The Game

After defeating Richmond, 34-13, at Zable Stadium last season, the Tribe will look to retain the Capital Cup when it concludes its 2017 slate at UR on Saturday at 3 p.m. The game will be broadcast live by NBCS-W, Chicago and Philly and on delay by SNY. Richmond currently leads the CAA in total offense (455.7), while W&M's defense has allowed just one of its opponent to post more than 400 yards of total offense.

The Series

Saturday's game between William & Mary and Richmond will mark the 128th meeting between the two schools in what has been traditionally called the "Oldest Rivalry in the South" – but may more accurately be described as the most PLAYED rivalry in the south. The Tribe leads the all-time series 62-60-5. The teams first met in 1898, when Richmond blanked W&M, 15-0.

The Coaches

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M '70) owns a career record of 245-188-2 and is in his 38th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 245 wins rank second nationally among all active Division-I coaches, while his 109 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- Richmond: Russ Huesman (Chattanooga '81) is in his first season at UR and owns a 5-5 record with the Spiders.

The Program

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 573-564-41 in 124 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won five conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs 10 times and posted 24 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice - 2004, 2009.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 45 All-Americans (125 total honors), while 38 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.

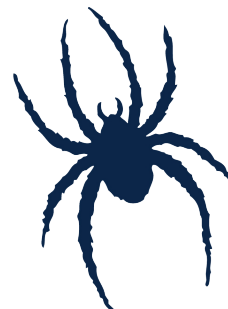

• W&M reclaimed the Capital Cup for the first time since 2011

• W&M trailed by a touchdown at halftime but outscored UR, 28-0, during the final 30 minutes; W&M outgained the Spiders, 245-55, during the second half

• W&M found the end zone with four of its five possessions during the second half

• RB Kendell Anderson was honored as the game's Most Valuable Performer after equaling the third-best rushing performance in school history (219 yards) on a school-record 42 carries with two touchdowns

• Anderson became just the fifth player in school history to eclipse 3,000 career rushing yards (3,082) and ranks tied for fourth all-time at W&M with 34 rushing touchdowns

• W&M outgained UR, 415-273, and dominated the time of possession by nearly 20 minutes (39:33-20:27)

• TE Andrew Caskin hauled in two TD catches

• CB Aaron Swinton recorded his fourth INT in the final five games

• UR starting quarterback Kyle Lauletta left the game with an injury late in the second quarter and did not return

• UR entered the game averaging 32.2 points per game and 439.2 total yards per game

Tribe Runs Past No. 7 Richmond on Senior Day, 34-13

Williamsburg, Va. - The Tribe wrapped up the 2016 campaign with an impressive 34-13 victory against No. 7 Richmond on Senior Day at Zable Stadium.

Although W&M trailed by a touchdown at halftime, it blanked the Spiders, 28-0, during the final 30 minutes en route to claiming the Capital Cup for the first time since 2011. The Tribe's dominant second half performance included outgaining UR, 245-55, during the final two quarters.

Senior running back Kendell Anderson was honored as the game's Most Valuable Player after equaling the third-best rushing performance in school history (219 yards) on a school-record 42 carries with two touchdowns. With the outstanding effort, Anderson becomes just the fifth player in school history to eclipse 3,000 career rushing yards (3,082) and ranks tied for fourth all-time at W&M with 34 rushing touchdowns.

Senior quarterback Steve Cluley also closed out a tremendous career with a strong performance, as he completed 17 of 25 passes for 190 yards with a pair of touchdown strikes to junior tight end Andrew Caskin.

W&M outgained UR, 415-273, and dominated the time of possession by nearly 20 minutes (39:33-20:27). Additionally, the Tribe (5-6, 3-5) held Richmond (8-3, 5-3) to just 2 of 9 on third downs and forced a pair of turnovers while not committing any of its own.

Things looked good for W&M early when freshman linebacker Arman Jones recovered a fumble at the UR 19 caused by junior safety Richie DiPietro on the game's opening kickoff. However, W&M had to settle for a 37-yard field goal by redshirt freshman Kris Hooper.

A 5-yard touchdown run by Deontez Thompson and a 32-yard field goal by Griffin Trau gave UR a 10-3 advantage early in the second quarter before the teams traded field goals during the final minute of the opening half. W&M's came on a 24-yard kick by Hooper, while Ricky Segers connected on a 51-yard try as the second quarter clock expired.

In addition to limiting UR to just 55 total yards in the second half, W&M found the end zone with four of its five possessions during the final 30 minutes. The first touchdown came on a 5-yard pass from Cluley to Caskin in which the quarterback rolled to his left before throwing back to the right for the score early in the third quarter. A pair of short touchdown runs by Anderson increased the margin to 27-13 early in the fourth quarter before W&M sealed the victory with a 23-yard strike from Cluley to Caskin with 1:55 remaining.

Redshirt freshman Nate Atkins totaled a team-high six tackles for W&M, while junior cornerback Aaron Swinton returned an interception 27 yards to help set up Anderson's first touchdown run in the second half.

Thompson led UR with 144 yards on 19 carries with a touchdown, while starting quarterback Kyle Lauletta left the game with an injury late in the second quarter and finished the contest 7 of 11 for 107 yards. Richmond's other two quarterbacks - Reid Chenault and Jake Clise - combined to complete just 1 of 5 passes for 11 yards with an interception.

Series History

Saturday's game between William & Mary and Richmond will mark the 128th meeting between the two schools in what has been traditionally called the "Oldest Rivalry in the South" – but may more accurately be described as the most PLAYED rivalry in the south. The Tribe leads the all-time series 62-60-5. The teams first met in 1898, when Richmond blanked W&M, 15-0.

Only three other Division I series have a longer history than that of W&M vs. UR.

W&M-UR Recent History

Since the two teams started meeting as conference opponents in 1993, Richmond owns a 13-12 edge. During that stretch, UR owns a 7-6 edge in Richmond while the series is

tied, 6-6, in Williamsburg.

In the 25 total games the two have played as conference foes, which includes one playoff matchup in 2015, W&M has never scored fewer than seven points, while scoring at least 20 on 15 occasions. Conversely, the Spiders have failed to score 21 points 12 times, and have been held to less than 10 in three contests.

Since 1993, the two squads have only played seven games in the series decided by three points or less (William & Mary is 4-3 in such contests). Conversely, 17 of the games during the same span have been decided by double-digit margins (UR owns an 9-8 edge in such games).

Traditionally, A High Stakes Game

While not the case the past two seasons, the matchup between the two teams has traditionally been a high-stakes game.

Since W&M and UR met for the first time as league opponents (in the current league affiliation) in 1993, the game has been the difference for at least one team winning at least a share of the league title an amazing 10 times. The 2015 regular-season matchup was the 10th such contest when UR's win secured a share of the league title with W&M and JMU.

W&M has claimed wins in three of those games (1996, 2004, 2010), while UR won in (1998, 2000, 2005, 2007, 2009, 2012, 2015).

A Key to Victory

W&M's ability to run the ball successfully against Richmond has been a key to its last three victories in the series. In those games, the College has averaged 248.3 rushing yards per game (745 yards). Conversely, it has averaged just 72.8 rushing yards per game during its last 10 losses in the series (728 yards).

Familiar Faces

There will be three familiar face on the Richmond sidelines this Saturday, as UR head coach Russ Huesman, defensive coordinator Adam Braithwaite and recruiting coordinator Dave Legg all have ties to W&M.

Huesman worked as an assistant at W&M from 1985-97 and served as the defensive coordinator his final two seasons.

Braithwaite played defensive back at W&M from 1997-01 and later returned as an assistant during the 2004 season in which the Tribe advanced to the NCAA Semifinals.

Legg posted an extended run on the Tribe staff, as he worked with the team's outside linebackers from 1991-1994.

Did You Know?

A win by William & Mary on Saturday would give Tribe Head Coach Jimmie Laycock 23 career wins against the Spiders. The number would represent more than one third of the school's all-time win total in the 128-game series (63).

While Laycock has been a fixture on W&M's sidelines since the 1980 season, Richmond's first-year head coach Russ Huesman is the ninth different Spider head coach the Tribe has faced during Laycock's tenure.

Quality Opponents

W&M's first seven opponents in league play this season currently own a combined overall record of 48-20 and a league mark of 34-15.

Limiting Penalties

W&M currently ranks third nationally in fewest penalties per game (3.7) and in fewest penalty yards per game (34.6).

The Tribe has been whistled for just one penalty in three games this season, while it committed just two in a fourth contest.

The impressive figures continue a recent trend that has seen W&M consistently ranked among the top-10 nationally in fewest penalties per game and fewest penalty yards per game.

Stanford Game

W&M Director of Athletics Samantha K. Huge recently announced that the Tribe football team will travel to Stanford University in 2020 to take on the Cardinal. It will be the first meeting on the gridiron between the schools, which both have been playing football for more than a century.

The match-up will be the first football game that W&M has played in California, and the farthest west the team has traveled since playing at the University of Oklahoma in 1951. The game will also mark the first meeting between a current PAC-12 school and W&M and only the second meeting between Stanford and a school from the state of Virginia (Virginia Tech in the 2011 Orange Bowl).

True Freshmen

A school-record* five true freshmen have earned playing time this season - quarterback Shon Mitchell, running back Nate Evans, tight end Nick Muse, defensive tackle Will Kiely and punter Will Michael. Additionally, all five have started at least one game this season.

During the last four years, 13 true freshmen have played for the Tribe (2017 - 5; 2016 - 4; 2014 - 4).

Importance of Getting Ahead

The three losses came against Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

Winning at Zable Stadium

Despite going 1-4 at home this season, W&M has posted a 19-9 record at Zable Stadium since the start of the 2013 season, which represents a 67.9 winning percentage.

W&M's recent undefeated regular-season home records came in 2015, 2010, 2009 & 2004.

SOLD OUT

W&M's Homecoming game against James Madison on Oct. 21 was the program's first sellout at the renovated Zable Stadium (13,125).

Historical Success in Close Games

Since taking over the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmye Laycock's squads have played in 69 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced success in those contests, totaling an impressive 37-30-2 record.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.

One Tribe, One Family

The W&M athletic department's unofficial slogan - "One Tribe, One Family" - is especially true for the Tribe football team, as the roster features a pair of brother tandems - Josh/Justin Dulaney and Collin/Corey Parker.

W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during six of the last seven seasons - Jonathan Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013), John Carpenter (2014) and DeVonte Dedmon (2015).

National Preseason Honor

Having established himself as one of the nation's elite offensive linemen throughout his career, W&M senior left tackle Chris Durant was selected to the STATS FCS Preseason All-America Third Team this summer.

A two-time All-CAA honoree and four-year starter at left tackle, Durant also earned 2017 preseason All-CAA distinction.

Durant's standout play has helped W&M produce a 1,000-yard rusher during each of the last three seasons. Additionally, the Tribe allowed the league's fewest sacks per game (1.08) and led the nation in fewest tackles for a loss allowed per game (3.46) in 2015.

Preseason All-CAA

In addition to Durant's selection on the preseason All-CAA team, senior wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon also garnered the distinction.

One of the nation's most electric playmakers as both a wide receiver and a return specialist, Dedmon entered his senior season as an All-America candidate at both positions. A two-time All-CAA selection at wideout and former CAA Special Teams Player of the Year (2015), Dedmon ranked among the league's top 10 in five statistical categories last fall despite being limited for much of the season by injury.



W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009 leads the CAA and ranks second among all FCS programs. Additionally, it ranks behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech in the state of Virginia.

Webb (Bears). Additionally, two other former players were on NFL rosters last season - Jerome Couplin III (Rams) and Sean Lissimore (Chargers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Since 2011, W&M's ability to run the ball well has been indicative of its overall success. The Tribe has averaged 197.7 rushing yards per game in its 37 wins (7,314) rushing yards), while it has averaged just 130.9 yards per game on the ground in its 42 losses (5,496 rushing yards).

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 76 times and posted a 71-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 25-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013. Interestingly, two of those losses have come in the last two weeks.

Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns a 7-19 mark in such contests.

New Coordinator

After three highly successful seasons as W&M's running backs coach, DJ Mangas was promoted to the Tribe's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach in May.

One of the nation's top young coaches, Mangas (28) was the second-youngest offensive coordinator in Division I (FBS & FCS) at the time of his promotion.

In addition to producing a 1,000-yard rusher during each of the last three seasons, Tribe running backs earned all-conference distinction all three years - highlighted by first-team selections in 2014 and 2015.

Team Defensive Notes

Defensive Success

W&M is holding opponents to just 322.9 total yards per game, a figure that ranks 24th nationally. Additionally, W&M has allowed just one opponent to record more than 400 yards of total offense.

Sacking the Opposition

W&M has been tremendously successful getting to opposing teams' quarterbacks this fall and currently ranks 19th nationally in sacks per game (3.0).

The impressive numbers represent a reversal of last year's squad that posted just 10.0 sacks during the entire season.

Third Down Stops

During the last eight contests, W&M's defense has held the opposition to just 45 of 132 on third downs (34.1).

The Tribe currently ranks 15th nationally in first down defense (161).

Second Half Excellence vs. CAA

CAA opponents are averaging just 126.4 total yards during the second half of games against W&M (885 total yds).

Limiting Big Runs

W&M has allowed just one rush for more than 30 yards this season, which came against Norfolk State.

Shutting Down the Pass

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 126 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just eight times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

Tough to Score Through the Air

Since the start of the last season, a span of 20 games, just four opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M. The only opponents to accomplish the feat this season are Virginia and New Hampshire.

Youth in the Front Seven

Although W&M returns a pair of senior starters on its defensive line from 2016, the Tribe's front seven features 10 freshmen and sophomores on its Week 9 two-deep.

Consistency at MLB

A total of just five players have accounted for 126 of 129 starts at MLB during the past 11 seasons. Sophomore standout Nate Atkins added his name to that list last fall.

Defensive/Special Teams Scores

With Corey Parker's 19-yard fumble return for a touchdown in the win against Bucknell, W&M has now posted a defensive or special teams touchdown during 10 of the last 11 seasons.

Although it has not recorded a pick-six yet this fall, W&M entered the 2017 campaign having returned an interception for a touchdown in four straight seasons - and seven of the last eight.

Dating back to the 2007 season, the Tribe's defense and special teams have generated 241 points (33 touchdowns / three safeties / two PAT returns).

Less Than 40

W&M has allowed just five opponents to score more than 40 points during the last 55 games (James Madison, 41 in 2015 & 46 in 2017; Duquesne, 49 in 2015; Richmond, 48 in 2015; NC State, 48 in 2016).

Impressive Efforts

Since the start of the 2011 season, W&M has held opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense in more than 31.3 percent of its games (25 times in 80 games). The Tribe has posted a 20-5 record in those contests, with its only losses coming vs. Towson (2017), at Delaware (2017), vs. Elon (2016) at Maryland (2012) and at Rhode Island (2011).

Dating back to last season, W&M has held six of its last 12 opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense.

Tough Defense at Zable

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.0 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 49 games (883 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 33-16 record at home during that span.

Shutout History

The Tribe has posted 15 shutouts during the Laycock era, with more than a third of them (six) having come since 2009.

William & Mary Head Coach Jimmyle Laycock

38th Season

Career Record: 245-188-2 (.565)

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than William & Mary has with Jimmyle Laycock. In a tenure that will stretch into its 38th season this fall, Laycock has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Laycock is the nation's longest tenured Division I head coach at his current school and entered the 2017 season ranked second in wins among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches with 243 victories. Laycock also ranked second all-time among conference head coaches in league wins (109) entering this fall, while the Tribe has appeared in 19 postseason contests and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals twice under his direction.

The success has led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$28 Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed this summer. The rejuvenated stadium, which includes and upper deck, luxury suites and a spacious state-of-the-art press box, provides an enhanced game day experience for both student-athletes as well as Tribe alumni and supporters.

On June 21, 2008, the College dedicated the \$11 million Jimmyle Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides W&M with one of the finest facilities in the FCS.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 123-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement.

When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the College would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 37 seasons.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With eight all-league recognitions in 2016, the Tribe has produced an astounding 248 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011.

Since 2009, W&M has produced six NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech).

The Tribe is well represented in the pro ranks, as eight former Tribe players were on NFL rosters during the last year: Jerome Couplin III (Los Angeles Rams), Jonathan Grimes (Jacksonville Jaguars), DeAndre Houston-Carson (Chicago Bears), Sean Lismore (San Diego Chargers), Tre McBride (Tennessee Titans), Luke Rhodes (Indianapolis Colts), Jerry Ugokwe (New Orleans Saints) and B.W. Webb (Chicago Bears).

In addition to the draft picks, 12 additional Tribe players have signed free agent contracts after their senior season since the conclusion of the 2004: Lang Campbell (2005, Cleveland Browns), Dominique Thomspon (2005, St. Louis Rams), Adam O'Connor (2007, Carolina Panthers), Drew Atchison (2008, Dallas Cowboys), Mike Potts (2008, Pittsburgh Steelers), Jonathan Grimes (2011, Houston Texans), Alex Gottlieb (2011, Detroit Lions), Jerome Couplin III (2014, Detroit Lions), Jasper Coleman (2015, Houston Texans), Mike Reilly (2015, Cleveland Browns), Luke Rhodes (2016, Tampa Bay Buccaneers) and Jerry Ugokwe (Indianapolis Colts).

In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) was hired as the Buffalo Bills head coach in January, 2017, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and previously held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, Michael Clemons ('87) was one of the CFL's most explosive players after a brief stint in the NFL and currently holds the position of Vice Chair for the Toronto Argonauts.

As a 1970 graduate of the College, Laycock played football under two legends of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco 49ers.

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deirdre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at the College. They have three children: Michael, a Captain in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a recent graduate of Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail and Nolan.

Charlottesville, Va. - The William & Mary football team opened the 2017 season with a 28-10 setback at Virginia on Sept. 2.

Although W&M outgained UVA in the second half, 172-138, it was unable to overcome a 14-0 halftime deficit.

The Tribe narrowed the gap to 21-10 and had possession of the ball midway through the fourth quarter, but a turnover deep in its own territory ended the late comeback bid.

Although W&M outgained UVA on the ground (168-92), the Cavaliers threw for 262 yards and outgained the Tribe, 354-240. Additionally, W&M was just 1 of 11 on third down, while UVA converted half its third downs (9-18).

Junior quarterback Tommy McKee, who made his first career start, finished as W&M's leading rusher with 89 yards on 15 carries and a touchdown, while redshirt freshman tailback Noah Giles posted 54 yards on 11 carries.

Sophomore safety Corey Parker (13, TFL), sophomore linebacker Nate Atkins (12, sack, FF) and junior linebacker Josh Dulaney (10, 1.5 TFL) all posted double-digit tackle totals. Sophomore linebacker Arman Jones also came up big with eight stops and a sack.

Sophomore kicker Kris Hooper made his only field goal attempt, as his 41-yard kick early in the third quarter nearly matched his career long (42).

Virginia quarterback Kurt Benkert completed 27 of 39 passes for 262 yards with three touchdowns, while Olamide Zaccheaus (5-56), Andre Levrone (2-56) and Jordan Ellis (2-11) all hauled in touchdown catches. Doni Dowling was the Cavaliers' leading receiver (6-76), while Ellis rushed for a team-high 80 yards on 20 carries with a score.

Malcolm Cook led UVA defensively with 13 tackles and a sack, while Quin Blanding (12) and Juan Thornhill (10) also posted double-digit sack totals.

W&M Shuts Down Norfolk State, 20-6

Norfolk, Va. - Junior quarterback Tommy McKee threw three touchdown passes and rushed for a game-high 114 yards to help lead the William & Mary football team to a 20-6 victory at Norfolk State on Sept. 9, 2017.

Although NSU (0-2) took an early 3-0 lead with a 19-yard field goal by Josh Nardone midway through the second quarter, W&M (1-1) responded with three unanswered touchdowns to pull away for the victory. The Spartans' only other score came on a 37-yard field goal by Nardone midway through the third quarter.

In addition to keeping NSU out of the end zone, the Tribe's defense allowed just 273 total yards and posted 5.0 sacks and 10.0 tackles for a loss.

En route to throwing three scoring strikes, McKee completed 16 of 27 passes for 169 yards, while his 114 rushing yards came on just 14 carries. Senior wide receiver Daniel Kuzjak (6 rec., 53 yds), redshirt freshman fullback Tyler Crist (2 rec., 35 yds) and senior tight end Andrew Caskin (2 rec, 32 yds) all hauled in one touchdown catch apiece.

Defensively, sophomore linebacker Arman Jones totaled a team-high seven tackles with 0.5 TFL, while junior linebacker Joshua Dulaney posted five stops, 3.0 TFL and a sack. Senior defensive end Matt Ahola (1.5 sacks) and senior defensive tackle Isaiah Stephens (1.0 sack) also registered sacks.

Excluding a few big plays (four of NSU's plays accounted for 149 yards of its total offense), the Tribe's defense was dominant for much of the night. In addition to holding the Spartans without a touchdown, W&M limited the Spartans to just 273 total yards (101 rushing / 172 passing) and 12 first downs. Additionally, the Tribe held NSU to just 3 of 13 on third downs.

W&M was balanced offensively and piled up 206 rushing yards to go with 169 yards through the air. Four different Tribe players rushed for at least 20 yards, while eight different players recorded at least one catch.

Aaron Savage posted a team-high 79 rushing yards on eight carries, as 40 of those yards came on a single run. Isaiah Winstead (4-55) and George Wahee (4-45) both totaled four catches apiece, while quarterback Juwan Carter finished the evening 11 of 19 for 160 yards.

Defensively, Kyle Archie totaled a game-high 14 tackles to lead the Spartans.

Williamsburg, Va. - The William & Mary football team concluded its non-conference slate with a 30-9 victory against Bucknell in its home opener at Zable Stadium on Saturday evening.

Although the Tribe (2-1) led by just a point at halftime, 10-9, it posted three unanswered touchdowns during the third quarter en route to pulling away for the lopsided victory.

W&M was dominant defensively during the final 30 minutes, as it held the Bison (1-2) scoreless and allowed just 42 total yards. Additionally, one of the Tribe's three second half touchdowns came on a defensive play when sophomore safety Corey Parker scooped up a fumble caused by sophomore linebacker Nate Atkins and returned it 19 yards for a touchdown.

In addition to allowing just 226 total yards, including just 23 on the ground, the Tribe's defense posted 6.0 sacks and 9.0 TFL.

Freshman running back Nate Evans rushed for a game-high 89 yards on 18 carries with a touchdown, while redshirt freshman running back Noah Giles also found the end zone on the ground and finished with 31 yards on eight carries. Both touchdowns were the first of their careers.

Junior quarterback Tommy McKee provided W&M's other offensive score with a 4-yard touchdown pass to redshirt freshman fullback Tyler Crist late in the third quarter and completed 12 of 17 passes for 105 yards. The Virginia Beach, Va., native was especially effective during the second half when he completed 7 of 8 passes for 65 yards and the touchdown.

Atkins and junior linebacker Josh Dulaney both posted seven tackles apiece with sacks, while Atkins forced fumble midway through the third quarter led to Parker's defensive score. Also recording sacks were senior defensive tackle Isaiah Stephens, senior defensive tackle Bill Murray, senior defensive end Matt Ahola and freshman defensive tackle Will Kiely. Murray also added a blocked extra-point, the second of his career.

Sophomore Jalen Christian came up big on special teams and recorded a 48-yard punt return and a 33-yard kickoff return.

In addition to outscoring Bucknell in the second half, 20-0, W&M outgained the Bison in the second half, 160-42, and finished the contest with a 281-226 advantage in total yards. The Tribe was especially dominant on the ground, 176-23.

W&M held BU to just 5 of 16 on third downs and stopped the Bison on both its fourth down conversion attempts.

Bucknell quarterback Matt Muh completed 15 of 20 passes for 155 yards with a touchdown, while Jack Horan posted a game-high seven catches for 69 yards. Joey DeFloria led the ground attack and rushed for 62 yards on 18 carries.

Trailing 21-0 late in the third quarter, the Tribe began its comeback bid with a 34-yard field goal by sophomore Kris Hooper with 4:36 showing in the third frame. A pair of fourth quarter touchdowns, coming on a 3-yard run by freshman tailback Nate Evans with 11:12 left and a 21-yard strike from junior quarterback Tommy McKee to sophomore wideout Chris Conlan with 7:54 remaining, helped W&M draw within a field goal. Conlan's touchdown was followed by a successful 2-point conversion on a pass from junior wide receiver Isaiah Kinder to McKee.

W&M's final drive was one of two offensive possessions in the waning minutes, as it also took over at its own 30-yard line with 3:44 left but turned it over with an interception on the first play of the series.

Evans recorded a career-high 162 all-purpose yards, as he finished with 82 rushing yards on 14 carries and a touchdown to go with a team-high five catches for 80 yards.

Sophomore linebacker Arman Jones totaled a team-high nine tackles with 2.0 TFL, while sophomore linebacker Nate Atkins matched Jones' tackle total and recovered a fumble. Senior defensive tackle Isaiah Stephens posted a sack and 2.0 TFL, while sophomore defensive tackle Bill Murray tallied a sack, forced fumble and fumble recovery – all of which came on the same play.

Although W&M recorded more first downs than SBU (20-18), the Seawolves outgained the Tribe, 382-300, and held a significant advantage on the ground, 200-88. W&M entered the game allowing just 72.0 rushing yards per game, which ranked 10th nationally.

The Seawolves were penalized nine times for 97 yards, all of which came during the second half.

Both teams committed two turnovers apiece, as SBU lost a pair of fumbles while W&M was intercepted twice.

Tailback Stacey Bedell rushed for 104 yards on 21 carries with a touchdown, while tailback Donald Liotine rushed for 42 yards on 11 carries with a score.

Quarterback Joe Carbone completed 12-of-17 passes for 182 yards, which included a 61-yard touchdown pass to Liotine.

Defensively, John Haggart posted seven tackles and 3.0 sacks.

Tribe's Comeback Bid Falls Short at Elon, 25-17

Elon, N.C. - The William & Mary football team nearly rallied back from a 20-point second half deficit but fell at No. 18/23 Elon, 25-17, on Oct. 7, 2017.

Although W&M (2-3, 0-2) trailed 23-3 at halftime, it outscored the Phoenix (5-1, 3-0) 14-0 during the third quarter to draw within six points as the teams entered the final stanza.

However, the Tribe's final scoring threat ended late in the fourth quarter when its offense stalled at Elon's 13-yard line and was forced to attempt a field goal, which missed wide left with 4:26 remaining.

The Tribe's next possession ended with a safety, while its final drive concluded near midfield when the clock expired on a sack.

Freshman running back Nate Evans posted his third consecutive impressive effort and totaled 77 yards on 19 carries with a touchdown, which came with 1:06 left in the third quarter and cut the margin to just six points. It marked the third straight game in which he has rushed for a touchdown.

Sophomore quarterback Brandon Battle saw his first significant game action and completed 11-of-21 passes for 155 yards with his first career touchdown pass, which he threw to sophomore tight end Riley Wilson with 4:17 left in the third quarter. The score was Riley's first career catch. Junior wideout Isaiah Kinder led all W&M receivers with four catches for 61 yards.

Defensively, junior linebacker Josh Dulaney totaled eight tackles, a sack and 2.5 TFL, while sophomore defensive end Gavin Johnson posted 1.5 sacks and 2.5 TFL to go with his five tackles. Sophomore safety Isaiah Laster also came up big with an interception, while sophomore linebacker Nate Atkins finished with a team-high nine stops.

Although W&M allowed no offensive points in the second half and outgained the Phoenix, 180-63, during the final 30 minutes, Elon outgained the Tribe, 319-271.

W&M's defense held Elon to just 12 first downs and limited the Phoenix to 4 of 14 on third down situations. The Tribe limited EU to just two first downs in the second half.

However, Elon scored on all four of its trips into the red zone – three of which ended with touchdowns.

Additionally, the Phoenix defense posted 7.0 sacks and 10.0 TFL.

Elon tailback Malcolm Summers rushed for 81 yards on 17 carries with two touchdowns, while quarterback Davis Cheek also found the end zone on the ground. Davis also completed 12 of 16 passes for 179 yards.

Kortez Weeks accounted for half of Elon's receptions with six catches for 66 yards.

Defensively, Elon's T.J. Speight totaled a game-high 10 tackles, while Marcus Willoughby and Dondre Howell both posted 2.0 sacks apiece.

Tribe Falls to No. 1 JMU, 46-14, on Homecoming

Williamsburg, Va. - The William & Mary football team outgained top-ranked James Madison by more than 100 yards in the second half but fell to the defending national champions, 46-14, in front of a sold-out Homecoming crowd (13,125) at Zable Stadium on Oct. 21, 2017.

W&M (2-5, 0-4) scored a pair of touchdowns in the fourth quarter - coming on a 33-yard pass from quarterback Tommy McKee to wideout Jordan Lowery and on a 66-yard run by tailback Noah Giles - but was unable to overcome a 43-0 deficit.

JMU (7-0, 4-0) capitalized off six W&M turnovers and converted the Tribe's miscues into 33 points.

In addition to his 66-yard touchdown scamper, Giles posted a game-high and career-best 74 yards on three carries to lead the Tribe offensively.

Linebacker Nate Atkins totaled a team-high 12 tackles with a TFL, while safety Mike Barta posted nine stops, a TFL and an interception in the end zone to stop a JMU drive. W&M's other interception came by cornerback Aaron Swinton and also came in the end zone to halt a scoring opportunity by the Dukes.

Defensive tackle Will Kiely also came up big with seven tackles, a sack and 2.0 TFL, while defensive end Matt Ahola posted six stops and 1.5 sacks.

Punter Will Michael posted one of his best performances of the season and averaged 44.3 yards per punt on his seven kicks and pinned the Dukes inside their own 20 twice.

Although JMU outgained the Tribe, 389-298, the Tribe posted a big second half and outgained the Dukes by more than 100 yards (245-143) in the final 30 minutes.

While W&M tallied a pair of interceptions, it threw four interceptions and lost a pair of fumbles.

JMU controlled the time of possession (33:21-26:39) and held W&M to just 3 of 13 on third downs.

The Tribe totaled 3.0 sacks with 8.0 TFL, while the Dukes posted 6.0 sacks and 8.0 TFL.

JMU tailback Marcus Marshall rushed for two touchdowns and totaled a team-high 64 yards on 11 carries.

Tribe Falls at Maine, 23-6

Orono, Maine - The William & Mary football team fell at Maine, 23-6, on Oct. 28, 2017.

W&M (2-6, 0-5) jumped out to a 3-0 lead on a 41-yard field goal by Kris Hooper early in the first quarter but was outscored 23-3 during the remainder of the contest.

The Tribe limited Maine (4-3, 3-3) to just 342 total yards of offense but managed 199 yards of its own and converted on just one of its three trips into the red zone.

W&M trailed by just a touchdown, 13-6, entering the fourth quarter after Hooper connected on a 25-yard field goal late in the third stanza, but UM closed the game with 10 unanswered points. Tailback Josh Mack provided the first score on a 2-yard touchdown run with 13:43 showing, while Brandon Briggs connected on his third field goal of the game – a 23-yard kick – with 8:13 remaining.

Safety Corey Parker led the Tribe defensively with a team-high 12 tackles, while defensive tackle Bill Murray posted seven stops, 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble.

Defensive end Gavin Johnson also posted a half sack with 1.5 TFL, while defensive end Matt Ahola registered a half sack.

Although Maine narrowly outgained W&M on the ground (150-142), the Black Bears held a 192-57 advantage through the air.

While UM was 5 of 16 on third down, the Tribe converted on just 3 of its 16 third downs.

Both teams were heavily penalized, as Maine (10-92) and W&M (8-95) were flagged for more than 90 yards.

Tribe Unable to Overcome Early Deficit vs. No. 21/19 UNH

Williamsburg, Va. - The William & Mary football team was unable to overcome an early deficit against No. 21/19 New Hampshire and suffered a 35-16 setback at Zable Stadium on Nov. 4.

The Wildcats (6-3, 4-2) jumped out to a 14-0 lead early in the second quarter on a pair of touchdown passes by quarterback Trevor Knight and never relinquished the lead.

W&M (2-7, 0-6) briefly narrowed the margin to just a touchdown on a 2-yard scoring scamper by quarterback Tommy McKee with 11:47 left in the second quarter, but UNH responded by scoring 21 of the next 24 points to pull away for the victory.

New Hampshire outgained the Tribe, 511-379, and piled up 406 yards through the air.

Five of UNH's 10 possessions ended with touchdowns, while the Wildcats punted just once.

Quarterback Tommy McKee led the Tribe offensively and completed 28 of 44 passes for a career-high 272 yards, while he rushed for 79 yards on 13 carries with a pair of touchdowns.

Tight end Andrew Caskin recorded a team-high five catches for 43 yards, while wideout Daniel Kuzjak (4-46), wideout Jack Armstrong (4-41) and tailback Nate Evans (4-16) all posted four catches apiece.

Linebacker Nate Atkins led W&M defensively with a game-high 11 tackles, while safety Corey Parker and linebacker Josh Dulaney posted nine stops apiece.

New Hampshire scored touchdowns with all four of its trips into the red zone and converted 8 of 13 third downs. W&M was also effective on third downs (7 of 12) but scored just one touchdown on its three trips inside the UNH 20-yard line.

Although W&M outgained the Wildcats on the ground (107-105) and limited UNH to just 2.8 yards per carry, New Hampshire held a 406-272 advantage through the air.

The matchup featured just one turnover, which came on an interception thrown by McKee on the opening drive of the second half at the UNH 34 with W&M trailing 21-10.

Knight completed 25 of 35 passes for 406 yards and four touchdowns, while wideout Neil O'Connor totaled seven catches for 193 yards and a touchdown. Wideout Kieran Presley, wideout Nick Lorden and running back Donal Goodrich all recorded touchdown catches, while tailback Evan Gray rushed for a team-high 55 yards on 15 carries with a score.

TU capitalized on pair of Tribe turnovers that created short fields and punt return for a score, as the Tigers' four touchdown drives combined to cover just 61 total yards.

W&M outgained TU, 316-238, and limited the Tigers to just 12 first downs.

Quarterback Tommy McKee accounted for both of W&M's scores, as he threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to tight end Nick Muse late in the first quarter and rushed for a touchdown on a 3-yard scamper midway through the second quarter.

Tailback Albert Funderburke rushed for a game-high 58 yards on 13 carries, while wideout Daniel Kuzjak totaled a team-best four catches for 47 yards.

Linebacker Nate Atkins totaled a team-high nine tackles, while linebacker Josh Dulaney and defensive tackle Isaiah Stephens both posted seven stops apiece. Dulaney added a sack, 1.5 TFL and a PBU while Stephens' stat line included a TFL and a half sack.

Defensive tackle Will Kiely also came up big with six tackles, 1.5 TFL and a half sack, while cornerback Aaron Swinton added an interception.

In addition to outgaining the Tigers by 78 yards, held the TU to just 98 yards on the ground and dominated the time of possession by nearly 10 minutes (34:25-25:35).
