W&M NEWS AND NOTES

• The Tribe earned its first series win last weekend against High Point. It took an extra innings triumph, which is also a 2018 first, followed by the best offensive effort of the season in the series finale. The Green and Gold manufactured season-highs in hits (14), runs scored (13) and RBI (12) in the rubber game. W&M also matched the school record with four sacrifice flies last Sunday.

• The W&M pitching staff is fifth-best in the Colonial Athletic Association in batters struck out (98) and stands second in batters struck out looking (36). Five Tribe hurlers have reached double-digit k's, led by junior Bodie Sheehan and freshman Jacob Haney. Sheehan, who leads the CAA with 21.2 innings of work, has fanned 18 batters and Haney boasts 15 strikeouts in 14 innings. Senior Michael Toner and junior Nick Butts have tallied 13 apiece and sophomore Wade Strain adds 10 more. Strain punched in seven strikeouts in just four innings of work during the opener with HPU.

• Juniors Zach Pearson and Owen Socher both batted at least .400 last weekend. Pearson has paced the offensive effort in the early goings of 2018 and that didn't change against the Panthers. He finished the series 5-for-12 at the plate with an RBI, two walks and three runs scored. Socher generated his best weekend of the year after going 4-for-10, adding a double and two RBI. The Vienna, Va., native also held a .500 slugging percentage and .538 on base rate.

• The Tribe defense ranks 26th in the nation behind 12 converted 26 double plays. W&M turned a season-high three double plays in its extra-inning affair at No. 18 Virginia. In total, the Green and Gold has executed at least one double plays in eight of its first 12 games.

• Senior Ryan Hall recorded his 200th career hit in the fifth inning on Sunday against the Panthers. He is 17 knocks away from raking top 15 in program history. The Richmond, Va., native also tied 15th all-time with 46 career doubles. His five 2018 doubles tie 48th in the NCAA and matches second in the CAA.

• Four-year veteran Charlie Fletcher ties third in program history with 82 career appearances on the bump. The Ashburn, Va., native ties second in the conference after seeing action in six games this year. He tossed a scoreless inning in three of his last four outings, allowing just one hit. Fletcher will break the Tribe record with 15 more appearances.

• Rookie Matt McDermott is riding a team-best nine-game on-base streak. He drew a walk in three of his last four outings, and recorded his first multi-hit game (2-for-4) in the series finale against High Point (March 4). Junior Zach Pearson has also reached safely in his last five appearances.

• The month of February pitted the Green and Gold against three Power Five opponents, two of which were ranked top 20 in the nation. In four total games at ACC members No. 10 Clemson and No. 18 Virginia, the Tribe fell in each contest by a combined four runs and went extra innings twice. However, W&M scored a season-high 10 runs in a triumph over Big Ten affiliate Maryland.

• The Green and Gold opens up March with eight consecutive games against Big South programs in High Point, Radford, and Campbell. In all-time series history, W&M boasts a 66-54 (.542) record against Big South opponents after its series win over HPU. After hosting Radford in mid-week action, the Tribe travels to Campbell for a three-game set (March 9-11).

• W&M will play against another school from the Commonwealth 13 times in 2018. The Tribe plays VCU (L, 4-3), Virginia (4-3), Radford (March 6-7), George Mason (March 21), Old Dominion (March 28; April 10), James Madison (April 13-15), Norfolk State (April 17), Richmond (April 24), and Virginia Tech (May 15). The Green and Gold is currently 0-2 against in-state foes.

• Sheehan was named CAA Pitcher of the Week for the week of Feb. 20. He went seven strong innings with four strikeouts, an earned run and three hits on Feb. 16 at No. 12 Clemson. The honor marks the third weekly conference award of his career. Furthermore, Sheehan has fanned 12 batters in a conference-leading 14 innings of work.

Under head coach Brian Murphy, W&M has fashioned three 30-plus win seasons in his four years as the skipper. His most wins (34) occurred in his first season at the helm (2014), resulting in CAA Coach of the Year honors. Murphy owns a career record of 122-117 (.510) and 54-35 (.600) mark in conference play as of March 5.

Brian Murphy was named head coach of the Tribe baseball program on Dec. 3, 2013, and enters his fifth season as the Tribe's head coach. It will be his sixth season in Williamsburg, after spending one season as the Tribe's top assistant coach.

The former one-year assistant guided the Green and Gold to three 30-plus win seasons, a NCAA Regional Final appearances and a Colonial Athletic Association Tournament bid each season in his first four years as the skipper. Before his promotion, Murphy helped the Tribe earn its first-ever NCAA Tournament at-large bid and win its first regional games in school history on the strength of a record-23730setting 39-win season in 2013. He made a seamless transition to head coach the following year as W&M secured its first-ever regular season conference title, culminating in CAA Coach of the Year honors. A couple seasons later, W&M captured its first CAA tournament championship since 2001 en route to reaching the NCAA Regional Final for the second time in a four-year span.

In 2017, a third-place finish in the CAA standings allowed W&M to make its fifth consecutive postseason appearance, which is a program-best since qualifying started for the CAA Baseball Tournament. Murphy secured his 100th career victory mid-way through the season after the Tribe edged conference rival UNCW, 10-9, on March 26. At the end of the regular season, the Green and Gold landed five players on the all-conference teams, highlighted by junior Cullen Large receiving All-CAA First Team accolades. Senior Ryder Miconi, who was tabbed All-CAA Third Team, continued to excel in the classroom as he repeated as CAA Scholar Athlete of the Year. In addition, All-CAA second teamer Brandon Raquet was named to Collegiate Baseball's Freshman All-American Team. Murphy also helped produced a draft class of at least three W&M players for the fifth time in program history. Redshirt sophomore Nick Raquet became the third-highest all-time MLB draft pick by getting selected in the third round by the Washington Nationals. Large was chosen in the fifth round by the Toronto Blue Jays and senior Nick Brown was picked by the Minnesota Twins in the 32nd round. It was the second time in program history that two players were taken inside the first five rounds of the MLB Draft.

The 2016 season will go down as one of the most memorable seasons in program history. Down 8-1 in what looked like its final at-bat of the season, the Tribe answered with seven runs in the ninth and sparked a two-week run for the ages. Following a 27-hour rain delay, W&M went onto win the first CAA Championship game in 12 innings, before senior Josh Smith's grand-slam homer in the bottom of the eighth inning lifted them to the CAA Tournament crown and automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA Regional, the Tribe, which fell in its first game, knocked out Bryant and defending national champion Virginia on its way to its second Regional Final in four seasons. When all was said and done the Green and Gold won six elimination games against Northeastern, College of Charleston, UNCW (twice), Bryant, and Virginia. For his efforts, Murphy was named VaSID Coach of the Year. Individually, he helped lead six Tribe players to all-conference awards, including senior Charley Gould, junior Ryder Miconi, and sophomore Ryan Hall, who were named to the second team. Miconi was rewarded for his hard work in the classroom by being named the CAA Scholar Athlete of the Year. Gould became the 35th player in school history to be drafted when the Oakland Athletics drafted him in the 26th round. It was the fifth straight season that the Tribe had a player selected in the MLB Draft.

Throughout his stint in the W&M dugout, Murphy has mentored a total of nine MLB Draft picks, two national award semifinalists and 22 all-conference players. Michael Katz (2012-14), who garnered multiple All-American honors, was tabbed a Golden Spikes Award semifinalist in 2014. Additionally, Katz and Charley Gould (2013-16) were just two of three players in program history to become Dick Howser Trophy semifinalists, representing W&M on the prestigious list in back-to-back years ('14 & '15). Murphy also helped develop a quartet of record-setting athletes. Under his watch, three pitching records were shattered as John Farrell (2010-13) set a new single-season wins standard (11), Jason Inghram (2012-15) replaced the school's all-time wins mark (26) and Joseph Gaouette (2013-16) broke the career saves record (18). Furthermore, Katz eclipsed the single-season RBI ledger (75).

The Easton Mass. native, who enters his sixth season with the Tribe baseball program, after spending three-seasons at Ivy League school Brown.

While at Brown, Murphy served as the Bears recruiting coordinator and hitting coach. During his three-year tenure in Providence, R.I., Murphy mentored 10 All-Ivy League selections.

Prior to his time with the Bears, Murphy was an assistant at Bryant University in Smithfield, R.I., (2006-09) where he was the recruiting director for the Bulldogs. His on the field responsibilities at Bryant included overseeing the catchers, outfielders and batting. In 2008, he was a member of a Bulldog squad that captured the Northeast-10 Championship. His tenure at Bryant was highlighted by 132 victories, two NCAA Tournament Regional final appearances and a school-record 42 wins in 2008. At the plate, Bryant improved every season in batting average and runs per game under Murphy's tutelage.

In 2004 and 2005, Murphy served as an assistant at Wheaton College in Norton, Ma. While coaching at Wheaton, Murphy's coaching engagement centered on the Lyons' hitting approach and catchers. The Lyons captured two New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) titles and made it all the way to the 2005 NCAA New England Regional finals during Murphy's two seasons.

Murphy has summer coaching experience in the Cape Cod League and the Northwoods League. Murphy served as the hitting coach for the CCBL's Hyannis Mets during the summers of 2005 and 2006. In 2008, he was the Head Coach of the Battle Creek (MI) Bombers of the Northwoods League.

He played collegiately at Merrimack College in North Andover, Mass., where he was the team captain in 2003. Murphy earned a degree in business management from Merrimack in 2003 and a Master's Degree in Sports Management from California University of Pennsylvania in 2009.

Murphy resides in Williamsburg with his wife, Karen, son, Connor, and daughter Maggie.
