THE GAME

No. 15/17 William & Mary will conclude its non-conference slate when it plays at Lafayette on Saturday at 3:30 p.m. The game will be broadcast by ESPN+, while a radio broadcast will be available on 92.3 FM The Tide and at TribeAthletics.com.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

No. 15/17 W&M is off to a 2-0 start and jumped five spots in both national polls this week after earning a convincing 37-21 victory against Campbell. The Tribe currently ranks fifth nationally in rushing (287.0) and has piled up six rushing touchdowns through two games. Additionally, W&M has been tremendously effective through the air and ranks eighth nationally in passing efficiency (175.2). Defensively, the Tribe has held both its first two opponents scoreless in the fourth quarter and ranks eighth in the country with 4.0 sacks per game.

SCOUTING THE LEOPARDS

Lafayette split its opening two games and fell at Temple, 30-14, last weekend after earning a season-opening win against Sacred Heart. The Leopards are averaging just 111.5 yards of total offense per game but have generated five turnovers. Patriot League Preseason Defensive Player of the Year Malik Hamm leads the squad and has posted 4.5 TFL and 1.5 sacks.

ABOUT THE SERIES

Saturday's game at Lafayette will mark just the seventh meeting between the two programs. Although the Leopards won the initial matchup, 17-14, in 2012, W&M has claimed the last five meetings.

Prior to the teams' initial meeting in 2012, W&M and Lafayette had combined to play 2,363 games but had never met. Lafayette began playing football in 1882 and claimed national championships in 1896, 1921 and 1926, while W&M fielded its first team in 1893.

■ W&M/LAFAYETTE NOTES

LAST MEETING

William & Mary opened its 2021 home slate with a 24-3 win against Lafayette.

The Tribe's defense had six sacks, 11 tackles for loss, and outscored the Leopards by itself. Safety Gage Herdman and inside linebacker Quinn Osborne became the first W&M teammates since 2013 to have pick-sixes in the same game.

William & Mary (1-1) held Lafayette to 256 total yards, only 32 coming on the ground. The three points were the fewest allowed by the Tribe since 2015.

A KEY TO VICTORY

W&M has run the ball well in its five victories against Lafayette, averaging 196.2 yards per game on the ground (981 yds). Conversely, the Tribe totaled just 84 rushing yards on 28 carries in its loss to LC in 2012.

THIRD DOWN STOPS

W&M's defense has been outstanding on third downs versus Lafayette in the teams' prior six meetings, as the Leopards have converted just 31 of 96 (32.2 percent) third down opportunities.

W&M VS. THE PATRIOT LEAGUE

W&M boasts a 28-10 all-time record against teams currently in the Patriot League.

Last season, W&M earned a pair of wins versus Patriot League foes, as it defeated Lafayette and Colgate.

Fordham is the lone Patriot League team W&M is yet to play.

LAFAYETTE CONNECTION

W&M sophomore safety Joseph Groves began his career at Lafayette as a wide receiver and played in all 11 games for the Leopards last fall.

■ TEAM NOTES

NATIONAL RANKING

W&M rose five spots in both national polls this week, checking in at No. 15 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and No. 17 in the AFCA FCS Coaches' Top 25 Poll. It marks the Tribe's highest ranking since 2016.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

W&M has won 38 of its last 40 games against non-conference FCS opponent during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally it owns a 41-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

STRONG START

With wins in its first two games, W&M is off to its best start since 2009 when it opened the year with four straight victories.

WIDE MARGINS

W&M has won its first two games by an average margin of 16.5 points per game.

FINISHING STRONG

W&M has outscored its first two opponents 44-21 in the second half. Additionally, the Tribe held both Charlotte and Campbell scoreless in the fourth quarter.

COACH LONDON Vs. THE FBS

W&M's season-opening win at Charlotte marked the third time head coach Mike London has led an FCS team to a victory against a FBS squad - Richmond def. Duke (2009); Howard def. UNLV (2017).

London owns a 3-7 all-time record versus FBS teams as an FCS head coach.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last five seasons, W&M is 13-3 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 2-12 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 19-4 record during the last five seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

It owned a 6-1 mark in those games last season and is 2-0 this year.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 24 of its last 28 games when leading at halftime.

Three of those setbacks came against Towson (2016, 2017, 2018), while the other was at UAlbany (2019).

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 40-4 record when leading after three quarters.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are five seniors - defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant, defensive end Carl Fowler, tight end Lachlan Pitts, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and linebacker Trey Watkins.

Fowler is the only player in W&M's history (129 seasons) to be selected as a team captain three times, while Bessant enters his second season as a captain.

GRADUATES

Sixteen W&M football student-athletes have already earned their undergraduate degrees - Carl Fowler, Zyquan Bessant, Trey Watkins, Colby Sorsdal, Marcus Crowell, Kevin Jarrell, Hunter Klein, Lachlan Pitts, Ryan Poole, Malcolm Spencer, Will Whitehurst, Cam Spangler, Tye Freeland, Caylin Newton, Justin Johnson and Tyler Oedekoven.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Four former Tribe standouts are on NFL rosters this season - safety DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive/defensive lineman Bill Murray (Patriots) and offensive lineman Andrew Trainer (Chargers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills), while Alan Williams '92 is currently the Chicago Bears' defensive coordinator.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

STRONG START

W&M has piled up 78 points through its first two games, which marks the program's best start since 2007 when it totaled 94 points in its opening two weeks.

Additionally, W&M currently ranks 15th nationally in scoring offense (39.0) and total offense (475.5).

RUSHING SUCCESS

After leading the CAA in rushing last season, W&M is once again establishing itself with a dominant ground game. The Tribe currently ranks fifth nationally in rushing (287.0).

W&M has also already piled up six rushing touchdowns through the opening two games.

PROTECTING THE FOOTBALL

W&M's offense has not committed a turnover through the first two games. The Tribe's lone turnover this season came on special teams.

EFFICIENT PASSING ATTACK

Although W&M has produced more yards on the ground (287.0) than through the air (188.5), it has been tremendously efficient in the passing game. The Tribe currently ranks eighth nationally in passing efficiency (175.2).

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 89 times and posted a 81-8 record in those contests. Three of those eight losses came last season.

Additionally, W&M is 38-8 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 11-26 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

SACKING THE OPPOSITION

W&M has totaled eight sacks through the first two games and currently ranks eighth nationally in sacks per game (4.0).

FOURTH QUARTER SHUTOUTS

W&M's defense has been outstanding in the fourth quarter this season and has not allowed any points during the final 15 minutes in either of its first two games.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE

After recording three non-offensive touchdowns last season, W&M has already posted a pick-six this season.

Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 45 non-offensive touchdowns.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 60 games, just 19 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

W&M's defense has allowed just one passing touchdown through the first two games.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 163 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 13 times.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.9 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 67 games (1,270 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 43-24 at home during that span.



■ PLAYER NOTES

QUARTERBACKS

DARIUS WILSON

- Ranks 11th nationally in passing efficiency (173.0), 12th in yards per pass attempt (9.7) and 17th in yards per completion (15.5)
- Honored as the CAA Offensive Player of the Week after posting a career-high 292 yards of total offense in the season-opening win at Charlotte; completed 11-of-17 passes for a career-high 225 yards with two touchdowns; also rushed for 67 yards on 10 carries and hauled in a 19-yard reception
- 2021 CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year
- One of the nation's top freshman quarterbacks last season, he broke W&M's true freshman record for passing yards (1,205) and total yards (1,591) - both records that were held by current teammate Hollis Mathis in 2019
- A dual threat, he averaged 42.9 rushing yards per game (51.9 rushing yards per game when excluding sack yardage)
- Earned the start at Virginia in last year's season opener, becoming just the fourth true freshman to start at QB in school history and just the third to start a season opener

HOLLIS MATHIS

- Completed 2-of-2 passes for 31 yards in the season-opening win at Charlotte; started the contest at WR and also totaled 14 rushing yards on six carries
- Has thrown just one interception in his last 128 passing attempts; thrown just two interceptions in the last 14 games in which he has played dating back to 2019 (206 passing attempts)
- Led the CAA in total offense per game (232.0) in 2021

Tremendously successful and widely respected, Mike London enters his fourth year as head coach of the William & Mary football program.

Under London's leadership, W&M continued its upward trajectory during the 2021 campaign as it posted the program's most wins since 2015 and garnered a national ranking in multiple weeks. Highlighting the notable victories was a 31-18 road win at No. 4 Villanova. W&M finished the year with the CAA's most productive rushing offense and the nation's 12th-ranked rushing defense.

Individually, seven Tribe standouts earned postseason all-conference honors, highlighted by a pair of All-America standouts in defensive end Nate Lynn, a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist for national defensive player of the year, and left tackle Andrew Trainer, who signed a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Chargers. Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson was selected as the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In addition to the success on the field, London's squad distinguished itself in the classroom as 33 players were recognized on the CAA Football Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll for the fall semester.

Although the COVID-19 global pandemic limited London's second season with the Tribe to a three-game slate during the spring, he successfully guided the program through the challenges. A pair of standouts – left tackle Andrew Trainer and defensive end Will Kiely – both earned all-conference honors, while standout freshman running back Malachi Imoh garnered all-state distinction.

The team also continued its tradition of academic excellence, as a program-record 69 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll Accolades during the fall semester.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at longtime rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, four members of the squad earned Freshman All-America honors.

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Williamsburg. In addition to nearly doubling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26) – an impressive figure that ranked just outside the program's all-time top-10 list.

The Tribe also excelled academically under London's leadership, as a then-program-record 51 student-athletes earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll distinction during the spring semester.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of

Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmie Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983.
