INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

With just two regular season games remaining on its slate, No. 25 William & Mary will continue its push for a postseason bid when it hosts No. 2 James Madison at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. The contest will be televised by Cox YurView, while a video stream will be available at FloFootball.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

Ranked 25th nationally, William & Mary enters Saturday's game with a 6-3 record overall and a 4-2 mark in conference play. The Tribe is undefeated at home this season with a 3-0 record and is looking to post an undefeated slate at Zable Stadium for the first time since 2015. W&M continues to lead the Colonial Athletic Association in rushing and is averaging 204.4 yards per game on the ground, while it has posted a league-best 16 rushing touchdowns. Conversely, the Tribe's defense has allowed just 55.3 rushing yards per game in the last three contests. W&M's 20 takeaways this season - 13 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries - ranks tied for sixth nationally.

SCOUTING THE DUKES

Ranked No. 2 in the nation, JMU currently owns an 8-1 record overall and a 5-1 mark in CAA play. The Dukes' lone loss came against Villanova - a team W&M defeated on the road two weeks ago. JMU leads the conference in scoring offense (38.6) and scoring defense (15.3). The Dukes rank second in the CAA in rushing offense with 178.9 yards per game, which ranks behind only W&M's 204.4.

ABOUT THE SERIES

In a series that began in 1978, JMU has won 26 of the 43 all-time meetings. The series is tied in Williamsburg, 12-12.

Since becoming league opponents in 1993, the teams have met 28 times in the regular season, with JMU winning 20 of those contests.

The Dukes have won 13 of the last 17 meetings, including a NCAA semifinal matchup in 2004.

■ W&M/JMU NOTES

LAST MEETING

W&M fell to top-ranked James Madison, 38-10, at Zable Stadium on March 27, 2021.

Mixing the pass and run at a no-huddle pace, Madison scored touchdowns on its first four possessions.

The Dukes finished with 460 total yards, 278 coming in the first half. JMU was 11-of-17 on third- and fourth-down conversions, including a 7-yard touchdown run on a fake field goal, and had 23 more plays from scrimmage.

SLOWING DOWN THE DUKES

W&M's defense has been effective slowing down JMU's passing attack during the last 12 matchups, as it has allowed just 175.7 passing yards per game (2,109) during the recent stretch.

SCHOOL RECORD

W&M set a single-game school record for fewest passing yards allowed at JMU in 2010, as the Dukes threw for zero yards (attempted just one pass).

OVERTIME

W&M and JMU have played a pair of overtime contests, as the Dukes earned narrow victories in 2002 (34-31) and 2012 (27-26). The 2012 matchup went into double overtime and ended after a failed two-point conversion attempt.

■ TEAM NOTES

BACK IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

Despite falling at Delaware last week, W&M remains in the national rankings and is No. 25 in the Stats Perform Poll.

Prior to garnering its ranking this season, W&M last earned a spot in the national top 25 in 2016.

UNDEFEATED AT HOME

With a 3-0 record at home this season, W&M is looking to earn its first undefeated record at Zable Stadium since posting a 6-0 mark in 2015.

TURNOVER MARGIN

With a +7 turnover margin, W&M currently ranks tied for ninth nationally.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last four seasons, W&M is 12-2 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 2-11 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch. The only wins came against Elon last spring and this fall.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 17-3 record during the last four seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

It owns a perfect 6-0 mark in those games this season.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 23 of its last 27 games when leading at halftime.

Three of those setbacks came against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018), while the other was at UAlbany (2019).

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 39-4 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against UAlbany, 2019; Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

COMEBACK WINS

W&M's impressive comeback win against UAlbany earlier this season marked the 23rd time the Tribe has rallied back from a double-digit second half deficit dating back through 1970.

A SIGN OF GOOD THINGS TO COME

The Tribe's victory at Elon in its conference opener may indicate a sign of good things to come this season. During the previous 28 seasons (excluding the abbreviated three-game COVID slate in spring 2021), W&M has averaged nearly nine wins (8.7) in the 10 years it has started the league slate with a victory (the Tribe's combined winning percentage for those 10 seasons is .702, 87-37). Additionally, W&M has never failed to win less than seven games during a season in which it started conference play with a victory. Six of the program's seven NCAA playoff appearances since 1993 have come in seasons that have started with a victory in conference play.

Conversely, in the 17 seasons W&M has lost its conference opener it has averaged 5.2 wins for a .468 winning percentage (89-101). The 2010 season marked the only time during the 28-year stretch that W&M had lost its conference opener and won more than seven games.

GRADUATES

More than 20 percent of W&M's roster is comprised of student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees (19 total players).

Highlighting the impressive group is second-year Law student Carl Fowler, who serves as a Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) representative on the NCAA Football Student-Athlete Connection Group.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are five seniors - defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant, wide receiver Zach Burdick, linebacker Tyler Crist, defensive end Carl Fowler and offensive lineman Ryan Ripley.

Crist, Fowler and Ripley served as captains last season.

Of the five, only Fowler was recruited as a scholarship player.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Three former Tribe standouts are on NFL rosters this season - DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Luke Rhodes (Colts) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills), while Joe Brady '13 is currently the Carolina Panthers offensive coordinator.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

BEST RUSHING ATTACK IN THE CAA

W&M currently leads the CAA and ranks 16th nationally with 204.4 rushing yards per game.

W&M's current average of 4.9 yards per carry is threatening the school record of 5.1 set in 1990.

The Tribe also leads the CAA with 16 rushing touchdowns.

BALANCED ATTACK

W&M currently has three players who are averaging more than 50 rushing yards per game - Donavyn Lester (64.9), Bronson Yoder (59.9) and Malachi Imoh (54.4).

PROTECTING THE QB

W&M ranks tied for ninth nationally with just nine sacks surrendered this season.

OFFENSIVE LINE ADJUSTMENTS

Expected to be one of W&M's strengths this season, the offensive line featured a talented group that entered the fall with a combined 78 career starts. However, due to injuries and illness, W&M utilized different starting lineups along the offensive front in each of the first seven games this season.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 85 times and posted a 79-6 record in those contests. One of those losses came at Maine earlier this season.

Additionally, W&M is 36-6 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 11-26 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

CREATING TURNOVERS

W&M has totaled 20 takeaways this season - 13 interceptions and seven fumble recoveries - which ranks tied for sixth nationally.
The Tribe has generated at least one turnover in eight straight games.

NO FLY ZONE

W&M currently ranks tied for eighth nationally with 13 interceptions.
The Tribe's last eight interceptions have all come by different players.

SACKING THE OPPOSITION

W&M currently ranks third in the CAA with 23 sacks.

SLOWING DOWN THE RUN

W&M currently ranks third in the CAA in rushing defense (102.9) and has held five of its nine opponents to fewer than 100 rushing yards.
The Tribe has allowed just 55.3 rushing yards per game in its last three contests.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE

W&M has recorded three non-offensive touchdowns this season, two coming on pick-sixes and one on a fumbled snap on a punt.
Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 44 non-offensive touchdowns.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 56 games, just 19 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 159 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 12 times.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.7 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.
During the stretch of 64 games (1,197 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.
W&M owns a 42-22 record at home during that span.

■ PLAYER NOTES

QUARTERBACKS

DARIUS WILSON

- Scored his fourth rushing touchdown of the season (1 yd run) in the win at No. 4 Villanova

Tremendously successful and widely respected, Mike London enters his third year as head coach of the William & Mary football program.

Although the COVID-19 global pandemic limited last season's campaign to a three-game slate during the spring, London successfully guided the program through the challenges. A pair of standouts – left tackle Andrew Trainer and defensive end Will Kiely – both earned all-conference honors, while standout freshman running back Malachi Imoh garnered all-state distinction.

The team also continued its tradition of academic excellence, as a program-record 69 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll Accolades during the fall semester.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, four members of the squad earned Freshman All-America honors.

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Williamsburg. In addition to nearly doubling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26) – an impressive figure that ranked just outside the program's all-time top-10 list.

The Tribe also excelled academically under London's leadership, as a then-program-record 51 student-athletes earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll distinction during the spring semester.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a

season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmie Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983.

London graduated from UR in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later earned a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy. He served as a detective from 1985-87.

London and his wife, Regina, have four children: daughters Ticynn, Jaicyn and Madicyn and son Korben. He has three children from a previous marriage: sons Michael Jr. and Brandon, and daughter Kristen.
