INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

No. 11/12 William & Mary will open its conference slate when it hosts Hampton at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 6 p.m. The contest will be televised on FloFootball, while a radio broadcast will be available on 92.3 FM The Tide.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M posted a 3-1 record during its non-conference slate and recorded a perfect 3-0 mark versus FCS opponents - all of which came from the Southern Conference (VMI, Wofford, Furman). Led by running

back Bronson Yoder (166 yards) and quarterback Darius Wilson (155 yards), who both rushed for career highs, the Tribe piled up 384 yards on the ground in last week's win against Furman and now ranks fifth nationally in rushing (243.5). Additionally, W&M ranks 16th nationally in total offense (418.8) and 25th in scoring offense (31.0). Defensively, TJ McGill was honored as the CAA Rookie of the Week following last week's win after recording his first career interception - one of three turnovers forced by W&M's defense.

SCOUTING THE PIRATES

Hampton also posted a 3-1 record during its nonconference slate and won its last three games after opening the season with a 30-28 setback to Morgan State. The Pirates boast one of the country's top rushing attacks and rank 13th nationally with 208.0 yards per game on the ground. Defensively, HU ranks 11th nationally in total defense (272.8) and 18th in scoring defense (19.5).

■ TEAM NOTES

CAA OPENERS

W&M will look to open its CAA slate with a victory for the second consecutive season after it earned a 34-24 win at Campbell last season.

Despite the win, W&M has won just two of its last eight conference openers, as its only other victory during the recent stretch came in a 34-31 win at Elon in 2021.

Saturday's game will mark just the second time in the last seven seasons that W&M has opened its CAA slate at home.

SUCCESS AT HOME

Off to a 2-0 start at home this season, W&M has posted an 9-2 record at Zable Stadium during the last three seasons.

HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS

Although W&M has outscored its opponents by just a touchdown (69-62), the Tribe has bettered the opposition by a lopsided 59-30 margin during the second half of games this season.

NATIONAL RANKING

W&M enters Saturday's game ranked No. 11 in the Stats Perform FCS Top 25 Poll and No. 12 in the AFCA FCS Coaches' Top 25 Poll.

It marks the fourth consecutive season in which W&M has garnered a top-25 national ranking.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

After posting a 3-0 mark against FCS opponents - all versus teams from the Southern Conference - during its non-conference slate, W&M has won 44 of its last 46 games against non-conference FCS opponents during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally W&M owns a 47-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 36-8 record during the last seven seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

During the last four seasons, W&M is 25-5 in such contests.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last seven seasons, W&M is 24-4 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 4-16 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 38 of its last 45 games when leading at halftime

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 56-6 record when leading after three quarters.

PRESEASON NATIONAL RANKINGS

With 12 starters returning from last season's squad (8 offense / 4 defense), W&M garnered multiple preseason national rankings. The Tribe is No. 15 in the Stats Perform Poll and No. 16 in the AFCA Coaches Poll.

W&M enters the 2024 campaign having posted three consecutive winning seasons. Additionally, the Tribe earned a top-25 ranking for multiple weeks during each of the last three years.

W&M was picked to finished fourth in the CAA preseason poll by the league's 16 head coaches.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

After establishing themselves among the nation's best players, W&M senior left tackle Charles Grant and senior running back Bronson Yoder were selected to multiple preseason All-America teams this summer. The duo was also tabbed to the East-West Shrine Bowl 1000 Watch List and garnered preseason All-CAA honors by the league's head coaches, while Grant was chosen to the prestigious Senior Bowl Watch List.

PRESEASON ALL-CAA SELECTIONS

In addition to Charles Grant and Bronson Yoder, four other W&M standouts earned preseason all-conference honors - fullback/halfback Trey McDonald, running back Malachi Imoh, offensive lineman Ryan McKenna and safety Marcus Barnes.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are six seniors - OL Charles Grant, ATH Hollis Mathis, OL Ryan McKenna, LB Quinn Osborne, LB Alex Washington and RB Bronson Yoder, who is a two-time team captain. The six captains are the most in school history.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Five former Tribe standouts were in NFL preseason camps this year - linebacker/defensive end Nate Lynn (Lions), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive lineman Bill Murray (Bears), offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal (Lions) and running back Owen Wright (Ravens).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills).

New York Giants head coach Brian Daboll was an assistant on W&M's staff in 1997, while Washington Commanders head coach Dan Quinn was an assistant with the Tribe in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

BIG NUMBERS

Under the direction of first-year offensive coordinator Mario Acitelli, W&M's offense is off to a strong start this season and ranks 16th nationally in total offense (418.8) and 25th in scoring offense (31.0).

RUSHING SUCCESS

After rushing for a season-high 384 yards in last week's win against Furman, W&M leads the CAA and fifth nationally in rushing (243.5).

Running back Bronson Yoder (166 yards) and quarterback Darius Wilson (155 yards) accounted for much of rushing yardage versus the Paladins as both posted career highs on the ground.

Additionally, the Tribe is averaging 313.5 rushing yards per game on the ground during the last two weeks.

THIRD DOWN CONVERSIONS

W&M has been tremendously successful converting third downs this season and ranks fifth nationally with a .517 conversion percentage.

The Tribe was especially impressive during last two weeks against Wofford and Furman, as it combined to convert 20-of-33 (60.6 percent).

PROTECTING THE BALL

After ranking sixth nationally last season in fewest turnovers committed (10), W&M is off to another strong start this fall and has committed just five turnovers through the opening four contests.

COMING FROM EVERY ANGLE

Six different players on W&M's roster have thrown at least one career touchdown pass - Darius Wilson, Hollis Mathis, Tyler Hughes, Sean Kendrick, Malachi Imoh and Andrew Piercy.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 103 times and posted an 94-10 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 53-10 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 12-26 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

STRONG FINISHES

W&M's defense has allowed just two offensive touchdown during second halves through its first four games, as Wofford and Furman are the only teams to find the end zone offensively during the final 30 minutes of action (Charlotte scored a defensive touchdown on a fumble recovery).

DEFENDING THE PASS

In addition to allowing just three passing touchdown this season, W&M leads the CAA and ranks 12th nationally in pass efficiency defense (105.9).

RUN DEFENSE

W&M has been stout versus the run during the last two games an is limiting its opponents to just 104 yards per game on the ground. Additionally, the Tribe is allowing just 3.6 yards per carry during that span.

THIRD DOWN STOPS

W&M has been outstanding defensively on third downs this season and leads the CAA and ranks eighth nationally in third down conversion defense (.261).

CREATING TURNOVERS

After forcing three turnovers in the win against Furman, W&M now ranks 28th nationally with six turnovers gained.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 189 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 13 times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 86 games, just 28 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

During the last three seasons, W&M's defense is allowing just 1.03 touchdown passes per game (29 TD / 28 games).

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.7 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 79 games (1,479 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 52-27 at home during that span.

SCORING WITH DEFENSE & SPECIAL TEAMS

After recording two non-offensive touchdowns last season, W&M found the end zone on a blocked punt return against VMI in the season opener.

Dating back to 2007, the Tribe has generated 47 non-offensive touchdowns.

■ PLAYER NOTES

QUARTERBACKS

DARIUS WILSON

- One of just two players in school history to throw for more than 5,000 yards and rush for more than 1,000 yards the other is David Corely, Jr.
- W&M's first four-year starter at quarterback since Jake Phillips (2005-08)
- Ranks fifth all-time at W&M in total offense (7,229), ninth in passing yards (5,663) and tied for ninth in touchdown passes (36)
- Thrown for at least 200 yards eight times, which ranks ninth in school history
- Accounted for three touchdowns (two passing/ one rushing) in the win against Furman; rushed for a career-high 155 yards on 17 carries (9.1 yards/carry), highlighted by a 53-yard touchdown run
- Completed 18-of-27 passes for 185 yards and rushed for 41 yards with a touchdown in the win at Wofford
- Accounted for two touchdowns a 62-yard pass to DreSean Kendrick and a 19-yard run - at Coastal Carolina
- Completed 11-of-15 passes for 190 yards with two touchdowns in the win against VMI; also rushed for 32 yards on six carries

After leading the William & Mary football team to three consecutive winning campaigns, Head Coach Mike London returns for his sixth season at the helm of the Tribe.

W&M ascended as high as No. 4 in the national rankings in 2023, marking the third straight season in which the Tribe garnered a national ranking and the second straight year in which it appeared in the top 10.

During the recent stretch of success, London has helped Tribe standouts garner 32 All-CAA honors during the last three seasons, highlighted by 14 first-team selections. Additionally, 14 W&M players have combined to earn 45 All-America honors during London's tenure.

In addition to the numerous accolades, London has overseen the development of five former Tribe standouts who have signed NFL contracts – Nate Lynn (Lions), Colby Sorsdal (Lions), Owen Wright (Ravens), Andrew Trainer (Chargers) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Numerous achievements highlighted the Tribe's most recent campaign last fall. In addition to extending the program's streak of winning seasons and once again appearing in the national polls, five W&M standouts combined to earn 13 All-America honors. Additionally, 10 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades. Highlighting the impressive group was All-America defensive end Nate Lynn, who signed a free agent contract with the Detroit Lions.

One of the country's top teams defensively, W&M ranked 10th nationally in total defense (303.8), 12th in scoring defense (18.5) and fourth in passing defense (153.5).

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the CAA title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were recognized with national honors for their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned All-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS National Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA

Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jalen Jones.

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five.

Under London's leadership, W&M continued its upward trajectory during the 2021 campaign as it posted the program's most wins since 2015 and garnered a national ranking in multiple weeks. Highlighting the notable victories was a 31-18 road win at No. 4 Villanova.

Individually, seven Tribe standouts earned postseason all-conference honors, highlighted by a pair of All-America standouts in defensive end Nate Lynn, a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist for national defensive player of the year, and left tackle Andrew Trainer, who signed a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Chargers. Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson was selected as the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmye Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the AP Poll.
