INSIDE THE TRIBE

THE GAME

W&M will conclude the early portion of its non-conference slate when it hosts Charleston Southern at Zable Stadium on Saturday at 4 p.m. The contest will be televised on FloCollege, while a radio broadcast will be available on 92.3 FM The Tide. The game will be part of W&M's Hall of Fame Weekend, which honors this year's class that includes former All-America cornerback and NFL standout B.W. Webb, longtime strength & conditioning coach John Sauer and men's basketball head coach Tony Shaver.

ABOUT THE TRIBE

W&M enters Saturday's game with a 1-2 record overall and a 1-0 mark in conference play. Both of the Tribe's games versus FCS opponents have been tightly contested, as it defeated Maine, 28-27, and was edged at Furman, 23-21. W&M currently ranks second nationally in fewest turnovers (1), while it is also among the country's least penalized teams and ranks ninth in fewest penalties per game (4.0). Wide receiver Deven Thompson highlights W&M's offensive attack and ranks 16th nationally in yards per catch (21.5) and has scored touchdowns in each of the last two games. Defensively, linebacker Luke Banbury ranks third nationally in tackle per game (13.0) and first in PBU (5), while linebacker Harrison Johnson ranks 15th in the country with 10.0 tackles per game.

SCOUTING THE BUCCANEERS

Although Charleston Southern enters the weekend with a 0-3 record, two of its setbacks have come on the road against FBS opponents – Vanderbilt and Coastal Carolina. In its last outing, CSU lost to Lindenwood,, 35-28, in its home opener. The Buccaneers are averaging just 10.3 points per game, while they are allowing 31.0.

ABOUT THE SERIES

W&M and CSU have met just once, as the Tribe earned a 15-7 win in Charleston in 2023. W&M posted a dominant performance defensively and limited the Buccaneers to just 77 total yards.

■ TEAM NOTES

LOOKING FOR WIN #100

W&M Head Coach Mike London currently has 99 career victories and needs just one more to reach the impressive 100-win milestone. Thirty-seven of those triumphs have come at W&M, while London also accumulated wins as the head coach at Richmond, Virginia and Howard.

CLOSE CALLS

Two of the Tribe's first three games have been tightly contested, as W&M was edged at Furman, 23-21, in the opener and defeated Maine, 28-27.

LIMITING PENALTIES

W&M is among the nation's least penalized teams this season, as it currently ranks ninth in fewest penalties per game (4.0) and 18th in fewest penalty yards per game (39.0).

The Tribe committed just two penalties for 11 yards last week at Virginia after committing just three penalties in the prior week's win against Maine.

The effort at UVA marked the Tribe's fewest penalties in a game since committing just one versus Towson in 2017.

SUCCESS AT HOME

After winning its home opener against Maine, W&M has won 13 of its last 16 games at Zable Stadium during the last four seasons.

20 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER

W&M owns an 41-11 record during the last eight seasons in games in which it scored more than 20 points.

During the last five seasons, W&M is 30-8 in such contests.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE

During the last eight seasons, W&M is 26-5 when it commits fewer turnovers than its opponents, while it is 5-18 when it loses the turnover battle during the recent stretch.

EARLY LEADS

W&M posted a 4-0 record when it scored first last season and was 6-1 when leading at halftime. Dating back to the 2014 season, the Tribe has won 42 of its last 50 games when leading at halftime.

HOLDING ON TO LEADS

Dating back to the start of the 2013 season, W&M owns a 59-7 record when leading after three quarters.

SUCCESS vs. FCS IN NON-CONFERENCE

W&M has won 44 of its last 47 games against non-conference FCS opponents during the regular season. The only losses during that span are Lafayette (2012), Colgate (2018) and Furman (2025).

Additionally W&M owns a 47-4 record vs. FCS non-conference teams during the regular season dating back through the 2002 season.

WINNING SEASONS

With last season's 7-5 record, W&M secured its fourth consecutive winning season. It marked the first time W&M has accomplished the feat since

posting eight straight winning seasons from 1992-99.

PRESEASON ALL-AMERICANS

Four W&M standouts recently earned preseason All-America honors from various organizations, as cornerback Jalen Jones, offensive lineman Ryan McKenna, linebacker Luke Banbury and fullback/halfback Trey McDonald all garnered national recognition.

PRESEASON ALL-CAA SELECTIONS

Eight W&M standouts earned preseason all-conference honors this year, as cornerback Jalen Jones, defensive lineman Davin Dzidzienyo, linebacker Luke Banbury, fullback/halfback Trey McDonald and punt returner Carson Jenkins garnered first-team distinction, while tight end Sean McElwain, offensive lineman Ryan McKenna and defensive lineman Ty Gordon earned honorable mention accolades.

The Tribe's three first-team selections on defense were the most of any team in the league.

W&M was picked to finish seventh in the preseason poll.

Both the preseason all-conference team and preseason poll were selected based on a vote by the CAA's 14 head coaches.

CAPTAINS

Serving as team captains this season are four standouts - DL Davin Dzidzienyo, CB Jalen Jones, TE Trey McDonald and OL Ryan McKenna, who is a two-time team captain.

PATRIOT LEAGUE IN 2026

The 2025 campaign will mark W&M football's final season as a member of CAA Football, as it will join the Patriot League next season as an associate member.

The Patriot League's football members include Bucknell University, Colgate University, Fordham University, Georgetown University, The College of the Holy Cross, Lafayette College, Lehigh University and University of Richmond. Villanova University football will begin play in the Patriot League in 2026.

TRIBE IN THE NFL

Six former Tribe standouts were in NFL preseason camps this year - offensive lineman Charles Grant (Raiders), linebacker/defensive end Nate Lynn (Lions), All-Pro long snapper Luke Rhodes (Colts), offensive lineman Bill Murray (Bears), offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal (Lions) and running back Owen Wright (Buccaneers).

Additionally, a pair of former Tribe players are currently serving as NFL head coaches - Mike Tomlin '95 (Pittsburgh Steelers, head coach) and Sean McDermott '98 (Buffalo Bills).

New York Giants head coach Brian Daboll was an assistant on W&M's staff in 1997, while Washington Commanders head coach Dan Quinn was an assistant with the Tribe in 1994.

Also noteworthy is a pair of former W&M head coaches who went on to have extraordinary Hall of Fame careers - Marv Levy and Lou Holtz. Levy served as W&M's head coach from 1964-68 and was followed by Holtz from 1969-71.

■ TEAM OFFENSIVE NOTES

LIMITING TURNOVERS

W&M currently ranks second nationally in fewest turnovers, as it has thrown just one interception and not lost any fumbles. The Tribe's lone turnover came on the opening drive of the season at Furman.

RED ZONE SUCCESS

W&M has scored touchdowns on eight of its 10 trips in the red zone this season for a conversion percentage of 80.0.

BIG PLAY STRIKE

Tyler Hughes' 79-yard touchdown pass to Deven Thompson at Virginia marked the Tribe's longest touchdown pass since 2022 (87-yd TD pass from Darius Wilson to Tyler Rose in the win vs. Villanova).

BIG RETURNS

W&M currently ranks second in the CAA and 21st nationally with a punt return average of 12.33.

HALFTIME ADJUSTMENTS

W&M's offense has been especially productive during the third quarter this season, as it has scored 35 points during the first three contests.

GROUND GAME PRODUCTION IS KEY

Since joining the CAA in 1993, W&M has rushed for at least 200 yards 110 times and posted an 98-12 record in those contests.

Additionally, W&M is 57-12 when out-rushing the opposition since 2013.

STAT TO WATCH

Dating back through the 2011 season, W&M has struggled to win games in which it has thrown at least 30 passes and owns an 12-27 mark in such contests.

■ TEAM DEFENSIVE NOTES

STRONG START TO STRONG FINISHES

After limiting opponents to just six touchdowns and 50 points during the fourth quarter last season, W&M has not allowed any touchdowns in the fourth quarter this season.

Additionally, W&M has allowed just two touchdowns during the second half this season.

BALL HAWKS

Dating back to last season, W&M has forced at least one turnover in 13 straight games, which is the longest active streak in the FCS. The Tribe has totaled 18 turnovers during that span.

SHUTTING DOWN THE PASS

Since the start of the 2007 season, a span of 199 games, the Tribe has allowed more than 300 passing yards just 16 times.

TOUGH TO SCORE THROUGH THE AIR

Since the start of the start of the 2016 season, a span of 97 games, just 33 opponents have scored more than one passing touchdown against W&M.

TOUGH DEFENSE AT ZABLE STADIUM

The Tribe defense has been outstanding in home games since the start of the 2009 season and is allowing just 18.9 points per game at Zable Stadium during the stretch.

During the stretch of 84 games (1,593 points), W&M has posted six shutouts.

W&M is 56-28 at home during that span.

TYLER HUGHES

- Threw a 79-yard touchdown pass to Deven Thompson at Virginia, marking the longest touchdown pass by a W&M quarterback since 2022 (87-yd TD pass from Darius Wilson to Tyler Rose in the win vs. Villanova)

- Rushed for a team-high 73 yards on 10 carries in the win against Maine; also completed 13-of-19 passes for 129 yards with two touchdowns

- Earned his second career start in the season opener at Furman, completing 19-of-31 passes for 208 yards with a touchdown; also rushed for a team-high 57 yards on 15 carries

- Totaled a career-high 130 rushing yards on just three carries with two touchdowns, highlighted by a 66-yard score, in the victory against Hampton last season

- Earned his first career start in the win at Hampton in 2023; accounted for all three of W&M's offensive touchdowns, throwing for two, including a 76-yard strike to JT Mayo, and rushing for another

After leading the William & Mary football team to four consecutive winning campaigns for the first time in 25 years, Head Coach Mike London returns for his seventh season at the helm of the Tribe.

W&M ascended as high as No. 10 in the national rankings in 2024, marking the fourth straight season in which the Tribe garnered a national ranking and the third straight year in which it appeared in the top 10.

During the recent stretch of success, London has helped Tribe standouts garner 44 All-CAA honors during the last four seasons, highlighted by 17 first-team selections. Additionally, 17 W&M players have combined to earn 65 All-America honors during London's tenure.

In addition to the numerous accolades, London has overseen the development of six former Tribe standouts who have signed NFL contracts – Charles Grant (Raiders), Nate Lynn (Lions), Colby Sorsdal (Lions), Owen Wright (Ravens), Andrew Trainer (Chargers) and Bill Murray (Patriots).

Numerous achievements highlighted the Tribe's most recent campaign last fall. In addition to extending the program's streak of winning seasons and once again appearing in the national polls, five W&M standouts combined to earn 20 All-America honors – highlighted by offensive lineman Charles Grant, who was a consensus first-team honoree and a third-round draft pick by the Las Vegas Raiders. In addition to Grant, three other standouts earned NFL rookie minicamp invites – Hollis Mathis (Steelers), Marcus Barnes (Bengals) and Matthew Akuchie (Colts) – while 12 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades.

W&M also continued its tradition of boasting one of the nation's top rushing attacks as it ranked fourth in the country in yards per game on the ground (232.8). Additionally, it marked the second time in the last three seasons W&M ranked among the nation's top four and the fourth-straight year in which it ranked among the top 17.

Members of the squad also excelled in the classroom as 55 standouts earned CAA Commissioner's Academic Honor Roll recognition during the fall semester.

In 2025 London was honored for the tremendous success on and off the field with the prestigious W&M Plumeri Award, which recognizes and rewards the core values that distinguish outstanding faculty members and coaches who define excellence.

Following a successful 2023 campaign five W&M standouts combined to earn 13 All-America honors, while 10 members of the Tribe garnered All-CAA accolades. Highlighting the impressive group was All-America defensive end Nate Lynn, who signed a free agent contract with the Detroit Lions.

One of the country's top teams defensively, W&M ranked 10th nationally in total defense (303.8), 12th in scoring defense (18.5) and fourth in passing defense (153.5).

Under London's leadership, W&M catapulted to the national forefront in 2022 as it secured a share of the CAA title, earned a No. 5 seed in the NCAA Playoffs and advanced to the NCAA Quarterfinals. Additionally, W&M equaled a school record for wins (11) and posted program records for regular season victories (10) and road triumphs (6). Highlighting the wins were three victories against nationally ranked opponents and a lopsided season-

opening triumph at FBS opponent Charlotte.

W&M's success was recognized at the national level, as London was selected as a finalist for the Eddie Robinson Award, which honors the FCS National Coach of the Year, and finished fourth in the final voting. Additionally, London was selected as the Bobby Ross Coach of the Year by the Touchdown Club of Richmond and the VaSID (Virginia Sports Information Directors) Coach of the Year.

In addition to the team's success, a number of Tribe standouts were recognized with national honors for their outstanding individual contributions. Highlighting an impressive group of six players who earned All-America recognition were linebacker John Pius, offensive lineman Colby Sorsdal and cornerback Jalen Jones. Pius was a finalist for the Buck Buchanan Award (FCS National Defensive Player of the Year) and finished second in the final voting, while Jones was a finalist for the Jerry Rice Award (FCS Freshman of the Year). Sorsdal garnered consensus All-America distinction and was invited to the East-West Shrine Bowl before being selected by the Detroit Lions in the fifth round of the 2023 NFL Draft.

Additionally, 13 Tribe standouts combined to earn 15 all-conference honors, highlighted by a school-record tying seven first-team selections, including the CAA Defensive Player of the Year, John Pius, and the CAA Defensive Rookie of the Year, Jalen Jones.

W&M also rewrote its record book in 2022, as it set single-season school records for rushing yards (3,455), rushing yards per game (265.8) and rushing yards per carry (5.9). Additionally, the Tribe's points per game (33.5), rushing touchdowns (35) and total yards per game (448.8) all ranked among the program's top five. Defensively, W&M's 33 sacks also ranked as the seventh-best total in school history.

London, a former assistant under longtime Tribe head coach Jimmie Laycock, returned to Williamsburg with an impressive list of accomplishments as a head coach that includes winning a national title at the University of Richmond (2008) and earning Atlantic Coast Conference Coach of the Year distinction at the University of Virginia (2011).

Howard University's head coach from 2017-18, London's tenure leading the Bison was highlighted with his selection as a finalist for the 2017 STATS Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) Eddie Robinson Award, which is bestowed upon the nation's top head coach. Additionally, he earned the 2017 American Football Coaches Association (AFCA) Regional Coach of the Year award after guiding Howard to a 6-2 conference record – the program's first winning season since 2012. His inaugural campaign at HU featured a season-opening win at UNLV, which ESPN lauded as one of college football's greatest upsets.

Prior to his two-year stint at HU, London served as an associate head coach/defensive line coach at the University of Maryland in 2016 where he helped lead the Terps to an appearance in the Quick Lane Bowl.

In addition to garnering ACC Coach of the Year honors at UVA in 2011, London led the Cavaliers to the Chick-Fil-A Bowl. En route to earning the postseason bowl bid, he guided UVA to road wins at Miami and Florida State – becoming the first program in the nation to accomplish the feat in the same season.
