### **W&M NEWS AND NOTES**

- After claiming just one win in February, the Tribe owns a 7-5 (.583) record in the first half of March. W&M won back-to-back games on two occasions and claimed a pair of weekend series triumphs. The month has also offered a handful of theatrical moments as three of the victories we're claimed in walk-off fashion - two of which occurred in extra innings.
- Over the past five seasons, the Green and Gold has gone a 9-5 (.643) in its conference opening series. The Tribe dropped two of first three league games at UNCW last year, but won four consecutive series to start CAA play beforehand. In addition, W&M made its conference debut on the road in all but one occasion during the stretch.
- W&M and CofC will meet for just the 18th-20th time in series history this weekend. The recently chartered members of the CAA (2014) lead the all-time series against W&M, 11-6. Their previous meeting was a postseason clash as the Cougars bounced the Green and Gold, 7-6, in 11 innings. During the 2017 regular season, the Tribe completed a three-game sweep of the Cougars by a total of five runs.
- Head coach Brian Murphy will coach his 250th career game on Saturday (March 24). The skipper holds a 127-121 (.512) all-time record in his five seasons with the Tribe. Under his guidance, W&M has exceeded 30 wins three times and qualified for the CAA Tournament each year, including a 2016 league title and NCAA Regional Final appearance.
- The W&M pitching staff was instrumental in the program's 3-1 effort last week. During • The W&M pitching staff was instrumental in the programs 3-1 enorgials week. During the four game homestand, the Tribe restricted opponents to a .178 batting average and surrendered just six earned runs for a 1.46 ERA. A quintet of junior Nick Butts, sophomore Jamie Sara, graduate transfer Andrew Burnick, senior Michael Toner and sophomore Wade Strain combined for the first 2018 shutout in the series lid-lifter against ETSU, allowing just four hits. Furthermore, the Green and Gold ranks third in the CAA in strikeouts (163) and second in struck out looking (54).
- Sara was a key cog in the W&M bullpen as he gained his first two wins in a three-day span. Sara logged the most effective innings in the shutout on Friday, before sustaining a 2-all tie in the ninth inning to set the stage for a Sunday walk-off. Since his shift to the 'pen, he has engineered six scoreless innings, allowed just three hits, punched in seven strikeouts and yielded just two free bases.
- Rookie Jacob Haney put together another banner performance last Sunday with seasonbest in multiple categories. Haney went seven innings for the first time and registered a 2018-low in runs and walks with one each. He also struck out six batters and retired the side in order four times. Also of note, the righty has not thrown a wild pitch in his last two starts (13.2 innings).
- Since March 7th, juniors Hunter Smith and Colin Lipke have served as the big bats in the Tribe lineup. Both players boast at least a .500 slugging percentage and tallied eight hits each during the stretch. Smith blasted two solo homers, doubled twice and drove in six runs. Lipke generated an extra base hit in four of his last seven games, including a pair of doubles against Lehigh (March 14). The community college transfer also launched his first DI home run versus Radford (March 7), while collecting four RBI.
- Senior Charlie Fletcher made back-to-back appearances during the three-game set with ETSU to bring his career total to 86. The Ashburn, Va., native is now 11 appearances away from establishing a new Tribe standard. Fletcher and Strain both tie first in the CAA with 10 calls to the mound this year.
- Ryan Hall, a Senior CLASS Award candidate, needs just 10 more knocks to become one the top 15 hitters in program history. The Richmond, Va., native boasts 207 hits over the span of his career. With two more doubles, Hall will also reach a collegiate total of 50, which would tie him 10th all-time. Hall also ranks top 15 in all-time sacrifice files (ninth) at bats (11th) walks (t-11th), and games started (14th).
- Junior Bodie Sheehan is four strikeouts away from surpassing 150 in his career. The Virginia Beach, Va., product has tallied 28 K's in a CAA-best 36.1 innings of work this year. Sheehan heads into the weekend boasting a 1.73 ERA and 1-1 record. He is also the only Tribe player to collect a weekly award after being named CAA Pitcher of the Week (Feb. 20) following an exceptional Friday start at then-ranked No. 12 Clemson.
- Sophomore Chris Farrell will make his weekend debut after enjoying success as a mid-week starter. Farrell pitched five innings in three of his four starts and owns a 3.57 ERA. The secondyear player picked up his first career win after limiting Lehigh (March 14) to just two runs (one earned) on two hits.

Brian Murphy was named head coach of the Tribe baseball program on Dec. 3, 2013, and enters his fifth season as the Tribe's head coach. It will be his sixth season in Williamsburg, after spending one season as the Tribe's top assistant coach.

The former one-year assistant guided the Green and Gold to three 30-plus win seasons, a NCAA Regional Final appearances and a Colonial Athletic Association Tournament bid each season in his first four years as the skipper. Before his promotion, Murphy helped the Tribe earn its first-ever NCAA Tournament at-large bid and win its first regional games in school history on the strength of a record-23730setting 39-win season in 2013. He made a seamless transition to head coach the following year as W&M secured its first-ever regular season conference title, culminating in CAA Coach of the Year honors. A couple seasons later, W&M captured its first CAA tournament championship since 2001 en route to reaching the NCAA Regional Final for the second time in a four-year span.

In 2017, a third-place finish in the CAA standings allowed W&M to make its fifth consecutive postseason appearance, which is a program-best since qualifying started for the CAA Baseball Tournament. Murphy secured his 100th career victory mid-way through the season after the Tribe edged conference rival UNCW, 10-9, on March 26. At the end of the regular season, the Green and Gold landed five players on the all-conference teams, highlighted by junior Cullen Large receiving All-CAA First Team accolades. Senior Ryder Miconi, who was tabbed All-CAA Third Team, continued to excel in the classroom as he repeated as CAA Scholar Athlete of the Year. In addition, All-CAA second teamer Brandon Raquet was named to Collegiate Baseball's Freshman All-American Team. Murphy also helped produced a draft class of at least three W&M players for the fifth time in program history. Redshirt sophomore Nick Raquet became the third-highest all-time MLB draft pick by getting selected in the third round by the Washington Nationals, Large was chosen in the fifth round by the Toronto Blue Jays and senior Nick Brown was picked by the Minnesota Twins in the 32nd round. It was the second time in program history that two players were taken inside the first five rounds of the MLB Draft.

The 2016 season will go down as one of the most memorable seasons in program history. Down 8-1 in what looked like its final at-bat of the season, the Tribe answered with seven runs in the ninth and sparked a two-week run for the ages. Following a 27-hour rain delay, W&M went onto win the first CAA Championship game in 12 innings, before senior Josh Smith's grand-slam homer in the bottom of the eighth inning lifted them to the CAA Tournament crown and automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA Regional, the Tribe, which fell in its first game, knocked out Bryant and defending national champion Virginia on its way to its second Regional Final in four seasons. When all was said and done the Green and Gold won six elimination games against Northeastern, College of Charleston, UNCW (twice), Bryant, and Virginia. For his efforts, Murphy was named VaSID Coach of the Year. Individually, he helped lead six Tribe players to all-conference awards, including senior Charley Gould, junior Ryder Miconi, and sophomore Ryan Hall, who were named to the second team. Miconi was rewarded for his hard work in the classroom by being named the CAA Scholar Athlete of the Year. Gould became the 35th player in school history to be drafted when the Oakland Athletics drafted him in the 26th round. It was the fifth straight season that the Tribe had a player selected in the MLB Draft.

Throughout his stint in the W&M dugout, Murphy has mentored a total of nine MLB Draft picks, two national award semifinalists and 22 all-conference players. Michael Katz (2012-14), who garnered multiple All-American honors, was tabbed a Golden Spikes Award semifinalist in 2014. Additionally, Katz and Charley Gould (2013-16) were just two of three players in program history to become Dick Howser Trophy semifinalists, representing W&M on the prestigious list in back-to-back years ('14 & '15). Murphy also helped develop a quartet of record-setting athletes. Under his watch, three pitching records were shattered as John Farrell (2010-13) set a new single-season wins standard (11), Jason Inghram (2012-15) replaced the school's all-time wins mark (26) and Joseph Gaouette (2013-16) broke the career saves record (18). Furthermore, Katz eclipsed the single-season RBI ledger (75).

The Easton Mass. native, who enters his sixth season with the Tribe baseball program, after spending three-seasons at lvy League school Brown.

While at Brown, Murphy served as the Bears recruiting coordinator and hitting coach. During his three-year tenure in Providence, R.I., Murphy mentored 10 All-lvy League selections.

Prior to his time with the Bears, Murphy was an assistant at Bryant University in Smithfield, R.I., (2006-09) where he was the recruiting director for the Bulldogs. His on the field responsibilities at Bryant included overseeing the catchers, outfielders and batting. In 2008, he was a member of a Bulldog squad that captured the Northeast-10 Championship. His tenure at Bryant was highlighted by 132 victories, two NCAA Tournament Regional final appearances and a school-record 42 wins in 2008. At the plate, Bryant improved every season in batting average and runs per game under Murphy's tutelage.

In 2004 and 2005, Murphy served as an assistant at Wheaton College in Norton, Ma. While coaching at Wheaton, Murphy's coaching engagement centered on the Lyons' hitting approach and catchers. The Lyons captured two New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) titles and made it all the way to the 2005 NCAA New England Regional finals during Murphy's two seasons.

Murphy has summer coaching experience in the Cape Cod League and the Northwoods League. Murphy served as the hitting coach for the CCBL's Hyannis Mets during the summers of 2005 and 2006. In 2008, he was the Head Coach of the Battle Creek (MI) Bombers of the Northwoods League.

He played collegiately at Merrimack College in North Andover, Mass., where he was the team captain in 2003. Murphy earned a degree in business management from Merrimack in 2003 and a Master's Degree in Sports Management from California University of Pennsylvania in 2009.

Murphy resides in Williamsburg with his wife, Karen, son, Connor, and daughter Maggie.
