The Game

William & Mary will look to build off the momentum generated in its exciting comeback victory against Albany last weekend when it plays at No. 17/18 Towson on Saturday at 4 p.m. The conference matchup will mark the first of four consecutive games against nationally ranked teams on W&M's slate. W&M wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon posted seven catches for 138 yards with two touchdowns in the win against UA and ranks third in the CAA in receiving yards per game (98.4). Towson leads the CAA in total offense (477.2) and ranks second in scoring offense (39.4). TU quarterback Tom Flacco is averaging a league-best 296.4 passing yards per game with 14 touchdown passes.

The Series

Saturday's game will mark the 15th meeting between W&M and Towson, as the Tribe won the initial seven meetings before losing five of the last eight matchups. The Tribe owns a 4-2 record against the Tigers in Towson.

The Coaches

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M '70) owns a career record of 247-192-2 and is in his 39th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 247 wins rank second nationally among all active Division-I coaches, while his 110 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- Towson: Rob Ambrose (Towson '93) is in his 10th season at Towson and owns a 56-55 record with the Tigers.

The Program

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 575-568-41 in 125 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won five conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs 10 times and posted 24 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice - 2004, 2009.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 45 All-Americans (125 total honors), while 40 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.

• W&M outgained TU, 316-238, and limited the Tigers to just 12 first downs.

• TU capitalized on pair of Tribe turnovers that created short fields and punt return for a score, as the Tigers' four touchdown drives combined to cover just 61 total yards

• QB Tommy McKee accounted for both of W&M's scores, as he threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to TE Nick Muse late in the first quarter and rushed for a touchdown on a 3-yard scamper midway through the second quarter

• W&M held the TU to just 98 yards on the ground and dominated the time of possession by nearly 10 minutes (34:25-25:35)

• Both teams struggled to convert third downs – W&M (3 of 13), TU (3 of 12)

• W&M was penalized just once for 5 yards

• McKee completed 10 of his first 11 passes for 98 yards and touchdown

• Muse's 5-yard touchdown catch with 4:49 left in the second quarter was the first of his career

• W&M lost for just the second time in the last 15 games in which it led at halftime; other instance came at Towson in 2016

• W&M outgained TU in the first half, 204-65, and dominated the time of possession (21:40-8:20)

Tribe Falls to Towson on Senior Day, 26-14

Williamsburg, Va. - The William & Mary football team held Towson to just 238 yards of total offense but fell to the Tigers, 26-14, on Senior Day at Zable Stadium.

W&M (2-8, 0-7) owned a narrow lead at halftime, 14-12, but was held scoreless during final 30 minutes of action as Towson (4-6, 2-5) pulled away with a pair of touchdowns during the fourth quarter.

TU capitalized on pair of Tribe turnovers that created short fields and punt return for a score, as the Tigers' four touchdown drives combined to cover just 61 total yards.

W&M outgained TU, 316-238, and limited the Tigers to just 12 first downs.

Quarterback Tommy McKee accounted for both of W&M's scores, as he threw a 5-yard touchdown pass to tight end Nick Muse late in the first quarter and rushed for a touchdown on a 3-yard scamper midway through the second quarter.

Tailback Albert Funderburke rushed for a game-high 58 yards on 13 carries, while wideout Daniel Kuzjak totaled a team-best four catches for 47 yards.

Linebacker Nate Atkins totaled a team-high nine tackles, while linebacker Josh Dulaney and defensive tackle Isaiah Stephens both posted seven stops apiece. Dulaney added a sack, 1.5 TFL and a PBU while Stephens' stat line included a TFL and a half sack.

Defensive tackle Will Kiely also came up big with six tackles, 1.5 TFL and a half sack, while cornerback Aaron Swinton added an interception.

In addition to outgaining the Tigers by 78 yards, held the TU to just 98 yards on the ground and dominated the time of possession by nearly 10 minutes (34:25-25:35).

Both teams struggled to convert third downs – W&M (3 of 13), TU (3 of 12) – while the Tribe also was unable to convert both of its fourth down attempts, including one on a fourth-and-1 at the Tigers' 5-yards line early in the second quarter.

W&M was penalized just once for 5 yards.

Tailback Kobe Young led Towson with 52 yards on 11 carries with a touchdown, while quarterback Ryan Stover and tight end Ellis Knudson both rushed for scores.

Defensive back Coby Tippet provided the Tigers other score with a 62-yard punt return for a touchdown midway through the first quarter, while he totaled a team-high 14 tackles defensively.

Series History

Saturday's game will mark the 15th meeting between W&M and Towson, as the Tribe won the initial seven meetings before losing five of the last eight matchups.

The Tribe owns a 4-2 record against the Tigers in Towson.

Clear Winner

Many of the previous contests between W&M and Towson have been lopsided, as 10 of the 14 meetings have been decided by at least 10 points. Overall, W&M has outscored the Tigers by an average margin of 29.1 - 17.4 (408-272).

Stopping the Run is Key

A key to earning a victory against Towson has been stopping the Tigers' rushing attack. In W&M's nine victories against Towson, it has allowed just 111.1 rushing yards per game (1,000 yards). Conversely, the Tribe has allowed 218.2 yards per game on the ground in its five losses to Towson (1,091 yards).

Additionally, Towson totaled just one rushing touchdown in its first six matchups versus W&M as league foes, which were all Tribe victories.

Team Notes

Impressive Comeback Win

W&M's impressive comeback win against Albany last weekend marked the 18th time in head coach Jimmye Laycock's career that the Tribe rallied to win after trailing by a double-digit margin in the second half.

The win marked the biggest fourth-quarter comeback since 2005 when W&M overcame a 21-point deficit at Northeastern.

Since 1970, the Tribe has rallied back from double-digit second half deficits 22 times - a complete list of those wins is below.

Challenging Slate

In addition to opening its slate with three consecutive road games, W&M's schedule includes eight nationally ranked teams.

This week's matchup at No. 17/18 Towson is the first of four consecutive games against ranked teams.

Underclassmen Playing a Big Role

W&M's depth chart currently features 24 underclassmen, while the Tribe's entire roster includes just six seniors.

True Freshmen

Four true freshmen have played this season - offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal, offensive lineman Marcus Crowell, defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant and linebacker Jack Erwin.

Dating back through 2014, 17 true freshmen have played for the Tribe (2017 - 5; 2016 - 4; 2014 - 4).

Importance of Getting Ahead

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 21-10 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 11-22 when the opponent scores first.

Importance of Leading at Halftime

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 14 of its last 16 games when leading at halftime. The only setbacks have come against Towson (2016, 2017).

Holding on to Leads

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 28-3 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

Limiting Penalties

W&M has ranked among the country's top 10 least penalized teams seven straight years.

W&M currently ranks 19th in fewest penalties per game (5.0) and 15th in fewest penalty yards per game (38.8).

One Tribe, One Family

The W&M athletic department's unofficial slogan - "One Tribe, One Family" - is especially true for the Tribe football team, as the roster features a pair of brother tandems - Josh/Justin Dulaney and Collin/Corey Parker.

Winning at Zable Stadium

W&M has posted tremendous success at Zable Stadium in recent years and owns a 20-10 record at home since the start of the 2013 season, which represents a 66.7 winning percentage.



With 247 career victories, head coach Jimmie Laycock ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 255.

W&M's recent undefeated regular-season home records came in 2015, 2010, 2009 & 2004.

Historical Success in Close Games

Since taking over the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmie Laycock's squads have played in 70 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced success in those contests, totaling an impressive 38-30-2 record.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.

#LaycockLegacy

Prior to the start of preseason camp, legendary head coach Jimmie Laycock announced the 2018 campaign would be his final season on the Tribe sidelines.

Currently in his 39th season at W&M, Laycock is the nation's longest-tenured Division I head football coach and ranks second in career wins among all active DI coaches with 247 victories.

Far and away W&M's all-time leader in career wins, Laycock's remarkable career accomplishments include 10 NCAA Playoff appearances, five conference titles and 24 winning seasons. Additionally, he guided W&M to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) semifinals twice - 2004 and 2009 - and finished a season with a national ranking 13 different times.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M, while 40 former Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts since he took the helm in 1980.

Laycock's connection with the NFL doesn't end there, as his remarkable influence is also evident in his impressive and vast coaching tree that extends into the highest levels of football. Two of his former players are currently head coaches in the NFL - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Laycock's impressive coaching tree also includes current Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn, who served as an assistant on W&M's staff in 1994.

W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during six of the last eight seasons - Jonathan

Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013), John Carpenter (2014) and DeVonte Dedmon (2015).

Captains

The Tribe is led by a trio of senior captains this season - junior linebacker Nate Atkins, senior cornerback Raeshawn Smith and senior wide receiver Jack Armstrong. Atkins will have the opportunity to become just the 12th player in the program's long and storied history to be selected as a two-time team captain if he garners the distinction again next season.

Tribe in the NFL

The Tribe was well represented in NFL training camps this summer, as seven former players were on active rosters - Chris Durant (Chargers), Connor Hilland (Dolphins), DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jets), Luke Rhodes (Colts), B.W. Webb (Giants) and Jerry Ugokwe (Buccaneers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

Tribe NFL Draft Picks

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

Below are a few notes about W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009.

- Leads the CAA and ranks second in the FCS, behind only Montana (7)
- Ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia Tech and Virginia)
- Is more than ACC member Duke (4)

Bouncing Back

Under coach Laycock, W&M has historically bounced back from seasons in which it failed to post a winning record (W&M was 2-9 last season), as the Tribe has registered consecutive losing seasons just four times during the past 36 years.

It's A Winner

In his 38 full seasons at W&M, head coach Jimmy Laycock has secured 24 winning seasons.

The achievement is remarkable when considering the program had just seven winning seasons in the previous 30 years (1950 - 1979) prior to his taking control of the program for the 1980 season.

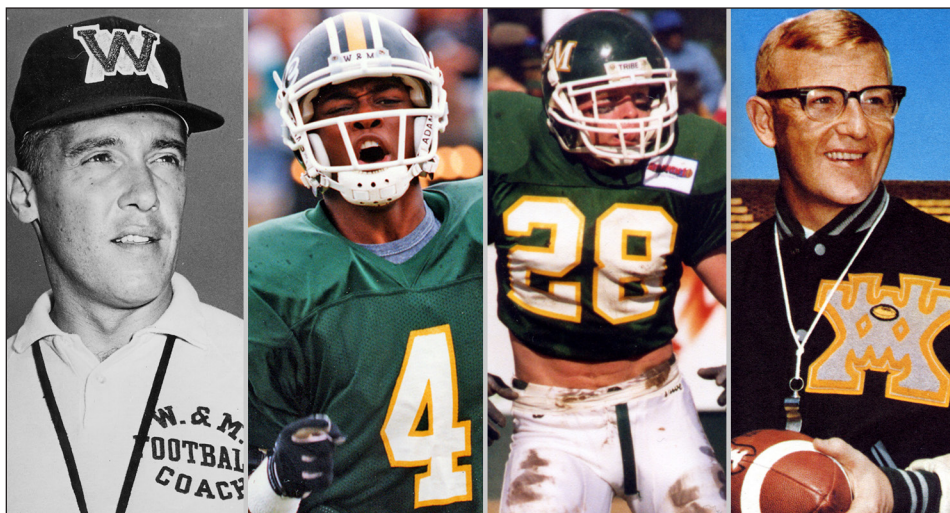

Mike Tomlin, Sean McDermott, Marv Levy and Lou Holtz all have ties to W&M. Tomlin (1990-94), a wide receiver, and McDermott (1993-97), a safety, are both former team captains, while Levy (1964-68) and Holtz (1969-71) both served as head coaches.

Dedmon is Back

After suffering a season-ending injury in the opener at Virginia last fall, standout wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon made a tremendous impact this fall.

In addition posting three 100-yard receiving games, he ranks among the CAA's top 10 in receptions per game (5.8), receiving yards per game (98.4), yards per catch (17.0) and all-purpose yards (101.6).

Three of Dedmon's four touchdown catches have covered at least 50 yards (50, 59, 75).

A two-time All-CAA selection and former CAA Special Teams Player of the Year, Dedmon is one of the nation's most talented and electric playmakers.

No Sophomore Slump for Mitchell

After becoming W&M's first true freshman to start at quarterback since 1975 last season, Mitchell has made tremendous progress this fall as the Tribe's full-time starter under center and has passed for more than 250 yards in three games.

Quick Strike Offense

Seven of W&M's nine scoring drives this season have lasted less than 2:30.

Big Plays Through the Air

Although W&M has posted just one run of at least 15 yards this season, which came on a fake punt, it has found success with big plays through the air and recorded seven passing plays longer than 40 yards - including two longer than 70 yards.

True Freshman on the OL

W&M has played two true freshman on the offensive line this season - Colby Sorsdal and Marcus Crowell. The duo joins Cody Morris (2003) as the only W&M true freshmen offensive lineman to play dating back through 1983.

Fourth Down Conversions

W&M has converted on six of its 11 fourth down attempts this season.

Additionally, W&M's 11 attempts on fourth down are nearly as many as it attempted all of last season (15).

Ground Game Production is Key

Since 2011, W&M's ability to run the ball well has been indicative of its overall success. The Tribe has averaged 190.6 rushing yards per game in its 39 wins (7,433 rushing yards), while it has averaged just 127.0 yards per game on the ground in its 46 losses (5,843 rushing yards).

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 76 times and posted a 71-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 25-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 9-22 mark in such contests.

Team Defensive Notes

Shutting Down a Prolific Passing Attack

Although Albany entered last week's game averaging 295.5 passing yards per game, W&M held the Great Danes to just 131 yards through the air.

The impressive effort marked the second time this season that W&M has held an opponent to fewer than 150 passing yards.

Third Down Stops

W&M has been effective getting stops on third down the last two weeks and is holding opponents to just a 36.7 percent conversion percentage (11 of 30) during the span.



Tough to Score Through the Air

In addition to holding opponents without a passing touchdown in three games this season - including each of the last two - W&M has allowed just three scoring strikes through the air all season.

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 27 games, just five opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

A Closer Look

Although W&M has allowed 33.0 points per game, it does not fully represent the Tribe's production defensively. In addition to a pair of pick-sixes by the opposition, 42 percent of the opponents' scoring drives have started inside W&M's 36-yard line (13/18).

Forcing Turnovers

After forcing just 10 turnovers all of last season, W&M has recorded nine turnovers through the first five games - five fumbles and four interceptions.

Additionally, the Tribe has forced at least one turnover in four of the five games this season.

Tackles for a Loss

After totaling just 8.0 TFL through the first three games, W&M's defense posted 14.0 TFL during the last two weeks.

Just One Senior

Although W&M's defense features seven returning starters - including an eighth with significant starting experience - the Tribe's two deep includes just two seniors (cornerback Raeshawn Smith and linebacker Josh Dulaney).

Shutting Down the Pass

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 130 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just eight times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

Consistency at MLB

A total of just five players have accounted for 132 of 135 starts at MLB during the past 12 seasons. Junior standout Nate Atkins, who enters his third season as a starter, added his name to that list in 2016.

Defensive/Special Teams Scores

W&M entered the 2018 campaign having recorded a defensive or special teams touchdown during 10 of the last 11 seasons.

Additionally, W&M entered the fall having recorded a pick-six in four of the last five seasons.

Impressive Efforts

Since the start of the 2011 season, W&M has held opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense in 30.2 percent of its games (26 times in 86 games). The Tribe has posted a 21-5 record in those contests, with its only losses coming vs. Towson (2017), at Delaware (2017), vs. Elon (2016) at Maryland (2012) and at Rhode Island (2011).

Tough Defense at Zable

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games

since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.2 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 51 games (928 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 34-17 record at home during that span.

Shutout History

The Tribe has posted 15 shutouts during the Laycock era, with more than a third of them (six) having come since 2009.

William & Mary Head Coach Jimmye Laycock

39th Season

Career Record: 247-192-2 (.562)

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock, who has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Laycock's legendary career, which includes 39 seasons as W&M's head coach, will conclude at the end of the 2018 campaign as he announced his retirement in August.

Laycock is the nation's longest tenured active Division I head coach and entered the 2018 season ranked second in wins among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches with 245 victories. Laycock also entered the fall ranked second all-time among conference head coaches

in league wins (109), while the Tribe has appeared in 19 postseason contests and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals twice under his direction.

The success has led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$28 million Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed in 2016.

On June 21, 2008, the university dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides W&M with one of the finest facilities in the FCS.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 124-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement.

When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the Tribe would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 37 seasons.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With seven all-league recognitions in 2017, the Tribe has produced an astounding 255 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011.

Since 2009, W&M has produced six NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech).

During Laycock's tenure, 40 Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts, including seven who were with teams this summer.

In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) was hired as the Buffalo Bills head coach in January, 2017, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and previously held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, Michael Clemons ('87) was one of the CFL's most explosive players after a brief stint in the NFL and currently holds the position of Special Advisor for the Toronto Argonauts.

As a 1970 graduate of W&M, Laycock played football under two legends of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco 49ers.

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deidre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at W&M. They have three children: Michael, a Captain in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a recent graduate of Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail and Nolan.
