## W&amp;M NEWS AND NOTES

• The William & Mary baseball team returns to Plumeri Park for a seven-game homestand starting with a three-game CAA series against James Madison this weekend. The series is slated for games on Friday at 4 p.m., Saturday at 4 p.m., and Sunday at 1 p.m.

• The Tribe and James Madison will meet for the 120th through the 122nd time in series history this weekend. The Dukes lead the all-time series 76-43, including sweeping the three-game series in Harrisonburg last year. Senior Hunter Smith led W&M in the series going for 2-for-9 with three RBI.

• Sophomore Randy Prosper has been one of the hottest arms out of the Tribe bullpen of late. At George Washington on Wednesday, the sophomore threw 1.2 innings, including getting the Tribe out of a bases-loaded jam. It marked his fifth straight scoreless appearance, and he has allowed just one run in his last 13 innings of work. For the season, he has posted a 1.89 ERA in 19.0 innings with 19 K's.

• W&M turned double plays in the third and eighth innings on Wednesday marking the eighth time this season the Tribe recorded multiple double plays in a game. For the season, the Tribe pitching staff and defense has turned 28 double plays, which ranks second in the CAA and 34th nationally.

• Senior Bodie Sheehan has been one of the Tribe's all-time most consistent pitchers during his career. He took a perfect game bid into the sixth inning at Delaware Saturday, after coming off his best start of the year against UNCW. He has record five quality starts of his eight starts this season. The Virginia Beach, Va. native has now made 52 starts and needs only three more to become the program's all-time leader. Sheehan also became the seventh W&M pitcher to surpass 300 career innings and the 13th to eclipse 200 career strikeouts.

• Redshirt junior Chris Farrell has been established as one of the top closers in the CAA. The right-handed pitcher ranks fourth in the league after locking down his fourth save on March 31. Farrell has 25 strikeouts in just 16.1 innings, holds a .203 opposing batting average, and a 2.20 ERA.

• Freshman Zach Tsakounis was honored with his second CAA Rookie of the Week Award for the week of April 1. He scattered six hit through six scoreless innings and fanned four batters in a win at UNCW. The Tribe has claimed four CAA awards with three of them going to a pitcher. Freshman righty Tristan Snyder also claimed Rookie of the Week accolades on Feb. 19, while sophomore Matt McDermott was named Player of the Week for March 5.

• On the offensive end, the Tribe leads the CAA with 205 runs scored. The team has put at least eight runs on the scoreboard in 12 games, going 10-2. W&M ranks among the nation's best in doubles (71) and triples (13). The Green and Gold's 71 two-baggers rank 14th in the NCAA, while its 13 triples are 15th in the nation.

• Senior Hunter Smith has been the Tribe's best offensive threat. The catcher sits first in the conference in both slugging percentage (.615) and home runs (8). Smith has already homered twice in a game on three occasions. The Caldwell, N.J., product stands 12th in W&M history with 24 career homers. With 193 career hits, Smith needs seven more to join the 200-career hits club.

• Classmate Zach Pearson enjoyed the best game of his career after finishing 4-for-5 with four RBI and a double at UNCW (3/30). Pearson established a new career-high in hits and tied his personal-best in RBI. The senior leads the team with a .324 batting average, which ranks him seventh in the league. Pearson also is tops on the team with 11 multi-hit games, including one at George Washington on Wednesday.

• Senior Owen Socher has started nine of the last 10 games in left field and took full advantage of the opportunity. During the stretch, Socher leads the team on a .355 batting average (11-for-31), adding three doubles, two triples, and three RBI. He is also reached base in a team-high 19 straight games.

• The Tribe claimed its third Power Five win of the season after topping Maryland 8-1 on Wednesday at Plumeri Park. Previously, the Tribe has topped the Big 12's West Virginia 6-4 on March 16 and topped the ACC's Virginia 9-3 on Feb. 26.

• Plumeri Park, the home of the Tribe Baseball, turns 20 this spring. The anniversary will be celebrated and recognized over the course of the season. The facility was constructed in large part due to the generous donation by Mr. Joseph J. Plumeri II in the autumn of 1996. It is now considered one of the finest baseball facilities in the region, consistently receiving upgrades over the course of time. W&M has enjoyed a lot of success at Plumeri Park with a 389-202 (.658) since its completion.

Brian Murphy was named head coach of the Tribe baseball program on Dec. 3, 2013, and enters his sixth season as the Tribe's head coach. It will be his seventh season in Williamsburg, after spending one season as the Tribe's top assistant coach.

The former one-year assistant guided the Green and Gold to three 30-plus win seasons, a NCAA Regional Final appearances and a Colonial Athletic Association Tournament bid each season in his first four years as the skipper. Before his promotion, Murphy helped the Tribe earn its first-ever NCAA Tournament at-large bid and win its first regional games in school history on the strength of a record-setting 39-win season in 2013. He made a seamless transition to head coach the following year as W&M secured its first-ever regular season conference title, culminating in CAA Coach of the Year honors. A couple seasons later, W&M captured its first CAA tournament championship since 2001 en route to reaching the NCAA Regional Final for the second time in a four-year span.

In 2017, a third-place finish in the CAA standings allowed W&M to make its fifth consecutive postseason appearance, which is a program-best since qualifying started for the CAA Baseball Tournament. Murphy secured his 100th career victory mid-way through the season after the Tribe edged conference rival UNCW, 10-9, on March 26. At the end of the regular season, the Green and Gold landed five players on the all-conference teams, highlighted by junior Cullen Large receiving All-CAA First Team accolades. Senior Ryder Miconi, who was tabbed All-CAA Third Team, continued to excel in the classroom as he repeated as CAA Scholar Athlete of the Year. In addition, All-CAA second teamer Brandon Raquet was named to Collegiate Baseball's Freshman All-American Team. Murphy also helped produced a draft class of at least three W&M players for the fifth time in program history. Redshirt sophomore Nick Raquet became the third-highest all-time MLB draft pick by getting selected in the third round by the Washington Nationals. Large was chosen in the fifth round by the Toronto Blue Jays and senior Nick Brown was picked by the Minnesota Twins in the 32nd round. It was the second time in program history that two players were taken inside the first five rounds of the MLB Draft.

The 2016 season will go down as one of the most memorable seasons in program history. Down 8-1 in what looked like its final at-bat of the season, the Tribe answered with seven runs in the ninth and sparked a two-week run for the ages. Following a 27-hour rain delay, W&M went onto win the first CAA Championship game in 12 innings, before senior Josh Smith's grand-slam homer in the bottom of the eighth inning lifted them to the CAA Tournament crown and automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament. In the NCAA Regional, the Tribe, which fell in its first game, knocked out Bryant and defending national champion Virginia on its way to its second Regional Final in four seasons. When all was said and done the Green and Gold won six elimination games against Northeastern, College of Charleston, UNCW (twice), Bryant, and Virginia. For his efforts, Murphy was named VaSID Coach of the Year. Individually, he helped lead six Tribe players to all-conference awards, including senior Charley Gould, 23732junior Ryder Miconi, and sophomore Ryan Hall, who were named to the second team. Miconi was rewarded for his hard work in the classroom by being named the CAA Scholar Athlete of the Year. Gould became the 35th player in school history to be drafted when the Oakland Athletics drafted him in the 26th round. It was the fifth straight season that the Tribe had a player selected in the MLB Draft.

Throughout his stint in the W&M dugout, Murphy has mentored a total of nine MLB Draft picks, two national award semifinalists and 23 all-conference players. Michael Katz (2012-14), who garnered multiple All-American honors, was tabbed a Golden Spikes Award semifinalist in 2014. Additionally, Katz and Charley Gould (2013-16) were just two of three players in program history to become Dick Hower Trophy semifinalists, representing W&M on the prestigious list in back-to-back years ('14 & '15). Murphy also helped develop a plethora of record-setting athletes. Under his watch, four pitching records were shattered as John Farrell (2010-13) set a new single-season wins standard (11), Jason Inghram (2012-15) replaced the school's all-time wins mark (26), Joseph Gaouette (2013-16) broke the career saves record (18), and Charlie Fletcher became the all-time appearance leader (105). Additionally, Katz eclipsed the single-season RBI ledger (75), while Ryan Hall raised the bar for most career at bats (844).

The Easton Mass. native, who enters his sixth season with the Tribe baseball program, after spending three-seasons at Ivy League school Brown.

While at Brown, Murphy served as the Bears recruiting coordinator and hitting coach. During his three-year tenure in Providence, R.I., Murphy mentored 10 All-Ivy League selections.

Prior to his time with the Bears, Murphy was an assistant at Bryant University in Smithfield, R.I., (2006-09) where he was the recruiting director for the Bulldogs. His on the field responsibilities at Bryant included overseeing the catchers, outfielders and batting. In 2008, he was a member of a Bulldog squad that captured the Northeast-10 Championship. His tenure at Bryant was highlighted by 132 victories, two NCAA Tournament Regional final appearances and a school-record 42 wins in 2008. At the plate, Bryant improved every season in batting average and runs per game under Murphy's tutelage.

In 2004 and 2005, Murphy served as an assistant at Wheaton College in Norton, Ma. While coaching at Wheaton, Murphy's coaching engagement centered on the Lyons' hitting approach and catchers. The Lyons captured two New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) titles and made it all the way to the 2005 NCAA New England Regional finals during Murphy's two seasons.

Murphy has summer coaching experience in the Cape Cod League and the Northwoods League. Murphy served as the hitting coach for the CCBL's Hyannis Mets during the summers of 2005 and 2006. In 2008, he was the Head Coach of the Battle Creek (MI) Bombers of the Northwoods League.

He played collegiately at Merrimack College in North Andover, Mass., where he was the team captain in 2003. Murphy earned a degree in business management from Merrimack in 2003 and a Master's Degree in Sports Management from California University of Pennsylvania in 2009.

Murphy resides in Williamsburg with his wife, Karen, son, Connor, and daughter Maggie.
