William & Mary will open its home slate when it hosts Elon at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 4 p.m. The contest is one of three home games scheduled for the 2021 spring slate, as the Tribe will host James Madison (March 27) and Richmond (April 10).

W&M is coming off an open date after its road game at James Madison was postponed due to COVID-19 protocols within the Dukes' program. The Tribe opened its season the prior week with a 21-14 setback at Richmond, as the Spiders earned the narrow victory with a late touchdown in the fourth quarter, W&M held UR to just 310 yards, 159 of which came on two possessions. Offensively, quarterback Hollis Mathis accounted for both of the Tribe's touchdowns - one on the ground and one through the air – and completed 18 of 28 passes for a career-high 204 vards.

After opening its season with a victory against Davidson. Elon has lost its last three games, including a pair of contests versus CAA opponents - James Madison (20-17) and Richmond (38-14). Saturday's game will be just the second road contest for the Phoenix, Although Elon ranks second in the conference in third down efficiency (46.3), it is averaging just 19.2 pts/game. Additionally, the Elon is allowing 30.8 pts/ game and 392.8 yds/game.

Jaylan Thomas (60.5) and Joey Baughman (60.0) lead Elon's rushing attack, while Omar Rogers has recorded a pair of interceptions.

Series History

Saturday's game will mark just the sixth meeting between W&M and Elon, as the Tribe owns a 3-2 edge.

Last season's 31-29 five-overtime victory at Elon marked the most extra sessions played in school history, as the Tribe has never played more than two overtimes. Additionally, it marked the most overtime sessions played by an FCS team in 2019 and is just one short of the NCAA record for an all-FCS matchup.

Good Start Needed

In W&M's three victories against Elon, it outscored the Phoenix, 54-14, in the first half. However, W&M has been outscored, 40-6, in the first halves of its losses vs. Elon.

GAME NOTES

Winning the Turnover Battle is Key

In the Tribe's three wins against Elon, it owned a +6 turnover margin and committed just one turnover.

Conversely, W&M has thrown four interceptions in its losses and has a -3 turn-over margin in those set-backs.

Home Openers

W&M has posted a 29-11 record in home openers since 1980.

Additionally, the Tribe has won 10 of its last 12 home openers, winning by an average margin of 22.1 points in the victories (+221).

The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Tough Defense at Zable Stadium

W&M's defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.8 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 59 games, W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 38-21 record at home during that span.

W&M Debuts

A total of 10 true freshmen made their collegiate debuts in the season opener at Richmond, the most to ever play in season opener in school history. The group included: DreSean Kendrick, Imari Smith, Malachi Imoh, Alex Washington, Quinn Osborne, John Kearney, Ethan Chang, John Pius, Charles Grant, and Tyler Rose.

Six of those newcomers were on the defensive side. The group also included three players on offense and one specialist.

Last season, W&M set a school record with 11 true freshman earning playing time.

Protecting the Football

W&M did not commit a turnover in its season opener at Richmond, marking the first time since 2018 that it did not throw an intercep-tion or lose a fumble in a game. Additionally, it marked W&M's first turnover-free season opener since 2007, which also came against a conference opponent (Delaware).

Protecting the Quarterback

Despite being without two projected starters on the offensive line, W&M allowed just once sack in the season opener against Richmond.

Strong Start

Although W&M returns just three starters on defense from a year ago, the unit posted an outstanding debut in the season opener at Richmond. In addition to limiting UR to just 310 total yards, it allowed just 141 yards through the air.

Captains

Serving as team captains this season are senior linebacker Tyler Crist, senior quarterback Ted Hefter, senior defensive end Carl Fowler and junior defensive end Carl Fowler. All four were selected by a vote of their teammates.

Three of the four came to W&M as walk-ons (Fowler).

London's first season leading the gram's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games
- including a Capital Cup victory at
long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, Freshman All-America honors

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Wilbling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26) - an impressive figure that ranked just outside the program's all-time

top-10 list. The Tribe also excelled academically under London's leadership, as a program-record 51 student-athletes earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll distinction during

the spring semester. London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning the Year distinction at the University of

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Footgional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record - the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural cam-paign at HU featured a season-open-ing win at UNILV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Floriin the nation to accomplish the feat in

coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London oversaw the devel opment of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the
