The Game

After 39 seasons as the head coach at William & Mary, Jimmye Laycock will coach his final game when the Tribe (4-5, 3-3) hosts long-time rival Richmond (3-7, 1-6) for Senior Day at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 2 p.m. With last week's win at Villanova, Laycock earned his 249th career victory and is tied for 24th on college football's all-time wins list with Lou Holtz, who coached Laycock as a player at W&M in 1969. On hand to honor the #LaycockLegacy this Saturday will be several hundred of his former players and teammates, who will be recognized on the field at halftime.

The Series

Saturday's game between William & Mary and Richmond will mark the 129th meeting between the two schools in what has been traditionally called the "Oldest Rivalry in the South" — but may more accurately be described as the most PLAYED rivalry in the south. The Tribe leads the all-time series 62-61-5. The teams first met in 1898, when Richmond blanked W&M, 15-0. Only three other Division I series have a longer history than that of W&M vs. UR.

The Coaches

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M '70) owns a career record of 249-193-2 and is in his 39th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 249 wins rank second nationally among all active Division-I coaches, while his 112 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- Richmond: Russ Huesman (Chattanooga '81) is in his second season at UR and owns a 9-12 record with the Spiders.

The Program

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 577-570-41 in 125 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won five conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs 10 times and posted 24 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice - 2004, 2009.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 45 All-Americans (125 total honors), while 40 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.

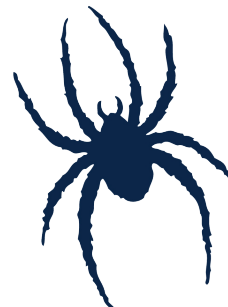

► Game Notes

• The Tribe rallied back from a 10-point deficit to tie the score at 20-20 early in the fourth quarter but fell after a 1-yard game-winning TD run by UR QB Kyle Lauletta with 3:59 remaining

• UR outgained the Tribe, 423-280. While the Spiders owned a narrow edge on the ground (202-187) it piled up a significant advantage through the air (221-93) and averaged 17.0 yards per completion

• All four of UR's touchdown drives covered more than 70 yards, while only one of W&M's scoring marches was longer than 43 yards

• W&M won the turnover battle (2-0) and did not commit a turnover for just the second time during the 2017 season

• UR tailback Xavier Goodall was named the game's Most Valuable Player after rushing for 180 yards on 23 carries with two touchdowns

• W&M limited Lauletta to just 221 passing yards, which was 130.6 fewer than his season average entering the contest

• Richmond became just the second W&M opponent to record more than 400 yards of total offense this season

• W&M totaled 3.0 sacks to increase its season total to 33, which ranks seventh on the program's single-season list

• The Tribe owns a 62-61-5 edge in the all-time series despite the loss

Tribe's Comeback Bid Falls Short at Richmond, 27-20

Richmond, Va. - The William & Mary football team rallied back from a 10-point deficit in the second half but fell at Richmond, 27-20, in the 128th meeting between the two programs in both teams' season finale.

UR (6-5, 4-4) quarterback Kyle Lauletta provided the game-winning score when he found the end zone from 1-yard out with 3:59 remaining in the fourth quarter. The touchdown capped a 14-play, 75-yard drive that lasted 7:13 and was aided by a pass interference penalty on a third-and-14 from W&M's 15-yard line.

The Tribe (2-9, 0-8) utilized a pair of interceptions – coming from defensive end Gavin Johnson and linebacker Nate Atkins – to rally back from a 20-10 deficit late in the third quarter. McKee narrowed the margin to 20-17 with a 6-yard touchdown run with no time remaining in the third quarter, while placekicker Kris Hooper made a 31-yard field goal with 11:12 left to knot the score. The pair of scoring drives combined to cover just 65 yards, as both interceptions gave W&M possession in UR territory.

W&M drove to the Spiders' 44-yard line on its final possession following Lauletta's touchdown but turned the ball over on downs when McKee was sacked for a 10-yard loss on a fourth-and-10 with 1:58 remaining. UR was then able to run out the clock.

McKee scored both of the Tribe's touchdowns, as he posted scoring runs of 1 yard and 6 yards during the third quarter.

Hooper accounted for the remainder of W&M's points, as he connected on two of his three field goal attempts.

Running back Nate Evans finished with 81 rushing yards on 16 carries and a team-high 127 all-purpose yards.

Linebacker Arman Jones led the Tribe with nine tackles and a sack, while Atkins and Johnson both came up big with interceptions that led to points.

UR outgained the Tribe, 423-280. While the Spiders owned a narrow edge on the ground (202-187) it piled up a significant advantage through the air (221-93) and averaged 17.0 yards per completion.

Lauletta completed 13 of 19 passes for 221 yards with a score, while wideout Cortrell Simpson recorded three catches for 121 yards, which included a 74-yard touchdown reception early in the third quarter to give UR a 13-3 lead.

- Be the 578th win the College's history - the program's all-time record stands at 577-570-41 and is in its 125th season of football

Series History

Saturday's game between William & Mary and Richmond will mark the 129th meeting between the two schools in what has been traditionally called the "Oldest Rivalry in the South" – but may more accurately be described as the most PLAYED rivalry in the South. The Tribe leads the all-time series 62-61-5. The teams first met in 1898, when Richmond blanked W&M, 15-0.

Only three other Division I series have a longer history than that of W&M vs. UR.

W&M-UR Recent History

Since the two teams started meeting as conference opponents in 1993, Richmond owns a 14-12 edge. During that stretch, UR owns an 8-6 edge in Richmond while the series is tied, 6-6, in Williamsburg.

In the 26 total games the two have played as conference foes, which includes one playoff matchup in 2015, W&M has

never scored fewer than seven points, while scoring at least 20 on 16 occasions. Conversely, the Spiders have failed to score 21 points 12 times, and have been held to less than 10 in three contests.

Since 1993, the two squads have only played seven games decided by three points or less (W&M is 4-3 in such contests). Conversely, 17 of the games during the same span have been decided by double-digit margins (UR owns an 9-8 edge in such games).

There will be three familiar faces on the Richmond sidelines this Saturday, as UR head coach Russ Huesman, defensive coordinator Adam Braithwaite and recruiting coordinator Dave Legg all have ties to W&M.

Braithwaite played defensive back at W&M from 1997-01 and later returned as an assistant during the 2004 season in which the Tribe advanced to the NCAA Semifinals.

Legg posted an extended run on the Tribe staff, as he worked with the team's outside linebackers from 1991-1994.

Did You Know?

A win by William & Mary on Saturday would give Tribe Head Coach Jimmye Laycock 23 career wins against the Spiders. The number would represent more than one third of the school's all-time win total in the 129-game series (63).

While Laycock has been a fixture on W&M's sidelines since the 1980 season, Richmond's second-year head coach Russ Huesman is the ninth different Spider head coach the Tribe has faced during Laycock's tenure.

Team Notes

Nearing a Milestone

With 249 career victories, Head Coach Jimmye Laycock enters his final game at W&M as the 24th all-time winningest coach in college football history. Interestingly, he is tied with his former college coach at W&M, Lou Holtz.

Laycock currently ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 257 career wins.

#LaycockLegacy

Saturday's game will mark the end of Laycock's remarkable 39-year tenure as W&M's head football coach. Prior to the start of preseason camp, he announced the 2018 campaign would be his final season on the Tribe sidelines.

Currently in his 39th season at W&M, Laycock is the nation's longest-tenured Division I head football coach and ranks second in career wins among all active DI coaches with 249 victories.

Far and away W&M's all-time leader in career wins, Laycock's remarkable career accomplishments include 10 NCAA Playoff appearances, five conference titles and 24 winning seasons. Additionally, he guided W&M to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) semifinals twice – 2004 and 2009 – and finished a season with a national ranking 13 different times.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M, while 40 former Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts since he took the helm in 1980.

Laycock's connection with the NFL doesn't end there, as his remarkable influence is also evident in his impressive and vast coaching tree that extends into the highest levels of football. Two of his former players are currently head coaches in the NFL – Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Laycock's impressive coaching tree also includes current Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn, who served as an assistant on W&M's staff in 1994.

Winning the Close Ones

W&M owns a 4-0 record in games decided by a touchdown or less this season. Conversely, the Tribe is 0-5 in contests with margins of more than a touchdown.

Blocking Kicks

With five blocks this season, W&M currently ranks 12th nationally.

Defensive tackle Bill Murray has posted three of those blocks, as he ranks tied for fourth in the country.

Winning the Turnover Battle

W&M is 3-0 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents this season, while it is 0-4 then it losses the turnover battle.

The Tribe is 1-1 in games in which it committed the same number of turnovers as its opponent.

Challenging Slate

In addition to opening its slate with three consecutive road games, W&M's 2018 schedule includes eight teams that have been nationally ranked this season.

Importance of Getting Ahead

W&M owns a 3-1 record when scoring first this season, while it is just 1-4 in games in which the opposition scores first.

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 22-11 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 12-23 when the opponent scores first.

Coin Flip

W&M has won the opening coin flip just once this season, coming at Virginia Tech.

Importance of Leading at Halftime

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 15 of its last 18 games when leading at halftime. The only setbacks have come against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018).

Holding on to Leads

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 29-3 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.



Limiting Penalties

W&M has ranked among the country's top 10 least penalized teams seven straight years.

W&M currently ranks 10th in fewest penalties per game (4.6) and 11th in fewest penalty yards per game (38.6).

Impressive Comeback Win

W&M's impressive comeback win against Albany earlier this season marked the 18th time in head coach Jimmie Laycock's career that the Tribe rallied to win after trailing by a double-digit margin in the second half.

The win marked the biggest fourth-quarter comeback since 2005 when W&M overcame a 21-point deficit at Northeastern.

Since 1970, the Tribe has rallied back from double-digit second half deficits 22 times - a complete list of those wins is below.

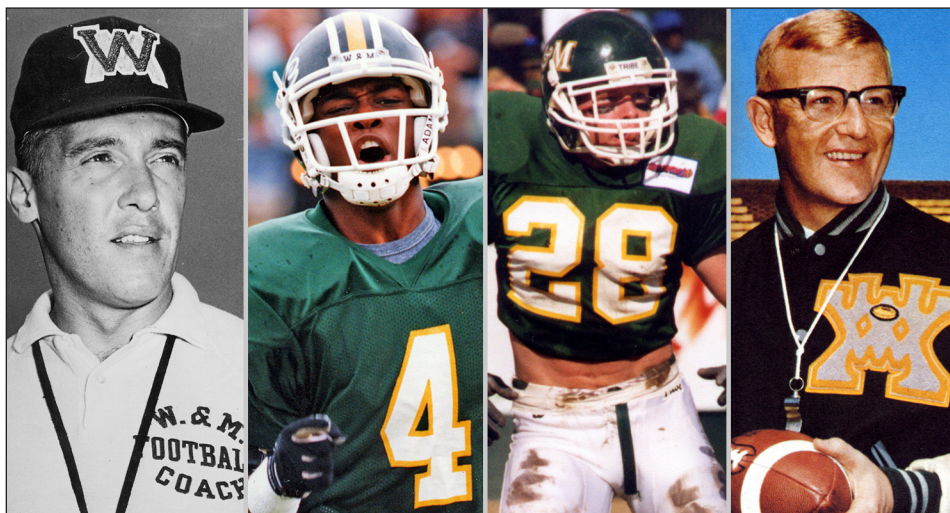

Mike Tomlin, Sean McDermott, Marv Levy and Lou Holtz all have ties to W&M. Tomlin (1990-94), a wide receiver, and McDermott (1993-97), a safety, are both former team captains, while Levy (1964-68) and Holtz (1969-71) both served as head coaches.

Historical Success in Close Games

Since taking over the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmye Laycock's squads have played in 70 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced success in those contests, totaling an impressive 38-30-2 record.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.

W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during six of the last eight seasons - Jonathan Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013), John Carpenter (2014) and DeVonte Dedmon (2015).

Captains

The Tribe is led by a trio of senior captains this season - junior linebacker Nate Atkins, senior cornerback Raeshawn Smith and senior wide receiver Jack Armstrong. Atkins will have the opportunity to become just the 12th player in the program's long and storied history to be selected as a two-time team captain if he garners the distinction again next season.

Tribe in the NFL

The Tribe was well represented in NFL training camps this summer, as seven former players were on active rosters - Chris Durant (Chargers), Connor Hilland (Dolphins), DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jets), Luke Rhodes (Colts), B.W. Webb (Giants) and Jerry Ugokwe (Buccaneers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

Tribe NFL Draft Picks

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

It's A Winner

In his 38 full seasons at W&M, head coach Jimmye Laycock has secured 24 winning seasons.

The achievement is remarkable when considering the program had just seven winning seasons in the previous 30 years (1950 - 1979) prior to his taking control of the program for the 1980 season.

Team Offensive Notes

Dedmon Concludes Exceptional Career

A Williamsburg native, senior wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon will conclude a remarkable career against Richmond at Zable Stadium this Saturday. Although he has overcome multiple injuries throughout his career, he ranks fifth in school history in kickoff return yards (1,324), sixth in all-purpose yards (3,727) and touchdown receptions (19), and ninth in catches (145).

Quick Strike Offense

In addition to its pair of defensive and special teams touchdowns, 70 percent (14-20) of W&M's 20 scoring drives this season have lasted less than 2:30.

Red Zone Success

W&M scored on all four of its trips into the red zone, which included three touchdowns, in the win at Villanova last Saturday.

Big Plays Through the Air

Although W&M has posted just two runs of at least 15 yards this season, it has found success with big plays through the air and recorded 10 passing plays longer than 40 yards - including two longer than 70 yards.

Tight Ends Making an Impact

Of W&M's top four pass catchers this season - in terms of total receptions - two are tight ends. Nick Muse currently ranks second on the team in catches (25), while Tyler Klaus is fourth (15).

Muse's 107 receiving yards in the win against No. 16/20 Maine were the second most by a W&M tight end in the Laycock Era, behind only Drew Atchison's 139 receiving yards vs. Delaware in 2007.

True Freshman on the OL

W&M has played two true freshmen on the offensive line this season - Colby Sorsdal and Marcus Crowell. The duo joins Cody Morris (2003) as the only W&M true freshmen offensive lineman to play dating back through 1983.

Ground Game Production is Key

Although W&M is averaging just 59.2 rushing yards per game in its four wins this season, the stat reverses a recent trend in which running the football well has been instrumental in the Tribe's success.

Since 2011, W&M has averaged 183.9 rushing yards per game in its 41 wins (7,541 rushing yards), while it has averaged just 123.9 yards per game on the ground in its 48 losses (5,950 rushing yards).

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 76 times and posted a 71-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 25-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 10-23 mark in such contests.

Team Defensive Notes

Strong Defensive Efforts

W&M has posted a number of impressive defensive efforts down the stretch this season, as it is allowing just 314.3 total yards per game during the last three contests.

Generating Turnovers

W&M's four forced turnovers in the win at Villanova last Saturday marked the most by the Tribe since forcing the same total against Elon in 2015.

Defensive/Special Teams Scores

With a pair of defensive and special teams touchdowns - both by linebacker Arman Jones - W&M has posted a defensive or special teams touchdown during 11 of the last 12 seasons.

A third touchdown, which is recorded as a defensive score by the NCAA, came at Rhode Island after quarterback Ted Hefter was intercepted by Branyan Javier-Castillo and running back Nate Evans stripped the ball back from the URI linebacker and returned it 71 yards for a touchdown.

Additionally, W&M has recorded a pick-six in five of the last six seasons.

W&M's three non-offensive touchdowns ranks tied for 12th nationally.

Third Down Stops

W&M has been effective getting stops on third down the last six games and is holding opponents to just a 32.9 percent conversion percentage (29 of 88) during the span.

Tough to Score Through the Air

In addition to holding opponents without a passing touchdown in four games this season, W&M has allowed just six scoring strikes through the air all season.

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 31 games, just five opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

Forcing Turnovers

After forcing just 10 turnovers last season, W&M has recorded 17 turnovers this fall.

Additionally, the Tribe has forced at least one turnover in seven of the nine games this season.

Just Two Seniors

Although W&M's defense features seven returning starters - including an eighth with significant starting experience - the Tribe's two deep includes just two seniors (cornerback Raeshawn Smith and linebacker Josh Dulaney).

Shutting Down the Pass

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 134 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just eight times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

Consistency at MLB

A total of just five players have accounted for 136 of 139 starts at MLB during the past 12 seasons. Junior standout Nate Atkins, who enters his third season as a starter, added his name to that list in 2016.

William & Mary Head Coach Jimmye Laycock

39th Season

Career Record: 249-194-2 (.562)

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock, who has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Laycock's legendary career, which includes 39 seasons as W&M's head coach, will conclude at the end of the 2018 campaign as he announced his retirement in August.

Laycock is the nation's longest tenured active Division I head coach and entered the 2018 season ranked second in wins among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches with 245 victories. Laycock also entered the fall ranked second all-time among conference head coaches

in league wins (109), while the Tribe has appeared in 19 postseason contests and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals twice under his direction.

The success has led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$28 million Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed in 2016.

On June 21, 2008, the university dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides W&M with one of the finest facilities in the FCS.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 124-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement.

When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the Tribe would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 37 seasons.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With seven all-league recognitions in 2017, the Tribe has produced an astounding 255 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011.

Since 2009, W&M has produced six NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech).

During Laycock's tenure, 40 Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts, including seven who were with teams this summer.

In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) was hired as the Buffalo Bills head coach in January, 2017, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and previously held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, Michael Clemons ('87) was one of the CFL's most explosive players after a brief stint in the NFL and currently holds the position of Special Advisor for the Toronto Argonauts.

As a 1970 graduate of W&M, Laycock played football under two legends of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco 49ers.

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deidre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at W&M. They have three children: Michael, a Captain in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a recent graduate of Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail and Nolan.
