Sophomore Victoria Reynolds ranks first in the CAA and 50th in the country with 2.6 steals per game.

Senior Abby Rendle enters today's game with 991 points needing just nine more to become the 19th player in school history to score her 1,000th point.

Junior Bianca Boggs has scored in double-figures in 12 straight games and leads the Tribe with 19 games in double-digits.

15

Jenna Green is now second in school history with 489 assists. The senior needs just 15 more to set the school record.

38.0

Jenna Green is averaging 38.0 minutes per game, which ranks 11th in the NCAA. She has played the whole game eight times this season.

64

Seniors - Jeanne Gaumont, Jenna Green, and Abby Rendle are now the winningest class in school history. The trio has won 64 times in their W&M careers.

100

With an appearance today, senior Abby Rendle will appear in her 100th career game. She becomes 7th player under coach Swanson to play, at least, 100 games.

110

Junior Bianca Boggs has gotten to the free throw line a team-high 110 times this season. That number ranks fourth in the CAA.

176

W&M has recorded 176 blocks this season, which is 8.4 rejections per game. Both of those numbers lead the country.

327

Senior Abby Rendle has recorded 327 career blocks, which is both a school and CAA record. It is the third most-active blocks in the NCAA.

W&M NEWS AND NOTES

• The William & Mary women's basketball team looks to get back into the win column as it embarks on a two-game road trip starting at Towson on Sunday, Feb. 4. Tip-off from SECU Arena is set for 2 p.m.

• The Green and Gold has played on 25-consecutive Super Bowl Sunday's, including this afternoon's contest, dating back to the Sunday, Jan. 31, 1993. The Tribe has posted a 7-17 record on games played on Super Bowl Sunday. Under coach Ed Swanson, W&M is 2-2 in games on Super Bowl Sunday, including win over College of Charleston (81-76) and Northeastern (72-66 2OT).

• Junior Bianca Boggs claimed the Tribe's sixth CAA weekly award after her big week last week. She joins senior Abby Rendle, who has been CAA Player of the Week three times, and freshman Nyla Pollard, who has been rookie of the week twice, have won the other five awards.

• W&M, the nation's leaders in blocks, set a school record and tied a CAA record with 17 block shots in the victory. Five of the nine players that played recorded, at least, one rejection led by 11 from senior Abby Rendle. The 17 blocks were the most in a game this season nationally, while Rendle's 11 were the second most.

• The Tribe is 7-1 when shooting better than 45-percent. For the season, the Green and Gold leads the CAA and ranks 52nd in the country at 43.8-percent.

• After losing its top two scorers from last season, W&M has put, at least, three players in double-figures in 17 of 21 games this season. Junior Bianca Boggs has been in double-figures in 19 of 21 games, including 21 in a row to lead the team. Seniors Abby Rendle (15 times) and Jenna Green (15 times), as well as sophomores Victoria Reynolds (13 times) and Nari Garner (six times), and freshman Nyla Pollard (twice) have also scored in double-figures, in at least one game, this season.

• Not only is senior Jenna Green scoring at a higher rate this season, but she is also finding her teammates at a higher clip. The Clifton, Virginia native has been in double-figures in 15 games and is averaging 11.1 points per game. She has added 135 assists, which is good for 15th in the country, while her 6.7 apg. rank her 12th. Green, who is just 15 assists away from breaking the school record, has 489 that rank her 13th among active players in the country.

• W&M's and the CAA's new all-time blocks leader senior Abby Rendle broke the school record with her 256th career block in the game against Davidson, and then topped the league's record with her 274th career block versus ODU. She added another school and conference record as she had a single-game record of 11 blocks against Charleston on Jan. 26. Rendle is the nation's top shot blocker and is leading the country with 105 blocks and 5.0 bpg. Her 327 career blocks are also the third-most active blocks in the country, and her 3.3 blocks per game are the most active in the country. The senior has reset her single-season at 105 blocks this year and counting.

• Junior Bianca Boggs has become one of the top players in the CAA this season. She has been the team's leading scorer 13 times, and recorded the most points in a game by a CAA player this season when she scored a career-high 33 points at St. Francis. The junior is averaging 16.9 points per game, which is second in the CAA, to go along with 4.5 rebounds, and 2.8 assists, and 2.3 steals.

• A big key to the Tribe's success this season has been well they share the basketball. W&M is averaging 18.1 assists per game in victories, but just 13.1 in its losses. For the year, W&M ranks first in the CAA and 39th in the country with 16.4 assists.
