THE PRESIDENT



Katherine A. Rowe President

On February 20, 2018, William & Mary's Board of Visitors unanimously elected Katherine A. Rowe as the 28th president of the university. Nationally recognized as an innovator in higher education, Rowe champions the liberal arts, entrepreneurship and strengthening education-workforce pathways. She began on July 1, 2018 and was inaugurated on February 8, 2019. On November 19, 2021, the Board unanimously approved an early extension of President Rowe's contract, through June 2028.

& Mary has advanced access and affordability, holding tuition flat for five years, from 2019-2023. Her cross-university initiatives include a central Entrepreneurship Hub, a Studio for Teaching & Learning Plan and Climate Action Roadmap, realization of William & Mary's longplanned Memorial to the Enslaved. a Veteran to Executive Transition program, an Institute for Integrative Conservation and a university-wide approach to inclusive excellence. William & Mary successfully closed its For the Bold campaign in June 2020, raising just over \$1 billion.

Rowe oversaw the creation of William & Mary's ambitious strategic plan, Vision 2026, via an inclusive, multi-year planning process. During the first phase of planning, the university community came together to craft William &

Mary's first-ever statement of shared values. Consistent with the strategic goals outlined in Vision 2026, Rowe announced in 2022 a commitment to cover full tuition and fees for all in-state Pell Grant recipients beginning in fall 2023.

As president, Rowe led William & Mary's effective COVID-19 response, joining forces with the City of Williamsburg and other key local partners. In August of 2020 William & Mary reconvened in-person learning, uninterrupted – flexibly adapting every university practice and system to ensure that students could maintain momentum to their degrees. Key institutional innovations were launched during the pandemic: enhanced career development for students, a unified approach to Communications and Marketing and a whole-university Council for Community Partnerships.

Rowe serves on the Northern Virginia Technology Council, the Virginia Business and Higher Education Council Board, RVA757 Connects, the Virginia American Revolution 250 Commission and the GoVA Region 5 Council. Rowe was named to the Virginia Business Virginia 500 Power List in 2020, 2021 and 2022. In 2020, Diverse: Issues in Higher Education named Rowe one of the top 35 women in higher education.

Previously, Rowe served as provost and dean of faculty at Smith College in Massachusetts. Earlier in her career, Rowe co-founded and served as the CEO of Luminary Digital Media, which developed educational apps for Shakespeare's plays.

Rowe holds a bachelor's degree from Carleton College and a master's and a Ph.D. from Harvard University. She has completed graduate work in Cinema and Media Studies at New York University's Tisch School of the Arts. Her areas of research and scholarship include Shakespeare, Milton, Renaissance drama and media history.

An award-winning teacher, Rowe spent 16 years at Bryn Mawr College

as an English professor, department chair and director of the Katharine Hepburn Center for leadership and public engagement. She began her teaching career as an assistant professor of English at Yale. Prior to arriving at William & Mary she held the Sophia Smith chair at Smith College.

Rowe has published three books: New Wave Shakespeare on Screen with Thomas Cartelli (Polity Press, 2007), Reading the Early Modern Passions: Essays in the Cultural History of Emotion as co-editor (Penn Press, 2004) and Dead Hands: Fictions of Agency, Renaissance to Modern (Stanford, 2000). She has editing credits in the Cambridge Guide to the Worlds of Shakespeare. With more than 350 scholarly contributors from five continents, this world-standard, multi-volume, reference work was honored in 2016 by the American Association of Publishers with two PROSE awards, considered the most prestigious in the publishing industry.

Dr. Rowe is a past president of the Shakespeare Association of America. She served on Harvard's Board of Overseers' Visiting Committee of the Library and the Executive Committee of the American Council of Learned Societies. She has held various scholarly memberships as well as service positions in the Modern Language Association and the American Council of Learned

Rowe spent more than a decade coaching Ultimate Frisbee and has led multiple teams to state championships in Pennsylvania. She was a World Ultimate Club Finalist and a Women's Nationals Finalist. She co-founded the nonprofit Boston Ultimate Disc Alliance and the Carleton College women's Ultimate team

Rowe shares her love of Ultimate with her spouse, Bruce Jacobson, William & Mary's First Gentleman. They have two adult children, Daniel and Beah.



THE CHANCELLOR



Robert M. Gates '65, L.H.D. '98 Chancellor

Robert M. Gates '65, L.H.D. '98, was named twenty-fourth Chancellor of William & Mary by the Board of Visitors at his investiture on February 3, 2012. He succeeded Sandra Day O'Connor, former Associate Justice of the United States Supreme Court, who was appointed in 2005. He was re-invested for a second term on February 8, 2019.

Chancellor Gates is the first alumnus to hold this ceremonial position in William & Mary's modern era. As U.S. Secretary of Defense from 2006 to 2011, he became the only person in American history to serve under presidents from different political parties. In his words, William & Mary instilled in him "a calling to serve—a sense of duty to community and country that this college has sought to instill in each generation of students for more than 300 years"

Chancellor Gates began a career graduation from William & Mary. In 1966, he joined the Central Intelligence Agency, working for six presidents during nearly 27 years as an intelligence officer. During this period, he was a National Security Council staff member for nine years. Gates is the only career officer in the CIA's history to rise from being an entry-level employee to become from 1991 to 1993. He was Deputy and Deputy National Security Adviser at the White House for President George H. W. Bush from On December 18, 2006, Gates took of Defense under President George W. Bush. When inaugurated in January 2009, President Barack Obama asked Gates to continue in office.

In June 2011, Gates retired as Secretary of Defense. At the farewell ceremony, President Obama awarded him the Presidential Medal of Freedom, the country's highest civilian honor. He has also received the National Security Medal and the Presidential Citizens Medal. Gates was awarded the National Intelligence Distinguished Service Medal twice and the Distinguished Intelligence Medal, the CIA's highest award, three times.

Gates has authored four books to include his memoirs and a guide to leadership and institutional reform. His most recent book, *Exercise* of *Power*, details non-military instruments of power and their incorporation into US foreign policy.

A history major at William & Mary, Gates was an active member of Alpha Phi Omega, a service organization that he led as a senior. Gates was also a dormitory manager and orientation aide as well as the business manager of the William & Mary Review, a literary and art magazine. At graduation, he received the Algernon Sydney Sullivan Award, given to honor splendid characteristics of heart, mind and helpfulness to others.

Chancellor Gates' ties to his alma mater run deep. He has been a trustee of the William & Mary Foundation Board and spoke at Charter Day in 1998 and again in 2013 as well as at Commencement in 2007. He received an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from the university in 1998 and the Alumni Medallion, the Alumni Association's highest honor, in 2000.

A native of Kansas, Gates earned his master's degree in history from Indiana University and a doctorate in Russian and Soviet history from Georgetown University. From 2002 until 2006, he was president of Texas A&M University. Gates is a distinguished Eagle Scout and served as the Boy Scouts of America national president from 2014-2016. Gates joined the Board of Governors of the NCAA in 2020 as one of its five independent members. In the fall of 2021, he chaired the institution's Constitution Committee, delivering a new constitution to reshape collegiate athletics. Gates and his wife, Becky, live in Washington state.

Brian Mann is entering his third year as William & Mary's Director of Athletics. He was named the university's AD on June 23, 2021, and began his tenure at W&M on Aug. 9. 2021.

He is responsible for the daily operations of the Athletics Department and its approximately 500 student-athletes and 120 coaches and staff. He oversees the university's 23 Division I varsity sports, which compete in the Coastal Athletic Association

During the 2022-23 year, Tribe Athletics won two conference championships, with women's tennis repeating as CAA Champions and football earning the program's sixth conference title and tying the school record with 11 wins.

Other athletics highlights include:

For the second year in a row, two-time Women's Tennis Head Coach Jessica Giuggioli was named CAA Coach of the Year

Four student-athletes were named Rookie of the Year

Five student-athletes were named Player of the Year

Two baseball players were selected in the MLB draft, including Ben Williamson, who was the second-round draft pick of the Seattle Mariners

Colby Sorsdal ended his Tribe career as a consensus All-American and was selected by the Detroit Lions in the 5th round of the

NFL Draft.

Men's soccer's Diba Nwegbo continued his playing career, post-graduation by joining Birmingham Legion FC

A record 225 student-athletes earned the Provost Award (GPA

An NCAA report lists William & Mary with the highest Federal Graduation Rate among all Division I public schools - for the 17th time in 18 years

The Tribe had a graduation rate of 88%, nearly 20 points higher than the national average and was tenth among public and private schools at the D-I level

At the end of fiscal year, W&M Athletics reported raising \$13.1 million in gifts and pledges, surpassing last year's \$10.9 million. Twelve teams bettered their fundraising totals, with seven achieving their goals as part of \$6,819,730 in annual gifts received across the department. The \$808,000 that was raised on One Tribe One Day marked the largest amount collected in the history of the Athletics Department.

Student-athletes, coaches, and fans will all benefit from the ongoing renovation and expansion of Kaplan Arena, which features a new weight room, new locker rooms and study areas, plus renovated practice and game spaces. This fall a cutting-edge scoreboard with enhanced digital capabilities will be installed in Kaplan. Plans for the Mackesy Sports Performance Center (MSPC) – the crown jewel of the W&M Athletics Complex, are also taking shape.

Mann continues his focus on student-athlete well-being and with the launch of the innovative EXCEL program, adds a component that will provide student-athletes with enhanced opportunities for personal development and for life post-gradua-

While he joined W&M Athletics in 2021, Mann is not a newcomer to William & Mary. "Many years ago, I toured the campus with a friend. I fell in love right then and I've been keeping an eye on William & Mary ever since," he said.

The impact of a student-athlete's experience is intensely

personal, said Mann. "While my parents weren't able to secure their degrees, they instilled in their five children the importance of higher education. I know how difficult it is to earn a college degree, especially at an institution with the rigorous standards of a Public Ivy. Being a former student-athlete, I also understand the commitment, discipline and hard work the Tribe's student-athletes demonstrate every day.

A seasoned athletics administrator, Mann has more than 20 years of experience in intercollegiate athletics, the private sector and professional sports. Prior to W&M, he was the senior associate athletics director at the University of California, Berkeley.

As chief development officer/ senior associate athletics director at UC Berkeley, Mann was the architect for the athletics department's \$350 million portion of the university's \$6 billion campaign. He helped orchestrate a \$12.5 million gift to create a new student-athlete development program, a \$10.8 million bequest in support of women's athletics and the first-ever head coach endowment for a women's sport at Berkeley. He had sport oversight of the men's basketball team and was a key contributor to the department's ongoing strategic plan.

Prior to his stint at UC Berkeley, Mann was chief development officer and senior associate athletics director at Rice, where he was responsible for all fundraising for the Owls' athletics programs. He also was the single contact between athletics and the office of admission for all 16 sports.

Mann got his start in athletics at Dartmouth College, his alma mater, where he served as director of football operations and began his work in fundraising. Mann holds bachelor's and master's degrees from Dartmouth, where he played quarterback. His 5,912 career passing yards are third on the Big Green's all-time list. Before beginning his career in academia, Mann played professional football for the L.A. Avengers of the Arena Football League.

He and his wife Hilary have two young sons, Russell and Henry. They reside in Williamsburg.

After leading the William & Mary football team to one of the program's best seasons in school history last fall, Head Coach Mike London returns for his fifth season at the helm of the Tribe.

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the Colonial Athletic Association title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Ouarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year

mation Directors) Coach of the Year. In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned Ăll-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the al Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFI Draft

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jahn Janes

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards

per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five. Defensively, W&M's 33 sacks also ranked as the seventh-best total in school history.

The Tribe also excelled in the classroom as 55 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll accolades.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011)

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.

A standout defensive back at Richmond (1979-82), London served as a team captain his senior season and was signed by the Dallas Cowboys as a free agent in 1983.

London and his wife, Regina, have four children: daughters Ti-cynn, Jaicyn and Madicyn and son Korben. He has three children from a previous marriage: sons Michael Jr. and Brandon, and daughter Kristen.

ASSISTANT COACHES



Christian TaylorOffensive Coordinator • RB
4th Season

After helping elevate W&M into one of the nation's most productive, efficient and explosive offensive units, Christian Taylor '07 enters his fourth season as the Tribe's Offensive Coordinator and Running Backs Coach eager to continue building upon the program's success.

Under Taylor's leadership, W&M ascended to new heights in 2022 as he utilized a fundamentally sound, explosive and creative offensive philosophy that generated recordsetting numbers and helped the Tribe equal a school record with 11 victories, win a share of the CAA title and advance to the NCAA Quarterfinals.

Additional evidence of W&M's success in 2022 is found in the squad's statistical national ranking, as it concluded the regular season among the country's best in yards per play, explosive runs, passing yards per attempt and rushing yards per carry. The Tribe also set single-season school records for rushing yards per carry. Syn, ushing yards per carry (59), while its points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five best figures.

With a 'multiple, well-rounded offense, often interwoven with innovative schemes and plays not yet seen, Taylor has developed a record-breaking run game at W&M combined with one of the nation's most efficient and explosive passing attacks. In addition to a stable of running backs that features no less than four All-America caliber standouts, Taylor has helped develop junior quarterback Darius Wilson into an elite signal caller who ranked first in the CAA and among the top 10 nationally in passing efficiency, explosive passes and yards per completion.

Among those benefiting from Taylor's tutelage and offensive system were six standouts who earned All-CAA honors in 2022. Additionally, OL Colby Sorsdal was a consensus All-America selection and was selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.



Ras-I Dowling
Co-Defensive Coordinator • DB
5th Season

Ras-I Dowling enters his fifth season at W&M and his first as the co-defensive coordinator after earning the promotion during the offseason. He will continue to serve as the Tribe's secondary coach, a role he has held since 2020

Promoted to W&M's defensive passing game coordinator prior to the 2022 season, Dowling made a tremendous impact on the Tribe's success last fall. His unit helped the Tribe rank sixth nationally in third down conversion defense (315) and 18th in pass efficiency defense (117.8) - figures that ranked first and second, respectively, in the Colonial Athletic Association. Additionally, W&M ranked third in the CAA in pass defense (199.15) and interceptions (10)

Highlighting the Tribe standouts o benefited from Dowling's tutelage were a pair of cornerbacks in Jalen Jones and Ryan Poole. Jones was selected as the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year and was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award, which honors the FCS National Freshman of the Year. Additionally, he was chosen as the state of Virginia's Defensive Rookie of the Year by VaSID and earned freshman All-America distinction by Stats Perform, HERO Sports and Phil Steele Magazine. Poole earned All-CAA first-team accolades, marking the second straight season he has garnered all-league honors, while Jones was joined on the VaSID All-State Team by safety Tye Freeland.

Dowling excelled as a standout

Dowling excelled as a standout player under London's tutelage at UVA where he garnered All-America honors in 2010 and earned All-ACC accolades three times. Additionally, he served as a team captain and was a member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes (FCA).

Drafted by Bill Belichick and the New England Patriots with the 33rd overall pick in the 2011 NFL Draft, Dowling became the highest selected defensive back to ever play at the University of Virginia.



Bo RevellCo-Defensive Coordinator • ILB
9th Season

Bo Revell enters his ninth season at W&M and his first as the codefensive coordinator after earning the promotion during the offseason. He will continue to oversee the Tribe's inside linebackers.

A former standout tight end at W&M (2010-14), and a team captain, Revell has held numerous coordinator roles on the Tribe's staff during his tenure as an assistant coach, including special teams coordinator (2021), recruiting coordinator (2020-21) and video coordinator (2017-19).

Revell continued to make his mark on W&M's defensive unit with another tremendously successful campaign last season, as his group helped the squad rank first nationally in fumbles recovered (15), seventh in turnovers gained (25), sixth in third down conversion defense (.315) and 16th in red zone defense (.736). Additionally, the Tribe ranked second in the CAA in sacks (33) – a figure that ranks seventh on the program's all-time single-season list.

Highlighting the Tribe standouts who benefited from Revell's tutelage was all-conference selection Isaiah Jones, who was one of the league's most productive linebackers

As special teams coordinator, Revell also helped elevate W&M's special team's units into one of the conference's premier groups as it ranked second in the CAA in net kickoffs (41.8) and was highlighted by a pair of all-league selections in Caylin Newton (specialist) and Ethan Chang (place kicker).

In addition to producing multiple all-conference standouts during his tenure, Revell helped oversee the development of 2015 Butkus Award Watch List standout Luke Rhodes. One of the nation's top collegiate linebackers throughout his career at W&M, Rhodes signed a free agent contract with the Tampa Bay Buccaneers following a successful senior season in which he earned first-team all-conference honors. Rhodes is currently a member of the Indianapolis Colts and was selected as an All-Pro in 2021.

Matt Johns enters his fifth year as an assistant on W&M staff and his fourth coaching the quarterbacks. He will continue to serve as the Tribe's passing game coordinator after earning the promotion in 2022

Johns made a tremendous impact on the Tribe's success in his first season as the Tribe's passing game coordinator, as W&M established itself as one of the nation's most efficient and dynamic attacks through the air. Under Johns' direction, W&M ranked seventh nationally in passing efficiency (164.62), fourth in yards per attempt (9.64) and sixth in yards per completion (15.06). Those figures helped the Tribe post 448.8 total yards per game and 33.5 points per game – averages that rank fourth and fifth, respectively, on the program's all-time

Quarterback Darius Wilson has benefited tremendously from Johns' tutelage, as he emerged as one of the country's most dynamic and efficient signal callers as a sophomore in 2022. Wilson finished the year ranked fourth nationally in yards per pass attempt (9.42), sixth in yards per completion (14.91) and 11th in passing efficiency (158.6) and was honored as the state of Virginia's second-best quarterback by VaSID.

During the prior season, Wilson established himself as one of the nation's top freshmen and was honored as the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year. Additionally, he broke W&M's true freshman record for passing yards and total yards.

A former starting quarterback at the University of Virginia, Johns joined the Tribe's staff after serving as a graduate assistant working with the Cavaliers' defense in 2018.

En route to helping Virginia post an 8-5 record, which included a shutout victory against South Carolina in the Belk Bowl, UVA's defense produced three All-Atlantic Coast Conference selections. Additionally, the Cavaliers ranked 11th nationally in interceptions (17), 16th in passing yards allowed per game (183.0) and 21st in scoring defense (20.1).



Mike London Jr.

Video Coordinator • WR

5th Season

Mike London Jr. enters his fifth season at W&M as the wide receivers coach and his fourth as the video coordinator.

London's group played an integral role in the Tribe's record-setting offense last season, as W&M boasted one of the nation's most efficient and dynamic attacks through the air. W&M ranked seventh nationally in passing efficiency (164.62), fourth in yards per passing attempt (9.64) and sixth in yards per completion (15.06). Those figures helped the Tribe post 448.8 total yards per game and 33.5 points per game – averages that rank fourth and fifth, respectively, on the program's all-time single-season list.

Under London's Tutelage, W&M has produced some of the CAA's most dynamic wideouts during the last few seasons. Last fall, Caylin Newton garnered first-team all-conference honors as a specialist, while Zach Burdick (18.6) and Cole Blackman (16.4) both ranked among the league's best in yards per catch in 2021. After completing his collegiate career, Blackman signed a professional contract with the BC Lions (CFL).

London led a dynamic group of wideouts during his initial season with the Tribe in 2019, as multiple members of the unit flourished under his leadership. Kane Everson highlighted the position group and earned Freshman All-America honors after setting true freshman single-season school records for catches (46) and receiving yards (585). Zach Burdick also posted a breakout season under London's tutelage and ranked third in the conference and 16th nationally with 19.3 yards per catch.

London Jr. joined the Tribe's staff transcription as Howard University's wide receivers coach where he helped the Bison rank fourth nationally in yards per catch (17.27) and 16th in passing offense (278.0).

In addition to producing a pair of first-team All-MEAC wideouts, Jequez Ezzard ranked seventh nationally neceiving yards per game (106.4) and 11th in receiving touchdowns (12).



Mario Acitelli Run Game Coord. • OL 2nd Season

Mario Acitelli was promoted to W&M's run game coordinator during the offseason and will return for his second year as the Tribe's offensive line coach after rejoining the staff prior

to the 2022 campaign.

Under Acitelli's direction, the Tribe's offensive line established itself among the nation's top units and was a dominant force in W&M's recordbreaking 2022 campaign. The 2022 season was the best statistical season for the offensive line in school history. Through the regular season, the Tribe ranked 1st nationally in Sacks Allowed per game (0.64), 2nd in Explosive Runs (97), 3rd in Rushing Yards per game (274), 3rd in Rushing Yards per carry (6.3), and 6th in Rushing Yards before contact (1307). Additionally, the Tribe piled up 35 rushing touchdowns - the third-most in school history - as well as 448.8 total yards per game and 33.5 points per game – averages that rank fourth and fifth, respectively, on the program's all-time single-season list.

Acitelli's positive impact can also be ent in the development of one of the nation's top linemen in Colby Sorsdal, who was a consensus All-America selection and garnered an invite to the prestigious East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft Joining Sorsdal on the All-CAA First Team was left tackle Charles Grant, who also garnered national accolades as a member of HERO Sports Sophomore All-America Team

Sports Sophomore All-America Team.
An assistant on W&M's staff from 2014-18, Acitelli returned to Williamsburg in January 2022 with tremendous coaching credentials that included stints at LSU, North Carolina and Trace

and Texas

In addition to his success as a coach, Acitelli's exceptional playing career at Appalachian State was highlighted by a pair of FCS National Championships, All-America honors and earning the prestigious Jacobs Blocking Trophy, which is awarded to the Southern Conference's top offensive lineman.



Jack ArmstrongRecruiting Director • TE
4th Season

Jack Armstrong, a former team captain and wide receiver at W&M (2014-18), enters his fourth season as a full-time assistant and works with the tight ends. Additionally, will continue to serve as the recruiting director after earning the promotion in 2022

Under Armstrong's leadership, the Tribe's tight ends once again played a tremendous role in W&M's success offensively, contributing as blockers in both the running and passing game and as receivers in the air attack. In addition to ranking fourth nationally in fewest sacks allowed per game (0.77), W&M set school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe piled up 35 rushing touchdowns – the third-most in school history – as well as 448.8 total yards per game and 33.5 points per game – averages that rank fourth and fifth, respectively, on the program's all-

time single-season list.

Armstrong also oversaw the development of one of the nation's elite tight ends in Lachlan Pitts, who earned rookie minicamp invites with the Chicago Bears and Minnesota Vikings following his impressive collegiate career. The All-CAA standout was selected as top tight in the state of Virginia last fall after ranking 14th nationally in yards per catch (19.39) and leading W&M in receiving yards (543), receiving yards per game (41.8) and touchdown

Armstrong's first season on the staff in 2019 as an offensive analyst was an incredibly productive year for the Tribe. While W&M relied heavily on a talented true freshman class that included its starting quarterback, its leading receiver and three of its top four rushers, the offense nearly doubled its scoring output from the prior season – improving from 13.6 points/game in 2018 to 25.2 points/game in 2019. Additionally, W&M's total yardage per game catapulted by nearly 100 yards per contest.



Keenan CarterRecruiting Coordinator • DL
5th Season

Keenan Carter enters his fifth season as the Tribe's defensive line coach and was promoted to recruiting coordinator during the offseason.

Carter has made a tremendous impact leading W&M's defensive front and that was the case once again last season. His unit helped the Tribe rank first nationally in fumbles recovered (15), seventh in turnovers gained (25), sixth in third down conversion defense (.315) and 16th in red zone defense (.736). Additionally, the Tribe ranked second in the CAA in sacks (33) – a figure that ranks seventh on the program's all-time single-season list.

' Under Carter's l'eadership, the Tribe's defensive line has produced at least one all-conference standout during each of his four seasons. Nate Lynn once again highlighted the unit last fall and gamered multiple All-America honors for the second consecutive year. Additionally, Lynn was joined on the All-CAA Team by Carl Fowler, who was also chosen as a Campbell Trophy Semifinalist.

Carter's unit was instrumental in the Tribe's overall defensive success in 2021 as it ranked among the nation's top 20 in defensive touchdowns (11th), rushing defense (12th) and interceptions (18th). Additionally, W&M's 29 sacks were just two shy of ranking among the program's top-10 list, while it ranked third in the CAA in forced turnovers and pass efficiency defense.

Lynn also emerged as one of the nation's top players in 2021, as he earned multiple All-America accolades and was selected as a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award, which honors the nation's top FCS defensive player. Will Kiely also garnered All-CAA honors for the second consecutive season.

Bill Murray is also among the individual Tribe standouts who benefited from Carter's tutelage, as the former defensive tackle earned first-team All-America honors from Hero Sports and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots.

Darryl BlackstockSpecial Teams Coord. • OLB
5th Season

Darryl Blackstock enters his fifth season as an assistant on W&M staff and was promoted to special teams coordinator during the offseason. He will continue to work with the outside linebackers, a role he has held since 2020.

The 2022 season was another tremendously productive campaign for Blackstock's unit, as the group established itself among the nation's best and helped W&M rank among the country's most productive defenses. The Tribe ranked first nationally in fumbles recovered (15), seventh in turnovers gained (25), sixth in third down conversion defense (.315) and 16th in red zone defense (.736). Additionally, the Tribe ranked second in the CAA in sacks (33) – a figure that ranks seventh on the program's all-time single-season list.

Blackstock's positive impact can also be seen in the development of one of the nation's top players in John Pius. The sophomore was a unanimous All-America selection in 2022 and finished runner-up for the Buck Buchanan Award, which honors the nation's top FCS defensive player. Pius was also honored as the CAA Defensive Player of the Year after ranking fourth nationally in sacks (11.5) and fifth in TFL (19.0).

A seven-year NFL veteran as a linebacker/defensive end, Blackstock played professionally with the Arizona Cardinals (2005-07), Cincinnals Bengals (2008-09), Oakland Raiders (2011) and Baltimore Ravens (2012).

Selected by the Cardinals in the third round (95th pick overall) of the 2005 NFL Draft, Blackstock began his professional tenure after an outstanding collegiate career at the University of Virginia. A three-time All-Atlantic Coast Conference honoree, he led the league in sacks and ranked first in the nation among linebackers as a junior. His long list of collegiate accolades also includes being selected as the ACC Defensive Freshman of the Year by the Sporting News and garnering first-team freshman All-America distinction from numerous organizations.

O'Mary is a 2010 graduate of Eastern Kentucky, where he majored in athletic training. He earned his master's degree in sports administration at EKU in 2012.


