THE GAME

William & Mary will look to extend its winning streak to four games when it opens its home conference slate against UAlbany at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. The Homecoming contest will be televised by Cox YurView, while a video stream is available via FloFootball.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

After an open date last weekend, W&M enters Saturday's contest with a 3-1 record overall and a 1-0 mark in conference play. The Tribe extended its winning streak to three games with a 34-34 win at Elon in its CAA opener during its last outing. W&M's current record marks the program's best start since 2014, while a victory against UAlbany will give the Tribe its first 2-0 start in league play since 2004. W&M's offense continues to improve each week, as its scoring production has increased every game and is averaging 28.3 points per game during the last three contests. Conversely, W&M's defense ranks 12th nationally with 13 sacks, 10 of which have come during the last three games.

SCOUTING THE GREAT DANES

UAlbany is looking for its first win this season after opening the year with an 0-4 record overall and a 0-2 mark in conference action. All four losses have come against quality opponents, however, as its early season slate included matchups against three FCS foes currently ranked - North Dakota State, Delaware and Rhode Island - as well as Syracuse. The Great Danes are led by a pair of All-Americans in quarterback, Jeff Undercuffler, who is a former CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year (2019)

■ W&M/UALBANY NOTES

LAST MEETING

W&M nearly rallied back from a 15-point deficit in the closing minutes but fell at UAlbany, 39-31, in its conference opener on Sept. 28, 2019.

Wide receiver Kane Everson totaled a careerhigh seven catches for 121 yards, highlighted by an 83-yard touchdown. Bronson Yoder posted a 98yard kickoff return for a touchdown.

While both teams gained comparable yardage on the ground (W&M – 184, UAlbany – 185), the Great Danes posted 291 passing yards and outgained the Tribe, 476-376.

LAST MEETING IN WILLIAMSBURG

W&M rallied back from a 12-point deficit with a pair of touchdowns late in the fourth quarter to earn a thrilling 25-22 victory against Albany at Zable Stadium on Oct. 6, 2018.

Quarterback Shon Mitchell scored the gamewinning touchdown on a 6-yard run with just 50 seconds remaining.

Wide receiver DeVonte Dedmon Dedmon recorded seven catches for 138 yards with two touchdowns, which included a 50-yard score on the opening drive of the game.

Albany outgained W&M, 395-301, and held a 264-38 advantage in rushing yards. However, the Tribe was efficient through the air and owned a 263-131 margin in passing yards. UA's passing yardage was 164.5 yards less than its average entering the contest.

■ TEAM NOTES

WELCOME BACK

Saturday's contest will mark the 92nd homecoming in the Tribe's football history. Traditionally, the squad has thrived on this special weekend, as the program sports a 53-38 all-time record in homecoming games.

W&M has greeted its alumni with dominating performances in a number of its recent homecoming games, as the program has won 14 of its last 21 tilts, including 10 by double-digit margins. Offensively, the team is averaging 27.3 points per contest during the span (574 points).

The W&M faithful have only left Zable unhappy nine times in the last 29 homecoming events, while five of those losses were to teams ranked in the national top five (No. 1 Villanova in 1997, No. 4 UMass in 2006, No. 5 Villanova in 2014, No. 1 James Madison in 2017, and No. 2 JMU in 2019).

The Tribe's first homecoming game was held in 1926, a 14-0 win over George Washington University.

KNOCKING ON THE DOOR

Currently on a three-game winning streak, W&M is receiving votes in both national polls - Stats Perform FCS Top 25 and AFCA Coaches Top 25 - this week.

A SIGN OF GOOD THINGS TO COME

The Tribe's victory at Elon in its conference opener may indicate a sign of good things to come this season. During the previous 28 seasons, W&M has averaged nearly nine wins (8.7) in the nine years it has started the league slate with a victory (the Tribe's combined winning percentage for those 10 seasons is .702, 87-37). Additionally, W&M has never failed to win less than seven games during a season in which it started conference play with a victory. Six of the program's seven NCAA playoff appearances since 1993 have come in seasons that have started with a victory in conference play.

Conversely, in the 17 seasons W&M has lost its conference opener it has averaged 5.2 wins for a .468 winning percentage (89-101). The 2010 season marked the only time during the 28-year stretch that W&M had lost its conference opener and won more than seven games.

OPENING CAA PLAY WITH WINS

After opening its conference slate with a 34-31 win at Elon, W&M will look to open its league slate with 2-0 mark for the first time since 2004 when it hosts UAlbany on Saturday.

WINNING STREAK

W&M's current three-game winning streak marks the program's best stretch since it won six straight in 2015.

GREAT START

With a 3-1 record, W&M is off to the program's best start since 2014 when it opened the season with a 4-1 mark.

FOLLOWING AN OPEN WEEK

W&M is just 2-9 following open weeks during the last 11 seasons, with the lone win coming against Villanova in 2018 and versus Elon last spring

Additionally, W&M has won just four of its last 15 games coming off its open date.

GETTING AHEAD

W&M is 3-0 when scoring first this season. Additionally, the Tribe is undefeated when leading at halftime.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 14-3 record during the last four seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last four seasons, W&M is 9-2 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 2-9 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch. The only wins came against Elon last spring and this fall.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 21 of its last 25 games when leading at halftime.

Three of those setbacks came against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018), while the other was at UAlbany (2019).

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 37-4 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against UAlbany, 2019; Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

GRADUATES

More than 20 percent of W&M's roster is comprised of student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees (19 total players).

Highlighting the impressive group is second-year Law student Carl Fowler, who serves as a Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) representative on the NCAA Football Student-Athlete Connection Group.

FIRST STARTS

Nine W&M players have earned their first career starts this season.

The list includes five offensive players - quarterback Darius Wilson, left tackle Charles Grant, center Bart Francois, wide receiver JT Mayo and wide receiver Tyler Rose.

Wilson became just the fourth true freshman to start at QB in school history and just the third to start a season opener.

The defensive players who have earned their first starts this fall are linebacker John Pius, defensive end Nate Lynn, defensive end Thomas Creed and cornerback Ethan Yip.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are five seniors - defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant, wide receiver Zach Burdick, linebacker Tyler Crist, defensive end Carl Fowler and offensive lineman Ryan Ripley.

Crist, Fowler and Ripley served as captains last

Of the five, only Fowler was recruited as a scholarship player.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Three former Tribe standouts are on NFL rosters this season - DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Luke Rhodes (Colts) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills), while Joe Brady '13 is currently the Carolina Panthers offensive coordinator.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

BETTER EVERY WEEK

W&M has increased its point production every week this season - 0, 24, 27, 34.

FLIPPING THE SCRIPT

After averaging just 178.0 yards of total offense in the first two games, W&M is averaging 427.5 yards of total offense in the last two contests.

W&M has been especially productive running the ball in the last two matchups, as it is averaging 251.5 yards per game on the ground in the wins.

PROTECTING THE QB

In addition to allowing just one sack in the last three games, W&M ranks tied for fifth nationally with just three sacks surrendered this season.

OFFENSIVE LINE ADJUSTMENTS

Expected to be one of W&M's strengths this season, the offensive line featured a talented group that entered the fall with a combined 78 career starts. However, due to injuries and illness, W&M has utilized different starting lineups along the offensive front in all four games this season, as eight different players have earned starts.

RUSHING ATTACK

W&M's 331 rushing yards in the win at Colgate marked the second-best ground game total posted by the Tribe dating back through the 2009 season. The only better performance during the span came in 2019 when W&M rushed for a school-record 462 yards in the win against Rhode Island.

FOURTH DOWN CONVERSIONS

The Tribe is perfect on its fourth down conversions this season and has successfully converted all three of its attempts.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 82 times and posted a 77-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 33-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 11-26 mark in such contests

SACKING THE OPPOSITION

With currently ranks tied for 12th nationally with 13 sacks this season. W&M has posted 10 of those sacks in the last three games.

STOPS BEHIND THE LINE

In addition to totaling 13 sacks through the first four games, W&M is averaging 6.8 TFL per game.

NO FLY ZONE

W&M is off to a good start this season generating takeaways through the air, as it has recorded five interceptions through the first four games.

Additionally, the Tribe ranks 23rd nationally in team passing efficiency defense (115.8).

GETTING OFF THE FIELD

W&M currently boasts a third down defensive percentage of 35.5.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE

W&M scored a pair of touchdowns with picksixes in the win against Lafayette, marking the first time the Tribe has posted multiple defensive touchdowns in a game since it recorded two picksixes versus Lafayette in 2013.

FOURTH DOWN STOPS

W&M's opponents have attempted fourth down conversions 12 times this season, and the Tribe has recorded stops nine times. The defensive fourth down conversion percentage (.250) ranks tied for 11th nationally.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 51 games, just 16 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 154 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 12 times.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.7 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 62 games (1,159 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 40-22 record at home during that span.

Tremendously successful and widely respected, Mike London enters his third year as head coach of the William & Mary football program.

Although the COVID-19 global pandemic limited last season's campaign to a three-game slate during the spring, London successfully guided the program through the challenges. A pair of standouts – left tackle Andrew Trainer and defensive end Will Kiely – both earned all-conference honors, while standout freshman running back Malachi Imoh garnered all-state distinction.

The team also continued its tradition of academic excellence, as a program-record 69 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll Accolades during the fall semester.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, four members of the squad earned Freshman All-America honors.

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Williamsburg. In addition to nearly doubling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26) – an impressive figure that ranked just outside the program's all-time top-10 list.

The Tribe also excelled academically under London's leadership, as a then-program-record 51 student-athletes earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll distinction during the spring semester.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a

season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmye Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983

London graduated from UR in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later earned a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy. He served as a detective from 1985-87.

London and his wife, Regina, have four children: daughters Ticynn, Jaicyn and Madicyn and son Korben. He has three children from a previous marriage: sons Michael Jr. and Brandon, and daughter Kristen.
