THE GAME

William & Mary will look to extend its winning streak to three games when it opens its conference slate at Elon on Saturday at 2 p.m. A broadcast of the game will be available at FloFootball.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M enters Saturday's conference opener with a 2-1 record and is coming off back-to-back victories

against Lafayette and Colgate. The Tribe's defense has been dominant in the wins, as it allowed just 10 total points and 259 total yards per contest during the two-game stretch. Additionally, W&M ranks third nationally in sacks (13), 12th in interceptions (5) and 13th in TFL (22). Offensively, W&M piled up 331 rushing yards in last week's win at Colgate, which ranks as the second-best ground game total posted by the Tribe dating back through the 2009

SCOUTING THE PHOENIX

Elon will also open its league slate this weekend after posting a 1-2 record in non-conference play. The Phoenix defeated Campbell and suffered setbacks to Wofford and Appalachian State. Most of Elon's offensive production has come through the air as quarterback Davis Cheek ranks 19th nationally with 268.7 passing yards per game. Wide receiver Jackson Parham has totaled 16 catches for 251 yards with a touchdown, while Chandler Brayboy has recorded 17 receptions for 167 yards with two touchdowns. Defensively, Elon is allowing 30.3 points per game and 409.0 total yards per game, but has generated seven turnovers – a figure that ranks 14th nationally.

■ W&M/ELON NOTES

LAST MEETING

Led by Malachi Imoh's 137 rushing yards and three touchdowns, W&M piled up 242 yards on the ground en route to earning a 31-10 win against Elon at Zable Stadium on March 20, 2021.

W&M's defense limited the Phoenix to just 196 total yards, including just 54 on the ground.

LAST TRIP TO ELON

W&M earned a thrilling 31-29 victory at Elon in an epic five-overtime contest at Rhodes Stadium on Nov. 2, 2019, marking the most overtime sessions in school history.

W&M outgained Elon, 452-369, and dominated the ground game, 276-120. Additionally, it posted 6.0 sacks and 9.0 TFL.

The Tribe punted just once but missed six of its seven field goal attempts.

IMPORTANCE OF A GOOD START

In W&M's four victories against Elon, it outscored the Phoenix, 68-17, in the first half.

However, in its losses to the Phoenix, Elon outscored the Tribe, 40-6, in the opening 30 minutes.

■ TEAM NOTES

CAA OPENERS

W&M will look to snap a five-game skid in CAA openers when it plays at Elon on Saturday. Additionally, it will mark the fourth straight season that the Tribe has opened its conference slate on the road.

WINNING STREAK

With a win at Elon on Saturday, W&M would extend its winning streak to three games, marking the program's longest streak since winning six straight in 2015.

Additionally, a victory would mark the first time W&M has earned road wins in consecutive weeks since 2010.

TURNOVER MARGIN

W&M currently ranks tied for 11th in turnover margin (+4), as it has generated five and committed just one.

FIRST STARTS

Eight W&M players have earned their first career starts during the opening three weeks of the season.

The list includes five offensive players - quarterback Darius Wilson, left tackle Charles Grant, center Bart Francois, wide receiver JT Mayo and wide receiver Tyler Rose.

Wilson became just the fourth true freshman to start at QB in school history and just the third to start a season opener.

The defensive players who have earned their first starts this fall are linebacker John Pius, defensive end Nate Lynn and cornerback Ethan Yip.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 13-3 record during the last four seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last four seasons, W&M is 9-2 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 1-9 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch. The lone win came against Elon last spring.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 20 of its last 24 games when leading at halftime.

Three of those setbacks came against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018), while the other was at UAlbany (2019).

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 36-4 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against UAlbany, 2019; Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

GRADUATES

More than 20 percent of W&M's roster is comprised of student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees (19 total players).

Highlighting the impressive group is second-year Law student Carl Fowler, who serves as a Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) representative on the NCAA Football Student-Athlete Connection Group.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are five seniors - defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant, wide receiver Zach Burdick, linebacker Tyler Crist, defensive end Carl Fowler and offensive lineman Ryan Ripley.

Crist, Fowler and Ripley served as captains last season.

Of the five, only Fowler was recruited as a scholarship player.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Three former Tribe standouts are on NFL rosters this season - DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Luke Rhodes (Colts) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills), while Joe Brady '13 is currently the Carolina Panthers offensive coordinator.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

RUSHING ATTACK

W&M's 331 rushing yards in last week's win at Colgate marked the second-best ground game total posted by the Tribe dating back through the 2009 season. The only better performance during the span came in 2019 when W&M rushed for a school-record 462 yards in the win against Rhode Island.

OFFENSIVE LINE ADJUSTMENTS

Expected to be one of W&M's strengths this season, the offensive line featured a talented group that entered the fall with a combined 78 career starts. However, due to injuries and illness, W&M has utilized different starting lineups along the offensive front in all three games this season,n as eight different players have earned starts.

PROTECTING THE QB

W&M has not allowed a sack in the last two games and currently ranks tied for ninth nationally with just two sacks allowed this season.

PROTECTING THE BALL

W&M has been effective protecting the football to start the season and has committed just one turnover.

The Tribe currently ranks ninth nationally with fewest turnovers lost.

FOURTH DOWN CONVERSIONS

The Tribe is perfect on its fourth down conversions this season and has successfully converted all three of its attempts.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 82 times and posted a 77-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 33-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

OUTSTANDING EFFORTS

In addition to allowing just one touchdown - and 10 total points - during the last two contests, W&M's defense has limited opponents to just 259 total yards per game in those games.

Additionally, W&M has totaled five interceptions, 10 sacks and 16 TFL during the last two contests.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE

W&M scored a pair of touchdowns with picksixes in the win against Lafayette, marking the first time the Tribe has posted multiple defensive touchdowns in a game since it recorded two picksixes versus Lafayette in 2013.

SACKING THE OPPOSITION

With currently ranks third nationally with 13 sacks this season. W&M has posted 10 of those sacks in the last two weeks.

STOPS BEHIND THE LINE

In addition to totaling 13 sacks through the first three games, W&M has recorded 22 TFL - a figure that ranks tied for 13th nationally.

NO FLY ZONE

With five interceptions this season, W&M currently ranks 12th nationally in the statistical category.

Additionally, the Tribe ranks 16th nationally in team passing efficiency defense (103.6).

GETTING OFF THE FIELD

W&M currently ranks fourth in the CAA with a third down defensive percentage of 30.4.

FOURTH DOWN STOPS

W&M's opponents have attempted fourth down conversions 10 times this season, and the Tribe has recorded stops eight times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 50 games, just 15 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 153 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 11 times.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.7 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 62 games (1,159 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 40-22 record at home during that span.

Tremendously successful and widely respected, Mike London enters his third year as head coach of the William & Mary football program.

Although the COVID-19 global pandemic limited last season's campaign to a three-game slate during the spring, London successfully guided the program through the challenges. A pair of standouts – left tackle Andrew Trainer and defensive end Will Kiely – both earned all-conference honors, while standout freshman running back Malachi Imoh garnered all-state distinction.

The team also continued its tradition of academic excellence, as a program-record 69 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll Accolades during the fall semester.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, four members of the squad earned Freshman All-America honors.

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Williamsburg. In addition to nearly doubling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26) – an impressive figure that ranked just outside the program's all-time top-10 list.

The Tribe also excelled academically under London's leadership, as a then-program-record 51 student-athletes earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll distinction during the spring semester.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a

season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmye Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983

London graduated from UR in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later earned a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy. He served as a detective from 1985-87.

London and his wife, Regina, have four children: daughters Ticynn, Jaicyn and Madicyn and son Korben. He has three children from a previous marriage: sons Michael Jr. and Brandon, and daughter Kristen.
