The Game

After opening the season with a 14-7 victory at Bucknell last weekend, William & Mary will return to action when it plays at No. 12/14 Virginia Tech on Saturday at 2 p.m. The Tribe's defense was outstanding in the season-opening win, as it limited the Bison to just one score and 257 total yards. After missing nearly the entire 2017 season with injury, senior wideout DeVonte Dedmon posted an impressive return and recorded 125 receiving yards with a touchdown. VT opened its season with a 24-3 win at No. 19 Florida State on Monday night, as it held the Seminoles to just 327 yards and forced five turnovers.

The Series

Saturday's game between W&M and VT will mark the 64th meeting between the two programs, as the Hokies lead the series, 41-18-4. W&M rattled off 12 consecutive wins against VT from 1940-53, but the Hokies have claimed the last 11 meetings. The Tribe's last win versus Virginia Tech came in 1976 - a 27-15 triumph in Blacksburg.

The Coaches

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M '70) owns a career record of 246-189-2 and is in his 39th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 246 wins rank second nationally among all active Division-I coaches, while his 109 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- Virginia Tech: Justin Fuente (Murray State '99) is in his third season at VT and owns an 20-8 record with the Hokies.

The Program

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 574-565-41 in 125 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won five conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs 10 times and posted 24 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice - 2004, 2009.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 45 All-Americans (125 total honors), while 40 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.

► Game Notes

- Virginia Tech outgained W&M, 488-193, including 275-65 in the second half
- W&M was just 1 of 12 on third downs
- W&M's four running backs combined to rush for 120 yards on 20 carries; RB Mikal Abdul-Saboor totaled a team-high 85 yards on 10 carries, including a career-long 40-yard run
- W&M posted two plays of at least 40 yards - a 43-yard pass from QB Steve Cluley to WR Tre McBride and Abdul-Saboor's 40-yard run
- W&M played four true freshmen; dating back to 1989, just twice before had W&M played that many true freshman during a single season
- PK John Carpenter was honored as the CAA Special Teams Player of the Week after equaling a career high with three made field goals (44, 36, 29)
- P Hunter Windmuller posted four punts of at least 50 yards and averaged 52.0 yards per punt with his five kicks
- LB Marcus Harvey made his first career start and totaled a team-high 11 tackles with a forced fumble and a TFL
- LB Airek Green totaled seven tackles with an interception and a fumble recovery
- VT earned a 35-21 victory at Ohio State the following week; OSU went on to win the national title

No. 19/22 W&M Falls at Virginia Tech in Season Opener

Blacksburg, Va. - The No. 19/22 William and Mary football team fell at Virginia Tech, 34-9, in both teams' season opener at Lane Stadium on Aug. 30, 2014.

W&M (0-1) was within striking distance late in the third quarter and trailed 20-9, but the Hokies (1-0) pulled away with a pair of touchdowns down the stretch.

Junior running back Mikal Abdul-Saboor led W&M offensively and piled up 85 rushing yards on just 10 carries, while senior wide receiver Tre McBride totaled four catches for 62 yards.

Defensively, sophomore Marcus Harvey totaled a career-high 11 tackles with a forced fumble and a TFL, while senior linebacker Airek Green posted seven stops with an interception and a fumble recovery. Junior linebacker Luke Rhodes and junior cornerback DeAndre Houston-Carson posted 11 and 10 tackles, respectively.

Sophomore punter Hunter Windmuller, a transfer from Virginia Tech who was making his debut with the Tribe, averaged 52.0 yards per punt with his five kicks.

After holding W&M to a three-and-out on the game's opening possession, the Hokies got on the scoreboard first with a 13-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Michael Brewer to wide receiver Isaiah Ford midway through the first quarter. The 14-play drive covered 84 yards and lasted 5:39.

The Tribe answered with a 36-yard field goal by senior placekicker John Carpenter on the ensuing drive. The seven-play, 55-yard scoring drive was highlighted by a career-long 40-yard run by Abdul-Saboor on the drive's initial play.

W&M narrowed the margin to 7-6 with a 29-yard field goal by Carpenter early in the second quarter. The drive started after Green intercepted Brewer near midfield on a pass deflected by sophomore defensive lineman Chris Donald and was keyed by a 44-yard catch by McBride.

An 8-yard touchdown pass from Brewer to tight end Bucky Hodges with 5:40 remaining in the second quarter extended the Hokies' lead to 14-6. The score was set up when linebacker Chase Williams sacked sophomore quarterback Steve Cluley near midfield and forced a fumble that was scooped up by linebacker Derek Di Nardo and returned 45-yards to W&M's 2-yard line.

Virginia Tech added a 20-yard field goal by Joey Slye with just 0:38 left in the opening half to push the margin to 17-6.

Virginia Tech opened the second half with a 14-play, 74-yard drive that ended with a 27-yard field goal by Slye. W&M appeared to have held the Hokies to a three-and out, but it was flagged for running into the punter to keep the drive alive.

Carpenter's third field goal of the afternoon, from 44 yards with 4:18 remaining in the third quarter, cut the margin to 20-9. The scoring drive covered just 11 yards, as W&M took over at Virginia Tech's 39-yard line after Harvey forced a fumble by VT running back J.C. Coleman that was recovered by Green.

The Hokies held W&M scoreless during the remainder of the contest, however, as it pulled away with touchdown runs by Shai McKenzie (39 yards) and Coleman (2 yards) to secure the victory.

Virginia Tech outgained W&M, 488-193, and held the Tribe to just 1-for-12 on third downs.

- Improve W&M's all-time record vs. VT to 19-41-4
- Improve W&M's all-time record vs. VT in Blacksburg to 7-21-1
- Snap an 11-game losing streak in the series vs. VT
- Be W&M's first win against an FBS opponent since 2009 when it defeated Virginia, 26-14, in Charlottesville
- Be the second time a CAA team has defeated VT in the last nine years (James Madison - 2010)
- Be W&M's first 2-0 start since 2009
- Be head coach Jimmye Laycock's 247th career win - his all-time record is 246-189-2; he currently ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 252 career wins
- Be the 575th win the College's history - the program's all-time record stands at 574-565-41 and is in its 125th season of football

Series History

Saturday's game between W&M and VT will mark the 64th meeting between the two programs, as the Hokies lead the series, 41-18-4. W&M rattled off 12 consecutive wins against VT from 1940-53, but the Hokies have claimed the last 11 meetings. The Tribe's last win versus Virginia Tech came in 1976 - a 27-15 triumph in Blacksburg.

W&M vs. The Atlantic Coast Conference

Since the league was formed in 1953, W&M has gone 11-41 (.212) against opponents from the ACC.

The Tribe has been very competitive in its recent matchups versus ACC teams during the past few seasons. After defeating Virginia, 26-14, in 2009, the W&M led at North Carolina, 17-7, with less than 10 minutes remaining before the Tar Heels rallied back with two late touchdowns to earn a 21-17 win in 2010. In 2012, the Tribe held Maryland scoreless

until midway through the fourth quarter until a late go-ahead touchdown proved to be the difference in the 7-6 decision. Three years ago at Virginia, W&M had an opportunity to score a game-winning touchdown before its final drive stalled at UVA's 30-yard line with 1:27 remaining in the 4Q.

Saturday's game will mark the 13th time in the last 15 seasons that W&M has faced an ACC team. The results of the previous 10 contests are listed below.

If games against current ACC members Florida State, Louisville, Miami, Pitt, Syracuse and Virginia Tech before they joined the league are taken into account, the Tribe's all-time record against current ACC teams is 19-82-1.

The Tribe's last two wins versus ACC opposition have come in Charlottesville. Prior to the victory in 2009, W&M also downed UVA in 1986, when the Tribe handed the Cavaliers a 41-37 setback.

W&M-VT Connections

Redshirt freshman linebacker Riley Fox's older brother, Coleman, is a running back for Virginia Tech.

Defensive line coach Kevin Lewis, a 2005 graduate of VT, was a three-year starter for the Hokies and helped the program win the 2004 ACC title.

Playing Well on a Big Stage

Linebacker Nate Atkins and safety Corey Parker have both performed well in their previous matchups versus FBS opponents (NC State, Virginia), as Parker is averaging 14.0 tackles per game while Atkins is averaging 12.0 tackles per contest.

Part of a Big Upset

While no current Tribe players were on the roster when W&M last defeated an FBS opponent (Virginia, 2009), offensive coordinator DJ Mangas was a sophomore on the '09 squad that defeated the Cavaliers in Charlottesville. Additionally, tight ends/fullbacks coach Mario Acitelli was part of one of college football's greatest upsets in 2007 when Appalachian State defeated No. 5 Michigan. Acitelli played all 72 snaps for the Mountaineers in that memorable victory and later went on to win the 2009 Jacobs Blocking Trophy, which is awarded annually to the Southern Conference's top offensive lineman.

#LaycockLegacy

Prior to the start of preseason camp, legendary head coach Jimmie Laycock announced the 2018 campaign would be his final season on the Tribe sidelines.

Currently in his 39th season at W&M, Laycock is the nation's longest-tenured Division I head football coach and ranks second in career wins among all active DI coaches with 246 victories.

Far and away W&M's all-time leader in career wins, Laycock's remarkable career accomplishments include 10 NCAA Playoff appearances, five conference titles and 24 winning seasons. Additionally, he guided W&M to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) semifinals twice – 2004 and 2009 – and finished a season with a national ranking 13 different times.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M, while 40 former Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts since he took the helm in 1980.



With 246 career victories, head coach Jimmie Laycock ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 252.

Laycock's connection with the NFL doesn't end there, as his remarkable influence is also evident in his impressive and vast coaching tree that extends into the highest levels of football. Two of his former players are currently head coaches in the NFL – Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Laycock's impressive coaching tree also includes current Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn, who served as an assistant on W&M's staff in 1994.

Challenging Opening Stretch

W&M opens its season with three of its first four games on the road. Additionally, the challenging stretch include FBS foe Virginia Tech and two nationally ranked FCS opponents – No. 2 James Madison and No. 15 Elon.

Opening on the Road

This fall marks the fifth consecutive season in which W&M has played its first two games on the road.

Underclassmen to Play Big Role

W&M's week 2 depth chart features 24 underclassmen, while the Tribe's entire roster includes just six seniors.

True Freshmen

Three true freshmen played in W&M's season-opening win at Bucknell – offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal, offensive lineman Marcus Crowell and defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant.

Dating back through 2014, 16 true freshmen have played for the Tribe (2017 – 5; 2016 – 4; 2014 – 4).

First Starts

Four Tribe players earned their first career starts in the season-opening win at Bucknell – left tackle Griffin Gilder, right tackle Colby Sorsdal, linebacker Alex Purviance, cornerback Nate Lewis.

One Tribe, One Family

The W&M athletic department's unofficial slogan – "One Tribe, One Family" – is especially true for the Tribe football team, as the roster features a pair of brother tandems – Josh/Justin Dulaney and Collin/Corey Parker.



Looking Forward to Success in September

W&M has played well during the month of September in recent years and has posted a 26-11 mark since 2009. During the past five seasons, the Tribe has registered a 14-5 mark during the month.

Limiting Penalties

The Tribe's eight penalties in the season-opening win at Bucknell were uncharacteristic, as the program has ranked among the country's top 10 seven straight years.

Last season, the Tribe ranked third nationally in fewest penalties per game (3.82) and fewest penalty yards per game (34.91)

Ending a Drought

When redshirt freshman safety Gage Herdman blocked a punt in the season-opening win at Bucknell, it marked the squad's first blocked punt since DeAndre Houston-Carson did so against New Hampshire on Oct. 17, 2015.

Importance of Getting Ahead

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 20-

10 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 11-19 when the opponent scores first.

Importance of Leading at Halftime

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 14 of its last 16 games when leading at halftime. The only setbacks have come against Towson (2016, 2017).

Holding on to Leads

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 28-3 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

Wide Margins

W&M owns an impressive average margin of victory dating back through 2014, while all but five of its last 24 victories during that span have come by double-digit margins.

Historical Success in Close Games

Since taking over the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmie Laycock's squads have played in 69 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced success in those contests, totaling an impressive 37-30-2 record.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.



W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009 leads the CAA and ranks second among all FCS programs. Additionally, it ranks behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech in the state of Virginia.

W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during six of the last eight seasons - Jonathan Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013), John Carpenter (2014) and DeVonte Dedmon (2015).

Captains

The Tribe is led by a trio of senior captains this season - junior linebacker Nate Atkins, senior cornerback Raeshawn Smith and senior wide receiver Jack Armstrong. Atkins will have the opportunity to become just the 12th player in the program's long and storied history to be selected as a two-time team captain if he garners the distinction again next season.

Tribe in the NFL

The Tribe was well represented in NFL training camps this summer, as seven former players were on active rosters - Chris Durant (Chargers), Connor Hilland (Dolphins), DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jets), Luke Rhodes (Colts), B.W. Webb (Giants) and Jerry Ugokwe (Buccaneers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

Tribe NFL Draft Picks

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

Below are a few notes about W&M's six NFL Draft picks since 2009.

- Leads the CAA and ranks second in the FCS, behind only Montana (7)

- Ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia Tech and Virginia)

- Is more than ACC member Duke (4)

Bouncing Back

Under head coach Jimmye Laycock, W&M has historically bounced back from seasons in which it failed to post a winning record (W&M was 2-9 last season), as the Tribe has registered consecutive losing seasons just four times during the past 36 years.

It's A Winner

In his 38 full seasons at W&M, head coach Jimmye Laycock has secured 24 winning seasons.

The achievement is remarkable when considering the program had just seven winning seasons in the previous 30 years (1950 - 1979) prior to his taking control of the program for the 1980 season.

Team Offensive Notes

Dedmon is Back

After suffering a season-ending injury in the opener at Virginia last fall, standout wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon made an immediate impact in the season-opening win at Bucknell.

The Williamsburg, Va., native recorded three receptions for 125 yards, including a 75-yard touchdown catch in the



fourth quarter.

A two-time All-CAA selection and former CAA Special Teams Player of the Year, Dedmon is one of the nation's most talented and electric playmakers.

Mitchell Makes Successful Season Debut

Making just his fourth career start under center, sophomore quarterback Shon Mitchell posted an impressive season debut in the win at Bucknell.

In addition to accounting for both of W&M's touchdowns - one on the ground and one through the air - Mitchell completed 21 of 32 passes for 267 yards.

Mitchell earned three starts last season, becoming W&M's first true freshman to start at quarterback since 1975 (Tom Rozantz). Additionally, he became the program's first true freshman to play at quarterback since 1981 (Stan Yagiello).

New Faces on the OL

W&M's starting offensive linemen last week at Bucknell owned a combined 13 career starts entering the contest, eight of which were logged by junior center Nick Wimmer.

Colby Sorsdal earned the start at right tackle, becoming just the second W&M true freshman offensive lineman to start since 1983 (Cody Morris, 2003).

True freshman Marcus Crowell also played at Bucknell, becoming just the third W&M true freshman offensive lineman to play dating back to 1982.

Production at TE/FB

As expected, W&M got good production from its tight ends and fullbacks in the season-opening win at Bucknell, as the position group combined to total eight catches for 61 yards.

W&M's tight ends/fullbacks have thrived under the tutelage of position coach Mario Acitelli during the last four seasons, as the position group has garnered six all-conference honors during that span. Fullback Tyler Crist added his name to that list as a redshirt freshman last fall after earning third-team all-league accolades.

Lots of Options

Quarterback Shon Mitchell did a good job spreading out the ball in the season-opening win at Bucknell, as nine players caught at least one pass.

Early Production on the Ground

While W&M totaled just 81 rushing yards in the season-opening win at Bucknell, 54 of those yards came during the game's opening drive, which resulted in a touchdown.

Fourth Down Conversion

W&M converted its only fourth-down attempt at Bucknell last weekend, as it picked up a first down on a fourth-and-1 at the Bucknell 6 with a run by Albert Funderburke on the game's opening drive. Shon Mitchell later finished the drive with a 2-yard touchdown run.

Ground Game Production is Key

Since 2011, W&M's ability to run the ball well has been indicative of its overall success. The Tribe has averaged 194.6 rushing yards per game in its 38 wins (7,395) rushing yards), while it has averaged just 132.2 yards per game on the ground in its 43 losses (5,683 rushing yards).

Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for

at least 200 yards 76 times and posted a 71-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 25-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns a 8-19 mark in such contests.

Team Defensive Notes

Solid Start

En route to limiting Bucknell to just one score - a touchdown that came on short field (36 yds) following a turnover - W&M's defense posted an impressive performance in the season-opening win at Bucknell. Below are a few highlights on the effort.

- Held BU to just 257 total yards (114 rushing / 143 passing)
- Limited BU to just 11 first downs
- Allowed BU into the red zone just once
- Held BU to just 4 of 14 on third down and 0 of 2 on fourth down
- Limited BU to just one play longer than 20 yards
- Forced two turnovers

Forcing Turnovers

After forcing just 10 turnovers all of last season, W&M recorded a pair of turnovers in the season-opening win at Bucknell. Safety Isaiah Laster intercepted a pass in the end zone, and safety Corey Parker recovered a fumble caused by cornerback Nate Lewis.

Tough Against the Pass

Dating back to last season, W&M has held two of its last three opponents to fewer than 150 passing yards.

Just One Senior

Although W&M's defense features seven returning starters - including an eighth with significant starting experience - the Tribe's two deep includes just one senior (cornerback Raeshawn Smith).

Stopping the Run

In addition to allowing just 332.0 total yards per game last season, W&M held opponents to just 128.0 rushing yards per game. The impressive figure ranks fourth in school history (dating back through 1955).

W&M got off to an impressive start in the opener at Bucknell, as it held the Bison to just 114 rushing yards.

Shutting Down the Pass

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 128 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just eight times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

Tough to Score Through the Air

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 23 games, just four opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

Consistency at MLB

A total of just five players have accounted for 128 of 131 starts at MLB during the past 12 seasons. Junior standout Nate Atkins, who enters his third season as a starter, added his name to that list in 2016.

Defensive/Special Teams Scores

W&M entered the 2018 campaign having recorded a defensive or special teams touchdown during 10 of the last 11 seasons.

Additionally, W&M entered the fall having recorded a pick-six in four of the last five seasons.

Less Than 40

W&M has allowed just five opponents to score more than 40 points during the last 57 games (James Madison, 41 in 2015 & 46 in 2017; Duquesne, 49 in 2015; Richmond, 48 in 2015; NC State, 48 in 2016).

Impressive Efforts

Since the start of the 2011 season, W&M has held opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense in more than 31.7 percent of its games (26 times in 82 games). The Tribe has posted a 21-5 record in those contests, with its only losses coming vs. Towson (2017), at Delaware (2017), vs. Elon (2016) at Maryland (2012) and at Rhode Island (2011).

Dating back to 2016, W&M has held seven of its last 14 opponents to less than 300 yards of total offense.

Tough Defense at Zable

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.0 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 49 games (883 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 33-16 record at home during that span.

Shutout History

The Tribe has posted 15 shutouts during the Laycock era, with more than a third of them (six) having come since 2009.

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock, who has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Laycock's legendary career, which includes 39 seasons as W&M's head coach, will conclude at the end of the 2018 campaign as he announced his retirement in August.

Laycock is the nation's longest tenured active Division I head coach and entered the 2018 season ranked second in wins among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches with 245 victories. Laycock also entered the fall ranked second all-time among conference head coaches

in league wins (109), while the Tribe has appeared in 19 postseason contests and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals twice under his direction.

The success has led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$28 million Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed in 2016.

On June 21, 2008, the university dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides W&M with one of the finest facilities in the FCS.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 124-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement.

When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the Tribe would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 37 seasons.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With seven all-league recognitions in 2017, the Tribe has produced an astounding 255 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011.

Since 2009, W&M has produced six NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech).

During Laycock's tenure, 40 Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts, including seven who were with teams this summer.

In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) was hired as the Buffalo Bills head coach in January, 2017, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and previously held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, Michael Clemons ('87) was one of the CFL's most explosive players after a brief stint in the NFL and currently holds the position of Special Advisor for the Toronto Argonauts.

As a 1970 graduate of W&M, Laycock played football under two legends of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco 49ers.

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deidre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at W&M. They have three children: Michael, a Captain in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a recent graduate of Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail and Nolan.

W&M Defeats Bucknell, 14-7, in Season Opener

Charlottesville, Va. - William & Mary opened the 2018 season with a 14-7 victory at Bucknell on Sept. 1.

After Bucknell (0-1) tied the game at 7-7 early in the fourth quarter, W&M (1-0) answered on its ensuing possession when quarterback Shon Mitchell connected on a short pass to wideout DeVonte Dedmon who raced down the field for a 75-yard touchdown with 11:55 remaining.

The Bison had three more possessions down the stretch, the final of which ended at W&M's 41-yard line when the game clock expired with a 10-second runoff for an injured player.

The Tribe's other score came on a 2-yard touchdown run by Mitchell midway through the first quarter, which capped off a 15-play, 68-yard drive that opened the contest.

En route to limiting Bucknell to just one score, W&M's defense held the Bison to just 257 total yards and forced two turnovers.

In addition to helping account for both of W&M's touchdowns, Mitchell completed 21 of 32 passes for 267 yards with an interception.

Dedmon was one of nine Tribe players to record at least one catch and finished the contest with three receptions for 125 yards, including the game-winning 75-yard touchdown. Wideout Jack Armstrong (5-50) and tight end Nick Muse (5-48) also came up big in the passing game.

Running back Albert Funderburke led the rushing attack with 61 yards on 17 carries.

Defensively, linebacker Arman Jones totaled a team-high 10 tackles with a TFL, while safety Isaiah Laster recorded an interception in the end zone to halt a Bucknell scoring opportunity on the Bison's first drive. W&M's other forced turnover came when safety Corey Parker recovered a fumble caused by cornerback Nate Lewis near midfield with 4:16 left in the fourth quarter.

Safety Gage Herdman provided a special teams highlight with a blocked punt midway through the third quarter.

W&M outgained BU, 348-257, and recorded nearly twice as many first downs (20-11). Additionally, the Tribe held nearly a 15-minute advantage in time of possession (37:25-22:35).

W&M was especially dominant in the opening half when it outgained Bucknell, 226-93, and controlled the time of possession, 22:43-7:17.

In addition to posting a touchdown on the game's opening possession, W&M had multiple scoring opportunities in the first half. However, Kris Hooper missed a 44-yard field goal, which would have been a career long, and a 43-yard touchdown pass from Mitchell to Dedmon was negated due to an illegal blocking penalty.

Bucknell's lone red zone opportunity resulted in its only score of the contest.

BU running back Marquis Carter rushed for a game-high 81 yards on 18 carries with a touchdown, while quarterback John Chiarolanzio completed 20 of 32 passes for 143 yards with an interception.

Bucknell wide receiver Brandon Sanders recorded a team-high four catches for 59 yards.

Defensively, safety Joe Lauro (11) and cornerback Bryan Marine (10) both registered double digit tackle totals to lead BU.
