INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

After opening its season with a 34-24 victory at Campbell last Thursday, the fourth-ranked William & Mary football team will open its home slate when it hosts Wofford at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 6 p.m. The contest will be televised on Cox, while a video stream will be available on FloFootball. A radio broadcast will be available on 92.3 FM The Tide.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M will look to build off an impressive season-opening conference win at Campbell when it hosts Wofford on Saturday. The Tribe piled up 270 rushing yards with a pair of rushing touchdowns against the Camels, while it also found the end zone twice through the air. The offensive line did not allow a sack. In addition to forcing a pair of pivotal turnovers in the first half, W&M's defense held Campbell to just 69 yards after halftime. Running back Bronson Yoder rushed for a game-high 124 yards on 20 carries with two touchdowns, while defensive end Nate Lynn recorded a pair of sacks.

SCOUTING THE TERRIERS

Wofford opened its season with a 45-7 setback at Pittsburgh last Saturday. The Panthers out-gained the Terriers, 491-126, and limited WC to -1 rushing yard on 19 carries. Quarterback Bryce Corriston and wide receiver Tyler Parker connected on a 75-yard touchdown strike for Wofford's only score. Safety John Michael DiRoberto led the Terriers with 11 tackles, while linebacker David Powers posted eight stops and a sack.

ABOUT THE SERIES

Saturday's game will mark just third meeting between W&M and Wofford, as both of the previous two matchups were played in Williamsburg. The Tribe earned a 30-14 victory on Homecoming at Zable Stadium in 1988, while W&M blanked Wofford, 19-0, in 1930.

■ TEAM NOTES

HOME OPENERS

W&M has posted a 32-11 record in home openers since 1980.

Additionally, the Tribe has won 13 of its last 15 home openers, winning by an average margin of 21.5 points in the victories (+280).

The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

W&M has won 39 of its last 41 games against non-conference FCS opponents during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally W&M owns a 42-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

W&M VS. THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

W&M boasts an 82-20 all-time record against teams currently in the Southern Conference.

The Tribe owns winning records against VMI (53-33-2), The Citadel (18-7) and Wofford (2-0), while it trails in series versus Furman (7-8) and Samford (0-1). W&M owns 1-1 records against Chattanooga and East Tennessee State, while it has never played Mercer or Western Carolina.

W&M & Mary was a member of the Southern Conference from 1936-1977 and won four league titles (1942, 1947, 1966, 1970).

CAA OPENERS

With its 34-24 victory at Campbell, W&M reversed a recent trend of struggling in its CAA openers. The Tribe entered the contest having lost six of its last seven conference lidlifters.

The contest at Campbell marked the fifth time in the last six seasons in which W&M opened its CAA slate on the road.

FIRST STARTS

Three W&M players earned their first career starts in the season-opening win at Campbell - WR Josh Guilford, DL Davin Dzidzienyo and DL Sammy Sarantis.

Additionally a pair of true freshmen made their collegiate debuts - WR Garrett Robertson and DL Gent Veizi.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last six seasons, W&M is 19-3 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 4-13 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

W&M was +2 in turnovers at Campbell and did not commit any turnovers.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 29-5 record during the last six seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

During the last three seasons, W&M is 18-2 in such contests.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe

has won 32 of its last 37 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 49-5 record when leading after three quarters.

PRESEASON NATIONAL RANKINGS

With 15 starters returning from last season's record-setting campaign, W&M enters 2023 ranked No. 4 in both the Stats Perform and AFCA Coaches preseason poll.

Led by 2022 Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Finalist Mike London, the Tribe is looking to build off last season's tremendously successful year in which it equaled a school record with 11 victories, advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals and won a share of the CAA title.

CAA PRESEASON FAVORITES

W&M was chosen as the overwhelming favorite to repeat as CAA champions according to a vote of the conference's head coaches during the annual preseason media day event.

W&M's selection as the CAA favorite was nearly unanimous, as it received 13 of the 15 first-place votes (teams cannot vote for themselves).

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

W&M boasts five preseason All-Americans this year, as linebacker John Pius, defensive end Nate Lynn, running back Bronson Yoder, cornerback Ryan Poole and long snapper Nick Levy all garnered national accolades this summer.

PRESEASON ALL-CAA SELECTIONS

Led by CAA Preseason Defensive Player of the Year John Pius, seven W&M standouts earned preseason all-conference honors. In addition to Pius, running back Bronson Yoder, offensive lineman Charles Grant, defensive end Nate Lynn, linebacker Isaiah Jones, cornerback Ryan Poole and cornerback Jalen Jones all garnered distinction.

W&M's seven all-conference picks were the most of any team in the league, while its five defensive selections also led all schools.

Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson, safety Marcus Barnes and punter Will Whitehurst earned honorable mention accolades.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are five seniors - offensive lineman Marcus Crowell, linebacker Kevin Jarrell, defensive end Nate Lynn, cornerback Ryan Poole and running back Bronson Yoder.

GRADUATES

In addition to the three grad transfers who joined the roster this season, six members of the Tribe have already earned their undergraduate degrees at W&M - Drew Babcock (B.B.A. Marketing), Bart Francois (B.S. Kinesiology & Health Sciences), Isaiah Jones (B.S. Kinesiology & Health Sciences) Hollis Mathis (B.S. Kinesiology & Health Sciences) Brayden Staib (B.S. Kinesiology & Health Sciences) and Alex Washington (B.B.A. Marketing).

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Seven former Tribe standouts were in NFL preseason camps this year - safety DeAndre Houston-Carson (Ravens), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive lineman Bill Murray (Patriots/Bears), offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal (Lions), offensive lineman Andrew Trainer (Chargers), tight end Lachlan Pitts (Bears) and running back Owen Wright (Ravens).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills), while Alan Williams '92 is currently the Chicago Bears' defensive coordinator.

Additionally, New York Giants head coach Brian Daboll was an assistant on W&M's staff in 1997.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

STRONG START

After boasting one of the nation's most productive offenses last season, W&M opened the 2023 campaign with an impressive start in the season-opening win at Campbell.

In addition to scoring 34 points, W&M piled up 452 total yards. The balanced attack included 270 rushing yards and 182 passing yards. Additionally, W&M averaged 5.9 yards per carry, did not allow any sacks or commit any turnovers.

RED ZONE PRODUCTION

W&M scored in all four of its trips into the red zone in the season-opening win at Campbell.

The Tribe found the end zone on three of the four occasions, while it also connected on a field goal.

THIRD DOWN CONVERSIONS

W&M converted 8-of-15 third down opportunities in its season-opening win at Campbell.

Additionally, it was 2-of-3 on its fourth-down conversions.

CONTROLLING THE CLOCK

W&M dominated the time of possession in its season-opening win at Campbell, as it controlled the ball for more than 36 minutes.

COMING FROM EVERY ANGLE

Six different players on W&M's roster have thrown at least one career touchdown pass - Darius Wilson, Hollis Mathis, Tyler Hughes, Sean Kendrick, Malachi Imoh and Andrew Piercy.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 98 times and posted an 90-8 record in those contests. Three of those eight losses came in 2021.

Additionally, W&M is 48-8 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 11-26 mark in such contests.

RETURNING STARTERS

Led by preseason all-conference standouts RB Bronson Yoder, OL Charles Grant and QB Darius Wilson, W&M returns nine offensive players who earned at least five starts last season - Wilson (13), Grant (13), OL Bart Francois (13), OL Rian Haigler (13), OL Ryan McKenna (13), WR JT Mayo (12), Yoder (11), WR DreSean Kendrick (9) and TE Colton Turner (5).

OFFENSIVE LINE

In addition to returning four offensive linemen who started all 13 games last season, senior captain Marcus Crowell returns after missing the entire 2022 campaign due to injury. Crowell has earned 11 starts during his career.

The lone loss on W&M's offensive line is Colby Sorsdal, who was selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of last spring's NFL Draft.

Expectations are high for the talented and experienced group. Through the regular season last fall, W&M ranked first nationally in sacks allowed per game (0.64), second in explosive runs (97), third in rushing yards per game (274.0), third in rushing yards per carry (6.3) and sixth in rushing yards before contact (1,307).

RUSHING ATTACK

After setting single-season school records in 2022 for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9), W&M returns its top three rushers from last fall - Bronson Yoder (1,255), Malachi Imoh (722) and Darius Wilson (534).

EFFICIENT PASSING ATTACK

Led by preseason All-CAA quarterback Darius Wilson, W&M boasted one of the nation's most efficient passing attacks last fall and ranked seventh in passing efficiency (164.62), fourth in yards per attempt (9.64) and sixth in yards per completion (15.06).

Those figures helped the Tribe post 448.8 total yards per game and 33.5 points per game - averages that rank fourth and fifth, respectively, on the program's all-time single-season list.



■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

STRONG SECOND HALF

A key to W&M's season-opening win at Campbell was the defensive performance in the second half. The Tribe held the Camels to just 69 total yards following halftime.

W&M was especially impressive against the run, as it limited Campbell to -12 rushing yards.

STOPPING THE RUN

In addition to holding Campbell to -12 rushing yards in the second half, W&M allowed just 84 rushing yards during the entire game. The Camels managed just 2.9 yards per carry versus the Tribe's stout defense.

THIRD DOWN STOPS

W&M was outstanding on third downs in the season-opening win at Campbell, as it held the Camels to just 2-of-8 on third downs.

W&M ranked sixth nationally last season by limiting opponent to a 31.5 third down conversion percentage.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 19.1 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 72 games (1,382 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 47-25 at home during that span.

FORCING TURNOVERS

The Tribe forced 25 turnovers last season, an impressive total that ranked seventh nationally.

W&M generated a pair of turnovers - both fumbles - in the season-opening win at Campbell.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 175 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 13 times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 72 games, just 23 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

W&M's defense allowed just one passing touchdown in the win at Campbell after surrendering just 14 passing touchdowns last season.

WE'RE BACK

Led by a trio of preseason All-Americans - LB John Pius, DE Nate Lynn and CB Ryan Poole - W&M returns eight defensive players who started at least eight games last season - Pius (13), Lynn (13), LB Isaiah Jones (13), LB Kevin Jarrell (11), DB Marcus Barnes (11), CB Jalen Jones (11), Poole (10) and DB Malcolm Spencer (8).

DYNAMIC DUO

Linebacker John Pius and Nate Lynn combine to form one of the nation's top defensive duos. Last season the pair combined to total 19.5 sacks and 32 TFL. In addition to garnering preseason All-America honors, both players were selected to the Buck

Buchanan Award Watch List and the Shrine Bowl 1000.

Additionally, Pius was chosen to the Butkus Award Watch List (the lone FCS player selected) and the Senior Bowl Watch List.

After leading the William & Mary football team to one of the program's best seasons in school history last fall, Head Coach Mike London returns for his fifth season at the helm of the Tribe.

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the Colonial Athletic Association title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were recognized with national honors for their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned All-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS National Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jalen Jones.

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five. Defensively, W&M's 33 sacks also ranked as the seventh-best total in school history.

Under London's leadership, W&M continued its upward trajectory during the 2021 campaign as it posted the program's most wins since 2015 and garnered a national ranking in multiple weeks. Highlighting the notable victories was a 31-18 road win at No. 4 Villanova. W&M finished the year with the CAA's most productive rushing offense and the nation's 12th-ranked rushing defense.

Individually, seven Tribe standouts earned postseason all-conference honors, highlighted by a pair of All-America standouts in defensive end Nate Lynn, a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist for national defensive player of the year, and left tackle Andrew Trainer, who signed a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Chargers. Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson was selected as the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year.

Although the COVID-19 global pandemic limited London's second season with the Tribe to a three-game slate during the spring, he successfully guided the program through the challenges. A pair of standouts – left tackle Andrew Trainer and defensive end Will Kiely – both earned all-conference honors, while standout freshman running back Malachi Imoh garnered all-state distinction.

The team also continued its tradition of academic excellence, as a program-record 69 players earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll Accolades during the fall semester.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots. Additionally, four members of the squad earned Freshman All-America honors.

Under London's leadership, the Tribe also dramatically improved in a number of offensive statistical categories during his first season in Williamsburg. In addition to nearly doubling its scoring production from the previous year (25.2), W&M increased its total offense by nearly 100 yards per game. The Tribe also increased its rushing average by more than 130 yards per contest and more than quadrupled its rushing touchdown total (26).

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the Associated Press (AP) Poll.
