INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

After an open week, No. 12/13 William & Mary will return to action when it plays at Towson for the Tigers' homecoming game on Saturday at 4 p.m. A video stream will be available at FloFootball.com, while a radio broadcast will be available on 92.3 FM The Tide.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

Off to its best start since 2010, W&M enters Saturday's game with a 5-1 record overall and a 2-1 mark in conference play. Additionally, with a win this weekend the Tribe will improve to 4-0 on the road for just the second time in school history (1976). W&M boasts one of the nation's top rushing attacks and ranks fifth in the country with 246.0 yards per game on the ground. Led by linebacker John Pius, who ranks first nationally in sacks (9.5) and TFL (14.5), W&M's defense is averaging 3.17 sacks per game and ranks second nationally in third down conversion percentage defense (23.7).

SCOUTING THE TIGERS

Like W&M, Towson is also coming off an open week but has struggled recently, losing four straight after beginning the season with a 2-0 mark. The Tigers are averaging just 14.0 points per game with 262.0 total yards per contest. Defensively, TU is allowing 31.2 points per game and surrendering 420.2 total yards per contest.

ABOUT THE SERIES

Saturday's game will mark the 18th meeting between W&M and Towson, as the Tribe won the initial seven meetings but has lost seven of the last 10 matchups. W&M won last season's meeting, 40-14, in Williamsburg and owns a 4-3 edge in games played at Towson.

■ W&M/TOWSON NOTES

LAST MEETING

W&M earned a convincing 40-14 victory against Towson last season at Zable Stadium. The Tribe led for all but the game's first 139 seconds and finished with 529 total yards, its most since 2019.

Running back Donavyn Lester rushed for 99 yards and a career-high three touchdowns, while Bronson Yoder piled up 82 rushing yards with a touchdown.

W&M's defense forced six turnovers, the program's best effort since 2012.

CLEAR WINNER

Many of the previous contests between W&M and Towson have been lopsided, as 13 of the 17 meetings have been decided by at least 10 points.

STOPPING THE RUN IS KEY

A key to earning a victory against Towson has been stopping the Tigers' rushing attack. In W&M's 10 victories against Towson, it has allowed just 108.3 rushing yards per game (1,083 yards). Conversely, the Tribe has allowed 226.1 yards per game on the ground in its seven losses to Towson (1,583 yards).

Additionally, Towson totaled just one rushing touchdown in its first six match ups versus W&M as league foes, which were all Tribe victories.

W&M-TU CONNECTION

Towson's cornerbacks coach Almondo Curry was a defensive analyst at W&M in 2019.

■ TEAM NOTES

NATIONAL RANKING

W&M enters Saturday's game ranked in both national polls. The Tribe fell one spot to No. 12 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and remained at No. 13 in the AFCA FCS Coaches' Top 25 Poll.

UP TO THE CHALLENGE

Three of W&M's final six regular games this season are against nationally ranked opponents - then-No. 6 Delaware, Rhode Island (22/19) and Richmond (#19/21). Additionally, Villanova is receiving votes in both polls.

STRONG START

W&M's 5-1 start matches the program's best season-opening record since it opened 6-1 in 2010.

ON THE ROAD

W&M has posted a perfect 3-0 mark on the road this season, marking the program's first 3-0 start on the road since 1986.

The Tribe's only 4-0 start on the road came in 1976 when it earned victories against Virginia, Virginia Tech, Navy and Ohio.

W&M has never won its first five road games.

WIDE MARGINS

In W&M's five victories this season, it has won by an average margin of 16.6 points per game.

The only contest not decided by double figures was the 27-21 win against then-No. 6 Delaware.

FOLLOWING AN OPEN WEEK

W&M has won three of its last four contests following open weeks, including a 31-24 victory against UAlbany last season.

The recent stretch marks a significant improvement after suffering eight straight losses following an open week from 2011-2018.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last five seasons, W&M is 15-3 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 3-13 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 22-5 record during the last five seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

It owned a 6-1 mark in those games last season and is 5-1 this year.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 26 of its last 31 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 43-5 record when leading after three quarters.

COACH LONDON vs. THE FBS

W&M's season-opening win at Charlotte marked the third time head coach Mike London has led an FCS team to a victory against a FBS squad - Richmond def. Duke (2009); Howard def. UNLV (2017).

London owns a 3-7 all-time record versus FBS teams as an FCS head coach.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

With wins against Campbell and Lafayette, W&M has won 39 of its last 41 games against non-conference FCS opponent during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally it owns a 42-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are five seniors - defensive tackle Zyquan Bessant, defensive end Carl Fowler, tight end Lachlan Pitts, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and linebacker Trey Watkins.

Fowler is the only player in W&M's history (129 seasons) to be selected as a team captain three times, while Bessant enters his second season as a captain.

GRADUATES

Sixteen W&M football student-athletes have already earned their undergraduate degrees - Carl Fowler, Zyquan Bessant, Trey Watkins, Colby Sorsdal, Marcus Crowell, Kevin Jarrell, Hunter Klein, Lachlan Pitts, Ryan Poole, Malcolm Spencer, Will Whitehurst, Cam Spangler, Tye Freeland, Caylin Newton, Justin Johnson and Tyler Oedekoven.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Four former Tribe standouts are on NFL rosters this season - safety DeAndre Houston-Carson (Bears), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive/defensive lineman Bill Murray (Patriots) and offensive lineman Andrew Trainer (Chargers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills), while Alan Williams '92 is currently the Chicago Bears' defensive coordinator.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

BIG NUMBERS

W&M is currently averaging 32.8 points per game, an impressive figure that ranks 24th nationally. The Tribe has scored at least 27 points in every game this season.

Additionally, W&M ranks 16th in the country in total offense (437.8).

RUSHING SUCCESS

After leading the CAA in rushing last season, W&M is once again producing a dominant ground game. The Tribe currently ranks fifth nationally in rushing (246.0). Additionally, W&M ranks tied for 11th in the country with 15 rushing touchdowns.

EFFICIENT PASSING ATTACK

Although W&M has produced more yards on the ground (246.0) than through the air (191.8), it has been tremendously efficient in the passing game. The Tribe currently ranks 16th nationally in passing efficiency (153.5).

COMING FROM EVERY ANGLE

Five different players on W&M's roster have thrown at least one career touchdown pass - Darius Wilson, Hollis Mathis, Caylin Newton, DreSean Kendrick and Malachi Imoh.

LUCKY NUMBER 3

W&M has recorded three rushing touchdowns in four of its six games this season.

EFFICIENT PASSING ATTACK

Although W&M has produced more yards on the ground (241.0) than through the air (199.8), it has been efficient in the passing game. W&M currently ranks 12th nationally in passing efficiency (157.7).

FIRST DOWNS

W&M has posted at least 21 first downs in every game this season.

Last fall, the Tribe earned at least 21 first downs in just one game.

QUICK STARTS

W&M has scored on its opening possession in five of its six games this season - two touchdowns

and three field goals.

PROTECTING THE QB

W&M has allowed just 0.83 sacks per game this season, a figure that leads the CAA and ranks seventh nationally.

4th DOWN CONVERSIONS

W&M leads the nation in fourth down conversion percentage this season (.833), as it has converted five of its six attempts.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 91 times and posted an 83-8 record in those contests. Three of those eight losses came last season.

Additionally, W&M is 41-8 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 11-26 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

SACKING THE OPPOSITION

W&M has been effective getting to opposing teams' quarterbacks and currently ranks 15th nationally in sacks per game (3.17).

THIRD DOWN STOPS

W&M is limiting opponents to a 23.7 third down conversion percentage. The impressive figure ranks second nationally.

The Tribe has been especially effective getting stops the last two games, limiting opponents to just 2 of 22 on third down.

AMONG THE BEST

By allowing just 19.7 points per game, W&M currently ranks 24th nationally in scoring defense.

Additionally, the Tribe ranks 21st nationally in total defense (313.0).

LATE GAME DEFENSE

W&M has held five of its six opponents scoreless in the fourth quarter this season.

RED ZONE DEFENSE

W&M's opponents have scored on just 69.6 percent of its trips into the Red Zone, as the Tribe ranks 15th nationally in the statistical category.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE

After recording three non-offensive touchdowns last season, W&M has already posted a pick-six this season.

Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 45 non-offensive touchdowns.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 64 games, just 20 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

W&M's defense has allowed just five passing touchdowns through the first six games.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 167 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 13 times.

W&M currently ranks 19th nationally in passing efficiency defense (113.5).

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 19.2 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 69 games (1,326 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 44-25 at home during that span.

Tremendously successful and widely respected, Mike London enters his fourth year as head coach of the William & Mary football program.

Under London's leadership, W&M continued its upward trajectory during the 2021 campaign as it posted the program's most wins since 2015 and garnered a national ranking in multiple weeks. Highlighting the notable victories was a 31-18 road win at No. 4 Villanova. W&M finished the year with the CAA's most productive rushing offense and the nation's 12th-ranked rushing defense.

Individually, seven Tribe standouts earned postseason all-conference honors, highlighted by a pair of All-America standouts in defensive end Nate Lynn, a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist for national defensive player of the year, and left tackle Andrew Trainer, who signed a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Chargers. Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson was selected as the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year.

In addition to the success on the field, London's squad distinguished itself in the classroom as 33 players were recognized on the CAA Football Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll for the fall semester.

Although the COVID-19 global pandemic limited London's second season with the Tribe to a three-game slate during the spring, he successfully guided the program through the challenges. A pair of standouts – left tackle Andrew Trainer and defensive end Will Kiely – both earned all-conference honors, while standout freshman running back Malachi Imoh garnered all-state distinction.

The team also continued its tradition of academic excellence, as a program-record 69 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll Accolades during the fall semester.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, four members of the squad earned Freshman All-America honors.

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Williamsburg. In addition to nearly doubling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26) – an impressive figure that ranked just outside the program's all-time top-10 list.

The Tribe also excelled academically under London's leadership, as a then-program-record 51 student-athletes earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll distinction during the spring semester.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of

Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

London landed the head coaching job at UR after an exceptional two-year stint as UVA's defensive coordinator (2006-07). During his first season, the Cavaliers allowed just 289.5 yards per game – the program's best figure in 27 years. The following season, London's defense ranked sixth nationally in sacks and among the nation's top 20 in scoring defense and rushing defense. London oversaw the development of an outstanding group of All-ACC honorees, highlighted by 2007 unanimous All-America standout Chris Long, who was the second overall pick in the 2008 NFL Draft.

Before returning to UVA, where he was an assistant from 2001-04, London spent the 2005 season in the NFL as the Houston Texans' defensive line coach. London's first stint with the Cavaliers also included serving as the program's recruiting coordinator from 2002-04.

London, a native of Hampton, Va., began his coaching career as the outside linebackers coach at Richmond in 1988 before coaching the defensive line at William & Mary under Jimmie Laycock (1991-94). He then returned to UR for two more years (1995-96) as the outside linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator before taking on the defensive line coaching duties at Boston College from 1997-00.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983.
