INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

No. 15/16 William & Mary will open its 2024 season when it hosts VMI at Zable Stadium on Thursday at 7 p.m. It will mark the first time since 2007 that W&M has hosted its season opener on a Thursday night. The contest will be televised on FloFootball, while a radio broadcast will be available on 92.3 FM The Tide.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

Ranked No. 15/16 in the preseason polls and picked to finish fourth in the CAA by the league's coaches, W&M enters the 2024 campaign posed to return to the NCAA Playoffs after reaching the quarterfinals in 2022. Led by preseason All-America standouts OL Charles Grant and RB Bronson Yoder, W&M returns eight offensive players who have at least 10 career starts. All-CAA safety Marcus Barnes leads the defensive unit that features five players who earned at least four starts last season. Grad transfer LB Jonathan Hammond, a four-time All-Pioneer League selection at Davidson, and Syracuse transfer DL Ty Gordon also bolster the group.

SCOUTING THE KEYDETS

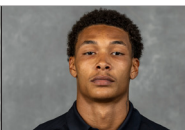
After posting a 5-6 record last season, which included a victory against No. 14 Western Carolina, head coach Danny Rocco returns for his second year leading the Keydets. Picked to finish seventh out of the nine SoCon teams in the preseason poll, VMI is led by five standouts who earned preseason all-conference honors. Highlighting the group are three first-team selections - running back Hunter Rice, offensive lineman Tyriq Poindexter and defensive lineman Dorian Starnes.

ABOUT THE SERIES

W&M leads the all-time series, 53-33-2, and owns a 25-9 record against the Keydets at Zable Stadium. W&M has won the last 25 meetings, which ranks as the fourth-most consecutive wins in a FCS series. The teams last played in Lexington in 2011 - a 24-7 Tribe win.

■ TEAM NOTES

SERIOUS HISTORY

Few schools can boast such long and storied histories as William & Mary (founded in 1693) and Virginia Military Institute (founded in 1839). This same history can be applied to the football programs, as each has sponsored a team for the better part of the last century. The two schools have met on the gridiron 88 times.

W&M leads the all-time series, 53-33-2, and owns a 25-9 record against the Keydets at Zable Stadium. W&M has won the last 25 meetings, which ranks as the fourth-most consecutive wins in a FCS series. The teams last played in Lexington in 2011 – a 24-7 Tribe win.

During the 25-game streak, W&M has outscored the Keydets, 1,004-337, an average of 27 points per game.

The most lopsided contest during the 25-game stretch was in 1998 when the Tribe earned a 49-0 triumph in Williamsburg, while the closest game came in 1992, a 21-16 W&M win.

W&M held VMI to seven or fewer points in 12 of the 25 games, including five of the last seven.

HOME OPENERS

W&M has posted a 33-11 record in home openers since 1980.

Additionally, the Tribe has won 14 of its last 16 home openers, winning by an average margin of 21.2 points in the victories (+297).

The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

SEASON OPENERS

W&M will look to secure its third consecutive season-opening win when it hosts VMI. The Tribe began the last two seasons with victories at Charlotte (2022) and at Campbell (2023).

Excluding the three-game spring season in 2021, W&M has won four of its last five season openers.

RARE OCCURRENCE

When W&M hosts VMI, it will mark the first time the Tribe has opened its season at home on a Thursday night since 2007 when it welcomed Delaware to Zable Stadium for the inaugural CAA Football game.

W&M VS. THE SOUTHERN CONFERENCE

W&M boasts an 83-20 all-time record against teams currently in the Southern Conference.

The Tribe owns winning records against VMI (53-33-2), The Citadel (18-7) and Wofford (3-0), while it trails in series versus Furman (7-8) and Samford (0-1). W&M owns 1-1 records against Chattanooga and East Tennessee State, while it has never played Mercer or Western Carolina.

W&M & Mary was a member of the Southern Conference from 1936-1977 and won four league titles (1942, 1947, 1966, 1970).

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

W&M has won 41 of its last 43 games against non-conference FCS opponents during the regular season. The lone losses during that span are Lafayette (2012) and Colgate (2018).

Additionally W&M owns a 44-3 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

PRESEASON NATIONAL RANKINGS

With 12 starters returning from last season's squad (8 offense / 4 defense), W&M garnered multiple preseason national rankings. The Tribe is No. 15 in the Stats Perform Poll and No. 16 in the AFCA Coaches Poll.

W&M enters the 2024 campaign having posted three consecutive winning seasons. Additionally, the Tribe earned a top-25 ranking for multiple weeks during each of the last three years.

W&M was picked to finished fourth in the CAA preseason poll by the league's 16 head coaches.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

After establishing themselves among the nation's best players, W&M senior left tackle Charles Grant and senior running back Bronson Yoder were selected to multiple preseason All-America teams this summer. The duo was also tabbed to the East-West Shrine Bowl 1000 Watch List and garnered preseason All-CAA honors by the league's head coaches, while Grant was chosen to the prestigious Senior Bowl Watch List.

PRESEASON ALL-CAA SELECTIONS

In addition to Charles Grant and Bronson Yoder, four other W&M standouts earned preseason all-conference honors - fullback/halfback Trey McDonald, running back Malachi Imoh, offensive lineman Ryan McKenna and safety Marcus Barnes.

SUCCESS AT HOME

W&M has posted a 7-2 record at Zable Stadium during the last two seasons.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 33-7 record during the last six seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

During the last three seasons, W&M is 22-4 in such contests.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last six seasons, W&M is 22-4 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 4-15 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

LEADING AT HALFTIME

Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 36 of its last 43 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 53-6 record when leading after three quarters.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are six seniors - OL Charles Grant, ATH Hollis Mathis, OL Ryan McKenna, LB Quinn Osborne, LB Alex Washington and RB Bronson Yoder, who is a two-time team captain. The six captains are the most in school history.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Five former Tribe standouts were in NFL preseason camps this year - linebacker/defensive end Nate Lynn (Lions), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive lineman Bill Murray (Bears), offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal (Lions) and running back Owen Wright (Ravens).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills).

New York Giants head coach Brian Daboll was an assistant on W&M's staff in 1997, while Washington Commanders head coach Dan Quinn was an assistant with the Tribe in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

RETURNING STARTERS

Led by preseason All-America standouts OL Charles Grant (29) and RB Bronson Yoder (21), W&M returns eight offensive players who have at least 10 career starts - WR JT Mayo (26), ATH Hollis Mathis (23), OL Ryan McKenna (23), OL Bart Francois (22) and DreSean Kendrick (12).

OFFENSIVE LINE

Anchored by one of the nation's elite left tackles and top prospects for the 2025 NFL Draft in senior Charles Grant, W&M'S offensive line is expected to continue building upon the group's tradition of excellence established in recent years. In addition to Grant, a consensus preseason All-America selection, Senior Bowl Watch List selection and team captain, the unit also features a pair of senior standouts - all-conference center Ryan McKenna (captain) and guard Bart Francois - who both enter their third seasons as starters.

W&M ranked 13th nationally in rushing last season with 196.9 yards per game on the ground.

RUSHING ATTACK

Although W&M enters the upcoming 2024 campaign loaded with talent at multiple position groups, perhaps no unit is more impressive than the running backs, which features two of the nation's top players in senior All-American Bronson Yoder and senior All-CAA standout Malachi Imoh. The duo has combined to rush for 4,769 yards with 48 total touchdowns during their careers and both possess the ability to significantly impact games. Bolstering the unit is talented junior Martin Lucas, whose powerful running style adds another dimension to the group and has helped him record 419 rushing yards with seven touchdowns.

AMONG THE BEST

Tremendously talented and experienced, senior Darius Wilson will once again headline the Tribe's quarterbacks as he enters his final campaign looking to become the program's first four-year starter

under center since Jake Phillips (2005-08). One of the most productive quarterbacks in school history, Wilson ranks among the program's career top-10 lists in passing yards (5,025), total offense (6,341), touchdown passes (31), completion percentage (61.3), pass attempts (633) and pass completions (388).

CHANCE TO MAKE HISTORY

Hollis Mathis needs just 8 rushing yards and 597 receiving yards to become the second player in the history of college football to total 1,000 career yards passing, receiving and rushing.

PROTECTING THE BALL

W&M ranked sixth nationally last season in fewest turnovers committed (10).

COMING FROM EVERY ANGLE

Six different players on W&M's roster have thrown at least one career touchdown pass - Darius Wilson, Hollis Mathis, Tyler Hughes, Sean Kendrick, Malachi Imoh and Andrew Piercy.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 100 times and posted an 91-10 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 50-10 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 12-26 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

NEW-LOOK DEFENSE

Although W&M will replace five all-conference standouts from last season's team, this year's unit features a number of talented players with significant game experience. Highlighting the group are five players who earned at least four starts last season - All-CAA safety Marcus Barnes (10), CB Jalen Jones (10), LB Quinn Osborne (6), DL Davin Dzidzienyo (6) and LB Alex Washington (4). Additionally, the talented group includes transfer LB Jonathan Hammond, was a four-time All-Pioneer League selection at Davidson, and Syracuse transfer DL Ty Gordon.

STOPPING THE RUN

W&M was extremely effective at keeping opponents out of the end zone on the ground last season and allowed less than one rushing score per game (0.9).

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 19.2 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 77 games (1,448 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 50-27 at home during that span.



SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 185 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 13 times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 82 games, just 27 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

During the last two seasons, W&M's defense is allowing just 1.08 touchdown passes per game (26 TD / 24 games).

After leading the William & Mary football team to three consecutive winning campaigns, Head Coach Mike London returns for his sixth season at the helm of the Tribe.

W&M ascended as high as No. 4 in the national rankings in 2023, marking the third straight season in which the Tribe garnered a national ranking and the second straight year in which it appeared in the top 10.

During the recent stretch of success, London has helped Tribe standouts garner 32 All-CAA honors during the last three seasons, highlighted by 14 first-team selections. Additionally, 14 W&M players have combined to earn 45 All-America honors during London's tenure.

In addition to the numerous accolades, London has overseen the development of five former Tribe standouts who have signed NFL contracts – Nate Lynn (Lions), Colby Sorsdal (Lions), Owen Wright (Ravens), Andrew Trainer (Chargers) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Numerous achievements highlighted the Tribe's most recent campaign last fall. In addition to extending the program's streak of winning seasons and once again appearing in the national polls, five W&M standouts combined to earn 13 All-America honors. Additionally, 10 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades. Highlighting the impressive group was All-America defensive end Nate Lynn, who signed a free agent contract with the Detroit Lions.

One of the country's top teams defensively, W&M ranked 10th nationally in total defense (303.8), 12th in scoring defense (18.5) and fourth in passing defense (153.5).

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the CAA title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were recognized with national honors for their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned All-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS National Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA

Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jalen Jones.

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five.

Under London's leadership, W&M continued its upward trajectory during the 2021 campaign as it posted the program's most wins since 2015 and garnered a national ranking in multiple weeks. Highlighting the notable victories was a 31-18 road win at No. 4 Villanova.

Individually, seven Tribe standouts earned postseason all-conference honors, highlighted by a pair of All-America standouts in defensive end Nate Lynn, a Buck Buchanan Award Finalist for national defensive player of the year, and left tackle Andrew Trainer, who signed a free agent contract with the Los Angeles Chargers. Additionally, quarterback Darius Wilson was selected as the CAA Offensive Rookie of the Year.

London's first season leading the Tribe provided a glimpse of the program's bright future, as the squad concluded the 2019 campaign with wins in three of its final four games – including a Capital Cup victory at long-time rival Richmond in the season finale. In addition to helping five W&M standouts earn all-conference honors, defensive tackle Bill Murray garnered All-America distinction and signed a free agent contract with the New England Patriots.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.

London gained his first head coaching experience at Richmond, his alma mater, where he amassed a 24-5 record and guided the Spiders to the 2008 FCS national title during his initial campaign. His efforts were recognized by the AFCA, which selected him as the FCS National Coach of the Year. After leading the Spiders to an 8-0 start the following season, UR became just the third FCS school to receive a vote in the AP Poll.
