The Game

After earning an exciting 27-20 Homecoming victory against then-No. 16/20 Maine last weekend, William & Mary (3-4, 2-2) will continue its challenging league slate at Rhode Island on Saturday at noon. Although URI (4-3, 2-2) opened the season by winning four of its first five games en route to earning a top-20 national ranking, the Rams have lost their last two contests. URI boasts one of the league's top passing attacks (245.6/17TD), while W&M's defense has held three of its last four opponents without a passing touchdown.

The Series

Saturday's game will mark the 17th meeting between W&M and Rhode Island, as the Tribe owns a 13-3 all-time record against the Rams. W&M owns a 6-3 mark against URI in Kingston. The Tribe has won four of the last five meetings. In those four victories, W&M has won by an average margin of 18.5 points.

The Coaches

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M '70) owns a career record of 248-193-2 and is in his 39th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 248 wins rank second nationally among all active Division-I coaches, while his 111 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- Rhode Island: Jim Fleming (Univ. of the South '82) is in his fifth season at URI and owns an 11-41 record with the Rams.

The Program

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 576-569-41 in 125 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won five conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs 10 times and posted 24 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice - 2004, 2009.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 45 All-Americans (125 total honors), while 40 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.

► Game Notes

- The 20-0 victory was W&M's first shutout dating back to the second game of the 2010 season; it was the Tribe's first shutout vs. a conference opponent since 2009

- The win marked the second straight game in which W&M did not allow a touchdown

- W&M outgained URI, 316-215, and allowed just 11 first downs

- W&M allowed URI into the red zone just one time

- Of URI's 12 possessions, nine ended with punts

- RB Mikal Abdul-Saboor eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark for the third consecutive game with 108 yards on 26 carries

- RB Jarrell Coopers scored a touchdown on his only carry of the contest with a 28-yard scamper late in the second quarter

- TE Bo Revell's only catch of the contest was a 49-yard touchdown late in the second quarter

- LB Airek Green totaled a career-high 11 tackles with 2.0 TFL and two PBU's

- Much of the contest was played in a steady rain

W&M Blanks Rhode Island, 20-0, in CAA Opener

Williamsburg, Va. - William and Mary extended its winning streak to three games with a 20-0 victory against Rhode Island in its conference opener on a rainy Saturday evening at Zable Stadium.

It marked the Tribe's first shutout since the second game of the 2010 season against VMI, while it was the program's first shutout versus a league opponent since defeating Towson, 31-0, in 2009. Additionally, the impressive effort marked the second consecutive game in which W&M has not allowed a touchdown, as the squad has now surrendered just 37 points through the first four games – the fewest by the program during a season-opening stretch since 1948.

W&M (3-1, 1-0) outgained the Rams (1-3, 1-2), 316-215, and allowed just 11 first downs, while URI managed just one trip inside the red zone and was held to 6-of-18 on third downs.

Sophomore running back Mikal Abdul-Saboor eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark for the third consecutive game with 108 yards on a career-high 26 carries, while junior wide receiver Tre McBride posted eight catches for 87 yards. Junior running back Jarrell Cooper scored on his only carry of the night, a 28-yard scamper late in the second quarter, while junior tight end Bo Revell provided the Tribe's other touchdown with his only reception of the contest, a 49-yard catch on a pass from senior Michael Graham, just moments later.

Junior linebacker Airek Green posted another outstanding performance to lead the defensive corps, totaling a career-high 11 tackles, two tackles for a loss and two PBUs. Senior safety Jerome Couplin III and sophomore linebacker Luke Rhodes also came up big with 10 tackles apiece.

With a steady rain falling, neither team was able to generate much production offensively for the majority of the first half. After both team's missed long field goals early in the contest, Cooper's 28-yard touchdown run with 4:03 remaining in the second quarter gave W&M a 7-0 lead.

Following a quick three-and-out by URI on its ensuing possession, Graham connected with Revell on a 49-yard touchdown strike on the first play of the Tribe's next drive to put the Green and Gold ahead 14-0 with less than three minutes remaining in the opening half.

W&M's defensive unit was dominant in the opening stanza and held the Rams to just 84 yards and four first downs. Abdul-Saboor already had 71 rushing yards on 13 carries, while Graham completed 11-of-17 passes for 118 yards with a touchdown. Much of McBride's production also came in the first half, as he recorded seven catches for 55 yards.

McBride returned the opening kickoff of the second half 64 yards to help set up another W&M score, as junior John Carpenter's 20-yard field goal early in the third quarter capped off a 10-play drive that covered just 26 yards and extended the advantage to 17-0.

The Tribe added another field goal by Carpenter on its next possession. McBride came up big on that scoring drive as well, as his 32-yard reception put W&M inside the red zone.

URI's lone trip into the red zone was halted when Rhodes and junior defensive end Mike Reilly stopped running back Justin Semmes for no gain on a fourth-and-goal from the 2-yard line.

Of the Rams' 12 possessions, nine ended with punts while they were stopped on downs twice and missed a 47-yard field goal.

- Be the 577th win the College's history - the program's all-time record stands at 576-569-41 and is in its 125th season of football

Series History

Saturday's game will mark the 17th meeting between W&M and Rhode Island, as the Tribe owns a 13-3 all-time record against the Rams. W&M owns a 6-3 mark against URI in Kingston.

The Tribe has won four of the last five meetings. In those four victories, W&M has won by an average margin of 18.5 points.

Big Numbers

W&M has squared off against Rhode Island 16 times since the 1993 season, and it has never scored fewer than 20 points in any of those contests.

During the series, W&M is averaging 29.2 points per game (467 total points), while URI is averaging 17.9 points per game (287 total points).

Defense is Key

A key to the Tribe's recent victories against Rhode Island has been its ability to shut down the Rams' offensive attack. In W&M's last three wins versus URI, it has allowed just 199.0 yards per game (55.7 rushing yds/game, 143.3 passing yds/game).

Team Notes

Nearing a Milestone

With 248 career victories, Head Coach Jimmye Laycock currently ranks as the 25th all-time winningest coach in college football history.

With one more win, he will tie his former college coach, Lou Holtz, for 24th on the all-time list.

Laycock currently ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 255 career wins.

Comeback Wins

W&M has overcome second half deficits in both its conference victories this season. After rallying back from 12 points down in the fourth quarter against Albany, W&M overcame a three-point deficit in its win against No. 16/20 Maine.

Blocking Kicks

With four blocks this season, W&M currently ranks 10th nationally.

Defensive tackle Bill Murray has posted three of those blocks, as he ranks tied for second in the country.

Winning the Turnover Battle

W&M is 2-0 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents this season, while it is 0-3 then it losses the turnover battle.

The Tribe is 1-1 in games in which it committed the same number of turnovers as its opponent.

Challenging Slate

In addition to opening its slate with three consecutive road games, W&M's 2018 schedule includes eight teams that have been nationally ranked this season. Additionally, W&M's schedule ranks as the nation's 15th-toughest according to opponent winning percentage.

Importance of Getting Ahead

W&M owns a 2-0 record when scoring first this season, while it is just 1-4 in games in which the opposition scores first.

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 21-10 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 12-23 when the opponent scores first.

Impressive Comeback Win

W&M's impressive comeback win against Albany earlier this season marked the 18th time in head coach Jimmie Laycock's career that the Tribe rallied to win after trailing by a double-digit margin in the second half.

The win marked the biggest fourth-quarter comeback since 2005 when W&M overcame a 21-point deficit at Northeastern.

Since 1970, the Tribe has rallied back from double-digit second half deficits 22 times - a complete list of those wins is below.

W&M's depth chart currently features 26 underclassmen, while the Tribe's entire roster includes just six seniors.

True Freshmen

Four true freshmen have played this season - offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal, offensive lineman Marcus Crowell, defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant and linebacker Jack Erwin.

Dating back through 2014, 17 true freshmen have played for the Tribe (2017 - 5; 2016 - 4; 2014 - 4).

Importance of Leading at Halftime

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 14 of its last 17 games when leading at halftime. The only setbacks have come against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018).

Holding on to Leads

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 28-3 record when leading after three quarters.



With 248 career victories, head coach Jimmie Laycock ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 255.

The three losses came against Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

Limiting Penalties

W&M has ranked among the country's top 10 least penalized teams seven straight years.

W&M currently ranks 25th in fewest penalties per game (5.1) and 19th in fewest penalty yards per game (42.0).

The W&M athletic department's unofficial slogan - "One Tribe, One Family" - is especially true for the Tribe football team, as the roster features a pair of brother tandems - Josh/Justin Dulaney and Collin/Corey Parker.

Winning at Zable Stadium

W&M has posted tremendous success at Zable Stadium in recent years and owns a 21-10 record at home since the start of the 2013 season, which represents a 67.7 winning percentage.

W&M's recent undefeated regular-season home records came in 2015, 2010, 2009 & 2004.

Historical Success in Close Games

Since taking over the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmie Laycock's squads have played in 70 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced success in those contests, totaling an impressive 38-30-2 record.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.



#LaycockLegacy

Prior to the start of preseason camp, legendary head coach Jimmye Laycock announced the 2018 campaign would be his final season on the Tribe sidelines.

Currently in his 39th season at W&M, Laycock is the nation's longest-tenured Division I head football coach and ranks second in career wins among all active DI coaches with 248 victories.

Far and away W&M's all-time leader in career wins, Laycock's remarkable career accomplishments include 10 NCAA Playoff appearances, five conference titles and 24 winning seasons. Additionally, he guided W&M to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) semifinals twice – 2004 and 2009 – and finished a season with a national ranking 13 different times.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M, while 40 former Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts since he took the helm in 1980.

Laycock's connection with the NFL doesn't end there, as his remarkable influence is also evident in his impressive and vast coaching tree that extends into the highest levels of football. Two of his former players are currently head coaches in the NFL – Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Laycock's impressive coaching tree also includes current Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn, who served as an assistant on W&M's staff in 1994.

W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during six of the last eight seasons - Jonathan Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013), John Carpenter (2014) and DeVonte Dedmon (2015).

Captains

The Tribe is led by a trio of senior captains this season - junior linebacker Nate Atkins, senior cornerback Raeshawn Smith and senior wide receiver Jack Armstrong. Atkins will have the opportunity to become just the 12th player in the

program's long and storied history to be selected as a two-time team captain if he garners the distinction again next season.

Tribe in the NFL

The Tribe was well represented in NFL training camps this summer, as seven former players were on active rosters - Chris Durant (Chargers), Connor Hilland (Dolphins), DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jets), Luke Rhodes (Colts), B.W. Webb (Giants) and Jerry Ugokwe (Buccaneers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

Tribe NFL Draft Picks

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

Below are a few notes about W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009.

- Leads the CAA and ranks second in the FCS, behind only Montana (7)
- Ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia Tech and Virginia)
- Is more than ACC member Duke (4)

It's A Winner

In his 38 full seasons at W&M, head coach Jimmye Laycock has secured 24 winning seasons.

The achievement is remarkable when considering the program had just seven winning seasons in the previous 30 years (1950 – 1979) prior to his taking control of the program for the 1980 season.



W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009 leads the CAA and ranks second among all FCS programs. Additionally, it ranks behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech in the state of Virginia.

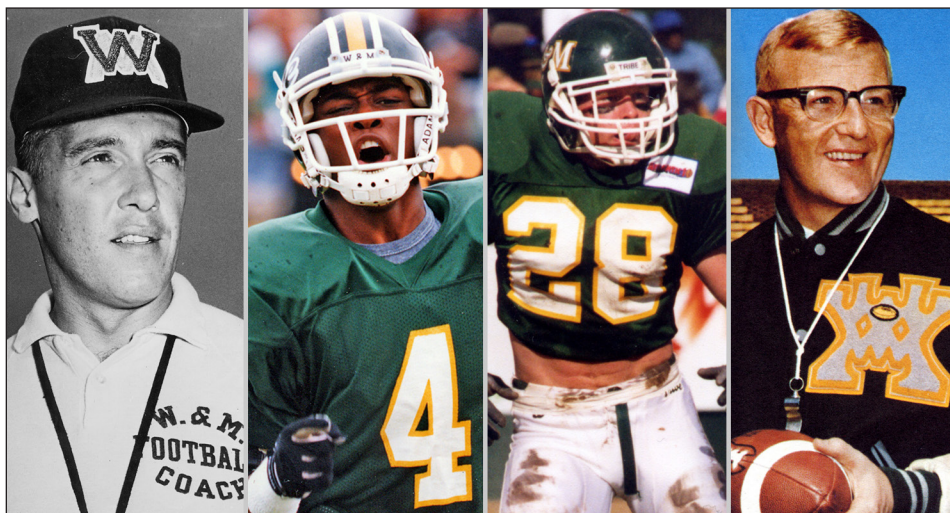

Team Offensive Notes

Overcoming a Challenge

While last week's 20-17 win against No. 16/20 Maine was impressive, it was even more so when considering W&M was without its starting quarterback (Shon Mitchell) and top running back (Albert Funderburke) and wide receiver (DeVonte Dedmon) who all missed the game due to injuries.

Limiting Turnovers

W&M has committed just three turnovers in its last three games. Additionally, the Tribe has thrown just one interception during the recent stretch.

Quick Strike Offense

In addition to its pair of defensive and special teams touchdowns, 10 of W&M's 14 scoring drives this season have lasted less than 2:30.

Big Plays Through the Air

Although W&M has posted just one run of at least 15 yards this season, which came on a fake punt, it has found success with big plays through the air and recorded nine passing plays longer than 40 yards - including two longer than 70 yards.

Tight Ends Making an Impact

Of W&M's top five pass catchers this season - in terms of total receptions - two are tight ends. Nick Muse currently ranks second on the team in catches (21), while Tyler Klaus is fifth (13).

Muse's 107 receiving yards in the win against No. 16/20 Maine were the second most by a W&M tight end in the Laycock Era, behind only Drew Atchison's 139 receiving yards vs. Delaware in 2007.

True Freshman on the OL

W&M has played two true freshmen on the offensive line this season - Colby Sorsdal and Marcus Crowell. The duo joins Cody Morris (2003) as the only W&M true freshmen offensive lineman to play dating back through 1983.

Ground Game Production is Key

Although W&M is averaging just 54.0 rushing yards per game in its three wins this season, the stat reverses a recent trend in which running the football well has been instrumental in the Tribe's success.

Since 2011, W&M has averaged 186.7 rushing yards per game in its 40 wins (7,466 rushing yards), while it has averaged just 125.8 yards per game on the ground in its 47 losses (5,913 rushing yards).

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 76 times and posted a 71-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 25-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 10-23 mark in such contests.



Team Defensive Notes

Defensive/Special Teams Scores

With a pair of defensive and special teams touchdowns - both by Arman Jones - W&M has posted a defensive or special teams touchdown during 11 of the last 12 seasons.

Additionally, W&M has recorded a pick-six in five of the last six seasons.

W&M's two non-offensive touchdowns ranks tied for 15th nationally.

INTs

W&M's three interceptions in the win against No. 16/20 Maine marked the most picks by the Tribe since posting three against Georgia State in 2012.

Third Down Stops

W&M has been effective getting stops on third down the last four weeks and is holding opponents to just a 29.3 percent conversion percentage (17 of 58) during the span.

Tough to Score Through the Air

In addition to holding opponents without a passing touchdown in four games this season - including three of the last four - W&M has allowed just four scoring strikes through the air all season.

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 29 games, just five opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

Forcing Turnovers

After forcing just 10 turnovers all of last season, W&M has recorded 12 turnovers through the first seven games - five fumbles and seven interceptions.

Additionally, the Tribe has forced at least one turnover in five of the seven games this season.

Just One Senior

Although W&M's defense features seven returning starters - including an eighth with significant starting experience - the Tribe's two deep includes just two seniors (cornerback Raeshawn Smith and linebacker Josh Dulaney).

Shutting Down the Pass

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 132 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just eight times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

Consistency at MLB

A total of just five players have accounted for 134 of 137 starts at MLB during the past 12 seasons. Junior standout Nate Atkins, who enters his third season as a starter, added his name to that list in 2016.

Tough Defense at Zable

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.2 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 52 games (948 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 35-17 record at home during that span.

Shutout History

The Tribe has posted 15 shutouts during the Laycock era, with more than a third of them (six) having come since 2009.

Head Coach Jimmye Laycock



William & Mary Head Coach Jimmye Laycock

39th Season

Career Record: 248-193-2 (.561)

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock, who has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Laycock's legendary career, which includes 39 seasons as W&M's head coach, will conclude at the end of the 2018 campaign as he announced his retirement in August.

Laycock is the nation's longest tenured active Division I head coach and entered the 2018 season ranked second in wins among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches with 245 victories. Laycock also entered the fall ranked second all-time among conference head coaches

in league wins (109), while the Tribe has appeared in 19 postseason contests and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals twice under his direction.

The success has led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$28 million Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed in 2016.

On June 21, 2008, the university dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides W&M with one of the finest facilities in the FCS.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 124-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement.

When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the Tribe would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 37 seasons.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With seven all-league recognitions in 2017, the Tribe has produced an astounding 255 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011.

Since 2009, W&M has produced six NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech).

During Laycock's tenure, 40 Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts, including seven who were with teams this summer.

In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) was hired as the Buffalo Bills head coach in January, 2017, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and previously held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, Michael Clemons ('87) was one of the CFL's most explosive players after a brief stint in the NFL and currently holds the position of Special Advisor for the Toronto Argonauts.

As a 1970 graduate of W&M, Laycock played football under two legends of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco 49ers.

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deidre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at W&M. They have three children: Michael, a Captain in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a recent graduate of Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail and Nolan.
