MATCHUP

The No. 22/24 William & Mary football team will return to action when it hosts Monmouth as part of Family Weekend at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 1 p.m. The contest will be televised on Cox, while a video stream will be available on FloFootball. A radio broadcast will be available on 92.3 FM The Tide.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M will look to snap a three-game skid when it hosts Monmouth. The Tribe enters the contest with

one of the country's top defensive units and currently ranks second nationally in passing defense (146.9), third in total defense (264.6) and sixth in scoring defense (16.4) and third down defense (.286). Additionally, the Tribe ranks among the country's top 10 in sacks per game (2.86). Offensively, Malachi Imoh leads W&M's rushing attack that is averaging 235.7 yards per game on the ground – an impressive figure that ranks seventh nationally. Imoh has rushed for more than 100 yards in four of the last five games.

SCOUTING THE HAWKS

Monmouth currently owns a 3-4 overall record and a 2-2 mark in conference play. One of the CAA's most productive offensive teams this season, Monmouth is averaging 35.6 points per game and leads the league in total offense (440.9). Running back Jaden Shirden ranks third nationally with 131.7 rushing yards per game, while wideout Dymere Miller ranks third in the country in receptions per game (8.1) and receiving yards per game (99.7).

■ TEAM NOTES

RECORD-BREAKING CROWD

A record-breaking crowd of 13,713 was in attendance for the Tribe's homecoming game against Towson last Saturday. It marked the biggest crowd to see a Tribe football game in the stadium's current configuration (dating back to 2016).

HOME WINNING STREAK SNAPPED

W&M's loss to Towson last weekend snapped a six-game home winning streak at Zable Stadium that dated back to the start of last season.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 31-6 record during the last six seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

During the last three seasons, W&M is 20-3 in such contests.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last six seasons, W&M is 20-4 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 4-15 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 35 of its last 42 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 52-6 record when leading after three quarters.

RECORD STREAKS SNAPPED

The setback at Elon earlier this fall snapped a pair of school-record winning streaks, including consecutive CAA wins (nine) and regular-season road wins (eight).

Additionally, W&M regular-season winning streak ended at 11 games, which was just one shy of the school record set in 1993-94.

4-0 START

W&M'S 4-0 start this season equaled the program's best season-opening record since 2009.

The Tribe posted the program's best start - 6-0 - twice, coming in 1986 and 1992.

FEDEX GROUND FCS NATIONAL TEAM OF THE WEEK

After extending its season-opening winning streak to four games with an impressive 28-3 victory against Maine, W&M was selected as the FedEx Ground FCS National Team of the Week.

En route to securing the lopsided conference victory, W&M's defense held Maine to just 138 total yards and a field goal. It marked the third consecutive game in which the Tribe's defense did not allow an offensive touchdown, as the unit has held opponents to just 123.6 total yards per game during the impressive three-game stretch.

W&M's offense was equally dominant on the ground and rushed for 331 yards, which included three rushing touchdowns. The Tribe scored touchdowns on all four of its trips into the red zone.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

With its win at Charleston Southern, W&M has won 41 of its last 43 games against non-conference FCS opponents during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally W&M owns a 44-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

HOME OPENERS

With its win against Wofford, W&M improved to 33-11 in its home openers since 1980.

Additionally, the Tribe has won 14 of its last 16 home openers, winning by an average margin of 21.2 points in the victories (+297).

CAA OPENERS

With its 34-24 victory at Campbell, W&M reversed a recent trend of struggling in its CAA openers. The Tribe entered the contest having lost six of its last seven conference lidlifters.

The contest at Campbell marked the fifth time in the last six seasons in which W&M opened its CAA slate on the road.

PRESEASON NATIONAL RANKINGS

With 15 starters returning from last season's record-setting campaign, W&M enters 2023 ranked No. 4 in both the Stats Perform and AFCA Coaches preseason poll.

Led by 2022 Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Finalist Mike London, the Tribe is looking to build off last season's tremendously successful year in which it equaled a school record with 11 victories, advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals and won a share of the CAA title.

CAA PRESEASON FAVORITES

W&M was chosen as the overwhelming favorite to repeat as CAA champions according to a vote of the conference's head coaches during the annual preseason media day event.

W&M's selection as the CAA favorite was nearly unanimous, as it received 13 of the 15 first-place votes (teams cannot vote for themselves).

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

W&M boasts five preseason All-Americans this year, as linebacker John Pius, defensive end Nate Lynn, running back Bronson Yoder, cornerback Ryan Poole and long snapper Nick Levy all garnered national accolades this summer.

PRESEASON ALL-CAA SELECTIONS

Led by CAA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year John Pius, seven W&M standouts earned preseason all-conference honors. In addition to Pius, running back Bronson Yoder, offensive lineman Charles Grant, defensive end Nate Lynn, linebacker Isaiah Jones, cornerback Ryan Poole and cornerback Jalen Jones all garnered distinction.

W&M's seven all-conference picks were the most of any team in the league, while its five defensive selections also led all schools.

Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson, safety Marcus Barnes and punter Will Whitehurst earned honorable mention accolades.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are five seniors - offensive lineman Marcus Crowell, linebacker Kevin Jarrell, defensive end Nate Lynn, cornerback Ryan Poole and running back Bronson Yoder.

GRADUATES

In addition to the three grad transfers who joined the roster this season, six members of the Tribe have already earned their undergraduate degrees at W&M - Drew Babcock (B.B.A Marketing), Bart Francois (B.S. Kinesiology & Health Sciences), Isaiah Jones (B.S. Kinesiology & Health Sciences) Hollis Mathis (B.S. Kinesiology & Health Sciences) Brayden Staib (B.S. Kinesiology & Health Sciences)and Alex Washington (B.B.A. Marketing).

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Seven former Tribe standouts were in NFL preseason camps this year - safety DeAndre Houston-Carson (Ravens), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive lineman Bill Murray (Patriots/Bears), offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal (Lions), offensive lineman Andrew Trainer (Chargers), tight end Lachlan Pitts (Bears) and running back Owen Wright (Ravens).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills).

Additionally, New York Giants head coach Brian Daboll was an assistant on W&M's staff in 1997.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

AMONG THE BEST

W&M boasts one of the nation's top ground games and currently ranks seventh nationally in rushing yards per game (235.7).

Additionally, the Tribe is averaging 5.4 yards per carry.

BALANCED ATTACK

W&M has utilized a balanced rushing attack this season, as four players currently average at least 33.0 rushing yards per game - Bronson Yoder (102.0), Malachi Imoh (86.0), Darius Wilson (40.9) and Martin Lucas (33.7).

Additionally, all four players have scored at least one rushing touchdown.

OFFENSIVE LINE SUCCESS

In addition to helping W&M rank seventh nationally in rushing (235.7), the Tribe's offensive line ranks first in the CAA in fewest sacks allowed per game (1.29).

PROTECTING THE BALL

 $\ensuremath{\mathsf{W\&M}}$ has committed just seven turnovers this season and ranks second in the CAA and 20th

nationally in fewest turnovers lost.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

W&M has controlled the time of possession this season and ranks 16th nationally (32:38).

COMING FROM EVERY ANGLE

Six different players on W&M's roster have thrown at least one career touchdown pass - Darius Wilson, Hollis Mathis, Tyler Hughes, Sean Kendrick, Malachi Imoh and Andrew Piercy.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 100 times and posted an 91-10 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 50-10 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 11-26 mark in such contests.

TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

ELITE DEFENSE

W&M has established itself as one of the nation's elite defensive units this season with a tremendous start to the 2023 campaign. The Tribe currently ranks third nationally in total defense (264.6), second in passing defense (146.9) and sixth in scoring defense (14.4)

Additionally, W&M ranks sixth in third down defense (.286).

SACKING THE OPPOSITION

W&M has been effective getting stops behind the line of scrimmage this season and currently ranks ninth nationally in sacks per game (2.86).

DYNAMIC DUO

Linebacker John Pius and Nate Lynn combine to form one of the nation's top defensive duos. Last season the pair combined to total 19.5 sacks and 32 TFL. In addition to garnering preseason All-America honors, both players were selected to the Buck Buchanan Award Watch List and the Shrine Bowl 1000

Additionally, Pius was chosen to the Butkus Award Watch List (the lone FCS player selected) and the Senior Bowl Watch List.

This season, the duo has combined to total 15.0 sacks and 21.5 TFL.

STOPPING THE RUN

After allowing a pair of rushing touchdowns in the season-opening win at Campbell, W&M has allowed just three scores on the ground in the last six games.

THIRD QUARTER DEFENSE

W&M has been outstanding defensively following halftime this season and has allowed just two touchdowns in the third quarter this season.



TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 19.0 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 75 games (1,425 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 49-26 at home during that span.

IMPRESSIVE STRETCH

W&M's defense posted an impressive stretch of 15 consecutive quarters without allowing an offensive touchdown earlier this season.

After allowing a late touchdown in the season opener at Campbell, the Tribe's defense did not let an opponent find the end zone until the fourth quarter in its fifth game (Elon). Charleston Southern did manage a touchdown, but it came on special teams via of a kick return.

HISTORIC PERFORMANCE

W&M posted one of the best defensive performances in school history in last week's win at Charleston Southern. In addition to not allowing any offensive points, the Tribe limited CSU to just 77 total yards. It marked the first time since 1996 that W&M held an opponent to fewer than 100 yards.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 181 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 13 times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 78 games, just 26 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

W&M's defense has allowed just seven passing touchdowns through seven games this season after surrendering just 14 passing touchdowns last season.

After leading the William & Mary football team to one of the program's best seasons in school history last fall, Head Coach Mike London returns for his fifth season at the helm of the Tribe.

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the Colonial Athletic Association title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were recognized with national honors for their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned All-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS National Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jalen Jones.

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five. Defensively, W&M's 33 sacks also ranked as the seventh-best total in school history.

Under London's leadership, W&M continued its upward trajectory during the 2021 campaign as it posted the program's most wins since 2015 and garnered a national ranking in multiple weeks. Highlighting the notable victories was a 31-18 road win at No. 4 Villanova. W&M finished the year with the CAA's most productive rushing offense and the nation's 12th-ranked rushing

Individually, seven Tribe standouts earned postseason all-conference honors, highlighted by a pair of All-America standouts in defensive end Nate Lynn, a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist for national defensive player of the year, and left tackle Andrew Trainer, who signed a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Chargers. Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson was selected as the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year.

Although the COVID-19 global pandemic limited London's second season with the Tribe to a three-game slate during the spring, he successfully guided the program through the challenges. A pair of standouts – left tackle Andrew Trainer and defensive end Will Kiely – both earned all-conference honors, while standout freshman running back Malachi Imoh garnered all-state distinction.

The team also continued its tradition of academic excellence, as a program-record 69 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll Accolades during the fall semester.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games - including a Capital Cup victory at longtime rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, four members of the squad earned Freshman All-America honors.

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Williamsburg. In addition to nearly doubling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26).

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record - the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish

the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.
