INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

William & Mary will look to reclaim the Capital Cup when concludes its 2019 slate at Richmond on Saturday at noon. The game will be televised locally on WTKR-3 (Norfolk) and WTVR-6 (Richmond), while a video stream will be available at FloFootball.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M had its two-game winning streak snapped with a 31-10 setback against Towson in its final home game last Saturday and enters the weekend with a 4-7 record overall and a 2-5 mark in conference play. Offensively, the Tribe has rushed the ball well and currently ranks third in the CAA with 190.5 rushing yards per game. Additionally, the Tribe needs just two more rushing touchdowns and 247 more rushing yards to break into the school's single-season top-10 lists. Defensively, W&M has posted 25 sacks this season, which is more than double its total (11) from last season.

SCOUTING THE SPIDERS

After winning four of five games during a recent stretch, Richmond enters Senior Day having lost its last two contests and owns a 5-6 overall record and a 4-3 mark in league play. Although the Spiders lead the league in passing defense (201.6), they rank 10th in the conference in scoring offense (23.6). Quarterback Joe Mancuso has provided much of UR's offensive production, as he is averaging 168.9 yards per game through the air and leads the team in rushing with 58.9 yards per game. Wideout Keyston Fuller has also come up big with 10 touchdown catches.

ABOUT THE SERIES

Saturday's game between William & Mary and Richmond will mark the 130th meeting between the two schools in what has been traditionally called the "Oldest Rivalry in the South" – but may be more accurately described as the most PLAYED rivalry in the South. The all-time series is tied, 62-62-5. The teams first met in 1898, when Richmond blanked W&M, 15-0.

■ W&M/RICHMOND NOTES

LAST MEETING

W&M fell to Richmond, 10-6, in the 2018 season finale at Zable Stadium.

A 35-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Shon Mitchell to wideout DeVonte Dedmon narrowed the margin to 10-6 with 0:47 remaining in the fourth quarter, but W&M missed the PAT and was unable to recover the ensuing onside kick.

Defensive tackle Bill Murray led the Tribe defensively with seven tackles, a forced fumble, a sack and 3.0 TFL.

Richmond won the turnover battle, as it forced three Tribe turnovers and committed none of its own.

Additionally, the Spiders converted points on both its trips into the red zone, while W&M came up empty during its pair of opportunities inside the 20.

W&M-UR RECENT HISTORY

Since the two teams started meeting as conference opponents in 1993, Richmond owns a 15-12 edge. During that stretch, UR owns an 8-6 edge in Richmond and a 7-6 edge in Williamsburg.

Since 1993, the two squads have only played seven games decided by three points or less (W&M is 4-3 in such contests). Conversely, 17 of the games during the same span have been decided by double-digit margins (UR owns an 9-8 edge in such games).

A KEY TO VICTORY

W&M's ability to run the ball successfully against Richmond has been a key to its last three victories in the series. In those games, the Tribe has averaged 248.3 rushing yards per game (745 yards). Conversely, it has averaged just 81.2 rushing yards per game during its last 12 losses in the series (974 yards).

W&M-UR CONNECTIONS

In addition to winning a national championship as head coach at Richmond in 2008, W&M Head Coach Mike London was also a standout defensive back for the Spiders (1979-82) and served as a team captain as a senior. Additionally, he spent two stints as an assistant at UR.

W&M Associate Head Coach, Defensive Coordinator, Vince Brown, coached linebackers at Richmond for both seasons (2008-09) that London served as the Spiders' head coach.

On the UR sidelines, Head Coach Russ Huesman, defensive coordinator Adam Braithwaite and recruiting coordinator Dave Legg all have ties to W&M.

Huesman worked as an assistant at W&M from 1985-97 and served as the defensive coordinator his final two seasons.

Braithwaite played defensive back at W&M from 1997-01 and later returned as an assistant during the 2004 season in which the Tribe advanced to the NCAA Semifinals.

Legg posted an extended run on the Tribe staff, as he worked with the team's outside linebackers from 1991-1994.

SENIOR SALUTE

Twenty-seven W&M players will suit up for the Tribe one last time at Richmond on Saturday. BLOCKING KICKS

With four blocks in the last four games - two punts and two PAT - W&M now has five blocks this season and ranks seventh nationally.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last two seasons, W&M is 6-1 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 0-9 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

The Tribe forced four turnovers in the win against Rhode Island two weeks ago, matching a season high that it had totaled twice earlier this season.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 9-3 record during the last three seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points. All three losses have come in conference play this season (UAlbany, Villanova, Maine).

EARLY LEADS

W&M has scored first in eight of its 11 games this season, with the lone exceptions coming against its two FBS opponents - Virginia and East Carolina - and versus Towson last week.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 17 of its last 21 games when leading at halftime.

Three of those setbacks came against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018), while the other was at UAlbany (2019).

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 33-4 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against UAlbany, 2019; Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

RECOVERING ONSIDE KICKS

W&M has recovered a pair of its onside kick attempts this season, both coming off the foot of Kris Hooper. Alex Purviance recovered the first at UAlbany, while Kevin Jarrell scooped up the loose ball at Maine.

VERSATILITY

The Tribe has utilized the versatility of multiple players this year, as Bronson Yoder and Tyler Crist have played on both sides of the ball, as well as on special teams. Yoder, one of the nation's top kickoff returners, has also played safety, running back and wide receiver, while Crist has played running back and linebacker.

TRUE FRESHMEN

Eleven true freshmen have played for the Tribe this season: punter George Eberle, wide receiver Kane Everson, offensive lineman Bart Francois, long snapper Sam Katz, running back Donavyn Lester, defensive lineman Nate Lynn, quarterback Hollis Mathis, cornerback Latrelle Smith, wide receiver/safety Bronson Yoder, safety Marcus Barnes and linebacker Brayden Staib.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

With the wins against Lafayette and Colgate, W&M has won 35 of its last 37 games against non-conference FCS opponent during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally it owns a 38-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

RECORD-SETTING GAME

W&M's five-overtime victory at Elon marked the most extra sessions played in school history, as the Tribe has never played more than two overtimes.

Additionally, it marked the most overtime sessions played by an FCS team this year and is just one short of the NCAA record for an all-FCS matchup.

NEW ERA BEGINS

A new era of Tribe football is underway as first-year head coach Mike London leads W&M in 2019.

A former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, London returns to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011). Additionally, he was honored as the 2008 AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year.

CHALLENGING SLATE

Playing its first 12-game regular season slate since 2014, W&M's schedule this fall features a number of challenging matchups. In addition to playing two FBS opponents (Virginia/ECU), W&M squares off against five teams nationally ranked in the preseason polls (James Madison, Maine, Towson, Elon, Colgate). This season marks the first time since 1991 that W&M's schedule will include two FBS opponents.

ONE TRIBE

W&M's roster features a pair of brother tandems - Collin/Corey Parker and Andrew/Sam Trainer. Additionally, head coach Mike London's son, Mike London Jr. is the Tribe's wide receivers coach.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Leading the Tribe's 19-member senior class is a quartet of talented seniors - Nate Atkins (senior, LB), Bill Murray (senior, DT), Corey Parker (senior, DB) and Mark Williamson (senior, OL). Atkins enters his second season as a captain, becoming just the 12th player in the program's 126-year history to be selected as a team captain twice. In addition to their leadership, all four players have excelled on the field and earned all-conference honors at least once during their careers.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Four former Tribe standouts were in NFL training camps this summer - DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jaguars), Luke Rhodes (Colts) and B.W. Webb (Bengals).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

Below are a few notes about W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009.

- Leads the CAA and ranks second in the FCS, behind only Montana (7)
- Ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia Tech and Virginia)
- Is more than ACC member Duke (5)

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES**RUSHING TOWARDS SUCCESS**

W&M has posted one of its best seasons rushing in the program's 126-year history. The Tribe needs just two more rushing touchdowns and 247 more rushing yards to break into the school's single-season top-10 lists.

PUTTING UP POINTS

W&M enters its final contest at Richmond averaging 25.6 points per game, which is the program's best mark since 2015. Additionally, the average ranks as the second-best figure in the last 10 seasons.

TRENDING UPWARDS

In addition to averaging nearly twice as many points per game than from a season ago (25.6 / 13.6), W&M has dramatically increased its averages for total yards per game (348.6 / 241.5) and rushing yards per game (190.5 / 55.3) compared to last year.

RECORD-SETTING PERFORMANCE

W&M rushed for a school-record 462 yards in its 55-19 victory against Rhode Island two weeks ago. It broke the previous mark of 453 that was set against Ohio Wesleyan in 1970.

In addition to the effort on the ground, which included seven rushing touchdowns - the program's best effort since scoring seven against VMI in 1993 - W&M's 55 points were the most since scoring 63 at VMI in 2007. Additionally, its 580 total yards were the most since tallying 616 versus Richmond in 2010.

The Tribe averaged 7.8 yards per carry and 8.3 yards per play in the win against the Rams.

DYNAMIC DUO

En route to setting a school record rushing total in the win against Rhode Island, W&M had two players rush for more than 100 yards - Bronson Yoder (144) and Owen Wright (123). It marked the first time W&M has had a pair of 100-yard rushers in the same game since 1995 when Troy Keen (158) and Derek Fitzgerald (140) also accomplished the feat against URI.

YARDS ON THE GROUND

The Tribe has rushed for more than 200 yards five times this season. Entering the 2019 campaign, W&M had eclipsed the 200-yard mark on the ground just four times during the previous three seasons.

30-POINT PERFORMANCES

W&M has scored at least 30 points in five games this season. Prior to this year, the Tribe reached the 30-point mark just once during the last two seasons.

OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION

W&M has totaled more than 400 yards of total offense four times this season. Entering the fall, W&M had not eclipsed the 400-yard mark since 2016.

BIG PLAYS

W&M has posted 21 plays longer than 30 yards - eight on the ground (30, 31, 32, 41, 52, 54, 59, 73) and 13 through the air (32, 32, 34, 38, 39, 41, 43, 46, 49, 49, 58, 62, 83).

Last season, W&M produced just one run longer than 30 yards, while it posted just 14 total plays of at least 30 yards.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 80 times and posted a 75-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 29-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 10-26 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES**SACKS**

With 25 sacks this fall, W&M has more than doubled its total from last season (11).

STOPS BEHIND THE LINE

W&M is averaging 7.8 TFL per game during the last four contests.

FORCING TURNOVERS

W&M matched a season high by forcing four turnovers in the win against Rhode Island two weeks ago. The Tribe also generated four turnovers in games against Lafayette and Virginia earlier this season.

DEFENSIVE/SPECIAL TEAMS TOUCHDOWNS

W&M has continued a recent trend of scoring with defense and special teams, as the Tribe has found the end zone four times with non-offensive touchdowns this season - Tyler Crist's fumble return (15 yds), Arman Jones' pick-six at UVA (47 yds) and Bronson Yoder's kickoff returns against Colgate (93 yds) and UAlbany (98 yds.).

W&M has recorded at least one defensive or special teams touchdown in 12 of the last 13 years.

BALANCE

Six different Tribe players have intercepted a pass this season. The last time more W&M players posted at least one interception in a season was 2015.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 43 games, just 13 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 146 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 10 times.

BREAKING UP PASSES

W&M totaled 11 PBU's in the conference opener at UAlbany, marking the team's highest total since the win at Penn in 2012 when it also recorded 11 breakups.

The Tribe nearly matched that total when it posted 10 PBU in the win against Rhode Island.

IMPRESSIVE EFFORT

W&M's defense allowed just 215 total yards in the win against Colgate, which marked the fewest allowed by the Tribe since the contest at Delaware in 2017.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.8 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

Tremendously successful and widely respected, Mike London enters his first season as head coach of the William & Mary football program.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returns to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

"This is an exciting day for William & Mary, and we are thrilled to welcome Mike and his family back to Williamsburg," W&M Director of Athletics Samantha K. Huge said at the time of London hiring in November. "Mike embodies the values and character that we need to lead our football program forward and he has demonstrated an ability to develop players and win championships over his nearly 30 years in coaching. His unique journey and commitment to the development of young men make him the perfect successor to carry on Coach Jimmye Laycock's 39-year legacy while forging a new path for Tribe Football."

Howard University's head coach the last two seasons, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed

just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmye Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983.

London graduated from UR in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later earned a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy. He served as a detective from 1985-87.

London and his wife, Regina, have four children: daughters Ticcyn, Jaicyn and Madicyn and son Korben. He has three children from a previous marriage: sons Michael Jr. and Brandon, and daughter Kristen.
