MATCHUP

No. 13/14 William & Mary will look to open its season with consecutive wins for the third straight season when it plays at Coastal Carolina on Saturday at 7 p.m. The contest will be televised by ESPN+, while a radio broadcast will be available on 92.3 FM The Tide.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M opened its season with a convincing 41-7 victory against VMI last Saturday. Led by an efficient performance by quarterback Darius Wilson (11-of-15, 190 yds, 2TD) and a pair of touchdowns by Hollis

Mathis, the Tribe jumped out to a 21-0 lead midway through the second quarter and piled up all 41 of its points through three quarters. Defensively, W&M held the Keydets scoreless in the second half and allowed just 72 total yards in the final 30 minutes. W&M outgained VMI, 446-241, which included a 241-96 advantage through the air. Additionally, W&M scored touchdowns with all four of its trips into the red zone and were forced to punt just twice.

SCOUTING THE CHANTICLEERS

Coastal Carolina opened its season with a lopsided 55-27 win at Jacksonville State last weekend. The Chanticleers totaled 552 yards, including 294 on the ground, en route to setting a school record for most points scored in a season opener. Quarterback Ethan Vasko was named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week after accounting for 288 yards of total offense and three touchdowns. Senior Bowl Watch List selection Will Whitson led CCU's defensive effort with six tackles, a sack and a forced fumble, while Shane Bruce posted a team-high eight tackles.

■ TEAM NOTES

COACH LONDON Vs. THE FBS

W&M's win at Charlotte in the 2022 season opener marked the third time head coach Mike London has led an FCS team to a victory against a FBS squad - Richmond def. Duke (2009); Howard def. UNLV (2017).

London owns a 3-8 all-time record versus FBS teams as an FCS head coach.

SUCCESS VS. THE FBS

W&M has performed well in many of its recent contests against FBS opponents. In addition to defeating UVA in 2009 and winning at Charlotte in 2022, W&M owned second half leads in multiple games against FBS foes.

Below is a quick look at some of those matchups.

2022 Charlotte W, 41-24

W&M totaled 559 yards of total offense

2015 Virginia L, 35-29

Had chance for go-ahead TD, but final drive stalled at UVA's 30 with 1:27 left in 4Ω

2013 West Virginia L, 24-17 W&M led by 10 midway through 3Q

2012 Maryland L, 7-6

W&M held UM scoreless until 9:52 remaining

2010 North Carolina L, 21-17

W&M led by 10 with less than 10 minutes left

2009 Virginia W, 26-14 W&M held UVA to just 269 total yds

SOUTH CAROLINA BOUND

Although Saturday's game at Coastal Carolina will mark the first meeting between the two schools, W&M will return to the Palmetto State again next weekend when it plays at Wofford.

STRONG STARTS

A win at Coastal Carolina on Saturday would mark the third consecutive season in which W&M has opened its season with multiple wins. The Tribe won its first four games last fall after beginning 3-0 in 2022.

W&M won its road openers each of the last two seasons.

NATIONAL RANKING

W&M enters Saturday's game ranked No. 13 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and No. 14 in the AFCA FCS Coaches' Top 25 Poll.

It marks the fourth consecutive season in which W&M has garnered a top-25 national ranking.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 34-7 record during the last seven seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points

During the last four seasons, W&M is 23-4 in such contests.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last seven seasons, W&M is 23-4 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 4-15 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 37 of its last 44 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 54-6 record when leading after three quarters.

SUCCESS AT HOME

With its season-opening win against VMI, W&M has posted an 8-2 record at Zable Stadium during the last three seasons.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

W&M has won 42 of its last 44 games against non-conference FCS opponents during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally W&M owns a 45-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

PRESEASON NATIONAL RANKINGS

With 12 starters returning from last season's squad (8 offense / 4 defense), W&M garnered multiple preseason national rankings. The Tribe is No. 15 in the Stats Perform Poll and No. 16 in the AFCA Coaches Poll.

W&M enters the 2024 campaign having posted three consecutive winning seasons. Additionally, the Tribe earned a top-25 ranking for multiple weeks during each of the last three years.

W&M was picked to finished fourth in the CAA preseason poll by the league's 16 head coaches.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

After establishing themselves among the nation's best players, W&M senior left tackle Charles Grant and senior running back Bronson Yoder were selected to multiple preseason All-America teams this summer. The duo was also tabbed to the East-West Shrine Bowl 1000 Watch List and garnered preseason All-CAA honors by the league's head coaches, while Grant was chosen to the prestigious Senior Bowl Watch List.

PRESEASON ALL-CAA SELECTIONS

In addition to Charles Grant and Bronson Yoder, four other W&M standouts earned preseason all-conference honors - fullback/halfback Trey McDonald, running back Malachi Imoh, offensive lineman Ryan McKenna and safety Marcus Barnes.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are six seniors - OL Charles Grant, ATH Hollis Mathis, OL Ryan McKenna, LB Quinn Osborne, LB Alex Washington and RB Bronson Yoder, who is a two-time team captain. The six captains are the most in school history.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Five former Tribe standouts were in NFL preseason camps this year - linebacker/defensive end Nate Lynn (Lions), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive lineman Bill Murray (Bears), offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal (Lions) and running back Owen Wright (Ravens).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills).

New York Giants head coach Brian Daboll was an assistant on W&M's staff in 1997, while Washington Commanders head coach Dan Quinn was an assistant with the Tribe in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

BIG NUMBERS

In addition to scoring 41 points in its seasonopening win against VMI, W&M piled up 446 yards of total offense. It marked the debut of Mario Acitelli as offensive coordinator, who was promoted to the role during the offseason.

BALANCED ATTACK

W&M was successful in utilizing a balanced attack in the win against VMI, as it eclipsed 200 yards on the ground (205) and through the air (241). It marked the first time W&M has accomplished the feat since the NCAA Playoff win versus Gardner-Webb in 2022.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

W&M was outstanding in the Red Zone against VMI and scored touchdowns in all four of its trips inside the opposition's 20.

EARLY AND OFTEN

All 41 of W&M's points against VMI came in the first three quarters.

LOTS OF OPTIONS

Ten different W&M players recorded at least one reception in the season-opening win against VMI.

BIG GAINS

W&M averaged 5.7 yards per carry and 16.1 yards per catch in the season-opening win against VMI.

QB EFFICIENCY

W&M's quarterbacks combined to post a 209.22 passing efficiency rating in the win against VMI. The figure ranked as the nation's sixth-best effort in Week 1.

The Tribe quarterbacks combined to complete 15-of-20 passes for 241 yards with two touchdowns and no interceptions.

PROTECTING THE QB

A big part of W&M's success offensively was the play of the offensive line, which did not allow any sacks in the season opener against VMI.

CHANCE TO MAKE HISTORY

Hollis Mathis needs just 526 receiving yards to become the second player in the history of college football to total 1,000 career yards passing, receiving and rushing.

PROTECTING THE BALL

After ranking sixth nationally last season in fewest turnovers committed (10), W&M committed just one turnover in the season-opening win against VMI.

COMING FROM EVERY ANGLE

Six different players on W&M's roster have thrown at least one career touchdown pass - Darius Wilson, Hollis Mathis, Tyler Hughes, Sean Kendrick, Malachi Imoh and Andrew Piercy.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 101 times and posted an 92-10 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 51-10 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 12-26 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

DOMINANT DEBUT

Despite losing five all-conference standouts from last season's tremendous defense, W&M posted a dominant season-opening performance in the win against VMI. In addition to limiting the Keydets to just seven points and 241 yards, W&M was especially strong in the second half when it allowed just 72 total yards and held the Keydets scoreless.

DEFENDING THE PASS

W&M's defensive unit held VMI to just 96 passing yards and posted two interceptions in the season-opening win. The effort help W&M post the nation's sixth-best team passing efficiency defense rating during the opening week (64.26).

STOPPING THE RUN

After allowing less than one rushing score per game last season (0.9), W&M is off to another strong start this fall and allowed just one rushing touchdown in the season-opening win against VMI.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 186 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 13 times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 83 games, just 27 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

During the last three seasons, W&M's defense is allowing just 1.04 touchdown passes per game (26 TD / 25 games).

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.6 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 78 games (1,455 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 51-27 at home during that span.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE & SPECIAL TEAMS

After recording two non-offensive touchdowns last season, W&M found the end zone on a blocked punt return against VMI.

Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 47 non-offensive touchdowns.

After leading the William & Mary football team to three consecutive winning campaigns, Head Coach Mike London returns for his sixth season at the helm of the Tribe.

W&M ascended as high as No. 4 in the national rankings in 2023, marking the third straight season in which the Tribe garnered a national ranking and the second straight year in which it appeared in the top 10.

During the recent stretch of success, London has helped Tribe standouts garner 32 All-CAA honors during the last three seasons, highlighted by 14 first-team selections. Additionally, 14 W&M players have combined to earn 45 All-America honors during London's tenure.

In addition to the numerous accolades, London has overseen the development of five former Tribe standouts who have signed NFL contracts – Nate Lynn (Lions), Colby Sorsdal (Lions), Owen Wright (Ravens), Andrew Trainer (Chargers) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Numerous achievements highlighted the Tribe's most recent campaign last fall. In addition to extending the program's streak of winning seasons and once again appearing in the national polls, five W&M standouts combined to earn 13 All-America honors. Additionally, 10 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades. Highlighting the impressive group was All-America defensive end Nate Lynn, who signed a free agent contract with the Detroit Lions.

One of the country's top teams defensively, W&M ranked 10th nationally in total defense (303.8), 12th in scoring defense (18.5) and fourth in passing defense (153.5).

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the CAA title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were recognized with national honors for their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned All-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS National Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA

Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jalen Jones.

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five

(448.8) all ranked among the program's top five.

Under London's leadership, W&M continued its upward trajectory during the 2021 campaign as it posted the program's most wins since 2015 and garnered a national ranking in multiple weeks. Highlighting the notable victories was a 31-18 road win at No. 4 Villanova.

Individually, seven Tribe standouts earned postseason all-conference honors, highlighted by a pair of All-America standouts in defensive end Nate Lynn, a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist for national defensive player of the year, and left tackle Andrew Trainer, who signed a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Chargers. Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson was selected as the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the AP Poll.
