## The Game

After an open date last week, William & Mary (3-5, 2-3) will return to action when it concludes its road slate at Villanova (4-5, 1-5) on Saturday at 1 p.m. The Tribe owns a 15-14 record in games following an open week during Head Coach Jimmye Laycock's tenure. Although it lost in its last outing, a 21-10 setback at Rhode Island, W&M posted a tremendous defensive effort and limited the Rams to just 228 total yards and 12 first downs. Villanova is coming off a 45-21 win against Richmond last weekend, which snapped a four-game losing streak and marked the Wildcats' first conference victory of the season. VU currently ranks third in the CAA in total defense (318.1) and second in turnover margin (+7).

## The Series

Saturday's game will mark the 34th meeting between W&M and Villanova, as the Tribe owns a 17-15-1 all-time record against the Wildcats. After losing six consecutive contests to VU from 2005-09, W&M has won three of the last five matchups. Saturday's game will mark the sixth time in the last eight meetings that the contest has been played at Villanova.

## The Coaches

- William & Mary: Jimmye Laycock (W&M '70) owns a career record of 248-193-2 and is in his 39th season at the helm of the Tribe. His 248 wins rank second nationally among all active Division-I coaches, while his 111 conference victories rank second all-time in the CAA. Additionally, no active Division I head coach has been with his respective program longer than Laycock.
- Villanova: Mark Ferrante (St. Lawrence '83) is in his second season at VU and owns an 9-11 record with the Wildcats.

## The Program

- William & Mary's all-time record stands at 576-570-41 in 125 seasons.
- During Laycock's tenure, W&M has won five conference titles, advanced to the NCAA playoffs 10 times and posted 24 winning seasons. W&M has advanced to the NCAA FCS semifinals twice - 2004, 2009.
- W&M has finished the season ranked among the top 10 nationally twice since 2009 and ranked as high as No. 1 during the 2010 campaign.
- Laycock has coached 45 All-Americans (125 total honors), while 40 W&M players have signed NFL contracts during his tenure.

## ► Game Notes

• W&M trailed 10-3 at the end of the first quarter, but outscored Villanova, 28-0, in the second quarter

• W&M outgained VU, 466-310, and held the Wildcats to just 96 total yards in the second half

• W&M held Villanova to just 1-of-12 on third down

• RB Kendell Anderson eclipsed the 100-yard rushing mark for the third consecutive game with 149 yards on 23 carries and a career-high three TD's; he posted a career-long 71-yd TD run in the second quarter

• Anderson's effort marked the 10th consecutive game dating back to the 2014 season in which a Tribe RB has rushed for at least 100 yards

• FS DeAndre Houston-Carson posted a 94-yard pick-six in the second quarter, which set a school record for longest INT return

• WR Christian Reeves totaled four catches for a career-high 126 yards and a TD

• P Hunter Windmuller averaged 50.0 yards per punt (four punts), including two at least 60 yards; also pinned VU inside its own 20-yd line with two of his four punts

• W&M's win snapped a three-game losing streak vs. nationally ranked teams

• Game marked just the 39th time two DI head coaches with 200 or more wins have met

## Tribe Upends No. 14/16 Villanova, 38-16

**Williamsburg, Va.** - Playing on the road for the fourth time in its opening five contests, William & Mary earned an impressive 38-16 victory at No. 14/16 Villanova on Oct. 10.

Although W&M (3-2, 2-1) trailed, 10-3, early in contest, it scored 28 unanswered points during the second quarter en route to securing the significant road win.

In addition to outgaining Villanova, 466-310, W&M held the Wildcats (2-3, 1-1) to just 1-of-12 on third downs and controlled the time of possession, 34:58-25:02.

Junior running back Kendell Anderson posted his third-consecutive 100-yard rushing effort with 149 yards on 23 carries with three touchdowns, while junior quarterback Steve Cluley completed 16-of-28 passes for 267 yards with a touchdown. A trio of wide receivers – sophomore DeVonte Dedmon (7-73), senior Christian Reeves (4-126, TD) and junior Kevin Hart (4-60) – also registered outstanding efforts.

Defensively, senior free safety DeAndre Houston-Carson recorded a 94-yard pick-six, which set a school record for longest interception return. Sophomore Denzel Dykes also posted an interception, which helped set up a short field and a touchdown drive.

W&M got on the scoreboard first when sophomore Nick Dorka, Jr., kicked a 23-yard field goal to punctuate the game's opening drive. Dedmon keyed the 11-play, 69-yard drive with four catches for 57 yards.

Villanova responded with a 4-yard touchdown run by Gary Underwood and a 26-yard field goal by Gerard Smith to lead, 10-3, at the end of the first quarter.

The College's big second quarter began with a 1-yard touchdown run by Anderson with 12:06 showing. Hart came up big during the nine-play, 79-yard drive, as he totaled three catches for 57 yards.

After the Tribe's defense forced a punt with a three-and-out on VU's next possession, Anderson rattled off a career-long 71-yard touchdown scamper to give the College a 17-10 lead with 10:49 left in the second quarter.

A school-record 94-yard pick-six by Houston-Carson increased the margin to 24-10 midway through the quarter, while Cluley connected with Reeves on a 53-yard touchdown strike with 1:12 left before halftime.

After a scoreless third quarter, W&M found the end zone again with a 1-yard run by Anderson – his third touchdown of the afternoon – to push the margin to 38-10. The 12-play, 40-yard drive began following an interception by Dykes.

Villanova's lone score in the final 30 minutes came on a 6-yard touchdown run by Javon White with 7:41 remaining. Of Villanova's 96 total yards in the second half, 62 came on the scoring drive.

## William & Mary/Villanova Notes

### A Tribe Win vs. Villanova Would ...

- Improve W&M's all-time record against Villanova to 18-15-1
- Improve W&M's all-time record vs. VU in Villanova to 7-11
- Improve the Tribe's league record against Villanova to 12-11 in conference games played since the two teams became league foes in 1993
- Snap a seven-game losing streak in games following bye weeks
- Be head coach Jimmye Laycock's 249th career win, which would tie him for 24th all-time in career wins with his former college head coach Lou Holtz; Laycock's all-time record is 248-194-2; he currently ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 256 career wins
- Be the 577th win the College's history - the program's all-time record stands at 576-570-41 and is in its 125th season of football

### Series History

Saturday's game will mark the 34th meeting between W&M and Villanova, as the Tribe owns a 17-15-1 all-time record against the Wildcats. After losing six consecutive contests to VU from 2005-09, W&M has won three of the last five matchups. Additionally, five of the last six matchups have been decided by a touchdown or less.

Interestingly, Saturday's game will mark the sixth time in the last eight meetings that the contest has been played at Villanova.

### Rushing Defense is Key

A key to the Tribe's last three victories against Villanova has been its ability to shut down the Wildcats' rushing attack, as it has allowed just 92.0 rushing yards per game.

Conversely, the Tribe has allowed 178.0 rushing yards per game in its last two losses versus VU.

### Closely Contested

When looking at the combined total points scored by W&M and Villanova since the teams first met as league foes (in 1993), it produces a very balanced result - W&M 650, VU 635.

### Team Notes

#### Nearing a Milestone

With 248 career victories, Head Coach Jimmye Laycock currently ranks as the 25th all-time winningest coach in college football history.

With one more win, he will tie his former college coach, Lou Holtz, for 24th on the all-time list.

Laycock currently ranks as the second-winningest active D-I head coach and trails only Al Bagnoli (Columbia), who has 256 career wins.

#### Following an Open Week

William & Mary owns a 15-14 record in games following an open week during Head Coach Jimmye Laycock's tenure.

However, W&M has struggled coming off the open week recently and has lost its last seven such games. Additionally, it was won just two of its last 12 games coming off its open date.

During the Laycock era, W&M is 2-2 versus Villanova following an open week.

#### Comeback Wins

W&M has overcome second half deficits in both its conference victories this season. After rallying back from 12 points down in the fourth quarter against Albany, W&M overcame a three-point deficit in its win against No. 16/20 Maine.

#### Blocking Kicks

With five blocks this season, W&M currently ranks eighth nationally.

Defensive tackle Bill Murray has posted three of those blocks, as he ranks tied for fourth in the country.

### Winning the Turnover Battle

W&M is 2-0 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents this season, while it is 0-4 then it loses the turnover battle.

The Tribe is 1-1 in games in which it committed the same number of turnovers as its opponent.

### Challenging Slate

In addition to opening its slate with three consecutive road games, W&M's 2018 schedule includes eight teams that have been nationally ranked this season.

### Importance of Getting Ahead

W&M owns a 2-1 record when scoring first this season, while it is just 1-4 in games in which the opposition scores first.

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M is 21-11 in games in which it scores first. Conversely, it is 12-23 when the opponent scores first.

### Impressive Comeback Win

W&M's impressive comeback win against Albany earlier this season marked the 18th time in head coach Jimmye Laycock's career that the Tribe rallied to win after trailing by a double-digit margin in the second half.

The win marked the biggest fourth-quarter comeback since 2005 when W&M overcame a 21-point deficit at Northeastern.

Since 1970, the Tribe has rallied back from double-digit second half deficits 22 times - a complete list of those wins is below.

### True Freshmen

Five true freshmen have played this season - offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal, offensive lineman Marcus Crowell, defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant, linebacker Jack Erwin and

### Importance of Leading at Halftime

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 14 of its last 17 games when leading at halftime. The only setbacks have come against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018).

### Holding on to Leads

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 28-3 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

### Limiting Penalties

W&M has ranked among the country's top 10 least penalized teams seven straight years.

W&M currently ranks 13th in fewest penalties per game (4.9) and 14th in fewest penalty yards per game (40.9).

### Winning at Zable Stadium

W&M has posted tremendous success at Zable Stadium in recent years and owns a 21-10 record at home since the start





of the 2013 season.

W&M's recent undefeated regular-season home records came in 2015, 2010, 2009 & 2004.

## Historical Success in Close Games

Since taking over the W&M football program in 1980, head coach Jimmye Laycock's squads have played in 70 games decided by three or fewer points. W&M has experienced success in those contests, totaling an impressive 38-30-2 record.

Additionally, the Tribe has posted a 7-4 record in overtime games.

## #LaycockLegacy

Prior to the start of preseason camp, legendary head coach Jimmye Laycock announced the 2018 campaign would be his final season on the Tribe sidelines.

Currently in his 39th season at W&M, Laycock is the nation's longest-tenured Division I head football coach and ranks second in career wins among all active DI coaches with 248 victories.

Far and away W&M's all-time leader in career wins, Laycock's remarkable career accomplishments include 10 NCAA Playoff appearances, five conference titles and 24 winning seasons. Additionally, he guided W&M to the NCAA Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) semifinals twice – 2004 and 2009 – and finished a season with a national ranking 13 different times.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M, while 40 former Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts since he took the helm in 1980.

Laycock's connection with the NFL doesn't end there, as his remarkable influence is also evident in his impressive and vast coaching tree that extends into the highest levels of football. Two of his former players are currently head coaches in the NFL – Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Laycock's impressive coaching tree also includes current Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn, who served as an assistant on W&M's staff in 1994.

## W&M a Special Place for Special Teams

A Tribe standout has earned the CAA Special Teams Player of the Year honor during six of the last eight seasons - Jonathan Grimes (2010, 2011), B.W. Webb (2012), Tre McBride (2013), John Carpenter (2014) and DeVonte Dedmon (2015).

## Captains

The Tribe is led by a trio of senior captains this season - junior linebacker Nate Atkins, senior cornerback Raeshawn Smith and senior wide receiver Jack Armstrong. Atkins will have the opportunity to become just the 12th player in the program's long and storied history to be selected as a two-time team captain if he garners the distinction again next season.

## Tribe in the NFL

The Tribe was well represented in NFL training camps this summer, as seven former players were on active rosters - Chris Durant (Chargers), Connor Hilland (Dolphins), DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Tre McBride (Jets), Luke Rhodes (Colts), B.W. Webb (Giants) and Jerry Ugokwe (Buccaneers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills). Atlanta Falcons head coach Dan Quinn also has W&M ties, as he was an assistant on the Tribe's staff in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

## Tribe NFL Draft Picks

When All-American defensive back DeAndre Houston Carson was selected by the Chicago Bears in the sixth round of the 2016 NFL Draft, he became the sixth Tribe player drafted since 2009.

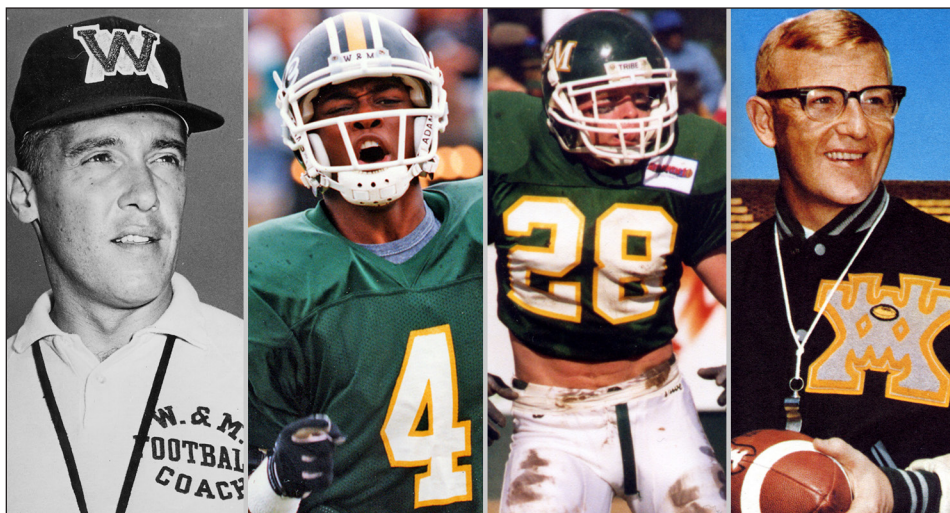

### Team Offensive Notes

#### Top Play

Running back Nate Evans' 71-yard touchdown at Rhode Island was ranked by ESPN as one of college football's top plays of the week and was featured during NBC's Sunday Night Football "Sunday Spotlight" segment during halftime.

The touchdown came early in the first quarter when quarterback Ted Hefter was intercepted by Branyan Javier-Castillo, but running back Nate Evans stripped the ball back from the URI linebacker and returned it 71 yards for a touchdown.

#### Quick Game

W&M's last contest, which was played in heavy rain and windy conditions at Rhode Island, was completed in just 2:18,

marking the quickest game dating back through at least 2002 (when total elapsed game times are available).

#### Quick Strike Offense

In addition to its pair of defensive and special teams touchdowns, 11 of W&M's 16 scoring drives this season have lasted less than 2:30.

#### Big Plays Through the Air

Although W&M has posted just two runs of at least 15 yards this season, it has found success with big plays through the air and recorded 10 passing plays longer than 40 yards - including two longer than 70 yards.

#### Tight Ends Making an Impact

Of W&M's top five pass catchers this season - in terms of total receptions - two are tight ends. Nick Muse currently ranks second on the team in catches (22), while Tyler Klaus is fifth (13).

Muse's 107 receiving yards in the win against No. 16/20 Maine were the second most by a W&M tight end in the Laycock Era, behind only Drew Atchison's 139 receiving yards vs. Delaware in 2007.

#### True Freshman on the OL

W&M has played two true freshmen on the offensive line this season - Colby Sorsdal and Marcus Crowell. The duo joins Cody Morris (2003) as the only W&M true freshmen offensive lineman to play dating back through 1983.

#### Ground Game Production is Key

Although W&M is averaging just 54.0 rushing yards per game in its three wins this season, the stat reverses a recent trend in which running the football well has been instrumental in the Tribe's success.

Since 2011, W&M has averaged 186.7 rushing yards per game in its 40 wins (7,466 rushing yards), while it has averaged just 123.9 yards per game on the ground in its 48 losses (5,950 rushing yards).





Since joining the league in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 76 times and posted a 71-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 25-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

## Stat to Watch

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 10-23 mark in such contests.

## Team Defensive Notes

### Outstanding Defensive Effort

Although it fell at Rhode Island in its last outing, W&M posted one of its best defensive outings of the season.

W&M limited URI to just 228 total yards, including just 94 through the air, and 12 first downs.

Additionally, the Tribe recorded a season-high 10.0 TFL.

### Stops Behind the Line

In addition to posting a season-high 10.0 TFL in its last outing, W&M has recorded at least 7.0 TFL in four of its last five games.

### Defensive/Special Teams Scores

With a pair of defensive and special teams touchdowns - both by linebacker Arman Jones - W&M has posted a defensive or special teams touchdown during 11 of the last 12 seasons.

A third touchdown, which is recorded as a defensive score by the NCAA, came at Rhode Island after quarterback Ted Hefter was intercepted by Branyan Javier-Castillo and running back Nate Evans stripped the ball back from the URI linebacker and returned it 71 yards for a touchdown.

Additionally, W&M has recorded a pick-six in five of the last six seasons.

W&M's three non-offensive touchdowns ranks tied for ninth nationally.

### Third Down Stops

W&M has been effective getting stops on third down the last five weeks and is holding opponents to just a 28.8 percent conversion percentage (21 of 73) during the span.

### Tough to Score Through the Air

In addition to holding opponents without a passing touchdown in four games this season, W&M has allowed just five scoring strikes through the air all season.

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 30 games, just five opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

### Forcing Turnovers

After forcing just 10 turnovers last season, W&M has recorded 13 turnovers this fall.

Additionally, the Tribe has forced at least one turnover in six of the eight games this season.

### Just One Senior

Although W&M's defense features seven returning starters - including an eighth with significant starting experience - the Tribe's two deep includes just two seniors

(cornerback Raeshawn Smith and linebacker Josh Dulaney).

### Shutting Down the Pass

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 133 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just eight times - New Hampshire (2008, 2011, 2017), Delaware (2009), Hampton (2014), James Madison (2014) and Elon (2015), Duquesne (2015).

### Consistency at MLB

A total of just five players have accounted for 135 of 138 starts at MLB during the past 12 seasons. Junior standout Nate Atkins, who enters his third season as a starter, added his name to that list in 2016.

### Tough Defense at Zable

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.2 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 52 games (948 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 35-17 record at home during that span.

### Shutout History

The Tribe has posted 15 shutouts during the Laycock era, with more than a third of them (six) having come since 2009.

# Head Coach Jimmye Laycock



## William & Mary Head Coach Jimmye Laycock

39th Season

Career Record: 248-194-2 (.561)

Few schools feature a better match at the helm of its program than William & Mary has with Jimmye Laycock, who has worked hand-in-hand with the university's world-class academic tradition to fashion a program that is a point of pride for the campus, alumni and community.

Laycock's legendary career, which includes 39 seasons as W&M's head coach, will conclude at the end of the 2018 campaign as he announced his retirement in August.

Laycock is the nation's longest tenured active Division I head coach and entered the 2018 season ranked second in wins among all active D-I (FCS and FBS) coaches with 245 victories. Laycock also entered the fall ranked second all-time among conference head coaches

in league wins (109), while the Tribe has appeared in 19 postseason contests and advanced to the NCAA Semifinals twice under his direction.

The success has led to an era of unprecedented interest and support for his program. In addition to consistent growth in attendance, evidence of this is illustrated by the \$28 million Zable Stadium renovation project that was completed in 2016.

On June 21, 2008, the university dedicated the \$11 million Jimmye Laycock Football Center with a ceremony that featured more than 500 friends and alumni of the program. While the building carries his name and stands as a strong symbol of what Laycock has meant to the Tribe, it makes a stronger statement about the school's commitment to football and the program's proud tradition. The state-of-the-art center provides W&M with one of the finest facilities in the FCS.

As the architect of what is easily the most extended run of success in W&M's 124-year football history, Laycock has never compromised academic standards for athletic success, as his program earned recognition from the NCAA in each of the first seven seasons the organization has awarded outstanding academic achievement.

When Laycock, a 1970 grad, returned to coach his alma mater prior to the 1980 season, he inherited a program that had won six or more games in a season just four times in the previous 25 years. Few could have predicted that the Tribe would produce nearly five times that amount of seven-win seasons over the next 37 seasons.

Individual accomplishments under Laycock have been plentiful, as he has helped 45 players earn 125 All-America honors at W&M and coached 11 Academic All-Americans. Former quarterback Lang Campbell is one of the most honored, as the 2004 season saw him earn the prestigious Payton Award, given annually to the nation's top offensive player in the FCS ranks, consensus first team All-America honors, as well as the A-10's Offensive Player of the Year and Scholar-Athlete of the Year. With seven all-league recognitions in 2017, the Tribe has produced an astounding 255 all-conference selections since 1993. Former All-American running back Jonathan Grimes accounted for 11 of those honors, as he became the most decorated player in conference history in 2011.

Since 2009, W&M has produced six NFL Draft picks - a figure that leads the CAA and ranks second nationally in the FCS. Additionally, the impressive total ranks third in the state of Virginia (behind only Virginia and Virginia Tech).

During Laycock's tenure, 40 Tribe players have gone on to sign NFL contracts, including seven who were with teams this summer.

In addition to producing a number of professional standouts, a number of Laycock's former players have gone on to accomplish tremendous success as NFL coaches. The most prominent of those is Mike Tomlin ('95), who became the youngest head coach to win a Super Bowl in NFL history when he guided the Pittsburgh Steelers to the title in 2009. Sean McDermott ('98) was hired as the Buffalo Bills head coach in January, 2017, while Alan Williams ('92) is the Detroit Lions defensive backs coach and previously held the title of defensive coordinator for the Minnesota Vikings. Additionally, Michael Clemons ('87) was one of the CFL's most explosive players after a brief stint in the NFL and currently holds the position of Special Advisor for the Toronto Argonauts.

As a 1970 graduate of W&M, Laycock played football under two legends of the game. For three years, he learned the details under the watchful eyes of Marv Levy, the legendary former head coach of the Buffalo Bills. In his last season, Hall of Fame coach Lou Holtz schooled Laycock in the finer aspects of psyche and motivation. As a sophomore, Laycock was a starter in the defensive secondary, but he was soon switched to quarterback where he completed 96 of 218 career passes for 1,366 yards.

Laycock's first full-time coaching position came at The Citadel as the offensive backfield coach under Bobby Ross, who went on to coach the NFL's San Diego Chargers and Detroit Lions. In 1975, Memphis State tabbed Laycock as its quarterback's coach and he helped the Tigers to consecutive 7-4 records.

In 1977, Laycock traveled to Clemson to serve as offensive coordinator for three years. During his tenure, he helped the Tigers fashion records of 8-3-1, 11-1 and 8-4. Clemson played bowl games in each year, defeating Ohio State 17-15 in the 1978 Gator Bowl. At that time, Laycock coached two-time All-ACC performer Steve Fuller, the Tiger quarterback who later played in the NFL, and Dwight Clark, an All-Pro receiver for the San Francisco 49ers.

A native Virginian, Laycock played football, basketball, baseball and golf at Loudoun Valley High School, where he won 12 letters and has since had his number retired and been inducted into the school's Athletics Hall of Fame. Laycock was also inducted into the Hampton Roads Sports Hall of Fame in the fall of 2010.

Laycock is married to Deidre Connelly, a sports psychology consultant at W&M. They have three children: Michael, a Captain in the U.S. Army; Mimi, a 2014 graduate of W&M, teaches for Teach for America in the Baltimore, Md., school system; and James, a recent graduate of Longwood University.

Laycock's daughter Melanie is married to Doug Johnson and is a school administrator in Atlanta, Ga. The couple has two daughters, Grail and Nolan.
