INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

William & Mary will look to extend its winning streak to five games when it travels to Maine on Saturday at noon. The contest is the Black Bears' homecoming game. A video stream of the contest will be available via FloFootball.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

In addition to its four-game winning streak, W&M owns a 4-1 record overall and is receiving votes in both national polls for the second consecutive week. Additionally, the Tribe's 2-0 record in league play marks the program's best start since 2004. W&M's offense continues to trend in a positive direction, as it is averaging 29.0 points per game during the four-game winning streak. Additionally, the Tribe ranks second in the CAA in rushing yards per game (176.0). Defensively, W&M ranks 13th nationally in sacks (16) and is allowing just 113.2 rushing yards per game – a figure that ranks third in the CAA. Additionally, the Tribe has generated at least one turnover in four consecutive games.

SCOUTING THE BLACK BEARS

Maine owns a 1-4 overall record and is winless (0-3) in conference play after dropping league matchups with Delaware, James Madison and Elon. The Black Bears have struggled defensively and are allowing 37.8 points per game and 454.4 total yards per game. Quarterback Joe Fagnano threw for 305 yards with a pair of touchdowns in the season opener versus Delaware, but suffered an injury in the first quarter against JMU the following week and has not played since.

ABOUT THE SERIES

Saturday's contest at Maine will mark the 16th meeting between the two schools, as W&M currently controls the all-time series, 8-7.

The Tribe won the first five meetings versus the Black Bears before Maine earned its first victory in the series in 2002. W&M snapped a four-game skid in the series with a 27-20 win at Zable Stadium in 2018 but fell in Orono, 34-25, in the teams' last meeting in 2019.

■ W&M/MAINE NOTES

LAST MEETING

W&M scored a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns in an unrelenting comeback bid but fell to the Black Bears, 34-25, on Oct. 26, 2019.

Although the Tribe trailed 31-12 in the fourth quarter, W&M charged back with a pair of touchdown runs by freshman quarterback Hollis Mathis to narrow the margin to just six, 31-25, with 6:59 remaining.

Maine (3-5, 1-3) answered, however, with a 24-yard field goal by Kenny Doak with 1:00 remaining, and W&M was unable to pick up a first down on its final possession.

LOOKING TO REVERSE A TREND

Although W&M owns a shutout against Maine (17-0 in 1994), the Black Bears have scored at least 20 points against the Tribe in the last 12 meetings.

BACK TO ORONO

When W&M and Maine square off on Saturday, it will mark the third time in the teams' last four meetings that the contest will have been played in Orono.

Additionally, it will be the sixth time in the teams' last nine matchups that W&M has faced the Black Bears on the road. The Tribe has lost its last three games in Orono.

■ TEAM NOTES

KNOCKING ON THE DOOR

Currently on a four-game winning streak, W&M is receiving votes in both national polls - Stats Perform FCS Top 25 and AFCA Coaches Top 25 - for the second consecutive week.

WINNING STREAK

W&M's current four-game winning streak marks the program's best stretch since it won six straight in 2015.

OPENING CAA PLAY WITH WINS

After opening its conference slate with a pair of wins, W&M is off to its best league start since 2004.

With a win Saturday at Maine, the Tribe can match the 2004 team's 3-0 start.

W&M has never opened conference play with four consecutive wins since joining the league in 1993.

The Tribe's only other 3-0 conference start came in 1994.

GREAT START

With a 4-1 record, W&M is off to the program's best start since 2014 when it opened the season with an identical record.

A win at Maine on Saturday would give W&M its best start since 2010 when it opened the year with a 6-1 record.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 15-3 record during the last four seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

It owns a perfect 4-0 mark in those games this season.

WINNING WITH LESS

W&M owns a 3-1 mark when it's out-gained by the opposition this season.

Additionally, the Tribe owns a 3-0 record when trailing time of possession.

GETTING AHEAD

W&M is 3-0 when scoring first this season. Additionally, the Tribe is undefeated when leading at halftime.

RUNNING TO WINS

W&M owns a perfect 3-0 record when out-rushing its opponents this season.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last four seasons, W&M is 10-2 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 2-9 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch. The only wins came against Elon last spring and this fall.

COMEBACK WINS

W&M's impressive comeback win against UAlbany last week marked the 23rd time the Tribe has rallied back from a double-digit second half deficit dating back through 1970.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 37-4 record when leading after three quarters.

The three losses came against UAlbany, 2019; Delaware, 2015; JMU, 2014; Villanova, 2013.

A SIGN OF GOOD THINGS TO COME

The Tribe's victory at Elon in its conference opener may indicate a sign of good things to come this season. During the previous 28 seasons, W&M has averaged nearly nine wins (8.7) in the nine years it has started the league slate with a victory (the Tribe's combined winning percentage for those 10 seasons is .702, 87-37). Additionally, W&M has never failed to win less than seven games during a season in which it started conference play with a victory. Six of the program's seven NCAA playoff appearances since 1993 have come in seasons that have started with a victory in conference play.

Conversely, in the 17 seasons W&M has lost its conference opener it has averaged 5.2 wins for a .468 winning percentage (89-101). The 2010 season marked the only time during the 28-year stretch that W&M had lost its conference opener and won more than seven games.

GRADUATES

More than 20 percent of W&M's roster is comprised of student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees (19 total players).

Highlighting the impressive group is second-year Law student Carl Fowler, who serves as a Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) representative on the NCAA Football Student-Athlete Connection Group.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are five seniors - defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant, wide receiver Zach Burdick, linebacker Tyler Crist, defensive end Carl Fowler and offensive lineman Ryan Ripley.

Crist, Fowler and Ripley served as captains last season.

Of the five, only Fowler was recruited as a scholarship player.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Three former Tribe standouts are on NFL rosters this season - DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), Luke Rhodes (Colts) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills), while Joe Brady '13 is currently the Carolina Panthers offensive coordinator.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

TRENDING UPWARDS

After being shutout at Virginia in its season opener, W&M is averaging 29.0 points per game in its last four contests.

FLIPPING THE SCRIPT

After averaging just 178.0 yards of total offense in the first two games, W&M is averaging 396.3 yards of total offense in the last three contests.

W&M has been especially productive running the ball in the last three matchups, as it is averaging 230.7 yards per game on the ground in the wins.

The Tribe currently ranks second in the CAA in rushing (176.0).

PROTECTING THE QB

In addition to allowing just three sacks in the last four games, W&M ranks tied for 12th nationally with just five sacks surrendered this season.

OFFENSIVE LINE ADJUSTMENTS

Expected to be one of W&M's strengths this season, the offensive line featured a talented group that entered the fall with a combined 78 career starts. However, due to injuries and illness, W&M has utilized different starting lineups along the offensive front in all five games this season, as eight different players have earned starts.

FOURTH DOWN CONVERSIONS

The Tribe is perfect on its fourth down conversions this season and has successfully converted all three of its attempts.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 82 times and posted a 77-5 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 34-4 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 11-26 mark in such contests.

RUSHING ATTACK

W&M's 331 rushing yards in the win at Colgate marked the second-best ground game total posted by the Tribe dating back through the 2009 season. The only better performance during the span came in 2019 when W&M rushed for a school-record 462 yards in the win against Rhode Island.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

SACKING THE OPPOSITION

With currently ranks tied for 13th nationally with 16 sacks this season.

STOPPING THE RUN

W&M is limiting opponents to just 90.0 rushing yards per game during the last four contests. Opponents are averaging just 2.9 yards per carry during the recent stretch.

W&M currently ranks third in the CAA in rushing defense (113.2).

GENERATING TURNOVERS

W&M has generated at least one turnover in four straight games.

NO FLY ZONE

W&M is off to a good start this season generating takeaways through the air, as it has recorded five interceptions.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE

W&M has recorded three non-offensive touchdowns this season, two coming on pick-sixes and one on a fumbled snap on a punt.

Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 44 non-offensive touchdowns.

FOURTH DOWN STOPS

W&M ranks tied for 23rd nationally with a fourth down percentage defense of 33.3 (5 of 15).

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 155 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 12 times.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.8 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 63 games (1,183 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M owns a 41-22 record at home during that span.

Tremendously successful and widely respected, Mike London enters his third year as head coach of the William & Mary football program.

Although the COVID-19 global pandemic limited last season's campaign to a three-game slate during the spring, London successfully guided the program through the challenges. A pair of standouts – left tackle Andrew Trainer and defensive end Will Kiely – both earned all-conference honors, while standout freshman running back Malachi Imoh garnered all-state distinction.

The team also continued its tradition of academic excellence, as a program-record 69 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll Accolades during the fall semester.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, four members of the squad earned Freshman All-America honors.

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Williamsburg. In addition to nearly doubling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26) – an impressive figure that ranked just outside the program's all-time top-10 list.

The Tribe also excelled academically under London's leadership, as a then-program-record 51 student-athletes earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll distinction during the spring semester.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a

season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmie Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983.

London graduated from UR in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in sociology and a year later earned a degree in law enforcement from the Richmond Police Academy. He served as a detective from 1985-87.

London and his wife, Regina, have four children: daughters Ticynn, Jaicyn and Madicyn and son Korben. He has three children from a previous marriage: sons Michael Jr. and Brandon, and daughter Kristen.
