under head coach Jimmye Laycock, W&M has historically bounced back from seasons in which it failed to post a winning record (W&M was 5-6 last season), as the Tribe has registered consecutive losing seasons just three times during the past 35 years (2005-2006; 2006-2007; 2011-2012).

It's A Winner

In his 37 full seasons at W&M, head coach Jimmye Laycock has secured 24 winning seasons.

The achievement is remarkable when considering the program had just seven winning seasons in the previous 30 years (1950 – 1979) prior to his taking control of the program for the 1980 season.

Captains

The Tribe is led by a quartet of senior captains this season - defensive end Matt Ahola, tight end Andrew Caskin, left guard Connor Hilland and cornerback Aaron Swinton.

Tribe in the NFL

The Tribe was well represented in NFL training camps this summer, as six former players were on active rosters - Jonathan Grimes (Jaguars), DeAndre Houston Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Titans), Luke Rhodes (Colts), Jerry Ugokwe (Saints) and B.W. Webb (Bears). Additionally, two other former players were on NFL rosters last season - Jerome Couplin III (Rams) and Sean Lissemore (Chargers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

Tribe NFL Draft Picks

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

Below are a few notes about W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009.

- Ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia Tech and Virginia)

New Radio Team

W&M broadcasts will feature a new member this season, as former Tribe All-American and 16-year NFL veteran Mike Leach '00 will join longtime play-by-play announcer Jay Colley in the radio booth. Colley will continue to handle play-by-play duties, while Leach will provide expert analysis and commentary.

Leach joins the broadcast team after a remarkable 16-year NFL career as a long snapper and tight end with the Arizona Cardinals, Denver Broncos and Tennessee Titans. While at W&M, Leach earned first-team Walter Camp All-America honors as a tight end during his senior season after garnering second-team All-America accolades from the Associated Press as a junior.

Team Offensive Notes

Offensive Line Coming Up Big ... Again

W&M has ranked among the nation's best in fewest tackles for a loss allowed per game during the past few seasons.

After leading the nation in 2015 (3.46), the Tribe ranked 11th last season (4.18).

The Tribe is off to another good start this season and currently ranks 10th nationally (4.0).

Fourth Down Success

W&M currently ranks 14th nationally in fourth down success (75.0) and has converted three of its four attempts.

Protecting the Ball

W&M currently ranks 16th nationally with just four turnovers this season.

Rare Occurrence

W&M is one of just nine teams that has not lost a fumble this season.

This year's success continues a trend that began last fall when the Tribe ranked sixth nationally in fewest fumbles lost (4).

Ground Game Production is Key

Since 2011, W&M's ability to run the ball well has been indicative of its overall success. The Tribe has averaged 197.7 rushing yards per game in its 37 wins (7,314 rushing yards), while it has averaged just 131.5 yards per game on the ground in its 36 losses (4,733 rushing yards).

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 76 times and posted a 71-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 25-2 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns a 7-16 mark in such contests.

Interestingly, six of those wins have come in since the start of the 2015 season.

New Coordinator

After three highly successful seasons as W&M's running backs coach, DJ Mangas was promoted to the Tribe's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in May.

One of the nation's top young coaches, Mangas (28) was the second-youngest offensive coordinator in Division I (FBS & FCS) at the time of his promotion.

In addition to producing a 1,000-yard rusher during each of the last three seasons, Tribe running backs earned all-conference distinction all three years – highlighted by first-team selections in 2014 and 2015.

Team Defensive Notes

Strong Finish

W&M's defense played a big role in its comeback bid against Stony Brook last weekend, as it held the Seawolves to just 51 total yards during its last four possessions.

Sacking the Opposition

W&M has been tremendously successful getting to opposing teams' quarterbacks this fall and currently ranks third nationally in sacks per game (4.0). Additionally, the Tribe ranks sixth in TFL per game (8.5).

The impressive numbers represent a reversal of last year's squad that posted just 10.0 sacks and 39.0 TFL during the entire season.

Defensive Dominance

W&M currently ranks 15th nationally in scoring defense and is allowing just 16.0 points per game. Additionally, the Tribe is limiting opponents to just 308.8 total yards per game this season - an impressive average that ranks 24th nationally.

Third Down Stops

During the last three contests, W&M's defense has held the opposition to just 13 of 42 on third downs (30.9).

Additionally, the Tribe is allowing just 14.7 first downs per game during the three-game stretch.

Shutting Down the Pass

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 122 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just seven times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

Youth in the Front Seven

Although W&M returns a pair of senior starters on its defensive line from 2016, the Tribe's front seven features 10 freshmen and sophomores on its Week 5 two-deep.

Consistency at MLB

A total of just five players have accounted for 120 of 123 starts at MLB during the past 11 seasons. Sophomore standout Nate Atkins added his name to that list last fall.

Defensive/Special Teams Scores

With Corey Parker's 19-yard fumble return for a touchdown in the win against Bucknell, W&M has now posted a defensive or special teams touchdown during 10 of the last 11 seasons.

Although it has not recorded a pick-six yet this fall, W&M entered the 2017 campaign having returned an interception for a touchdown in four straight seasons - and seven of the last eight.

Dating back to the 2007 season, the Tribe's defense and special teams have generated 241 points (33 touchdowns / three safeties / two PAT returns).

Creating Turnovers

Since the start of the 2013 season, W&M has generated 85 turnovers and has posted a +22 turnover margin.

Dating back to the start of the 2015 season, the Tribe has forced at least one turnover in 23 of the last 28 games.

Tradition of Excellence

In addition to currently ranking 15th nationally in scoring defense (16.0), W&M has established itself as one of the nation's top defensive teams during the last nine years and has finished the season ranked among the country's top 10 three

times since 2009 (see below).

Dating back to 2009, W&M is allowing just 19.5 ppg during the last 94 contests (1,812 total points). During that stretch, the Tribe has posted six shutouts.

Additionally, W&M has held 14 opponents without an offensive touchdown since the start of the 2009 season.

Especially Tough at Home

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 16.9 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 46 games (776 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 33-13 record at home during that span.

Less Than 40

W&M has allowed just four opponents to score more than 40 points during the last 50 games (James Madison, 41 - 2015; Duquesne, 49 - 2015; Richmond, 48 - 2015; NC State, 48 - 2016).

Limiting Big Plays

Since the start of the 2011 season (74 games), W&M has allowed just 35 plays 40 yards or longer - an average of just 0.5 per contest.

During that same 74-game stretch, W&M has allowed just 22 rushes of 30 yards or longer - an average of just 0.3 per contest.

Impressive Efforts

Since the start of the 2011 season, W&M has allowed less than 300 yards of total offense in more than 30 percent of its games (23 times in 74 games). The Tribe has posted a 20-3 record in those contests, with its only losses coming versus Elon (2016) at Maryland (2012) and at Rhode Island (2011).

Dating back to last season, W&M has held four of its last six opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense.

Shutout History

The Tribe has posted 15 shutouts during the Laycock era, with more than a third of them (six) having come since 2009.

#3 Aaron Swinton Senior • Cornerback Lancaster, Pa. McCaskey

What's your full name?

Aaron Lynel Swinton. My dad's first name is Aaron and my mom's is Lynette, so I'm named after both of them.

Where are you from, and what other sports did you play in high school?

I'm from Lancaster, Pa. I played varsity basketball for four years. I also did high jump and long jump on the track & field team.

Were you involved with any groups or organizations outside of sports?

I was involved with church and did some mission trips in high school. One of the trips was to the Dominican Republic and helped build an orphanage.

Knowing that, I assume the recent hurricanes have affected you.

I'm actually half Puerto Rican, and I have a lot of family in Puerto Rico. The live in the mountains and don't have a lot of good communication, so I'm not certain how they're doing because we last heard from them before the storm.

Have you been involved with any organizations at W&M other than football?

I volunteered at a local elementary school as a mentor during the season I was injured (sophomore season). It was great getting to see the student I was paired with grow. I'm also part of Tribe Fellowship and Intersivity, which are Christian groups on campus.

How valuable were sports in your life growing up?

I was a really, really shy kid. The main reason why I played football is because my mom made me. I initially wanted to quit after my first week. I begged and pleaded to quit, but my dad wouldn't let me and said I had to finish what I started. I played defensive tackle and fullback, and I was not having a good time. I was probably 7 or 8 at the time. But I stuck with it, and playing has helped me learn about myself and how to work with others. I never really viewed football a means to an end, but the game has definitely suited my strengths like attention to detail. I have an almost obsessive focus on things, like wanting to win. I'm uber competitive, so I've taken that to football.

You're a team captain, yet you have a somewhat reserved personality. How has that leadership role fit your personality?

I'm reserved, a bit of an introvert. But I'm a detail-oriented person, and I can see how to build something up from the ground level. I think I have a pretty good grasp of what it takes to separate yourself. I think deeply. I'm in a role now, as captain, where people look for me to speak and lead, and that forces me to be more outward about what I'm thinking. I've learned a lot about not only my teammates but also myself. I always knew I was capable of leading but I've kind of surprised myself. Having 95 guys looking to me and seeing how my words and actions have a direct role in the direction of the team; it's been a great opportunity.

How has being a captain affected the direction of your future after football?

I'm understanding how to learn different perspectives. Before coming to W&M, I was surrounded by people who generally thought the same way I did. Now I'm surrounded with 95 guys from different backgrounds, races, religions, political views . . . to me, that's super valuable. I can learn their perspectives by interacting with them, and then I can learn to work with them toward a common goal. Football provides you with an amazing opportunity to do something like that.

Discuss what went into the display of unity prior to the season opener at Virginia.

It was an amazing opportunity to take a stand and promote love and unity in a world and country that is dealing with so many divisive moments and actions. I don't want to pinpoint anything but the foundation is there is love and there is hate – we have 95 guys from different walks of life and different views, so it was an amazing opportunity in a place like Charlottesville, where two weeks before there was a manifestation of hate. It was great to stand beside each other and be an example of what you can achieve is you accept everyone's differences – because we're all different. You also have to realize you can't get anywhere without the unity and love, you just can't.

Describe how this year's team's unity and bond was created.

The first step is creating a discussion by raising awareness, which is what we've done. We weren't going to progress without an uncomfortable phase, so we had to kind of unsettle things first and have these conversations to move forward. I think that's kind of how it's happening. We stimulated those discussions and they were amazing. We have to understand everybody's perspective. You can't just shut somebody down because they have a different point of view. It doesn't mean you compromise your own point of view, but we can work through it together unified. Football is an amazing sport, but at the end of the day it's just a game. We all want to win, but it's so much more than just going out on the field and playing a game. We do an amazing job at W&M creating an atmosphere of a family. We make a point of breaking down at the end of practice every day on "family." Because that's what it is. We're working together on one common goal, but we need each other. In order to have that cohesiveness, you have to work at it.

The defense has played very well this season, talk about that success.

The most impressive thing thus far is that we have improved in areas where we wanted to get better. The defensive line and linebackers have played amazing. The other exciting part is we can still play much better, especially in the secondary. We want to make more plays and create more turnovers. It just goes to show how we're becoming more of a complete team. The first steps have definitely been taken.

How excited are you about your senior season.

I'm very excited, and I'm all in. You can just see the focus and intensity this year. We want it. I think we have shown what we can be when we play well in all facets – on offense, defense and special teams. When we're hitting on all cylinders, we're a tough team to stop.

How has the work during the offseason paid off thus far?

We established those core values of the team early on. We even posted why we play the game in our locker, so before you go out to practice you see that and are reminded why we fight through adversity. My "why" first and foremost is for my Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. My second is for my family because they have been there for me through everything. My third is kind of personal – I have been doubted and been through adversity my entire life. That's just part of who I am I guess. I embrace that, and I'm just going to keep proving people wrong. I've been the underdog, so I'm going to keep on chugging.

What are your postgraduate plans?

Strategic consulting or something in finance. I'm not sure yet. I really want to do is gain the skills needed to give back. I think there's a huge need in certain areas. I was very fortunate to get to an amazing place like this university. I'm getting my master's degree right now, and I'd never have dreamt of something like this. To be awarded this opportunity and to see world outside of what I had seen before makes it essential for me to give back. For me, the way to do that is to inspire. I can show them that there is someone who came from where they came from and made it somewhere that's different. I feel an obligation. People need role models. I'd like to be a social entrepreneur, but I'm not sure I'd put a title on it – I just want to give back.

What has been the value of your William & Mary experience.

It has been amazing. If had to sum it up in a single phrase, it would be "stepping out of my comfort zone." When I first got here, I didn't really like it and was ready to leave. Part of it was I grew up in the same place and had never been gone for more than a week. Coming here to Virginia and not knowing anybody was really tough on me. But I made the decision to step outside my comfort zone and to keep doing that over and over again. I've learned so much about myself and my time here has helped teach me who I am. I wouldn't be able to that anywhere else. I definitely love what W&M has prepared me with.

Head Coach Jimmye Laycock



William & Mary Head Coach Jimmye Laycock

38th Season

Career Record: 245-182-2 (.573)

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock. In a tenure that will stretch into its 38th season this fall, Laycock has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Laycock is the nation's longest tenured Division I head coach at his current school and entered the 2017 season ranked second in wins among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches with 243 victories. Laycock also ranked second all-time among conference head coaches in league wins (109) entering this fall, while the Tribe has appeared in 19 postseason contests and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals twice under his direction.

The success has led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$28 Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed this summer. The rejuvenated stadium, which includes and upper deck, luxury suites and a spacious state-of-the-art press box, provides an enhanced game day experience for both student-athletes as well as Tribe alumni and supporters.

On June 21, 2008, the College dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides W&M with one of the finest facilities in the FCS.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 123-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement.

When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the College would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 37 seasons.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With eight all-league recognitions in 2016, the Tribe has produced an astounding 248 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011.

Since 2009, W&M has produced six NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech).

The Tribe is well represented in the pro ranks, as eight former Tribe players were on NFL rosters during the last year: Jerome Couplin III (Los Angeles Rams), Jonathan Grimes (Jacksonville Jaguars), DeAndre Houston-Carson (Chicago Bears), Sean Lismore (San Diego Chargers), Tre McBride (Tennessee Titans), Luke Rhodes (Indianapolis Colts), Jerry Ugokwe (New Orleans Saints) and B.W. Webb (Chicago Bears).

In addition to the draft picks, 12 additional Tribe players have signed free agent contracts after their senior season since the conclusion of the 2004: Lang Campbell (2005, Cleveland Browns), Dominique Thomspon (2005, St. Louis Rams), Adam O'Connor (2007, Carolina Panthers), Drew Atchison (2008, Dallas Cowboys), Mike Potts (2008, Pittsburgh Steelers), Jonathan Grimes (2011, Houston Texans), Alex Gottlieb (2011, Detroit Lions), Jerome Couplin III (2014, Detroit Lions), Jasper Coleman (2015, Houston Texans), Mike Reilly (2015, Cleveland Browns), Luke Rhodes (2016, Tampa Bay Buccaneers) and Jerry Ugokwe (Indianapolis Colts).

In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) was hired as the Buffalo Bills head coach in January, 2017, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and previously held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, Michael Clemons ('87) was one of the CFL's most explosive players after a brief stint in the NFL and currently holds the position of Vice Chair for the Toronto Argonauts.

As a 1970 graduate of the College, Laycock played football under two legends of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco 49ers.

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deirdre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at the College. They have three children: Michael, a Captain in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a recent graduate of Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail and Nolan.

Tribe Falls at Virginia, 28-10, in Season Opener

Charlottesville, Va. - The William & Mary football team opened the 2017 season with a 28-10 setback at Virginia on Sept. 2.

Although W&M outgained UVA in the second half, 172-138, it was unable to overcome a 14-0 halftime deficit.

The Tribe narrowed the gap to 21-10 and had possession of the ball midway through the fourth quarter, but a turnover deep in its own territory ended the late comeback bid.

Although W&M outgained UVA on the ground (168-92), the Cavaliers threw for 262 yards and outgained the Tribe, 354-240. Additionally, W&M was just 1 of 11 on third down, while UVA converted half its third downs (9-18).

Junior quarterback Tommy McKee, who made his first career start, finished as W&M's leading rusher with 89 yards on 15 carries and a touchdown, while redshirt freshman tailback Noah Giles posted 54 yards on 11 carries.

Sophomore safety Corey Parker (13, TFL), sophomore linebacker Nate Atkins (12, sack, FF) and junior linebacker Josh Dulaney (10, 1.5 TFL) all posted double-digit tackle totals. Sophomore linebacker Arman Jones also came up big with eight stops and a sack.

Sophomore kicker Kris Hooper made his only field goal attempt, as his 41-yard kick early in the third quarter nearly matched his career long (42).

Virginia quarterback Kurt Benkert completed 27 of 39 passes for 262 yards with three touchdowns, while Olamide Zaccheaus (5-56), Andre Levrone (2-56) and Jordan Ellis (2-11) all hauled in touchdown catches. Doni Dowling was the Cavaliers' leading receiver (6-76), while Ellis rushed for a team-high 80 yards on 20 carries with a score.

Malcolm Cook led UVA defensively with 13 tackles and a sack, while Quin Blanding (12) and Juan Thornhill (10) also posted double-digit sack totals.

W&M Shuts Down Norfolk State, 20-6

Norfolk, Va. - Junior quarterback Tommy McKee threw three touchdown passes and rushed for a game-high 114 yards to help lead the William & Mary football team to a 20-6 victory at Norfolk State on Sept. 9, 2017.

Although NSU (0-2) took an early 3-0 lead with a 19-yard field goal by Josh Nardone midway through the second quarter, W&M (1-1) responded with three unanswered touchdowns to pull away for the victory. The Spartans' only other score came on a 37-yard field goal by Nardone midway through the third quarter.

In addition to keeping NSU out of the end zone, the Tribe's defense allowed just 273 total yards and posted 5.0 sacks and 10.0 tackles for a loss.

En route to throwing three scoring strikes, McKee completed 16 of 27 passes for 169 yards, while his 114 rushing yards came on just 14 carries. Senior wide receiver Daniel Kuzjak (6 rec., 53 yds), redshirt freshman fullback Tyler Crist (2 rec., 35 yds) and senior tight end Andrew Caskin (2 rec, 32 yds) all hauled in one touchdown catch apiece.

Defensively, sophomore linebacker Arman Jones totaled a team-high seven tackles with 0.5 TFL, while junior linebacker Joshua Dulaney posted five stops, 3.0 TFL and a sack. Senior defensive end Matt Ahola (1.5 sacks) and senior defensive tackle Isaiah Stephens (1.0 sack) also registered sacks.

Excluding a few big plays (four of NSU's plays accounted for 149 yards of its total offense), the Tribe's defense was dominant for much of the night. In addition to holding the Spartans without a touchdown, W&M limited the Spartans to just 273 total yards (101 rushing / 172 passing) and 12 first downs. Additionally, the Tribe held NSU to just 3 of 13 on third downs.

W&M was balanced offensively and piled up 206 rushing yards to go with 169 yards through the air. Four different Tribe players rushed for at least 20 yards, while eight different players recorded at least one catch.

Aaron Savage posted a team-high 79 rushing yards on eight carries, as 40 of those yards came on a single run. Isaiah Winstead (4-55) and George Wahee (4-45) both totaled four catches apiece, while quarterback Juwan Carter finished the evening 11 of 19 for 160 yards.

Defensively, Kyle Archie totaled a game-high 14 tackles to lead the Spartans.

Big Second Half Lifts Tribe Past Bucknell, 30-9

Williamsburg, Va. - The William & Mary football team concluded its non-conference slate with a 30-9 victory against Bucknell in its home opener at Zable Stadium on Saturday evening.

Although the Tribe (2-1) led by just a point at halftime, 10-9, it posted three unanswered touchdowns during the third quarter en route to pulling away for the lopsided victory.

W&M was dominant defensively during the final 30 minutes, as it held the Bison (1-2) scoreless and allowed just 42 total yards. Additionally, one of the Tribe's three second half touchdowns came on a defensive play when sophomore safety Corey Parker scooped up a fumble caused by sophomore linebacker Nate Atkins and returned it 19 yards for a touchdown.

In addition to allowing just 226 total yards, including just 23 on the ground, the Tribe's defense posted 6.0 sacks and 9.0 TFL.

Freshman running back Nate Evans rushed for a game-high 89 yards on 18 carries with a touchdown, while redshirt freshman running back Noah Giles also found the end zone on the ground and finished with 31 yards on eight carries. Both touchdowns were the first of their careers.

Junior quarterback Tommy McKee provided W&M's other offensive score with a 4-yard touchdown pass to redshirt freshman fullback Tyler Crist late in the third quarter and completed 12 of 17 passes for 105 yards. The Virginia Beach, Va., native was especially effective during the second half when he completed 7 of 8 passes for 65 yards and the touchdown.

Atkins and junior linebacker Josh Dulaney both posted seven tackles apiece with sacks, while Atkins forced fumble midway through the third quarter led to Parker's defensive score. Also recording sacks were senior defensive tackle Isaiah Stephens, senior defensive tackle Bill Murray, senior defensive end Matt Ahola and freshman defensive tackle Will Kiely. Murray also added a blocked extra-point, the second of his career.

Sophomore Jalen Christian came up big on special teams and recorded a 48-yard punt return and a 33-yard kickoff return.

In addition to outscoring Bucknell in the second half, 20-0, W&M outgained the Bison in the second half, 160-42, and finished the contest with a 281-226 advantage in total yards. The Tribe was especially dominant on the ground, 176-23.

W&M held BU to just 5 of 16 on third downs and stopped the Bison on both its fourth down conversion attempts.

Bucknell quarterback Matt Muh completed 15 of 20 passes for 155 yards with a touchdown, while Jack Horan posted a game-high seven catches for 69 yards. Joey DeFloria led the ground attack and rushed for 62 yards on 18 carries.

Tribe Edged by Stony Brook in CAA Opener, 21-18

Williamsburg, Va. - The William & Mary football team nearly rallied back from a 21-point second-half deficit but was edged by Stony Brook, 21-18, in its conference opener at Zable Stadium on Sept. 30.

W&M's (2-2, 0-1) final drive ended with a false start penalty at Stony Brook's (4-1, 3-0) 17-yard line in the waning seconds, as the penalty included a 10-second runoff that concluded the hard-fought contest.

Trailing 21-0 late in the third quarter, the Tribe began its comeback bid with a 34-yard field goal by sophomore Kris Hooper with 4:36 showing in the third frame. A pair of fourth quarter touchdowns, coming on a 3-yard run by freshman tailback Nate Evans with 11:12 left and a 21-yard strike from junior quarterback Tommy McKee to sophomore wideout Chris Conlan with 7:54 remaining, helped W&M draw within a field goal. Conlan's touchdown was followed by a successful 2-point conversion on a pass from junior wide receiver Isaiah Kinder to McKee.

W&M's final drive was one of two offensive possessions in the waning minutes, as it also took over at its own 30-yard line with 3:44 left but turned it over with an interception on the first play of the series.

Evans recorded a career-high 162 all-purpose yards, as he finished with 82 rushing yards on 14 carries and a touchdown to go with a team-high five catches for 80 yards.

Sophomore linebacker Arman Jones totaled a team-high nine tackles with 2.0 TFL, while sophomore linebacker Nate Atkins matched Jones' tackle total and recovered a fumble. Senior defensive tackle Isaiah Stephens posted a sack and 2.0 TFL, while sophomore defensive tackle Bill Murray tallied a sack, forced fumble and fumble recovery – all of which came on the same play.

Although W&M recorded more first downs than SBU (20-18), the Seawolves outgained the Tribe, 382-300, and held a significant advantage on the ground, 200-88. W&M entered the game allowing just 72.0 rushing yards per game, which ranked 10th nationally.

The Seawolves were penalized nine times for 97 yards, all of which came during the second half.

Both teams committed two turnovers apiece, as SBU lost a pair of fumbles while W&M was intercepted twice.

Tailback Stacey Bedell rushed for 104 yards on 21 carries with a touchdown, while tailback Donald Liotine rushed for 42 yards on 11 carries with a score.

Quarterback Joe Carbone completed 12-of-17 passes for 182 yards, which included a 61-yard touchdown pass to Liotine.

Defensively, John Haggart posted seven tackles and 3.0 sacks.
