INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

William & Mary and UAlbany will open their conference slates when they square off in Albany on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. The contest will mark just the second all-time meeting between the two programs and will be W&M's first trip to Casey Stadium.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M enters conference play with a 2-2 record after earning victories against Lafayette and Colgate and suffering setbacks against a pair of FBS opponents – Virginia and ECU. The Tribe has been successful offensively versus FCS opposition and is averaging 34.0 points per game in those contests. Additionally, W&M's defense has allowed just two touchdowns during the last two weeks and ranks tied for sixth in the nation with 10 forced turnovers. Defensive linemen Bill Murray and Carl Fowler have both totaled 2.5 sacks apiece, as W&M ranks among the nation's top 20 in sacks per game (2.75) and TFL per game (7.8).

SCOUTING THE GREAT DANES

After losing its season opener at Central Michigan, UAlbany has bounced back with wins in two of its last three games. The lone setback during the recent stretch came at Monmouth in overtime, 38-35. The Great Danes have been productive offensively and are averaging 34.2 points per game, while their defense ranks third in the CAA by allowing just 21.5 points per game. Karl Mofor leads UAlbany's rushing attack and ranks second in the conference with 100.5 yards per game on the ground, while wideout Jowan Green ranks second in the league with 102.0 receiving yards per game. Defensively, Levi Metheny and AJ Mistler rank tied for second in the CAA with 9.0 tackle per game.

ABOUT THE SERIES

Saturday's game will mark just the second meeting between W&M and UAlbany. The programs' first matchup came last year in Williamsburg, as the Tribe rallied back from a 12-point deficit with a pair of touchdowns late in the fourth quarter to earn a thrilling 25-22 victory at Zable Stadium.

■ W&M/UALBANY NOTES

LAST MEETING

W&M rallied back from a 12-point deficit with a pair of touchdowns late in the fourth quarter to earn a thrilling 25-22 victory against UAlbany at Zable Stadium on Oct. 6, 2018.

W&M QB Shon Mitchell scored the game-winning touchdown on a 6-yard run with just 50 seconds remaining. WR Isaiah Kinder put a punctuation on the exciting comeback when he connected on a short pass to Mitchell for the 2-point conversion that gave the Tribe a 25-22 lead with just 0:50 remaining.

UA advanced near midfield on its ensuing possession, but safety Corey Parker intercepted quarterback Vincent Testaverde at the W&M 22 and W&M ran out the final 10 seconds to preserve the conference victory.

■ TEAM NOTES

SIGN OF GOOD THINGS TO COME

A victory in its conference opener has traditionally proven to be a sign of good things to come for W&M. During the previous 26 seasons, W&M has averaged nearly nine wins (8.7) in the 10 years it has started the league slate with a victory (the Tribe's combined winning percentage for those 10 seasons is .702, 87-37). Additionally, W&M has won at least seven games during every season in which it started conference play with a victory. Six of the program's seven NCAA playoff appearances since 1993 have come in seasons that have started with a victory in conference play.

Conversely, in the 16 seasons W&M has lost its conference opener it has averaged 5.3 wins for a .472 winning percentage (84-94).

The 2010 season marked the only time during the stretch that W&M had lost its conference opener and won more than seven games.

TURNOVER MARGIN

W&M has been successful winning the turnover margin and currently ranks tied for third nationally with a +7 margin.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last two seasons, W&M is 5-1 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 0-6 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

SECOND HALF SUCCESS

W&M has thrived in the second half of games this season and is outscoring its opponents, 59-36, during the final 30 minutes of action.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M is undefeated when scoring more than 20 points during the last three seasons, as it has posted a 7-0 record in those contests.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 16 of its last 19 games when leading at halftime. The only setbacks have come against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018).

IMPORTANCE OF GETTING AHEAD

During the last two seasons, W&M is 5-1 when it scores first, while it is just 1-7 in games in which the opposition scored first.

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 24-11 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 12-26 when the opponent scores first.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 31-3 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

TRUE FRESHMAN

Nine true freshman have played for the Tribe this season: punter George Eberle, wide receiver Kane Everson, offensive lineman Bart Francois, long snapper Sam Katz, running back Donavyn Lester, defensive lineman Nate Lynn, quarterback Hollis Mathis, cornerback Latrelle Smith and safety Bronson Yoder.

WINNING AT HOME

In addition to owning a 2-0 record at home this season, W&M has won four of its last five contests at Zable Stadium dating back to last season.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

With the wins against Lafayette and Colgate, W&M has won 35 of its last 37 games against non-conference FCS opponent during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally it owns a 38-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

NEW ERA BEGINS

A new era of Tribe football is underway as first-year head coach Mike London leads W&M in 2019. A former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, London returns to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011). Additionally, he was honored as the 2008 AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year.

CHALLENGING SLATE

Playing its first 12-game regular season slate since 2014, W&M's schedule this fall features a number of challenging matchups. In addition to playing two FBS opponents (Virginia/ECU), W&M will square off against five teams nationally ranked in the preseason polls (James Madison, Maine, Towson, Elon, Colgate). This season marks the first time since 1991 that W&M's schedule will include two FBS opponents.

ONE TRIBE, ONE FAMILY

The W&M athletic department's unofficial slogan - "One Tribe, One Family" - is especially true for the Tribe football team, as the roster features a pair of brother tandems - Collin/Corey Parker and Andrew/Sam Trainer. Additionally, head coach Mike London's son, Mike London Jr. is the Tribe's wide receivers coach.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Leading the Tribe's 19-member senior class is a quartet of talented seniors - Nate Atkins (senior, LB), Bill Murray (senior, DT), Corey Parker (senior, DB) and Mark Williamson (senior, OL). Atkins enters his second season as a captain, becoming just the 12th player in the program's 126-year history to be selected as a team captain twice. In addition to their leadership, all four players have excelled on the field and earned all-conference honors at least once during their careers.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Four former Tribe standouts were in NFL training camps this summer - DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jaguars), Luke Rhodes (Colts) and B.W. Webb (Bengals).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

Below are a few notes about W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009.

- Leads the CAA and ranks second in the FCS, behind only Montana (7)
- Ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia Tech and Virginia)
- Is more than ACC member Duke (5)

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

30-POINT PERFORMANCES

W&M has scored at least 30 points in two of its first four games this season.

Prior to this year, the Tribe reached the 30-point mark just once during the last two seasons.

OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION

W&M has totaled more than 400 yards of total offense in two of its first four games this season.

Entering the fall, W&M had not eclipsed the 400-yard mark since 2016.

YARDS ON THE GROUND

W&M has rushed for more than 250 yards in two of its first four games.

Entering this season, the Tribe had eclipsed the 250-yard mark on the ground just once during the previous three seasons (vs. Norfolk State in 2016).

BIG PLAYS

W&M has posted seven plays longer than 30 yards - two on the ground (31, 41) and five through the air (32, 38, 39, 49, 49).

Last season, W&M produced just one run longer than 30 yards, while it posted just 14 total plays of at least 30 yards.

YARDS PER COMPLETION

W&M currently ranks 14th nationally with 15.5 yards per completion.

IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Three true freshmen found the end zone in the win against Colgate - Hollis Mathis (2-yd run), Donavyn Lester (2-yd run) and Bronson Yoder (93-yd kickoff return).

PROTECTING THE FOOTBALL

W&M has turned the ball over just four times this season.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 78 times and posted a 73-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 27-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 10-24 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

LIMITING TOUCHDOWNS

W&M has allowed a total of just two touchdowns during the last two games. The Tribe has been especially effective during the second halves of those contests, as it has not allowed a touchdown during the final 30 minutes of those games.

FORCING TURNOVERS

W&M's defense has generated 10 turnovers this season, which ranks tied for sixth in the nation.

The Tribe recorded 17 turnovers all of last season.

DEFENSIVE/SPECIAL TEAM TOUCHDOWNS

W&M has continued a recent trend of scoring with defense and special teams, as the Tribe has found the end zone twice with non-offensive touchdowns this season - Arman Jones' 47-yard pick-six at Virginia and Bronson Yoder's 93-yard kickoff return against Colgate.

W&M has recorded at least one defensive or special teams touchdown in 12 of the last 13 years.

SACKS

W&M has wrecked havoc on opposing teams' QB's this season and currently leads the CAA and ranks 20th nationally with 2.75 sacks per game.

STOPS BEHIND THE LINE

W&M has created disruption behind the line of scrimmage this season and currently leads the CAA and ranks 20th nationally in tackles for a loss per game (7.8).

BALANCE

Six different Tribe players have intercepted a pass this season. The last time more W&M players posted at least one interception in a season was 2015.

IMPRESSIVE EFFORT

W&M's defense allowed just 215 total yards in the win against Colgate, which marked the fewest allowed by the Tribe since the contest at Delaware in 2017.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 36 games, just six opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 139 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just eight times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 17.9 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 55 games (985 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 37-18 record at home during that span.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returns to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

"This is an exciting day for William & Mary, and we are thrilled to welcome Mike and his family back to Williamsburg," W&M Director of Athletics Samantha K. Huge said at the time of London hiring in November. "Mike embodies the values and character that we need to lead our football program forward and he has demonstrated an ability to develop players and win championships over his nearly 30 years in coaching. His unique journey and commitment to the development of young men make him the perfect successor to carry on Coach Jimmye Laycock's 39-year legacy while forging a new path for Tribe Football."

Howard University's head coach the last two seasons, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed

just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmye Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983.

London graduated from UR in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later earned a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy. He served as a detective from 1985-87.

London and his wife, Regina, have four children: daughters Ticynn, Jaicyn and Madicyn and son Korben. He has three children from a previous marriage: sons Michael Jr. and Brandon, and daughter Kristen.
