#### The Game

After Hurricane Florence forced the cancelation of last weekend's game against Elon, William & Mary will open its league slate at No. 2 James Madison on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. The contest, which will be televised by NBC Sports Washington+, marks W&M's third consecutive road game to open the season after defeating Bucknell and losing at Virginia Tech. Wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon has been tremendous and ranks second in the CAA with 110.5 receiving yards per game. JMU opened its ledger with a 24-13 loss at NC State but has bounced back with lopsided wins against Norfolk State and Robert Morris.

#### The Series

In a series that began in 1978, JMU has won 23 of the 40 all-time meetings while the Dukes own a 13-5 advantage in games played in Harrisonburg. Since becoming league opponents in 1993, the teams have met 25 times in the regular season, with JMU winning 17 of those contests. JMU has won 11 of the last 14 meetings, including a NCAA semifinal matchup in 2004.

### **The Coaches**

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M'70) owns a career record of 246–190-2 and is in his 39th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 246 wins rank second nationally among all active Division-I coaches, while his 109 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- James Madison: Mike Houston (Mars Hill '84) is in his third season at JMU and owns a 30-3 record with the Dukes.

### **The Program**

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 574-566-41 in 125 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won five conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs 10 times and posted 24 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice 2004, 2009.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 45 All-Americans (125 total honors), while 40 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.



### **▶** Game Notes

- W&M outgained JMU by more than 100 yards in the second half (245-143) but was outgained, 389-298, for the contest
- The game was the first sellout in the renovated Zable Stadium (13,125)
- The score marked the first time in the last eight meetings between W&M and JMU that the final margin was more than 10 points
- · JMU capitalized off six W&M turnovers and converted the Tribe's miscues into 33 points
- · Ranked No. 1 nationally, JMU extended its winning streak to 19 games - the nation's longest streak
- W&M's loss snapped a two-game winning streak when playing the nation's top-ranked team
- W&M played three quarterbacks -McKee, Shon Mitchell (starter) and **Brandon Battle**
- · Nine different Tribe players caught at least one pass, but none had more than two catches
- W&M was penalized just once for 5
- WR Jordan Lowery caught his first career touchdown pass - a 33-yard grab in the fourth quarter
- RB Noah Giles 66-yard touchdown run in the fourth quarter was the Tribe's longest play of the season

### Tribe Falls to No. 1 JMU. 46-14, on Homecoming

Williamsburg, Va. - The William & Mary football team outgained top-ranked James Madison by more than 100 yards in the second half but fell to the defending national champions, 46-14, in front of a sold-out Homecoming crowd (13,125) at Zable Stadium on Oct. 21, 2017.

W&M (2-5, 0-4) scored a pair of touchdowns in the fourth guarter — coming on a 33-yard pass from quarterback Tommy McKee to wideout Jordan Lowery and on a 66-yard run by tailback Noah Giles — but was unable to overcome a 43-0 deficit.

JMU (7-0, 4-0) capitalized off six W&M turnovers and converted the Tribe's miscues into 33 points.

In addition to his 66-yard touchdown scamper, Giles posted a game-high and career-best 74 yards on three carries to lead the Tribe offensively.

Linebacker Nate Atkins totaled a team-high 12 tackles with a TFL, while safety Mike Barta posted nine stops, a TFL and an interception in the end zone to stop a JMU drive. W&M's other interception came by cornerback Aaron Swinton and also came in the end zone to halt a scoring opportunity by the Dukes.

Defensive tackle Will Kiely also came up big with seven tackles, a sack and 2.0 TFL, while defensive end Matt Ahola posted six stops and 1.5 sacks.

Punter Will Michael posted one of his best performances of the season and averaged 44.3 yards per punt on his seven kicks and pinned the Dukes inside their own 20 twice.

Although JMU outgained the Tribe, 389-298, the Tribe posted a big second half and outgained the Dukes by more than 100 yards (245-143) in the final 30 minutes.

While W&M tallied a pair of interceptions, it threw four interceptions and lost a pair of fumbles.

JMU controlled the time of possession (33:21-26:39) and held W&M to just 3 of 13 on third downs. The Tribe totaled 3.0 sacks with 8.0 TFL, while the Dukes posted 6.0 sacks and 8.0 TFL

JMU tailback Marcus Marshall rushed for two touchdowns and totaled a team-high 64 yards on 11 car-

Quarterback Bryan Schor completed 13 of 24 passes for 186 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions and rushed for a score, while Terrence Alls posted a game-high seven catches for 113 yards.

Tyler Gray (42, 30) and Ethan Ratke (36, 39) both made a pair of field goals for the Dukes.

Defensively, Jordan Brown recorded two interceptions, while Jimmy Moreland and Rashad Robinson also had picks.

- Be head coach Jimmye Laycock's 247th career win his alltime record is 246-190-2; he currently ranks as the secondwinningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 253 career wins
- Be the 575th win the College's history the program's alltime record stands at 574-566-41 and is in its 125th season of football

### **Series History**

In a series that began in 1978, JMU has won 23 of the 40 all-time meetings while the Dukes own a 13-5 advantage in games played in Harrisonburg.

Since becoming league opponents in 1993, the teams have met 25 times in the regular season, with JMU winning 17 of those contests.

The Dukes have won 11 of the last 14 meetings, including a NCAA semifinal matchup in 2004.

### A Sign of Good Things to Come

A victory in its conference opener has traditionally proven to be a sign of good things to come for W&M. During the previous 25 seasons, W&M has averaged nearly nine wins (8.7) in the 10 years it has started the league slate with a victory (the Tribe's combined winning percentage for those 10 seasons is .702, 87-37). Additionally, W&M has won at least seven games during every season in which it started conference play with a victory. Six of the program's seven NCAA playoff appearances since 1993 have come in seasons that have started with a victory in conference play.

Conversely, in the 15 seasons W&M has lost its conference opener it has averaged 5.3 wins for a .476 winning percentage (80-88).

The 2010 season marked the only time during the stretch that W&M had lost its conference opener and won more than seven games.

#### **Narrow Margins**

Six of the last eight matchups between W&M and JMU have been tightly contested, as those games have been decided by no more than a touchdown - including a double overtime contest in 2012.

The recent matchups reversed a trend that developed during the prior four years when the average margin of victory was 20 points.

JMU holds a narrow 997-957 advantage in cumulative score in the all-time series.

### **Slowing Down the Dukes**

W&M's defense has been effective slowing down JMU's passing attack during the last nine matchups, as it has allowed just 160.2 passing yards per game (1,442) during the recent stretch.

#### **Blocking Kicks**

W&M has recorded blocks in three of its last five games against JMU. Additionally, the Tribe recorded multiple blocks during two of those matchups (2013 - 1; 2014 - 2; 2015 - 2).

### **School Record**

W&M set a single-game school record for fewest passing yards allowed at JMU in 2010, as the Dukes threw for zero yards (attempted just one pass).

### Overtime

W&M and JMU have played a pair of overtime contests, as the Dukes earned narrow victories in 2002 (34-31) and 2012 (27-26). The 2012 matchup went into double overtime and ended after a failed two-point conversion attempt.



The William & Mary football program boasts some of the finest facilities at the FCS level, as the \$28 million Zable Stadium renovation was completed in 2016 and sits adjacent to the team's \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center. The recent stadium renovation also includes the addition of a new state-of-the-art playing surface – FieldTurf Revolution 360.

### **Team Notes**

#### **Challenging Opening Stretch**

Saturday's game at James Madison will be W&M's third consecutive road game to open the season, marking the first time since 2005 that the Tribe has opened with three straight road games.

W&M's home opener against Elon last Saturday was postponed due to Hurricane Florence.

#### **Hurricane Florence**

W&M's home opener against Elon last Saturday was canceled due to Hurricane Florence, marking the first time since 2003 that the Tribe's schedule has been impacted by a hurricane (Isabel). That contest versus Maine was canceled.

### **Success in September**

W&M has played well during the month of September in recent years and has posted a 26-12 mark since 2009.

During the past five seasons, the Tribe has registered a 14-6 mark during the month, which includes a 14-2 mark against FCS foes.

#### **Underclassmen to Play Big Role**

W&M's week 2 depth chart features 25 underclassmen, while the Tribe's entire roster includes just six seniors.

#### **True Freshmen**

Three true freshmen have played this season - offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal, offensive lineman Marcus Crowell and defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant.

Dating back through 2014, 16 true freshmen have played for the Tribe (2017 - 5; 2016 - 4; 2014 - 4).

### **Importance of Getting Ahead**

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 20-10 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 11-20 when the opponent scores first.

### Importance of Leading at Halftime

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 14 of its last 16 games when leading at halftime. The only setbacks have come against Towson (2016, 2017).

### **Holding on to Leads**

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 28-3 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

### **Wide Margins**

W&M owns an impressive average margin of victory dating back through 2014, while all but five of its last 24 victories during that span have come by double-digit margins.

### **Limiting Penalties**

W&M has ranked among the country's top 10 least penalized teams seven straight years.

Last season, the Tribe ranked third nationally in fewest penalties per game (3.82) and fewest penalty yards per game (34.91).

W&M currently ranks 42nd in fewest penalties per game (6.0) and 46th in fewest penalty yards per game (51.0).

Four Tribe players earned their first career starts in the season-opening win at Bucknell - left tackle Griffin Gilder, right tackle Colby Sorsdal, linebacker Alex Purviance, cornerback Nate Lewis.

#### One Tribe, One Family

The W&M athletic department's unofficial slogan - "One Tribe, One Family" - is especially true for the Tribe football team, as the roster features a pair of brother tandems - Josh/Justin Dulaney and Collin/Corey Parker.

### **Ending a Drought**

When redshirt freshman safety Gage Herdman blocked a punt in the season-opening win at Bucknell, it marked the squad's first blocked punt since DeAndre Houston-Carson did so against New Hampshire on Oct. 17, 2015.

### **Historical Success in Close Games**

Since taking over the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmye Laycock's squads have played in 69 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced success



in those contests, totaling an impressive 37-30-2 record.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.

### #LaycockLegacy

Prior to the start of preseason camp, legendary head coach Jimmye Laycock announced the 2018 campaign would be his final season on the Tribe sidelines.

Currently in his 39th season at W&M, Laycock is the nation's longest-tenured Division I head football coach and ranks second in career wins among all active DI coaches with 246 victories.

Far and away W&M's all-time leader in career wins, Laycock's remarkable career accomplishments include 10 NCAA Playoff appearances, five conference titles and 24 winning seasons. Additionally, he guided W&M to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) semifinals twice — 2004 and 2009 — and finished a season with a national ranking 13 different times.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M, while 40 former Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts since he took the helm in 1980.

Laycock's connection with the NFL doesn't end there, as his remarkable influence is also evident in his impressive and vast coaching tree that extends into the highest levels of football. Two of his former players are currently head coaches in the NFL — Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Laycock's impressive coaching tree also includes current Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn, who served as an assistant on W&M's staff in 1994.

### Winning at Zable Stadium

Despite going 1-4 at home last season, W&M has posted a 19-9 record at Zable Stadium since the start of the 2013 season, which represents a 67.9 winning percentage.

W&M's recent undefeated regular-season home records came in 2015, 2010, 2009 & 2004.

### W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during six of the last eight seasons - Jonathan Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013), John Carpenter (2014) and DeVonte Dedmon (2015).

#### **Captains**

The Tribe is led by a trio of senior captains this season - junior linebacker Nate Atkins, senior cornerback Raeshawn Smith and senior wide receiver Jack Armstrong. Atkins will have the opportunity to become just the 12th player in the program's long and storied history to be selected as a two-time team captain if he garners the distinction again next season.

#### Tribe in the NFL

The Tribe was well represented in NFL training camps this summer, as seven former players were on active rosters - Chris Durant (Chargers), Connor Hilland (Dolphins), DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jets), Luke Rhodes (Colts), B.W. Webb (Giants) and Jerry Ugokwe (Buccaneers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

### **Tribe NFL Draft Picks**

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.



Under head coach Jimmye Laycock, W&M has historically bounced back from seasons in which it failed to post a winning record (W&M was 2-9 last season), as the Tribe has registered consecutive losing seasons just four times during the past 36 years.

### It's A Winner

In his 38 full seasons at W&M, head coach Jimmye Laycock has secured 24 winning seasons.

The achievement is remarkable when considering the program had just seven winning seasons in the previous 30 years (1950 – 1979) prior to his taking control of the program for the 1980 season.

### **Team Offensive Notes**

### **Relative Success**

While W&M did not get the result it wanted at Virginia Tech in its last outing, the Tribe's 17 points were 14 more than then-No. 20 Florida State scored against the Hokies defense in Tallahassee the previous week.

#### **Dedmon is Back**

After suffering a season-ending injury in the opener at Virginia last fall, standout wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon made an immediate impact through two games this season.

In addition to scoring a touchdown in both contests, he is averaging 110.5 yards per game and 24.6 yards per catch.

Dedmon recorded a 75-yard touchdown catch at Bucknell and a 59-yard score at Virginia Tech.

A two-time All-CAA selection and former CAA Special Teams Player of the Year, Dedmon is one of the nation's most talented and electric playmakers.

### No Sophomore Slump for Mitchell

Currently in his first season as W&M's full-time starter, quarterback Shon Mitchell is off to a solid start through the opening two contests and is averaging 237.5 passing yards per game.

Mitchell earned three starts last season, becoming W&M's first true freshman to start at quarterback since 1975 (Tom Rozantz). Additionally, he became the program's first true freshman to play at quarterback since 1981 (Stan Yaqiello).

### Protecting the QB

One week after Virginia Tech posted five sacks at Florida State, W&M's offensive line allowed just one sack against the Hokies in its last outing.

#### **Quick Strike Offense**

Three of W&M's four touchdown drives this season have lasted less than 1:30.

### **Big Plays Through the Air**

Although W&M is yet to post a rush of at least 15 yards, it has found success with big plays through the air and recorded four passing plays longer than 40 yards - including two longer than 70 yards.



#### True Freshman on the OL

W&M has played two true freshman on the offensive line this season - Colby Sorsdal and Marcus Crowell. The duo joins Cody Morris (2003) as the only W&M true freshmen offensive lineman to play dating back through 1983.

#### Production at TE/FB

As expected, W&M has gotten good production from its tight ends and fullbacks this season, as the position group has combined to total 15 catches for 175 yards through the first two

W&M's tight ends/fullbacks have thrived under the tutelage of position coach Mario Acitelli during the last four seasons, as the position group has garnered six all-conference honors during that span. Fullback Tyler Crist added his name to that list as a redshirt freshman last fall after earning third-team all-league accolades.

#### **Fourth Down Conversions**

W&M has converted on two of its three fourth down attempts this season.

### **Ground Game Production is Key**

Since 2011, W&M's ability to run the ball well has been indicative of its overall success. The Tribe has averaged 194.6 rushing yards per game in its 38 wins (7,395) rushing yards), while it has averaged just 129.9 yards per game on the ground in its 44 losses (5,717 rushing yards).

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 76 times and posted a 71-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 25-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

### Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns a 8-20 mark in such contests.

#### Team Defensive Notes

### **Forcing Turnovers**

After forcing just 10 turnovers all of last season, W&M has recorded three turnovers through the first two games - two fumbles and an interception.

### **Tough Against the Pass**

Dating back to last season, W&M has held two of its last four opponents to fewer than 150 passing yards.

### **Just One Senior**

Although W&M's defense features seven returning starters - including an eighth with significant starting experience - the Tribe's two deep includes just one senior (cornerback Raeshawn Smith).

### **Shutting Down the Pass**

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 129 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just eight times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

### Tough to Score Through the Air

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 24 games, just four opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

### **Consistency at MLB**

A total of just five players have accounted for 129 of 132 starts at MLB during the past 12 seasons. Junior standout Nate Atkins, who enters his third season as a starter, added his name to that list in 2016.

#### **Defensive/Special Teams Scores**

W&M entered the 2018 campaign having recorded a defensive or special teams touchdown during 10 of the last 11

Additionally, W&M entered the fall having recorded a pick-six in four of the last five seasons.

### Less Than 40

W&M has allowed just six opponents to score more than 40 points during the last 58 games (James Madison, 41 in 2015 & 46 in 2017; Duguesne, 49 in 2015; Richmond, 48 in 2015; NC State, 48 in 2016; Virginia Tech, 62, 2018).

### **Impressive Efforts**

Since the start of the 2011 season, W&M has held opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense in 31.3 percent of its games (26 times in 83 games). The Tribe has posted a 21-5 record in those contests, with its only losses coming vs. Towson (2017), at Delaware (2017), vs. Elon (2016) at Maryland (2012) and at Rhode Island (2011).

Dating back to 2016, W&M has held seven of its last 15 opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense.

### **Tough Defense at Zable**

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.0 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 49 games (883 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 33-16 record at home during that span.

### **Shutout History**

The Tribe has posted 15 shutouts during the Laycock era, with more than a third of them (six) having come since 2009.

## **Head Coach Jimmye Laycock**



### **William & Mary Head Coach Jimmye Laycock**

39th Season

Career Record: 246-190-2 (.564)

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock, who has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Laycock's legendary career, which includes 39 seasons as W&M's head coach, will conclude at the end of the 2018 campaign as he announced his retirement in August.

Laycock is the nation's longest tenured active Division I head coach and entered the 2018 season ranked second in wins among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches with 245 victories. Laycock also entered the fall ranked second all-time among conference head coaches

in league wins (109), while the Tribe has appeared in 19 postseason contests and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals twice under his direction.

The success has led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$28 million Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed in 2016.

On June 21, 2008, the university dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides W&M with one of the finest facilities in the FCS.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 124-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement.

When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the Tribe would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 37 seasons.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With seven all-league recognitions in 2017, the Tribe has produced an astounding 255 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011.

Since 2009, W&M has produced six NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech).

During Laycock's tenure, 40 Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts, including seven who were with teams this summer. In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) was hired as the Buffalo Bills head coach in January, 2017, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and previously held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, Michael Clemons ('87) was one of the CFL's most explosive players after a brief stint in the NFL and currently holds the position of Special Advisor for the Toronto Argonauts.

As a 1970 graduate of W&M, Laycock played football under two legends of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco 49ers.

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deidre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at W&M. They have three children: Michael, a Captain in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a recent graduate of Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail and Nolan.
