THE GAME

William & Mary will play the first of three consecutive nationally ranked opponents when it hosts No. 5/8 Villanova for its home conference opener at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. The contest will be televised by Cox YurView, while a video stream will be available at FloFootball.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M enters Saturday's contest with a 2-3 overall record and a 0-1 mark in conference play after falling at UAlbany in its CAA opener last weekend. The Tribe boasts a 2-0 record at home this season with wins against Lafayette and Colgate at Zable Stadium. Additionally, W&M has scored at least 30 points in all three of its games against FCS opponents and is averaging 33.3 points per game in those contests. Defensively, W&M has forced 10 turnovers, which ranks 15th nationally, while its 2.6 sacks per game also ranks among the nation's top 20. Bronson Yoder highlights W&M's impressive play on special teams and leads the nation in kickoff return average (36.8) and kickoff return touchdowns (2).

SCOUTING THE WILDCATS

Ranked No. 5/8 nationally, Villanova owns a 5-0 overall record and a 2-0 mark in league play. Both of the Wildcats' CAA victories have come against ranked opponents - Towson and Maine. Villanova currently leads the conference in scoring offense (40.4), while it ranks third in the league in scoring defense (19.2). Justin Covington leads the Wildcats' rushing attack and ranks first in the CAA with 134.8 yards per game on the ground.

■ W&M/VILLANOVA NOTES

LAST MEETING

W&M concluded its 2018 road slate with a hard-fought 24-17 victory at Villanova.

W&M scored on four consecutive possessions that spanned the second and third quarters to build a 24-7 lead heading into the fourth quarter.

Although Villanova narrowed the margin to just a touchdown, 24-17, following a 19-yard field goal by Drew Kresge with 4:52 remaining, W&M stopped the Wildcats on their final two possessions to preserve the conference victory.

While VU outgained the Tribe, 368-232, W&M forced four turnovers and committed none. Additionally, W&M scored on all four of its trips into the red zone, which included three touchdowns.

RUSHING DEFENSE IS KEY

A key to the Tribe's last four victories against Villanova has been its ability to slow down the Wildcats' rushing attack, as it has allowed just 131.0 rushing yards per game.

Conversely, the Tribe has allowed 178.0 rushing yards per game in its last two losses versus VU.

CLOSELY CONTESTED

When looking at the combined total points scored by W&M and Villanova since the teams first met as league foes (in 1993), it produces a very balanced result - W&M 674, VU 652.

■ TEAM NOTES

WINNING AT HOME

In addition to owning a 2-0 record at home this season, W&M has won four of its last five contests at Zable Stadium dating back to last season.

LOOKING FOR TWO IN A ROW VS. RANKED OPPONENTS

Although W&M has not faced a ranked opponent this season, it earned a victory against then-No. 16-20 Maine last season in its most recent matchup against a ranked foe.

Additionally, the Tribe has earned a victory against a nationally ranked team three of the last four seasons.

Villanova enters Saturday's game ranked No. 5 in the media poll and No. 8 in the coaches poll.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last two seasons, W&M is 5-1 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 0-7 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

SUCCESS IN THE THIRD QUARTER

W&M has thrived in the third quarters of games this season and is outscoring its opponents, 45-23, during the first 15 minutes after halftime.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns a 7-1 record during the last three seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points. The lone loss came at UAlbany last Saturday.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 16 of its last 20 games when leading at halftime.

Three of those setbacks came against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018), while the other was at UAlbany (2019).

IMPORTANCE OF GETTING AHEAD

During the last two seasons, W&M is 5-2 when it scores first, while it is just 1-7 in games in which the opposition scored first.

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 24-12 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 12-26 when the opponent scores first.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 31-4 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against UAlbany, 2019; Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

TRUE FRESHMAN

Nine true freshman have played for the Tribe this season: punter George Eberle, wide receiver Kane Everson, offensive lineman Bart Francois, long snapper Sam Katz, running back Donavyn Lester, defensive lineman Nate Lynn, quarterback Hollis Mathis, cornerback Latrelle Smith and safety Bronson Yoder.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

With the wins against Lafayette and Colgate, W&M has won 35 of its last 37 games against non-conference FCS opponent during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally it owns a 38-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

NEW ERA BEGINS

A new era of Tribe football is underway as first-year head coach Mike London leads W&M in 2019. A former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, London returns to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011). Additionally, he was honored as the 2008 AFCA FCS National Coach of the Year

CHALLENGING SLATE

Playing its first 12-game regular season slate since 2014, W&M's schedule this fall features a number of challenging matchups. In addition to playing two FBS opponents (Virginia/ECU), W&M will square off against five teams nationally ranked in the preseason polls (James Madison, Maine, Towson, Elon, Colgate). This season marks the first

ONE TRIBE, ONE FAMILY

The W&M athletic department's unofficial slogan - "One Tribe, One Family" - is especially true for the Tribe football team, as the roster features a pair of brother tandems - Collin/Corey Parker and Andrew/Sam Trainer. Additionally, head coach Mike London's son, Mike London Jr. is the Tribe's wide receivers coach.

SENIOR LEADERSHIP

Leading the Tribe's 19-member senior class is a quartet of talented seniors - Nate Atkins (senior, LB), Bill Murray (senior, DT), Corey Parker (senior, DB) and Mark Williamson (senior, OL). Atkins enters his second season as a captain, becoming just the 12th player in the program's 126-year history to be selected as a team captain twice. In addition to their leadership, all four players have excelled on the field and earned all-conference honors at least once during their careers.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Four former Tribe standouts were in NFL training camps this summer - DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jaguars), Luke Rhodes (Colts) and B.W. Webb (Bengals).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

Below are a few notes about W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009.

- Leads the CAA and ranks second in the FCS, behind only Montana (7)
- Ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia Tech and Virginia)
 - Is more than ACC member Duke (5)

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

30-POINT PERFORMANCES

W&M has scored at least 30 points in all three of its games against FCS opponents this season and is averaging 33.3 points per game in those contests.

Prior to this year, the Tribe reached the 30-point mark just once during the last two seasons.

OFFENSIVE PRODUCTION

W&M has totaled more than 400 yards of total offense twice this season.

Entering the fall, W&M had not eclipsed the 400-yard mark since 2016.

YARDS ON THE GROUND

The Tribe has rushed for more than 250 yards twice this season.

Entering the 2019 campaign, W&M had eclipsed the 250-yard mark on the ground just once during the previous three seasons (vs. Norfolk State in 2016).

BIG PLAYS

W&M has posted nine plays longer than 30 yards - three on the ground (31, 41, 54) and six through the air (32, 38, 39, 49, 49, 83).

Last season, W&M produced just one run longer than 30 yards, while it posted just 14 total plays of at least 30 yards.

YARDS PER COMPLETION

W&M currently ranks 13th nationally with 15.3 yards per completion.

SHARING THE LOAD

Ten different Tribe players logged at least one carry in the Tribe's conference opener at UAlbany, while six of those players totaled at least 10 yards on the ground.

IMMEDIATE IMPACT

Three true freshmen found the end zone in the win against Colgate - Hollis Mathis (2-yd run), Donavyn Lester (2-yd run) and Bronson Yoder (93-yd kickoff return).

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 78 times and posted a 73-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 27-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 10-24 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 17.9 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 55 games (985 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 37-18 record at home during that span.

BREAKING UP PASSES

W&M totaled 11 PBU's in the conference opener at UAlbany last week, marking the team's highest total since the win at Penn in 2012 when it also recorded 11 breakups.

FORCING FIELD GOALS

W&M has been effective holding opponents to field goals during the last two games, as both ECU and UAlbany kicked four field goals apiece.

FORCING TURNOVERS

W&M's defense has generated 10 turnovers this season, which ranks 15th nationally.

Additionally, the Tribe's six interceptions ranks 13th in the country.

The Tribe recorded 17 turnovers all of last season.

DEFENSIVE/SPECIALTEAMS TOUCHDOWNS

W&M has continued a recent trend of scoring with defense and special teams, as the Tribe has found the end zone three with non-offensive touchdowns this season - Arman Jones pick-six at UVA (47 yds) and Bronson Yoder's kickoff returns against Colgate (93 yds) and UAlbany (98 yds.).

W&M has recorded at least one defensive or special teams touchdown in 12 of the last 13 years.

SACKS

W&M has wrecked havoc on opposing teams' QB's this season and currently leads the CAA and ranks 20th nationally with 2.6 sacks per game.

STOPS BEHIND THE LINE

W&M has created disruption behind the line of scrimmage this season and currently ranks 28th nationally in tackles for a loss per game (7.4).

BALANCE

Six different Tribe players have intercepted a pass this season. The last time more W&M players posted at least one interception in a season was 2015.

IMPRESSIVE EFFORT

W&M's defense allowed just 215 total yards in the win against Colgate, which marked the fewest allowed by the Tribe since the contest at Delaware in 2017.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 37 games, just seven opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 140 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just nine times - UAlbany (2019), UNH (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), JMU (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

Tremendously successful and widely respected, Mike London enters his first season as head coach of the William & Mary football program.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returns to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

"This is an exciting day for William & Mary, and we are thrilled to welcome Mike and his family back to Williamsburg," W&M Director of Athletics Samantha K. Huge said at the time of London hiring in November. "Mike embodies the values and character that we need to lead our football program forward and he has demonstrated an ability to develop players and win championships over his nearly 30 years in coaching. His unique journey and commitment to the development of young men make him the perfect successor to carry on Coach Jimmye Laycock's 39-year legacy while forging a new path for Tribe Football."

Howard University's head coach the last two seasons, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed

just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmye Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in

London graduated from UR in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later earned a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy. He served as a detective from 1985-87.

London and his wife, Regina, have four children: daughters Ticynn, Jaicyn and Madicyn and son Korben. He has three children from a previous marriage: sons Michael Jr. and Brandon, and daughter Kristen.
