The Game

William & Mary will continue its challenging conference slate when it hosts No. 16/20 Maine for homecoming at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. The contest will be televised by Cox YurView Virginia. Although it led at halftime, W&M suffered a 29-13 setback at then-No. 17/18 Towson in its last outing and owns a 2-4 record overall and a 1-2 mark in conference action. Maine boasts a 4-2 record overall and sits tied atop the CAA standings with a 3-0 mark in league play. All three conference wins have come against ranked opponents, while it also defeated FBS foe, Western Kentucky, 31-28, earlier this season.

The Series

Saturday's contest against Maine will mark the 14th meeting between the two schools, as W&M currently controls the all-time series, 7-6. The Tribe won the first five meetings versus the Black Bears before Maine earned its first victory in the series in 2002. UM has won the last four meetings, as the Tribe's last victory in the series came in 2010 in Orono.

The Coaches

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M '70) owns a career record of 247-193-2 and is in his 39th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 247 wins rank second nationally among all active Division-I coaches, while his 110 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- Maine: Joe Harasymiak (Springfield '08) is in his third season at Maine and owns a 14-13 record with the Black Bears.

The Program

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 575-569-41 in 125 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won five conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs 10 times and posted 24 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice - 2004, 2009.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 45 All-Americans (125 total honors), while 40 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.

► Game Notes

• The Tribe limited Maine to just 342 total yards of offense but managed 199 yards of its own and converted on just one of its three trips into the red zone

• Although Maine narrowly outgained W&M on the ground (150-142), the Black Bears held a 192-57 advantage through the air

• While UM was 5 of 16 on third down, the Tribe converted on just 3 of its 16 third downs

• Both teams were heavily penalized, as Maine (10-92) and W&M (8-95) were flagged for more than 90 yards
• The Tribe was penalized just one time for 15 yards, while UD was whistled for just four penalties for 25 yards

• Although Maine's Josh Mack totaled a game-high 99 yards on the ground, it was more than 47 yards fewer than his nation-leading average entering the contest

• True freshman defensive tackle Will Kiely earned his first career start, becoming W&M's fifth true freshman to start a game this season

• With his 1.5 TFL, Gavin Johnson has recorded at least 1.0 TFL in five straight games

• Punter Will Michael converted a fourth-and-6 at the W&M 29 with a 12-yard run on a fake punt during the second quarter

• W&M fell to 7-6 all-time vs. Maine and to 4-3 in Orono

Tribe Falls at Maine, 23-6

Orono, Maine - The William & Mary football team fell at Maine, 23-6, on Oct. 28, 2017.

W&M (2-6, 0-5) jumped out to a 3-0 lead on a 41-yard field goal by Kris Hooper early in the first quarter but was outscored 23-3 during the remainder of the contest.

The Tribe limited Maine (4-3, 3-3) to just 342 total yards of offense but managed 199 yards of its own and converted on just one of its three trips into the red zone.

W&M trailed by just a touchdown, 13-6, entering the fourth quarter after Hooper connected on a 25-yard field goal late in the third stanza, but UM closed the game with 10 unanswered points. Tailback Josh Mack provided the first score on a 2-yard touchdown run with 13:43 showing, while Brandon Briggs connected on his third field goal of the game – a 23-yard kick – with 8:13 remaining.

Safety Corey Parker led the Tribe defensively with a team-high 12 tackles, while defensive tackle Bill Murray posted seven stops, 2.0 sacks and a forced fumble.

Defensive end Gavin Johnson also posted a half sack with 1.5 TFL, while defensive end Matt Ahola registered a half sack.

Although Maine narrowly outgained W&M on the ground (150-142), the Black Bears held a 192-57 advantage through the air.

While UM was 5 of 16 on third down, the Tribe converted on just 3 of its 16 third downs.

Both teams were heavily penalized, as Maine (10-92) and W&M (8-95) were flagged for more than 90 yards.

Mack led Maine with 99 yards on 24 carries with a touchdown, while quarterback Chris Ferguson completed 13 of 22 passes for 192 yards and threw a 9-yard touchdown pass to Drew Belcher late in the second quarter.

Earnes Edwards was the Black Bears' leading receiver with three catches for 66 yards.

Jaron Grayer led UM defensively with 12 tackles, while Ster Sheffield totaled seven tackles and a sack.

Series History

Saturday's contest against Maine will mark the 14th meeting between the two schools, as W&M currently controls the all-time series, 7-6.

The Tribe won the first five meetings versus the Black Bears before Maine earned its first victory in the series in 2002. UM has won the last four meetings, as the Tribe's last victory in the series came in 2010 in Orono.

Although the teams were scheduled to play in 2003, the game was cancelled due Hurricane Isabel. Maine was awarded a victory, while no contest was credited to W&M.

Team Notes

Welcome Back

Saturday's contest will mark the 90th homecoming in the Tribe's football history. Traditionally, the squad has thrived on this special weekend, as the program sports a 52-37 all-time

record in homecoming games. W&M has greeted its alumni with dominating performances, as the program has won 13 of its last 19 homecoming tilts, including 10 by double-digit margins. Offensively, the team is averaging 28.3 points per contest during the span (537 points).

The W&M faithful have only left Zable unhappy eight times in the last 27 homecoming events (1997, 1998, 2006, 2007, 2011, 2012, 2014, 2017), while four of those six losses were to teams ranked in the national top five (No. 1 Villanova in 1997, No. 4 UMass in 2006, No. 5 Villanova in 2014 and No. 1 James Madison in 2017).

An alum, head coach Jimmie Laycock has excelled in front of the home crowd, as he sports a 24-14 all-time homecoming record.

The Tribe's first homecoming game was held in 1926, a 14-0 win over George Washington University.

Winning at Zable Stadium

W&M has posted tremendous success at Zable Stadium in recent years and owns a 20-10 record at home since the start of the 2013 season, which represents a 66.7 winning percentage.

W&M's recent undefeated regular-season home records came in 2015, 2010, 2009 & 2004.

Blocking Kicks

With four blocks this season, W&M currently ranks seventh nationally.

Defensive tackle Bill Murray has posted three of those blocks, as he ranks tied for second in the country.

Challenging Slate

In addition to opening its slate with three consecutive road games, W&M's 2018 schedule includes eight teams that have been nationally ranked this season.

Importance of Getting Ahead

W&M owns a 2-0 record when scoring first this season, while it is 0-4 in games in which the opposition scores first.

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 21-10 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 11-23 when the opponent scores first.

Impressive Comeback Win

W&M's impressive comeback win against Albany earlier this season marked the 18th time in head coach Jimmye Laycock's career that the Tribe rallied to win after trailing by a double-digit margin in the second half.

The win marked the biggest fourth-quarter comeback since 2005 when W&M overcame a 21-point deficit at Northeastern.

Since 1970, the Tribe has rallied back from double-digit second half deficits 22 times - a complete list of those wins is below.

W&M's depth chart currently features 24 underclassmen, while the Tribe's entire roster includes just six seniors.

True Freshmen

Four true freshmen have played this season - offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal, offensive lineman Marcus Crowell, defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant and linebacker Jack Erwin.

Dating back through 2014, 17 true freshmen have played for the Tribe (2017 - 5; 2016 - 4; 2014 - 4).

Importance of Leading at Halftime

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 14 of its last 17 games when leading at halftime. The only setbacks have come against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018).

Holding on to Leads

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 28-3 record when leading after three quarters.



With 247 career victories, head coach Jimmye Laycock ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 255.

The three losses came against Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

Limiting Penalties

W&M has ranked among the country's top 10 least penalized teams seven straight years.

W&M currently ranks 25th in fewest penalties per game (5.2) and 13th in fewest penalty yards per game (38.8).

The W&M athletic department's unofficial slogan - "One Tribe, One Family" - is especially true for the Tribe football team, as the roster features a pair of brother tandems - Josh/Justin Dulaney and Collin/Corey Parker.

Historical Success in Close Games

Since taking over the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmye Laycock's squads have played in 70 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced success in those contests, totaling an impressive 38-30-2 record.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.

#LaycockLegacy

Prior to the start of preseason camp, legendary head coach Jimmye Laycock announced the 2018 campaign would be his final season on the Tribe sidelines.

Currently in his 39th season at W&M, Laycock is the nation's longest-tenured Division I head football coach and ranks second in career wins among all active DI coaches with



247 victories.

Far and away W&M's all-time leader in career wins, Laycock's remarkable career accomplishments include 10 NCAA Playoff appearances, five conference titles and 24 winning seasons. Additionally, he guided W&M to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) semifinals twice – 2004 and 2009 – and finished a season with a national ranking 13 different times.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M, while 40 former Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts since he took the helm in 1980.

Laycock's connection with the NFL doesn't end there, as his remarkable influence is also evident in his impressive and vast coaching tree that extends into the highest levels of football. Two of his former players are currently head coaches in the NFL – Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Laycock's impressive coaching tree also includes current Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn, who served as an assistant on W&M's staff in 1994.

W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during six of the last eight seasons - Jonathan Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013), John Carpenter (2014) and DeVonte Dedmon (2015).

Captains

The Tribe is led by a trio of senior captains this season – junior linebacker Nate Atkins, senior cornerback Raeshawn Smith and senior wide receiver Jack Armstrong. Atkins will have the opportunity to become just the 12th player in the program's long and storied history to be selected as a two-time team captain if he garners the distinction again next season.

Tribe in the NFL

The Tribe was well represented in NFL training camps this summer, as seven former players were on active rosters – Chris Durant (Chargers), Connor Hilland (Dolphins), DeAndre

Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jets), Luke Rhodes (Colts), B.W. Webb (Giants) and Jerry Ugokwe (Buccaneers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches – Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers – Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

Tribe NFL Draft Picks

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

Below are a few notes about W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009.

- Leads the CAA and ranks second in the FCS, behind only Montana (7)
- Ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia Tech and Virginia)
- Is more than ACC member Duke (4)

It's A Winner

In his 38 full seasons at W&M, head coach Jimmye Laycock has secured 24 winning seasons.

The achievement is remarkable when considering the program had just seven winning seasons in the previous 30 years (1950 – 1979) prior to his taking control of the program for the 1980 season.

Limiting Turnovers

In addition to not committing any turnovers at Towson last Saturday, W&M has surrendered just one turnover during the last two games.

Rotger Makes Collegiate Debut

Sophomore quarterback Dean Rotger made his collegiate debut when he entered the game late in the third quarter at Towson last Saturday and completed 12 of 18 passes for 92 yards.

Quick Strike Offense

Seven of W&M's 10 scoring drives this season have lasted less than 2:30.

Big Plays Through the Air

Although W&M has posted just one run of at least 15 yards this season, which came on a fake punt, it has found success with big plays through the air and recorded seven passing plays longer than 40 yards - including two longer than 70 yards.

True Freshman on the OL

W&M has played two true freshmen on the offensive line this season - Colby Sorsdal and Marcus Crowell. The duo joins Cody Morris (2003) as the only W&M true freshmen offensive lineman to play dating back through 1983.

Fourth Down Conversions

W&M has converted on seven of its 13 fourth down attempts this season.

Additionally, W&M's 13 attempts on fourth down are nearly as many as it attempted all of last season (15).

Ground Game Production is Key

Since 2011, W&M's ability to run the ball well has been indicative of its overall success. The Tribe has averaged 190.6 rushing yards per game in its 39 wins (7,433) rushing yards), while it has averaged just 125.8 yards per game on the ground in its 47 losses (5,913 rushing yards).

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 76 times and posted a 71-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 25-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 9-23 mark in such contests.

Team Defensive Notes

Defensive/Special Teams Scores

With linebacker Arman Jones' 71-yard return for a touchdown on a blocked field goal at Towson, W&M has now posted a defensive or special teams touchdown during 11 of the last 12 seasons.

Additionally, W&M entered the fall having recorded a pick-six in four of the last five seasons.

Tough Defense at Zable

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.2 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

Fourth Down Stops

W&M currently ranks 10th nationally in fourth down defense, allowing conversions just 25.0 percent of the time.

Third Down Stops

W&M has been effective getting stops on third down the last three weeks and is holding opponents to just a 32.5 percent conversion percentage (13 of 40) during the span.

Tough to Score Through the Air

In addition to holding opponents without a passing touchdown in three games this season - including two of the last three - W&M has allowed just four scoring strikes through the air all season.

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 28 games, just five opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

Forcing Turnovers

After forcing just 10 turnovers all of last season, W&M has recorded nine turnovers through the first six games - five fumbles and four interceptions.

Additionally, the Tribe has forced at least one turnover in four of the six games this season.

Just One Senior

Although W&M's defense features seven returning starters - including an eighth with significant starting experience - the Tribe's two deep includes just two seniors (cornerback Raeshawn Smith and linebacker Josh Dulaney).

Shutting Down the Pass

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 131 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just eight times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

Consistency at MLB

A total of just five players have accounted for 133 of 136 starts at MLB during the past 12 seasons. Junior standout Nate Atkins, who enters his third season as a starter, added his name to that list in 2016.

Shutout History

The Tribe has posted 15 shutouts during the Laycock era, with more than a third of them (six) having come since 2009.

39th Season

Career Record: 247-193-2 (.561)

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock, who has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Laycock's legendary career, which includes 39 seasons as W&M's head coach, will conclude at the end of the 2018 campaign as he announced his retirement in August.

Laycock is the nation's longest tenured active Division I head coach and entered the 2018 season ranked second in wins among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches with 245 victories. Laycock also entered the fall ranked second all-time among conference head coaches

in league wins (109), while the Tribe has appeared in 19 postseason contests and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals twice under his direction.

The success has led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$28 million Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed in 2016.

On June 21, 2008, the university dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides W&M with one of the finest facilities in the FCS.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 124-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement.

When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the Tribe would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 37 seasons.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With seven all-league recognitions in 2017, the Tribe has produced an astounding 255 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011.

Since 2009, W&M has produced six NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech).

During Laycock's tenure, 40 Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts, including seven who were with teams this summer.

In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) was hired as the Buffalo Bills head coach in January, 2017, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and previously held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, Michael Clemons ('87) was one of the CFL's most explosive players after a brief stint in the NFL and currently holds the position of Special Advisor for the Toronto Argonauts.

As a 1970 graduate of W&M, Laycock played football under two legends of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco 49ers.

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deidre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at W&M. They have three children: Michael, a Captain in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a recent graduate of Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail and Nolan.
